## PROCEEDINGS

The twenty-second annual session of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with Corinth church, R. F. D., Jamesville, North Carolina, on October 6, 1966.

### THURSDAY MORNING, 9:30 A. M.

Devotions were conducted by Mr. Isaac Furlough. He led the congregation in the opening hymn, "Send the Light." He read for a Scripture text First Corinthians 13. Prayer by Rev. Robert May.

The welcome address was given by Rev. William Gaylord. Response by Miss Alice Webster.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the printed program as the order of business.

The report of the Board of Ordination was given by Rev. Robert May.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the report (see report).

In accord with the above action, the Rev. Wade McCracken was enrolled with the list of ministers.

The roll of churches was called with fourteen (14) present. There were three (3) churches that did not represent at the conference session, but the clerk did receive their reports later. The churches present were: Corinth, Mt. Tabor, Mt. Zion, First Church of Plymouth, Sound Side, Gum Neck, Malachi's Chapel, Free Union, Trinity, Belhaven, Sidney, Shiloh, Hickory Chapel, and St. Paul. The Albemarle Union Meeting reported to the conference at this time.

By motion, duly made and carried, the Oak Grove Mission of Chesapeake, Virginia, was enrolled with the list of churches.

The roll of ministers was called and the following were present: Revs. A. B. Chandler, Willie Twiddy, Robert May, W. H. Brickhouse, James N. Webster, Wade McCracken, and William R. Gaylord.

Visiting ministers were recognized and the following were present: Revs. Earl Minshew, Walter Reynolds, C. H. Overman, J. W. Everton, H. M. Minshew, A. B. Bryan, M. L. Johnson, and W. Burkette Raper.

Motion was made and carried to grant Rev. Willie Twiddy a letter of transfer to the Eastern Conference to become effective at the close of the 1966 session.

Motion made and carried to adopt report of the Executive Committee (see report).

The Rev. Walter Reynolds, chairman-treasurer, gave a report of the North Carolina Board of Superannuation.

Motion was made and carried to adopt report (see report).

The Rev. A. B. Bryan, director-treasurer, gave a report of the North Carolina Board of Missions.

Motion made and carried to adopt report (see report).

The Rev. M. L. Johnson, superintendent, gave a report of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home.

Motion made and carried to adopt report (see report).

An offering was taken at this time for the general fund of the conference.

Mr. Isaac Furlough, conference treasurer, gave his report.

Motion made and carried to adopt report (see report).

Special music was rendered by the host church.

The conference sermon was preached by the Rev. C. H. Overman. His Scripture was taken from Isaiah, Chapter 1, Verses 2, 5, 11, and 14. His subject, "A Weary God."

The benediction was offered by Rev. Willie Twiddy.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION, 1:00 P. M.

The devotions were conducted by the Rev. Earl Minshew, using as his Scripture text, John 10:14-18 and Romans 12:1-6. He closed the devotions with prayer.

A memorial service was conducted by the Rev. Robert May. In this service the conference paid tribute to the Rev. T. F. Davenport who had gone to be with the Lord a few days before the conference setting. Brother Davenport was the oldest minister of the conference.

A report of the work of Oak Grove Mission was given by Rev. Wade McCracken.



Mr. Isaac Furlough, conference treasurer, reported that the Virginia Beach Mission had received from the Conference Mission Fund during the years 1965 and 1966, the total sum of \$722.

The release of this money had been approved by the Executive Committee and the Board of Missions of the conference.

A motion was made and carried approving the action of this committee and board.

Mrs. Minnie Mae Chandler and Miss Alice Webster were elected as delegates to the 1967 session of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists.

The Albemarle Conference, with a group known as the Hilton F. Simmons Faction, has been envolved against a group known as the Wallace Woody Faction in a litigation over the possession of and the use of the Malachi's Chapel Original Free Will Baptist Church property, its records, physical plants, fixtures, and accommodations.

This is to report that a final argument and settlement has been made in the matter.

To wit:

The Hilton F. Simmons Faction shall have the possession of and the use of same; the church building and grounds, including the church cemetery; the furniture, fixtures and other accommodations in the church

and on the grounds. Also, all rolls and records having to do with the history of Malachi's Chapel Original Free Will Baptist Church. They too, shall have the privilege of copying from the Woody Faction records any information they may desire (at the convenience of the custodian of records).

The Wallace Woody Faction shall have the possession of and the use of same—the church parsonage and lot, its furnishings and accommodations. Too, they shall have the privilege of copying from the original church records any information they may desire (at the convenience of the custodian of records). It is further stated, that they may bury in the church cemetery, their dead who are related to those already buried in said cemetery.

# Constitution of Albemarle Conference

## ARTICLE I

### SECTION 1—NAME

This organization shall be known as the Albemarle Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

### SECTION 2—PURPOSE

The general purpose of this conference shall be to promote the great cause of Christ among men by means in conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

## ARTICLE II

### SECTION 1—COMPOSITION

This conference shall be composed of the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, all general officers of the conference, the members of standing boards or committees, the president or moderator of each subordinate general organization and the churches that hold their membership with the conference, together with those that may subsequently be admitted.

### SECTION 2—REPRESENTATION

Every church affiliated with the Albemarle Conference shall represent in its annual session with two delegates, and each subordinate general organization shall represent with one delegate. A report from each church and subordinate organization shall be rendered at the annual session of the conference.

## ARTICLE III

### OFFICERS

The officers of this conference shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of two years. The term of office for all officers shall begin at the close of the annual session at which they are elected.

Temporary officers, representatives or messengers may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purpose deemed essential.

## ARTICLE IV

### STANDINGS BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the method of this conference to simplify its work by the assignment of specific work to representative units of authority which shall hereafter be known as standing boards and committees.

A board of trustees, a board of education and a board of ordination consisting of three (3) members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be three years but shall be adjusted as to terminate the office of one member annually.

A board of missions, consisting of five members shall be elected. The term of office for members of this board shall be five years, but shall be adjusted to terminate the office of one member annually.

## SECTION 1

Standing boards shall have authority to write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to the authority and approval of the conference.

## SECTION 2

The executive committee shall be composed of the general officers of the conference and the moderator or president of each subordinate general organization.

## SECTION 3

Temporary committees shall be appointed at the option of the conference for whatever deemed necessary.

## ARTICLE V

### FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference program according to its membership.

Conference funds shall be used for the work and general expense of the conference. The use of all funds to be approved by the conference.

## ARTICLE VI

### ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Free Will Baptists and desires to help promote the program and work of the Albemarle Conference may submit its petition for membership through an official delegation at any annual session of the conference. If the petition for membership be approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates and declare them duly seated.

## ARTICLE VII

### FRATERNAL DELEGATIONS AND VISITORS

Fraternal delegations and visitors shall be extended all the privileges of the conference except that of voting, serving on committees or holding elective offices.

## ARTICLE VIII

### MEETINGS

The Albemarle Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday before the second Sunday in October of each year. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.



## BYLAWS

### SECTION 1

The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Albemarle Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and subordinate general organizations, to sign official documents that require the signature of the moderator.

### SECTION 2

The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present and assist the moderator when called upon.

### SECTION 3

The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Albemarle Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents, not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature.

### SECTION 4

The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the duties of the recording secretary when that officer is not present and to assist the secretary when called upon.

### SECTION 5

The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive committee or any standing board invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report accordingly to the conference.

### SECTION 6

The executive committee shall have power to act in the behalf of and for the Albemarle Conference from one regular session to another. It shall organize at will and discharge the administrative duties assigned to it. It shall plan the programs of the conference. The executive committee shall meet as often as necessary for the good of the conference.

### SECTION 7

The board of trustees shall hold title to all property belonging to this conference. It shall have power to convey such property when authorized by the conference.

### SECTION 8

The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by

the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: obituary, temperance, resolutions, nominating and finance.

#### SECTION 9

All reports, resolutions and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

#### SECTION 10

No minister, officer or delegate shall be at liberty to retire from the building during a session of the conference without the consent of the moderator.

#### SECTION 11

If any member, in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his rights during the remaining part of that session of the conference.

#### SECTION 12

This constitution and bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-third favorite vote of the members present in a regular session. All amendments shall be on the table not less than three hours prior to adoption and shall, during that time, be read at least one time.

A REMINDER: Every 20 sessions of the conference minutes shall be bound together into a book for the permanent records of the conference.
