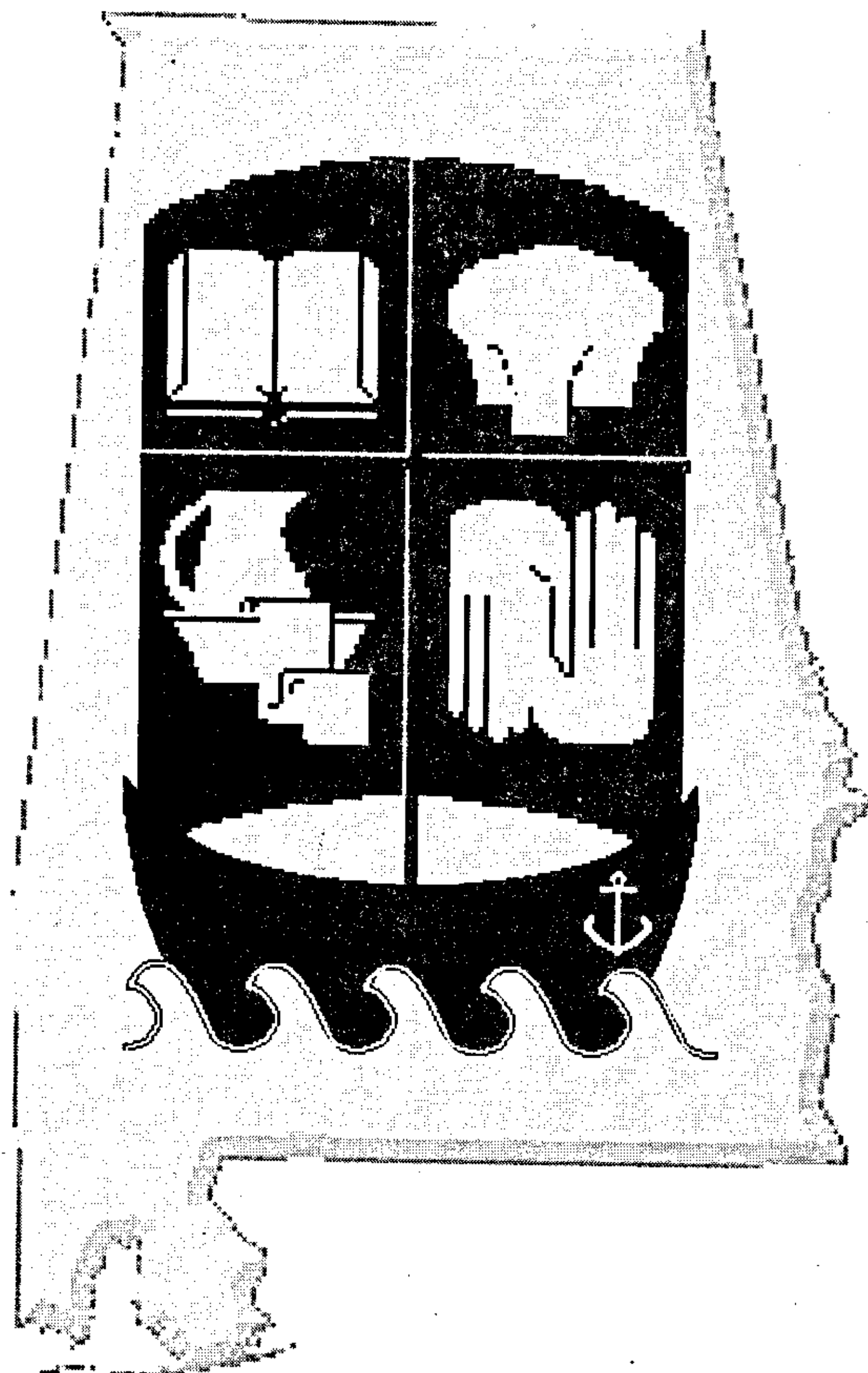

GENERAL BOARD MEETING WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, NOVEMBER 6, 2013

The General Board met on November 6, 2013 at New Oak Grove Free Will Baptist, Nauvoo, AL. The Moderator, Rev. Jerry Smith, opened the meeting, and read from Phil. 4:5-7. After some remarks on the Peace of God, Bro. Smith led in prayer.

The following items of business were dealt with:

1. Bro. Smith asked the Clerk, Bro. Rodney Yerby, to read the minutes of the 2012 General Board meeting and the October 8, 2013 Executive Committee meeting. It was noted that there is a conflict between the proposed date for the Pastors' & Workers' Conference and the State Youth Competition. There was a motion and second to approve the Executive Committee minutes. The motion carried. There was a motion and second to approve the General Board minutes. The motion carried.
2. Bro. Smith asked Bro. Yerby to call the roll. There were 10 individuals filling 12 General Board roles, out of 17 General Board positions. There were 13 people actually present, representing 8 of the 13 District Associations, 4 of the 4 standing boards, and 6 of the 9 Executive Committee positions. Some of the 13 individuals filled 2 or 3 different roles.
3. Bro. Smith asked Bro. Yerby to read the Executive Committee report to the General Board. There was a motion and second to receive the report and consider the budgets as the corresponding reports are given.
4. Bro. Smith asked Executive Director of State Ministries Rev. Rick Cash to give the Executive Director's report and present proposed budgets. There was a discussion about the difference between the dues charged by the State Association and the dues paid by the State Association to the National Association. There was a motion and second to adopt Executive Office budget. The motion carried. There was a motion and second to adopt the Executive Fund budget. The motion carried.
5. Bro. Smith asked Rev. Rick Taylor to give the Board of Christian Education report. There was an extended discussion on the date conflict between the Pastors' & Workers' Conference and the State Youth Competition, the cause of the conflict, how to prevent future similar conflicts, and what to do to resolve the current conflict. There was a motion and second to accept the report. The motion carried.
6. Bro. Smith asked Rev. Mickey Crane to give the Pastors' & Workers' Conference Board report. There was a motion and second to accept the report. The motion carried.
7. Bro. Smith asked Rev. Richard Hendrix to give the Missions Board report. Bro. Hendrix presented the proposed Mission Board budget. There was a motion and second to receive the report and adopt the Mission Board budget. The motion carried.
8. Bro. Smith asked Executive Director Mike Corley to give the Alabama Free Will Baptist Children's Home report and present the proposed budget. There was a motion and second to receive the report and adopt the budget. The motion carried.

9. Bro. Smith asked Sis. Carolyn Michael to give the Alabama Women Active for Christ report. There was a motion and second to receive the report. The motion carried.

10. Bro. Smith introduced the Nominating Committee report. There was a motion and second to adopt the report. The motion carried.

11. There was a motion and second to adopt the ACTS 1:8 budget in the amount of \$552,625. The motion carried.

12. Bro. Smith asked Bro. Cash to review the State Meeting locations for 2014 and beyond.

13. Bro. Cash addressed the investigation into the future of the General Board meeting. The investigatory committee recommended that the General Board meeting continues as is. There was a motion and second to receive the report.

14. Bro. Smith introduced a resolution from the Florida State Line Association requesting that the State Association investigate the feasibility of establishing a State Youth Camp. Bro. Trail spoke to the resolution. There was an extended discussion. There was a motion and second to table the resolution. The motion was withdrawn. There was a motion and second to table the resolution. The motion carried.

15. The meeting was adjourned.

PROCEEDINGS

THE NINETY-FOURTH SESSION of the ALABAMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS WEDNESDAY NIGHT, NOVEMBER 6, 2013

The Alabama State Association of Free Will Baptists convened at New Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church in Nauvoo, Alabama on Wednesday evening, November 6, 2013.

The service was opened with singing by the Page Trio.

The congregation sang "All the Way My Savior Leads Me" led by James Phelps.

The host pastor, Rev. Mickey Crane, welcomed the Association, and called on Rev. Scott Montgomery to pray.



It may be necessary for the Committee to adjust the approved percentages due to shortages or surplus in missionary accounts.

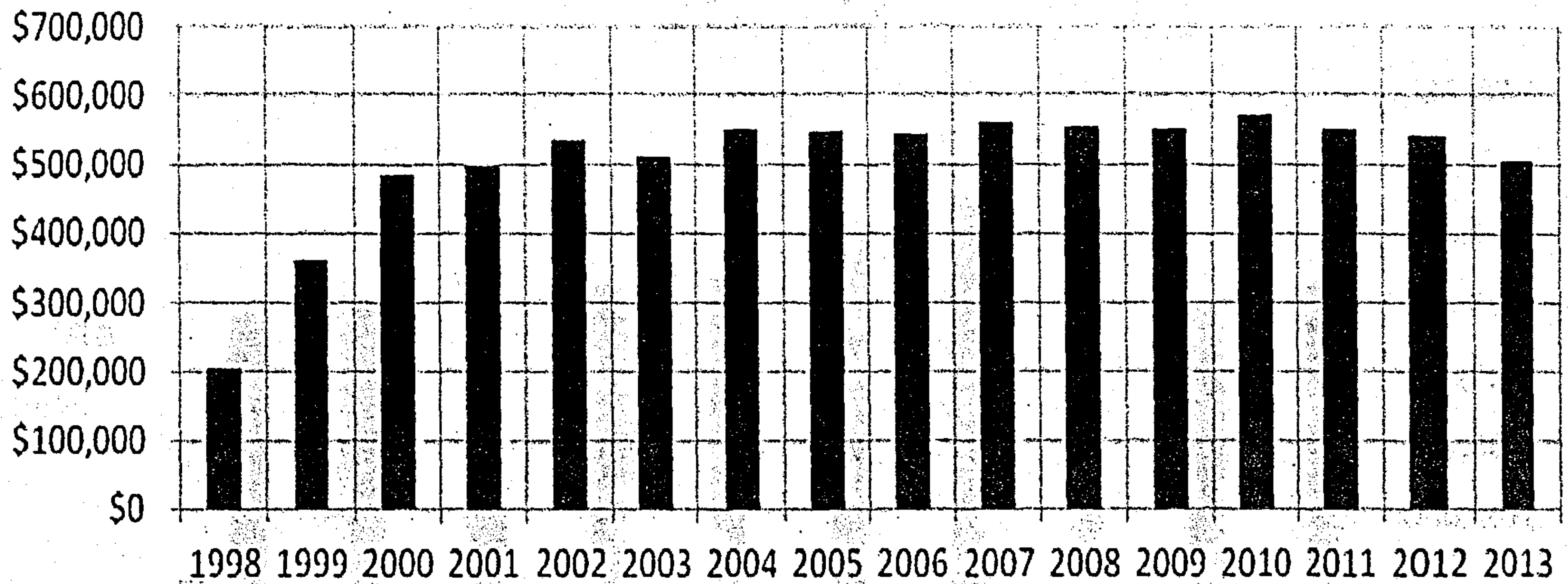

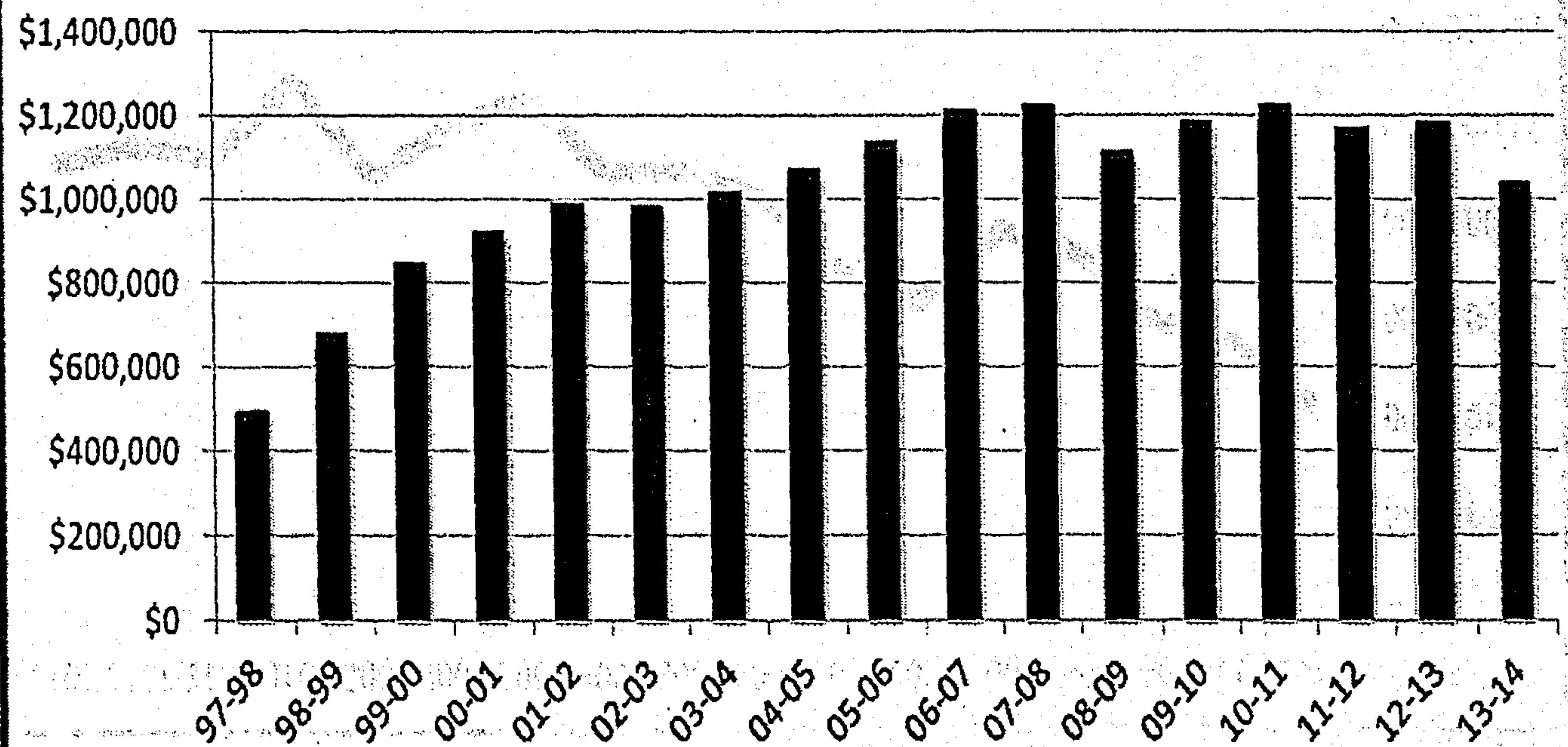

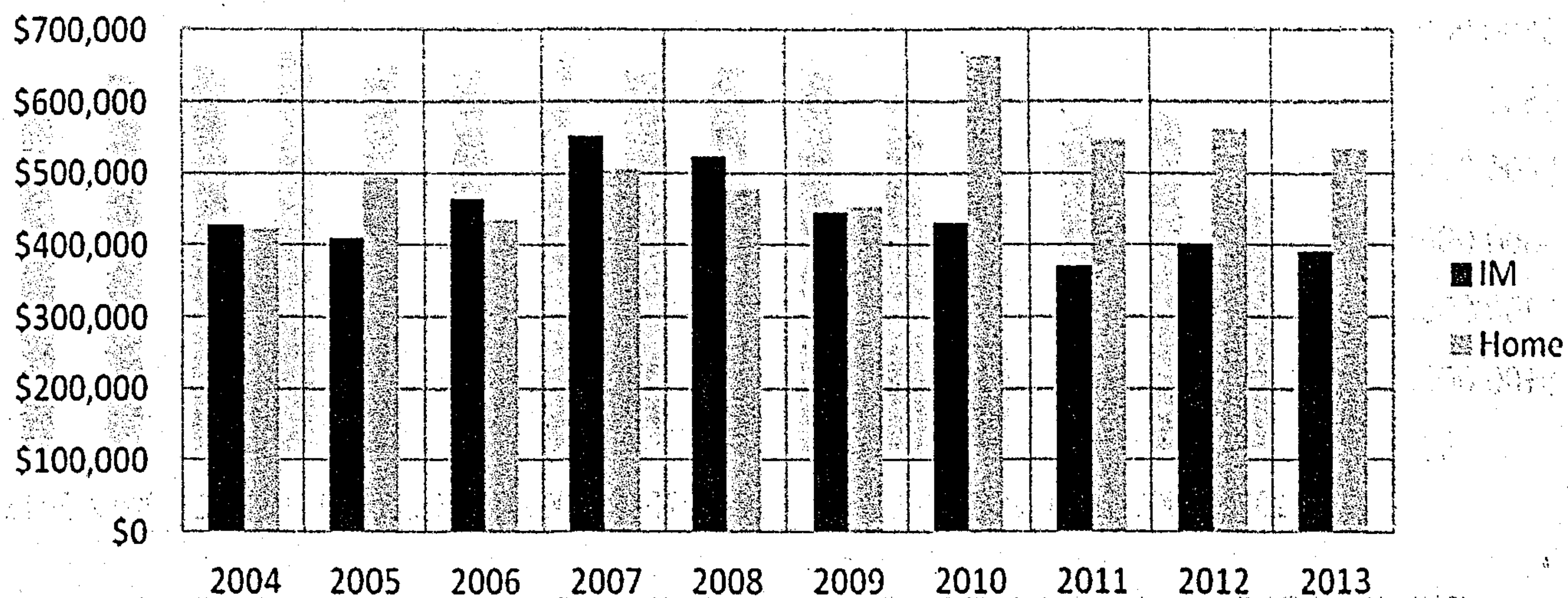

ALL ACCOUNTS CASH FLOW

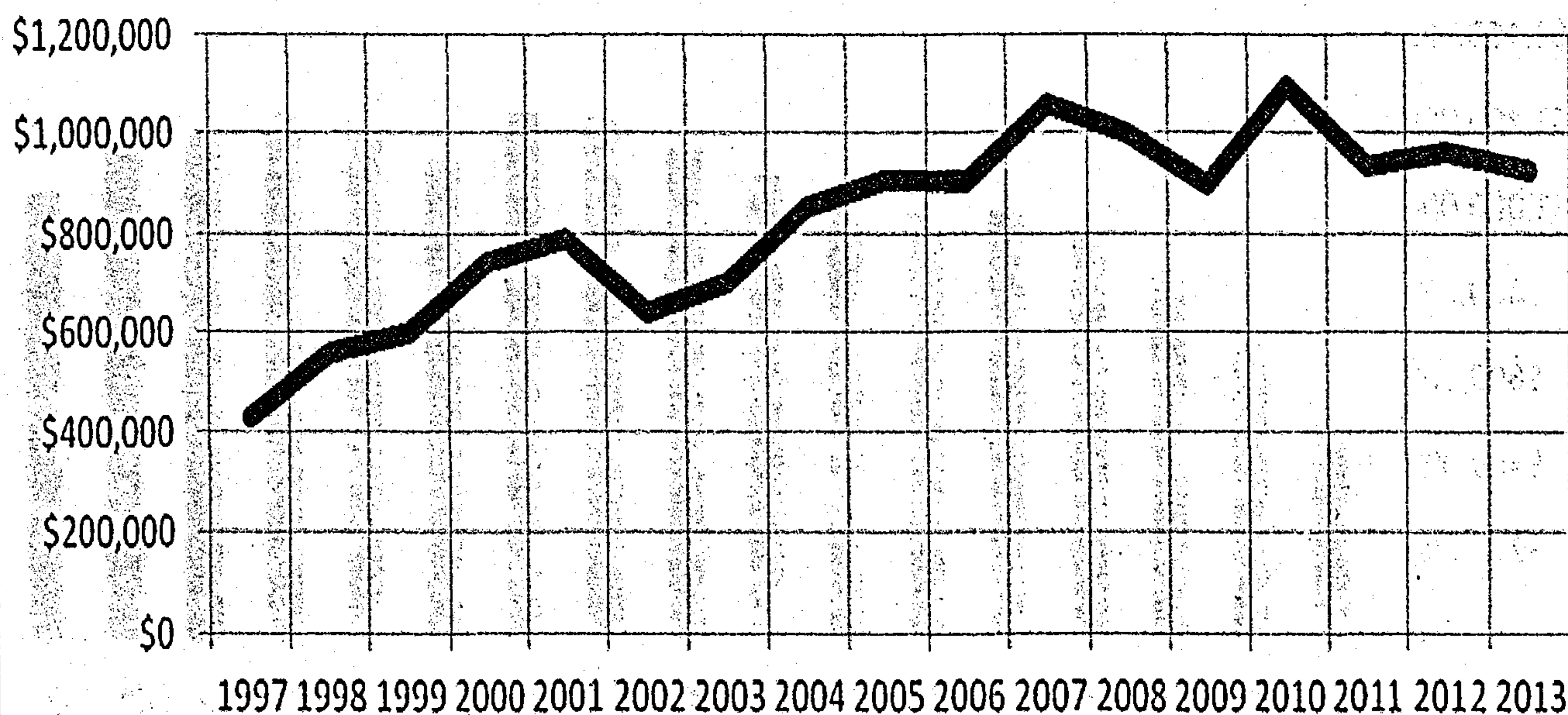
