REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss a supply pastor for the Plymouth Church. We decided to go along with the pastorial committee of the Plymouth Church to confer this work upon Rev. Winiford Brickhouse. We also agreed to help the church secure a pastor to succeed Rev. Bobby Aycock who had resigned to go to the mission field.

ORDINATION BOARD REPORT

The board met at the Plymouth Church on May 25, 1960, for the purpose of examining M. E. Cox for license to preach the gospel in the Free Will Baptist church. After a lengthy discussion and questioning Mr. Cox, the board recommended him to be licensed to preach by Shiloh Church of which he is a member. The meeting was adjourned. Rev. L. E. Ambrose was not present for this meeting but concurred upon discussion of the meeting.

The board met at the Plymouth Church on October 3, 1960, for the purpose of examining Winiford Brickhouse for ordination and to handle all matters to come before the board. Mr. Brickhouse was given a written examination; results of the examination to be determined at a later date. A lengthy discussion was held concerning the work and responsibilities of the board.

Rev. Daniel Gaskins and license minister M. E. Cox came before the board and there was a lengthy discussion relative to the work and relationship of M. E. Cox in the Free Will Baptist church, since he came to us with recommendations from the Baptist church. It was noted that Mr. Cox had been called and had begun his work as supply pastor of the Mizpah Church at Washington, North Carolina. Rev. Daniel Gaskins had been called as pastor to direct the work of Mr. Cox with the Mizpah Church. Meeting was adjourned.

The Albemarle Conference accepted the invitation of Hickory Chapel Church to convene the 1961 session with them. The date, Thursday, October 5, 1961. The host pastor is Rev. Johnny Eason.

By motion the conference adjourned with prayer.

Constitution of the Albemarle Conference

ARTICLE I

SECTION 1-NAME

This organization shall be known as the Albemarle Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

Section 2—Purpose

The general purpose of this conference shall be to promote the great cause of Christ among men by means in conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

ARTICLE II

Section 1—Composition

This conference shall be composed of the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, all general officers of the conference, the members of standing boards or committees, the president or moderator of each subordinate general organization and the churches that hold their membership with the conference, together with those that may subsequently be admitted.

Section 2—Representation

Every church affiliated with the Albemarle Conference shall represent in its annual session with two delegates, and each subordinate general organization shall represent with one delegate. A report from each church and subordinate organization shall be rendered at the annual session of the conference.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The officers of this conference shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of two years. The term of office for all officers shall begin at the close of the annual session at which they are elected.

Temporary officers, representatives or messengers may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purpose deemed essential.

ARTICLE IV

STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the method of this conference to simplify its work by the

assignment of specific work to representative units of authority which shall hereafter be known as standing boards and committees.

A board of trustees, a board of education and a board of ordination consisting of three (3) members shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be three years but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the office of one member annually.

A board of missions, consisting of five members shall be elected. The term of office for members of this board shall be five years, but shall be adjusted to terminate the office of one member annually.

Section 1

Standing boards shall have authority to write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to the authority and approval of the conference.

Section 2

The executive committee shall be composed of the general officers of the conference and the moderator or president of each subordinate general organization.

Section 3

Temporary committees shall be appointed at the option of the conference for whatever deemed necessary.

ARTICLE V

FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference program according to its membership.

Conference funds shall be used for the work and general expense of the conference. The use of all funds to be approved by the conference.

ARTICLE VI

Admission of Churches

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Free Will Baptists and desires to help promote the program and work of the Albemarle Conference may submit its petition for membership through an official delegation at any annual session of the conference. If the petition for membership be approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates and declare them duly seated.

ARTICLE VII

Fraternal Delegations and Visitors

Fraternal delegations and visitors shall be extended all the privileges of the conference except that of voting, serving on committees or holding elective offices.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

The Albemarle Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday before the second Sunday in October of each year. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.

Bylaws

Section 1

The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Albemarle Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and subordinate general organizations; to sign official documents that require the signature of the moderator.

Section 2

The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present and assist the moderator when called upon.

Section 3

The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Albemarle Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents, not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature.

Section 4

The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the duties of the recording secretary when that officer is not present and to assist the secretary when called upon.

Section 5

The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive committee or any standing board invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report accordingly to the conference.

Section 6

The executive committee shall have power to act in the behalf of and for the Albemarle Conference from one regular session to another. It shall organize at will and discharge the administrative duties assigned to it. It shall plan the programs of the conference. The executive committee shall meet not less than two times between the annual sessions of the conference.

Section 7

The board of trustces shall hold title to all property belonging to this conference. It shall have power to convey such property when authorized by the conference.

Section 8

The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: obituary, temperance, resolutions, nominating and finance.

Section 9

All reports, resolutions and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

Section 10

No minister, officer or delegate shall be at liberty to retire from the building during a session of the conference without the consent of the moderator.

Section 11

If any member, in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his rights during the remaining part of that session of the conference.

Section 12

This constitution and bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present in a regular session. All amendments shall be on the table not less than three hours prior to adoption and shall, during that time, be read at least one time.

Rev. Dan Gaskins brought news of the Free Will Baptist Bible College. He stressed the importance of the need for expansion. He stated that there were 247 students at the present time and that every room was filled and no more girls could be admitted next term.

Rev. J. W. Everton brought greetings from our Children's Home. He stated there were 72 children in the home at the present time. He requested our prayers, and asked that the local auxiliaries consider raising their clothing allowance as some auxiliaries had already done.

As the congregation sang "Bringing in the Sheaves," an offering was taken for our Children's Home. Rev. T. F. Davenport returned thanks for the offering.

Rev. R. H. Jackson brought greetings from our missionaries. He stated that the mission board was in the process of purchasing a metal building for \$2,500 to be used in the state program.

At this time, Rev. Raymond Riggs, a former general director of our foreign mission board, was recognized. Before his message he sang "Win the Lost at Any Cost," which was very impressive. He then brought a soul-stirring message on missions. He took his Scripture from Acts 13:44; Mark 16:15 and Matthew 28:19, 20. He urged us not to let the suggested goal for the medical project stop us, that after we become Christians, we should not be permitted to live unless we work to win souls, that if we fail to tell them of Christ, their blood would be dripping from our hands.

At this time Rev. Walter Reynolds spoke in behalf of superannuation. He brought greetings from the board of superannuation, and stated that we now have 21 ministers and 28 widows receiving checks. He urged us to try to do more for superannuation than we had in the past.

Mrs. Bruce Barrow represented the Free Will Baptist Press and spoke briefly concerning materials for daily vacation Bible schools and announced the Bible school clinic which would be held at Mount Olive College April 22.
