- 1. We recommend that the Executive Board shall be composed of five members with a term of one member expiring each year. The vacancy to be filled by the convention. The board to be composed as to afford a fair representation over the state.
- 2. We recommend that a committee be composed of three ministers, one district league president and one district Sunday school superintendent.
- We recommend that the secretary-treasurer purchase the gifts for Sword Drill not to exceed seven dollars.
- 4. We recommend that the offices of pianist, chorister and Bible Sword driller be inaugurated at this session, and that they be elected to these officers by the convention.
- 5. We recommend that the expenses of this convention and the youth rally be paid out of the treasury of this convention.
- 6. The First Church of Sylacauga, Alabama, and Brilliant Boston are asking for our youth rally to convene with their church, December 17, 1955. Delegates to vote where we shall go.

BY-LAWS FOR THE ALABAMA STATE LEAGUE AND SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION

- I. Each session shall be opened by a song, Scripture reading and prayer.
- II. Each Sunday school or league shall send one delegate and a \$2.00 fee, if not represented by a local convention; whereas each local convention representing shall pay a minimum fee of \$5.00, up to 4 leagues in the organization, and where the member exceeds 4, they shall pay \$1.50 for each league or Sunday school in the organization. A local convention may send one delegate for each league or Sunday school.
 - III. Ordained ministers and their wives shall be standing delegates.
- IV. Each league president and Sunday school superintendent, with the secretaries, shall be standing delegates.
- V. Visiting brothers and corresponding messengers shall be recognized by the presiding officer and invited to sit in the council, but not allowed a vote on any question.
- VI. In any regular convention there must be at least a quorum in the delegated body to legally transact any business.

VII. Any person wishing to speak shall arise and address the presiding officer. After being recognized, he or she shall be permitted to speak. When two shall rise at the same time, the president shall determine who speaks first.

VIII. All questions, properly recommended by their proper committee or board, after a motion and second, shall be clearly stated and discussed, then voted on.

IX. The various committees or boards shall be appointed by the president unless otherwise directed by the body.

X. The regular officers of the convention shall be elected by the body before the closing of each annual session.

XI. The program for each annual session may be arranged by the president, vice-president and secretary, assisted by the Executive Committee.
