Missionaries Warn of Mail Thefts

NASHVILLE, TENN.—Missionaries from several fields have informed the home office here of lost mail due to possible theft of letters and parcels. A typical communication is given below, name and field withheld to avoid incrimination:

"We have a definite problem here concerning mail. Sometimes it never gets to us. It is very dangerous to send money or packages. If they get to us we have to pay a great deal to get them, and there is a good chance that they will be stolen. We would like for people to know this. It would be best to send gifts to the missions department and let them notify us.

"We would also like for folks to let us know if they write us and do not get an answer because we answer all our letters, and if someone writes and does not get an answer it means that their letter was lost or stolen.

"If anyone wants to send anything personal to us, they can just mark it personal gift and send to the missions office. Sometimes people want to send something when a baby is born or something else they want to send us something for. It just wouldn't be worth it to send it directly to us."

Dave Franks to Arrive June 22

CAMPINAS, BRAZIL—Missionary Dave Franks will leave here late this month to begin furlough in the states. He is scheduled to arrive in Miami, Fla., by air on June 22.

Franks was the first Free Will Baptist missionary to settle in Brazil. He began his work here in early 1958.

During recent weeks, Franks has been engaged in evangelism meetings throughout the area.
