The Secretary called the body to order and seated the ordained ministers.

A motion carried to seat all ordained deacons be seated as standing delegates.

Rev. H. A. Pitts gave the report of the Youth's Bible Camp.

Motion carried to empower the Moderator to appoint a Finance committee to finance the project.

Motion carried that the Youth's Camp committee be designated as trustees of Youth Camp. Rev. Zigler of Southern Union Association and Rev. Narred of Muscle Shoals Association were recognized as visitors.

Sister A. M Wallis, Treasurer of Superannuation Board asked to make her report.

The Credential committee made the following report:

At one o'clock the body was again assembled and the Moderator appointed Rev. H. L. Mitchell, R. H. Yerby, Lesley Pinson to the Resolution committee.

The Business committee gave a partial report.

The Home mission report was given by Mrs. Lorene Ryland.

Sister K. V. Shutes gave the unified program report.

Rev, A, J. Lambert gave the Sunday School report.

Rev. W. H. Ryland gave a report on the State Sunday School Convention.

Rev. A. L. Warren gave a verbal report of the fine session of Bible Conference.

Rev. H. L. Mitchell gave his report of the Resolution committee. Rev. Grady Hudson gave the report of the Auditing committee.

At this point eight churches pledged \$20 each to buy a cow for the Children's Home. \$24 in cash was given for the same purpose.

FRIDAP EVENING

After a most wonderful song service Rev. R. K. Franklin, a representative of the National Mission Board for Alabama made an appeal for the support of the Mission Program. Rev. K. V. Shutes then took the stand to bring the message on this Mission Night Service. His text was Jno. 4:34-35. He poured out his heart in a plea for laborers to go into the field. The altar was filled to overflowing with those offering their service wherever God would send. The offering was \$130.40. Rev. Henry Melvin gave the benediction.

SATURDAY A. M.

Bro. Grady Hudson led the song service. Bro. Chester O'Donnel the prayer and Bro. Staab led the devotion.

The final report of the Business committee was given and accepted.

A motion carried to empower the Moderator to appoint a publicity man to handle any matter that needs to be publicized for the Free Will Baptist cause in Alabama. Bro. Edward Ledlow, 505 Booker St., Talladega, Ala., was appointed.

Bro. K. V. Shutes gave the Orphanage Trustee report.

Rev. J. T. Quick resigned from the board of trustees and Rev.

A. L. Warren was electde in his place.

Rev. K. V. Shutes resigned and Rev. Grady Hudson was elected to fill his place.

Motion carried to appoint Bro. Ford L. Louis as field worker for the Children's Home in the Southern Union Association.

Supt. Ryland gave the Finance report. The Home Mission report was received.

W. H. Ryland was appointed as corresponding delegate to the Georgia State Association.

The Secretary was instructed to have one thousand minutes printed.

Rev. H. A. Pitts was appointed State delegate to the National Association.

The following names were appointed to a finance committee to raise funds to pay the expenses of our delegate to the National Association: Revs. J. T. Quick, Charles Mayers, A. J. Lambert, A. L. Warren, N. A. Patterson, E. P. Rowden, I. K. Boyette and P. J. Box.

Mrs. J. D O'Donnell of Steele, Ala., was appointed treasurer of

the Unified Program, succeeding Sister K. V. Shutes.

A Bible conference committee composed of Revs. J. T. Quick, R. K. Franklin, and Chester O'Donnell was appointed to make arrangements for the conference in 1950.

All business having been attended to a motion carried to adjourn to meet with the East Florence Church, Florence, Ala., on Thursday

before the 2nd Sunday in November, 1950. At this time Rev. Luther Gibson of East Tupelo, Miss., brought

the closing message of the Association. He chose for his subject, "God's Marching Orders to His Church." Using for his text, Mt. 28:16-20. This message was very timely and delivered in a most forceful manner to an appreciative congregation.

CONSTITUTION OF THE MINISTERS' MEETING OF ALABAMA PREAMBLE

In order to promote fellowship ,better understanding, greater cooperation and greater vision among the ministers of Alabama, we do ordain and establish this Constitution:

I. NAME: This shall be known as the Alabama ministers' meeting.

II. We adopt the Treatise of Faith and practice of the National

Association of Free Will Baptist as our standard to look to and pray for the day when we may be more nearly one.

III. The officers of the ministers' meeting shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator and Secretary, and any other officer we may need.

IV. These officers shall be elected by nomination and acclamation at the regular session on even years. The officers of the State Association may serve as officers of the ministers' meeting if so elected.

V. This meeting shall be composed of all ordained ministers in good standing in Alabama and adjoining states who wish to represent.

VI. FINANCE: Each minister shall pay one dollar registration fee to help pay for the record being printed in minutes.

VII. The Secretary shall be paid five dollars preserving the record of each meeting.

VIII. DISCIPLINE: The ministers' meeting is not a court to try, nor air out the faults of preachers. If they are in good standing with the State Association they are with the ministers' meeting. This is to be a meeting of fellowship and inspiration and brotherly love.

X. All elected officers shall serve two years. All appointed officers and committees one year.

XII. The ministers' meeting shall meet on Thursday morning before the 2nd Sunday in November of each year at the meeting place of the State Association.

XIII. This Constitution may be altered at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of ministers' present.

BY-LAWS OF ALABAMA MINISTERS' MEETING

1. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk or the Senior Minister in years may calle the meeting to order and shall have charge until Moderator assumes his place.

2. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to enroll all the ministers present who are in good standing. If there are questionable characters they shall be referred to an appointed Credential committee for advice, but not for trial. They may be seated if found worthy, if not they are referred to their church and Association.

3. Each meeting shall be opened with scripture reading and prayer.

4. By a two-thirds vote any decision of the Moderator may be over-ruled.

5. This meeting shall sit with open doors unless it goes into a committee as a whole.

6. Any person, not a member of the body shall be allowed to take part in discussions, with Moderator's permission, but shall

have no vote.

- 7. All members of the body are expected to be present throughout the session unless excused by Moderator.
- 8. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one officer or committeeman if his nomination is elected.
- 9. The Moderator must not allow any discussion to be carried on in an unchristain spirit.
- 10. The person who desires to speak must first arise and address the Moderator, and when recognized, shall proceed.
- 11. The votes on any question must be counted upon request of one-fifth of members present.
- 12. No member shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes, nor twice on same subject unless gvien pemrission by the Moderator.

property since many have turned in a low evaluation. 6. That our next session be held with the East Florence Church, Florence, Ala.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF CHILDREN'S HOME

We are happy to report 47 fine children in the home at this time and a staff of six workers.

We are also glad to report that the Lord has blessed beyond our expectations.

There was a Board of Trustees appointed at the State Association held at Pell City, also a Finance Board. The first meeting was in the church in north Birmingham on Dec. 12, 1942. Bro. P. J. Box told us that the Baptist Academy at Eldridge was for sale at a price of \$7,000 for buildings, land and furniture.

On March 5th, 1943 we met at the Academy and purchased the proprety. We were to pay \$1,000 down and \$1,000 each Jan. 1st until paid in full. We paid the \$7,000 and over \$9,000 for repair and opened the home in Sept. 1947 which was the year we were to make the final payment.

We have operated the home for 2 years and now have 47 fine children in our care. So the Lord has blessed far beyond our expectations.

There are 10 acres of land for sale in front of the home. We wish our people would make it possible for us to buy it. Also the boy's dormotory need repairing.

Rev. J. T. Quick has resigned from the Board from the Vernon

Association and recommends Rev. A. L. Warren to take his place. I am resigning as a member from the Progressive Association and I wish to recommend Rev. Grady Hudson for this place.

I have served as chairman of this board since 1943 and it has been a pleasure to work with these men. We have never had a fuss. On our feet, knees and our cars we have made it a success.

May the blessings of the Lord be upon the Home.

July 4th and Thanksgiving day has been set aside as Rally days at the home. Rev. E. P. Rowden of Florence to bring the 11 o'clock message and Rev. Luther Gibson to bring the evening message on this Thanksgiving.

We recommend Bro. Ford S. Louis of Andalusia, Ala., be appointed field worker in the Southern Union Association for 1949-50 Associational year.

K. V. SHUTES, Chairman.

- 1. We the Home Mission Board wish to recommend that Bro. Pitts go to Fayette with the home mission tent and that we advance him \$100 with the promise of a man to follow in organizing a church.
- 2. We also pledge \$100 for the new church at Mt. Pleasant, Tenn., with the promise also that the work will be carried on.
- 3. The State Home Mission tent has been used 7 times this year for revivals. This tent has been used since 1946 and this year we paid out the first expense for supplies.

BY-LAWS

The adoption of By-Laws of National Association.

1. The clerk or the assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the association into conference if a quorum is present. The Moderator, or in his absence, the Assistant Moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as moderator.

2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the association who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the association. In case of questionable representation, however, the case under question shall be referred to the credential committee.

3. It shall be the duty of everybody belonging to this association to send a letter to every annual session of this association, reporting in the same its spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Any body belonging to this session may be dismissed from the association by a two-thrds vote of all members present.

Bible and with prayer and shall be closed with prayer.

5. By a two-third vote of all members present a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.

6. This associatoin may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

7. This assocation shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

8. Any person not a member of this association may be allowed to take part in its discussion by obtaining permission from the moderator.

9. It shall be the duty of all members of the assoication to be

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present at the time appointed for each meeting and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave from the moderator.

10. No member shall absent himself from the association during its meetings without first obtaining permission from the moderator.

11. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee provided the person nominated be elected.

12. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

13. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise to his feet and address the moderator by the appellation "brother moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.

14. The "yeas" and "nays" may be counted on any question by

request of one-fifth of the members present.

15. No member of this assoication shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.

16. It shall be the duty of the moderator to seat delegates in a body in a designated section of the assembly room at the beginning

of each business session.

17. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

CONSTITUTION

NAME—This body shall be known as the "ALABAMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST."

SEAL—This Alabama State Assoication of Free Will Baptist adopt the treatise of the National Association in fatih and practice. Praying for the day when we shall be one in Christ.

SEC. II.—The officers of the State Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary and Treasurer, Assistant

Secretary and Executive Board.

These officers are elective. Other officers being appointed as

Moderator may need or desire.

SEC. III.—This association shall be composed of all active, ordained ministers and deacons who are members of an Association or church, which is a member of this body and duly elected or appointed delegates of district association or church.

One delegate for each church of each Association which is a

members of this body.

SEC. IV.—No independent church may be a members of this body unless Association to which it belongs refuse to represent in the State body. Then the church may report independently. The fee of said church be the sum of \$20.00.

ARTICLE II—FINANCE—Each district Association send the sum of \$15.00 annual fee and \$5.00 National Association fee with the annual report. And each minister and deacon pay the sum of \$1.00 registration fee to help carry on the expenses of the Association.

SEC. V.—The secretary shall be paid \$15.00 and the moderator \$10.00 annually for their services rendered. All other expenditures not specified shall be made at the directions of the body.

ARTICLE II—DISCIPLINE—The State Assoication shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practice that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing the State Association of Free Will Baptist churches or act upon any appeal that may be made by any body belonging to the State Association. Said appeal having been properly signed by the constituent body or bodies and its decisions shall be final.

SEC. VI.—All appeals coming before the State Assoication may be settled in either of the following ways: (1) By the State Assoication stiting in a committee as a whole. (2) By a special committee appointed by the Executive Board, whose report shall be voted on without discussion.

ARTICLE II.—The Moderator of the State Association of Free Will Baptist shall be regarded as an ex official member of all Boards or committees elected or appointed.

ARTICLE III.—Each elected officer shall serve for a period of two (2) years. Elections coming on the even years.

The appointed officers or committees serving at the direction of the Moderator or until dismissed by the Moderator.

ARTICLE IV.—MEETINGS—The State Association of Free Will Baptist shall hold its regular meetings annually. Place of meeting to be decided by a vote of the body. The time of meeting to be on Thursday night before the second Sunday in November of each year. And to remain in session until its work is completed.

ARTICLE V.—This Constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of members present; provided proposed amendment be presented in writing to the body and shall lie on the table at laest from morning session till evening session, or from evening session till morning session prior to adoption and shall during that time be read at least twice in open session.
