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PROCEEDINGS

The twenty first annual session of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with Shiloh church, Route 1, Pinetown, North Carolina, on October 7, 1965.

THURSDAY MORNING, 9:30 A. M.

Devotions were conducted by the Rev. Earl Minshew. He read for a Scripture text Deuteronomy 29:29 and John 21:22.

The welcome address was given by Mr. Hassell Ray Osborne, a member of the host church. The response was given by the Rev. L. E. Ambrose.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the printed program as the order of business.

The roll of ministers was called and the following were present: Revs. L. E. Ambrose, A. B. Chandler, Willie Twiddy, and Robert May.

Visiting ministers were recognized and the following were present: Revs. D. W. Hansley, Earl Minshew, W. L. Moretz, James Howard, H. M. Minshew, A. B. Bryan, C. H. Overman, Walter Reynolds, and W. Burkette Raper.

The Rev. Walter Reynolds represented the North Carolina State Convention and the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists.

The Rev. W. L. Moretz represented the Eastern Conference of Original Free Will Baptists.

The moderator's address was given by the Rev. A. B. Chandler.

The following temporary committees were appointed:

Resolutions: Mrs. Minnie Chandler, Mrs. Amanda Willoughby, and the Rev. Willie Twiddy.

Temperance: The Rev. L. E. Ambrose, Mrs. Katie Roper, and Mrs. Renda Daniels.

Nominating: The Rev. Robert May, Mr. John Foreman, and Mrs. Laura Webster.

The Rev. Bobby Bazen, pastor of the Virginia Beach Mission, gave a report of the work there. He stated that property had been secured on which to build a church. An architect's drawing of the church building was shown.

The report of the executive committee was read by the secretary.

There was a discussion about the financial assistance that had been given the Virginia Beach Mission.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the report of the executive committee. (See report.)

Reports of the standing boards and committees were called for.

The mission board reported that a total of \$360 had been paid to the Virginia Beach Mission.

The other boards and committees stated that they had no formal reports.

The roll call of churches was called with fifteen (15) churches represented. There were two (2) churches not represented. The churches present were: Corinth, Mt. Tabor, Mt. Zion, First church of Plymouth, Sound Side, Gum Neck, Malachi's Chapel, Free Union, Trinity, Belhaven, Sidney, Shiloh, Hickory Chapel, St. Paul, and the Virginia Beach Mission.

An offering was taken for the general fund of the conference.

A report of Mount Olive Junior College was given by the president, Dr. W. Burkette Raper. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information. (See report.)

A report of the board of superannuation was given by the chairman-treasurer, the Rev. Walter Reynolds. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information. (See report.)

A report of the program of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists was given by the president, the Rev. Walter Reynolds.

Mr. Reynolds, who is also chairman of the board of Cragmont Assembly, Inc., gave a report of the work there.

A motion was made and carried to adopt these reports as information.

The Rev. C. H. Overman, editor of the Free Will Baptist Press, gave a report of the work of the press. A motion was made and carried to adopt this report as information.

The Rev. A. B. Bryan, director-treasurer of the North Carolina State Mission Board, gave a report on missions. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

Special music was rendered by four ladies of the host church, singing "Kneel at the Cross."

The conference sermon was preached by the Rev. D. W. Hansley. His Scriptures was taken from Habakkuk 3:2, on the subject, "Too Late for Hope."

The benediction was offered by Dr. W. Burkette Raper.

AFTERNOON SESSION, 1:15 P. M.

The devotions were conducted by the Rev. Robert May, using as his Scriptures text Romans 12:9-16. He closed the devotions with prayer.

A memorial service was conducted by the Rev. Willie Twiddy. The song, "Sweet Bye and Bye," was sung and the Scripture, John 11:12-27, was read. A moment of silent prayer was observed, closing with prayer by Mr. Twiddy.

A report of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home was given by the Rev. A. B. Bryan. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report as information. (See report.)

Delegates were elected to the North Carolina State Convention as follows: Miss Alice Webster and Mrs. Florence Liverman.

Reports of the temporary committees were given.

The nominating committee's report was given by the Rev. Robert May. A motion was made and carried to adopt this report. (See report.)

The temperance committee's report was given by Mrs. Katie Roper. A motion was made and carried to adopt this report. (See report.)

The resolutions committee's report was given by Mrs. Minnie Chandler. A motion was made and carried to adopt all four (4) of the resolutions that were offered. (See report.)

A motion was made and carried to give to the Virginia Beach Mission the sum of \$15 per week for a period of six (6) months. The time to be retroactive to September 1, 1965. This money is to come from the conference mission fund.

The Rev. Bobby Bazen was enrolled as a minister of the conference pending his letter from the conference of his present membership.

A motion was made and carried to adjourn.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the minutes as read.

The hymn, "God Be With You Till We Meet Again," was sung as the closing hymn.

The conference adjourned with prayer.

REPORTS

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Members of the executive committee in various numbers met several times with lawyers, John Wilkerson and John Rodman, in the matter concerning Malachi's Chapel church.

Several of the committee were present in the court house in Washington, North Carolina, in the regular term of the Superior Court. The conference and the Original Free Will Baptists of Malachi's Chapel church sought a temporary injunction to divide the use of the church building. The court granted the request.

The executive committee, together with the mission board of the conference, have acted two times in behalf of the Virginia Beach Mission. This business was transacted by letter, and the matter for consideration was the financial aid to the mission. The decision was to give the mission \$15 a week for a period of 90 days. This action was taken in March, 1965.

At another meeting on May 29, 1965, the committee decided to continue the payments to the Virginia Beach Mission for another 90 days. This made a total of \$360 given to the mission to-date from the conference mission fund.

Constitution of Albemarle Conference

ARTICLE I

SECTION 1—NAME

This organization shall be known as the Albemarle Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

SECTION 2—PURPOSE

The general purpose of this conference shall be to promote the great cause of Christ among men by means in conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

ARTICLE II

SECTION 1—COMPOSITION

This conference shall be composed of the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, all general officers of the conference, the members of standing boards or committees, the president or moderator of each subordinate general organization and the churches that hold their membership with the conference, together with those that may subsequently be admitted.

SECTION 2—REPRESENTATION

Every church affiliated with the Albemarle Conference shall represent in its annual session with two delegates, and each subordinate general organization shall represent with one delegate. A report from each and subordinate organization shall be rendered at the annual session of the conference.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The officers of this conference shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of two years. The term of office for all officers shall begin at the close of the annual session at which they are elected.

Temporary officers, representatives or messengers may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purpose deemed essential.

ARTICLE IV

STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the method of this conference to simplify its work by the assignment of specific work to representative units of authority which shall hereafter be known as standing boards and committees.

A board of trustees, a board of education and a board of ordination consisting of three (3) members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be three years but shall be as adjusted as to terminate the office of one member annually.

A board of missions, consisting of five members shall be elected. The term of office for member of this board shall be five years, but shall be adjusted to terminate the office of one member annually.

SECTION 1

Standing boards shall have authority to write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to the authority and approval of the conference.

SECTION 2

The executive committee shall be composed of the general officers of the conference and the moderator or president of each subordinate general organization.

SECTION 3

Temporary committees shall be appointed at the option of the conference for whatever deemed necessary.

ARTICLE V

FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference program according to its membership.

Conference funds shall be used for the work and general expense of the conference. The use of all funds to be approved by the conference.

ARTICLE VI

ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Free Will Baptists and desires to help promote the program and work of the Albemarle Conference may submit its petition for membership through an official delegation at any annual session of the conference. If the petition for membership be approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates and declare them duly seated.

ARTICLE VII

FRATERNAL DELEGATIONS AND VISITORS

Fraternal delegations and visitors shall be extended all the privileges

of the conference except that of voting, serving on committees or holding elective offices.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

The Albemarle Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday before the second Sunday in October of each year. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.

BYLAWS

SECTION 1

The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Albemarle Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and subordinate general organizations, to sign official documents that require the signature of the moderator.

SECTION 2

The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present and assist the moderator when called upon.

SECTION 3

The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Albemarle Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents, not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature.

SECTION 4

The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the duties of the recording secretary when that officer is not present and to assist the secretary when called upon.

SECTION 5

The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive committee or any standing board invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report accordingly to the conference.

SECTION 6

The executive committee shall have power to act in the behalf of and for the Albemarle Conference from one regular session to another. It shall organize at will and discharge the administrative duties assigned to it. It shall plan the programs of the conference. The executive committee shall meet as often as necessary for the good of the conference.

SECTION 7

The board of trustees shall hold title to all property belonging to this conference. It shall have power to convey such property when authorized by the conference.

SECTION 8

The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: obituary, temperance, resolutions, nominating and finance.

SECTION 9

All reports, resolutions and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

SECTION 10

No minister, officer or delegate shall be at liberty to retire from the building during a session of the conference without the consent of the moderator.

SECTION 11

If any member, in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his rights during the remaining part of that session of the conference.

SECTION 12

This constitution and bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-third favorable vote of the members present in a regular session. All amendments shall be on the table not less than three hours prior to adoption and shall, during that time, be read at least one time.

A REMINDER: Every 20 sessions of the conference minutes shall be bound together into a book for the permanent records of the conference.
