We recommend that the Clerk superintend the printing of the minutes and that he be paid \$20. for his services, that he have 700 copies printed. We futher recommend that the next session of this Conference meet with Cordova Church, Cordova, Alabama, and that Rev. J. D. Byars preach the Introductory Sermon and that Rev. I. K. Boyett be alternate. We recommend that the session begin on Wednesday before the Fourth Sunday in October 1929 and continue until all business is finished.

We further recommend that we vote against all candidates who are opposed to prohibition, and that we do all for the upbuilding of our Government on clean and higher plains of Christianity. We, your Sunday School Committee reports as follows. we have made a survey of the state and find only two Sunday Schools in Bear Association Muscle Shoals State Line 16; Vernon 10, State Line 8, Mt. Moriah 9, Jasper 10. We reccommend that this body strive for nothing less than a Sunday

School in each church in the state, We further suggest the or ganization of a Sunday School Convention. This will give the different schools an opportunity to report annually, further we suggest the importance of the pastors preaching a Sunday School Sermon once each year and we urge them to take part in the work in every way possible. Report received and Committee discharged.

We you committee on Articles of Faith reccommend that we adopt the Articles of Faith as appeared in the True Blue on August 1 1928 with the amendment on the 16th article added (Water Baptism) Report received and Articles adopted as printed in back of minute.

We, your committee on Missions report as followe; 1. We reccommend that this Confercence retain or elect a Home Mission Board. 2. We recommend that this conference ask each association to collect and send in to this board not less then 10 cents per copy and more if they see proper that this board take mony and buy a Gospel Tent and elect or send out their best evangelistic preacher to hold meetings in the various towns and cities and other places for the purpose of organizing churches in this state. We reccommend that the Home Mission Board devise plans for the support of the evangelist and that eacd pastor take and interest and cooperate with the board in collecting the funds. 
