We make the following report. We recommend:

- 1. That the Clerk superintend the printing of the minutes and that he have 500 copies printed.
- 2. That the Chairman of Finance Committee sit with the Clerk to receive all finance and make a record. At the end he shall make a report and turn the money over to the Clerk.
- 3. That each association be allowed three elected delegates in addition to its Ministers and Deacons.
- 4. That the body appoint a Credential Committee to be composed of one member from each association represented.
- 5 The duty of the Credential Committee shall be to examine all Petitionary letters and to examine all Ministers and Deacons of such associations presenting such letters. They shall make a written report of their findings.
- 6. That all officers of this body be nominated from the floor and they be elected by a majority vote of delegates present.
- 7. We recommend a survey of the State be made and boundary lines be established, dividing our work into districts and that each church become a member of the association of its district.
- 8. We recommend the General Business Committee make this Survey and report at the next session of this Association with their plans for carrying on our work.
- 9. That a Statistician be appointed. That he secure statistics of the Free Will Baptist of Alabama and that he make a written report to this body.
- 10. That each Church pay into the treasurer of this Association one dollar above the regular Association fee.
 - 11. That the Moderator appoint all committees hereafter.
