

Called for Querrie Number Four—Read as handed in as follows: After one has believed on Christ as their Savior. is God or Christ respecible for his past, present and future sins. Being ably discussed.

Report on Resolutions—We your committee report as follows: 1st. Be it resolved that this State Conference go on record as opposing

any one who comes among our churches setting up new standards and orders that genders to strife and confusion among our people as using their influence toward the pulling away any of our churches as members from the original bodies to which they belong. 2nd, Be it further resolved that we tender our thanks and appreciation to the Mt. Harmony Church and community for the great way and moves in which they have cared for this conference during our stay with them.—
