



He thought proper to make some remarks relative to his conversion, call and travel in the ministry, although short, being only about 8 year and eight months from his conversion to his death. During the glorious outpouring of the spirit of God in Hollis in January, 1841, Mr. Goodwin was present, and he said that at the time of his meeting with that change which Christ spoke of to one anciently, who was a ruler among the Jews, felt to come like the poor publican, and cry "God be merciful to me a sinner!" and while mourning and weeping, Christ's love to him, which was brought to him by the Holy Spirit, and he was enabled to praise God wonderfully on the happy day of deliverance. Previous to his joining the church in Hollis, he bore a powerful testimony to the reality of religion, witnessing to all that came in his way, by his daily walk and conversation to the truth of the Christian religion, and he was needed in the Free-Will Baptist Church in Hollis, of which his honored father had the pastoral care, about six months after his conversion.
