PROCEEDINGS

Of The

TWENTY-NINTH SESSION

Of The STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

Held At

LIBERTY CHURCH

In Lamar County, November 11-13, 1948

The session opened promptly at 10 o'clock. A good congregation joined in singing the grand old hymns "Blest Be The Tie," and "Take The Name of Jesus With You." Rev. T. H. Wiley led the prayer.

Moderator for the day, Rev. R. P. Rich of Pell City, took the chair and called Rev. A. L. Warren of Vernon to bring the first message of the day, "The Pastor as Church Guardian." His message was very instructive and pointed out the great responsibility of all pastors.

A praise service was a blessing to all present.

At 11 o'clock Rev. Rufus Hyman of Slocomb delivered a fine message to an appreciative congregation. Reading 1 Kings, 13, and using for a subject, "The Disobedient Prophet."

The noon hour, a splendid feast.

After lunch, the congregation joined in song service and then Rev. Harper of Cypress Inn, Tenn., conducted a fine devotional service.

In the absence of Rev. K. V. Shutes, Rev. T. H. Wiley substituted for him to bring one of the best messages of the session on the subject of "The Pastor as a Leader."

Then Rev. E. P. Rowden of Florence brought an equally great message on the subject, "The Pastor as a Feeder."

A general handshake of appreciation was given the two fine messengers. Rev. J. L. Lavender of Columbus, Miss., gave the next message, "The Pastor as an Evangelist."

The last message of the day was brought by Rev. R. K. Franklin of Birmingham, "The Pastor and Church Finance" was the subject assigned him.

A business session was the closing event of the day.

A committee appointed to arrange a Constitution and By-Laws for the ministers' meeting, reported as follows:

CONSTITUTION OF THE MINISTERS' MEETING OF ALABAMA PREAMBLE

In order to promote fellowship, better understanding, greater cooperation and greater vision among the ministers of Alabama, we do ordain and establish this Constitution:

I. NAME: This shall be known as the Alabama ministers' meeting.

II. We adopt the Treatise of Faith and practice of the National Association of Free Will Baptist as our standard to look to and pray for the day when we may be more nearly one.

III. The officers of the ministers' meeting shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator and Secretary, and any other officer we may need.

IV. These officers shall be elected by nomination and acclamation at the regular session on even years. The officers of the State Association may serve as officers of the ministers' meetings if so elected.

V. This meeting shall be composed of all ordained ministers in good standing in Alabama and adjoining states who wish to represent.

VI. FINANCE: Each minister shall pay one dollar registration fee to help pay for the record being printed in minutes.

VII. The Secretary shall be paid live dollars preserving the record of each meeting.

VIII. DISCIPLINE: The ministers' meeting is not a court to try, nor air out the faults of preachers. If they are in good standing with the State Association they are with the ministers' meeting. This is to be a meeting of fellowship and inspiration and brotherly love.

X. All elected officers shall serve two years. All appointed officers and committees one year.

XII. The ministers' meeting shall meet on Thursday morning before the 2nd Sunday in November of each year at the meeting place of the State Association.

XIII. This Constitution may be altered at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of ministers present.

BY-LAWS OF ALABAMA MINISTERS' MEETING

1. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk or the Senior Minister in years may call the meeting to order and shall have charge until Moderator assumes his place.

2. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to enroll all the ministers present who are in good standing. If there are questionable characters they shall be referred to an appointed Credential committee for advice, but not for trial. They may be seated if found worthy, if not they are referred to their home church and Association.

Each meeting shall be opened with scripture reading and prayer.

4. By a two-thirds vote any decision of the Moderator may

be over-ruled.

5. This meeting shall sit with open doors unless it goes into a committee as a whole.

6. Any person, not a member of the body shall be allowed to take part in discussions, with Moderator's permission, but shall have no vote.

7. All members of the body are expected to be present throughout the session unless excused by Moderator.

8. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one officer or committeeman if his nomination is elected.

9. The Moderator must not allow any discussion to be carried on in an unchristain spirit.

10. The person who desires to speak must first arise and address the Moderator, and when recognized, shall proceed.

11. The votes on any question must be counted upon request of one-fifth of members present.

12. No member shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes, nor twice on same subject unless given permission by the Moderator.

13. These By-Laws may be amended at any session by a two-thirds vote.

This report was adopted to go in effect at the next session. The election of officers resulted in Rev. R. P. Rich, Moderator and Rev. R. K. Franklin, Assistant Moderator.

The ministers' meeting adjourned.

THURSDAY EVENING

Rev. A. J. Lambert conducted a fine song service. Rev. K. V. Shutes offered prayer and Rev. L. V. Collier conducted the devotional service.

Supt. R. H. Ryland and children from the Free Will Baptist Children's Home at Eldridge presented a fine program to a large congregation, after which an offering of \$223.13 was given.

FRIDAY A. M.

At the 9 o'clock hour the State Association met in its 29th session.

BY-LAWS

The adoption of By-Laws of National Association.

1. The clerk of the assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the association into conference it a quorum is present. The Moderator, or in his absence, the Assistant Moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as moderator.

2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the association who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the association. In case of questionable representation, however, the case under question shall be referred to the credential committee.

3. It shall be the auty of everybody belonging to this association to send a letter to every annual session of this association, reporting in the same its spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Any body belonging to this association which shall fail to report itself for two successive session may be dismissed from the association by a two-thirds vote of all members present.

4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer and shall be closed with prayer.

5. By a two-thirds vote of all members present a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.

6. This association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

7. This association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

8. Any person not a member of this association may be allowed to take part in its discussion by obtaining permission from the moderator.

9. It shall be the duty of all members of the association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave from the moderator.

10. No member shall absent himself from the association during its meetings without first obtaining permission from the moderator.

11. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee provided the person nominated be elected.

12. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

13. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise to his feet and address the moderator by the appellation "brother moderator." but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.

14. The "yeas" and "nays" may be counted on any question by request of one-fifth of the members present.

15. No member of this association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.

16. It shall be the duty of the moderator to seat delegates in a body in a designated section of the assembly room at the

beginning of each business session.

17. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

CONSTITUTION

NAME—This body shall be known as the "ALABAMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST."

SEAL—This Alabama State Association of Free Will Baptist adopt the treatise of the National Association in faith and practice. Praying for the day when we shall be one in Christ.

SEC. II.—The officers of the State Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary and Treasurer, Assistant Secretary and Executive Board.

These officers are elective. Other officers being appointed

as Moderator may need or desire.

SEC. III.—This association shall be composed of all active, ordained ministers who are members of an Association or church, which is a member of this body and duly elected or appointed delegates of district associations or church.

One delegate for each church of each Association which is

a member of this body.

SEC. IV.—No independent church may be a member of this body unless Association to which it belongs refuse to represent in the State body. Then the church may report independently. The fee of said church be the sum of \$20.00.

ARTICLE II—FINANCE.—Each district Association send the sum of \$15.00 annual fee and \$5.00 National Association fee with the annual report. And each minister and deacon pay the sum of \$1.00 registration fee to help carry on the expenses of the Association.

SEC. V.—The secretary shall be paid \$15.00 and the moderator \$10.00 annually for their services rendered. All other expenditures not specified shall be made at the directions of the body.

ARTICLE II—DISCIPLINE.—The State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine of practice that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing the State Association of Free Will Baptist churches or act upon any appeal that may be made by any body belonging to the State Association. Said appeal having been properly signed by the constituent body or bodies and its decisions shall be final.

SEC. VI.—All appeals coming before the State Association may be settled in either of the following ways: (1) By the State Association sitting in a committee as a whole. (2) By a special committee appointed by the Executive Board, whose report shall be voted on without discussion.

ARTICLE II.—The Moderator of the State Association of Free Will Baptist shall be regarded as an ex official member of all Boards or committees elected or appointed.

ARTICLE III.—Each elected officer shall serve for a period of two (2) years. Elections coming on the even years.

The appointed officers or committees serving at the direction of the Moderator or until dismissed by the Moderator.

ARTICLE IV.—MEETINGS.—The State Association of Free Will Baptist shall hold its regular meetings annually. Place of meeting to be decided by a vote of the body. The time of meeting to be on Thursday night before the second Sunday in Movember of each year. And to remain in session until its work is completed.

ARTICLE V.—This Constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of members present; provided proposed amendment be presented in writing to the body and shall lie on the table at least from morning session till evening session, or from evening session till morning session prior to adoption and shall during that time be read at least twice in open session.
