PROCEEDINGS

The twenty-fourth annual session of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, convened with Trinity Church, Route 1, Pantego, North Carolina, on October 10, 1968.

THURSDAY MORNING, 9:30 P. M.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. W. L. Brickhouse; followed with a song by the congregation, "Standing on the Promises." Brother Brickhouse used for his Scripture, Psalm 26:3-5 and 1 John 12:12. Prayer was offered by Rev. Cecil Rose.

The welcome was given by Rev. E. E. Edwards, pastor of the host church.

The response to the welcome was given by Rev. John Owens.

The minutes of the last conference were read by the secretary for information.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the printed program as the order of business.

The list of churches was called with fourteen churches reporting.

The list of ministers was called with five ministers present.

A letter was read from Rev. James N. Webster asking that he be excused for not attending this session of the conference. A motion was made and carried to grant Brother Webster's request.

A motion was made and carried to enroll Rev. Fred Rivenbark with the list of ministers.

This motion was in response to a request for membership and a letter of commendation from his previous conference.

Visiting ministers present were as follows: *Central Conference*—Revs. Willis Wilson and Joe Barrow; *Eastern Conference*—Revs. E. E. Edwards and David Charles Hansley; *Western Conference*—Rev. Joseph Ingram; *Cape Fear Conference*—Rev. Walter Reynolds.

A motion was made and carried to enroll Rev. John Owens with the list of ministers.

This motion was in response to a request for membership and a letter from his previous conference.

The moderator's remarks were made by the moderator, Rev. A. B. Chandler.

The moderator appointed the temporary committees: Resolutions, Temperance, and Nominating. (See committees' report for their names.)

Reports were called for from the standing committees as follows:

Executive Committee: A brief summary of last year's work was given by the conference's secretary. (See report.)

Board of Trustees: No report.

Board of Education: No report.

Board of Missions: No report.

Board of Ordination: This report was given by Rev. Robert May. (See report.) A motion was made and carried to adopt this report.

Board of Evangelism: No report.

A talk on the youth work of the Woman's Auxiliary was given by Mrs. Lou Ellen Parker. A motion was made and carried to receive this talk as information.

A report of the annual session of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists was given by the conference's delegate, Mrs. Minnie Mae Chandler. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

A verbal report of the work of the Missions Board was given by Rev. Robert May.

A report of the work of the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation was given by the manager, Rev. Walter Reynolds. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

Rev. Walter Reynolds, chairman-treasurer of the North Carolina Board of Superannuation, gave a report of the work of the board. (See report.) A motion was made and carried to adopt this report.

Rev. Willis Wilson, president of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists, brought greetings from that body.

Rev. David Charles Hansley, general secretary of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists, gave a report of the work of that office.

Rev. Joseph Ingram, director-treasurer of the North Carolina Board of Missions, gave a report of the work of this board. (See report.) A motion was made and carried to adopt the report.

Rev. Joe Barrow, missionary-elect to Africa, spoke briefly to the conference. The Barrows plan to leave for the mission field in January, 1969.

An offering was received for the general fund of the conference. The offertory prayer was offered by Rev. Robert May.

Special music was rendered by Mrs. Douglass Spencer and Mrs. Lou Ellen Parker, with Mrs. June S. Respass as accompanist.

The conference sermon was delivered by Rev. E. E. Edwards. He read for a Scripture lesson 1 Timothy 1:8-17. The subject of the message was, "A Faithful Proclamation."

The morning session adjourned with the benediction by Rev. Walter Reynolds.

AFTERNOON SESSION, 1:15 P. M.

The afternoon session opened with Rev. Robert May leading the congregation in singing "He Keeps Me Singing."

The afternoon devotions were conducted by Rev. John Owens. He

used for his Scripture text Proverbs 29:23, and brought some very timely remarks on the subject; followed with prayer by Brother Owens.

A memorial service was conducted by Rev. Robert May. He read for a Scripture text John 14:1-6. After a moment of silent prayer, an audible prayer was offered by Brother May.

A report of Mount Olive College was given by Rev. Austin Carter, director of development. (See report.) A motion was made and carried to adopt the report.

Mr. Robert Spencer, chairman of the Board of Directors of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, gave a report on the work of the Home. He informed the conference that the superintendent, Rev. M. L. Johnson, was seriously ill. (Brother Johnson has now deceased.) (See report.) A motion was made and carried to adopt the report.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was given by Mr. Bill Gurganus. (See report.) A motion was made and carried to adopt the report.

The report of the Temperance Committee was given by Mrs. Florence Furlough. (See report.) A motion was made and carried to adopt the report.

The report of the Nominating Committee was given by Mr. Robert Spencer. (See report.) A motion was made and carried to adopt the report.

Mr. Isaac Furlough, the conference's treasurer, gave his report. (See report.) A motion was made and carried to adopt the report.

A motion was made and carried that the 1969 session of the conference convene with Sound Side Church, Route 2, Columbia, North Carolina.

Mr. Robert Spencer and Mrs. Lou Ellen Parker were elected as delegates to the 1969 session of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists.

The installation of officers was made by Rev. A. B. Chandler, retiring moderator.

Constitution of Albemarle Conference

ARTICLE I

SECTION 1—NAME

This organization shall be known as the Albemarle Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

SECTION 2—PURPOSE

The general purpose of this conference shall be to promote the great cause of Christ among men by means in conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

ARTICLE II

SECTION 1—COMPOSITION

This conference shall be composed of the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, all general officers of the conference, the members of standing boards or committees, the president or moderator of each subordinate general organization and the churches that hold their membership with the conference, together with those that may subsequently be admitted.

SECTION 2—REPRESENTATION

Every church affiliated with the Albemarle Conference shall represent in its annual session with two delegates, and each subordinate general organization shall represent with one delegate. A report from each church and subordinate organization shall be rendered at the annual session of the conference.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The officers of this conference shall be a moderator, an assistant

moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of two years. The term of office for all officers shall begin at the close of the annual session at which they are elected.

Temporary officers, representatives or messengers may be elected at the option of the conference for what purpose deemed essential.

ARTICLE IV

STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the method of this conference to simplify its works by the assignment of specific work to representative units of authority which shall hereafter be known as standing boards and committees.

A board of trustees, a board of education and a board of ordination consisting of three (3) members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be three years but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the office of one member annually.

A board of missions, consisting of five members shall be elected. The term of office for member of this board shall be five years, but shall be adjusted to terminate the office of one member annually.

SECTION 1

Standing boards shall have authority to write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of works, but each shall remain subject to the authority and approval of the conference.

SECTION 2

The executive committee shall be composed of the general officers of the conference and the moderator or president of each subordinate general organization.

SECTION 3

Temporary committees shall be appointed at the option of the conference for whatever deemed necessary.

ARTICLE V

FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference program according to its membership.

Conference funds shall be used for the work and general expense of the conference. The use of all funds to be approved by the conference.

ARTICLE VI

ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Free Will Baptists and desires to help promote the program and work of the Albemarle Conference may submit its petition for membership through an official delegation at any annual session of the conference. If the petition for membership be approved,

the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates and declare them duly seated.

ARTICLE VII

FRATERNAL DELEGATIONS AND VISITORS

Fraternal delegations and visitors shall be extended all the privileges of the conference except that of voting, serving on committees or holding elective offices.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

The Albemarle Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday before the second Sunday in October of each year. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.

BYLAWS

SECTION 1

The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Albemarle Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and subordinate general organizations; and to sign official documents that require the signature of the moderator.

SECTION 2

The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present and assist the moderator when called upon.

SECTION 3

The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Albemarle Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents, not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature.

SECTION 4

The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the duties of the recording secretary when that officer is not present and to assist the secretary when called upon.

SECTION 5

The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive commit-

tee or any standing board invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report accordingly to the conference.

SECTION 6

The executive committee shall have power to act in the behalf of and for the Albemarle Conference from one regular session to another. It shall organize at will and discharge the administrative duties assigned to it. It shall plan the programs of the conference. The executive committee shall meet as often as necessary for the good of the conference.

SECTION 7

The board of trustees shall hold title to all property belonging to this conference. It shall have power to convey such property when authorized by the conference.

SECTION 8

The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: obituary, temperance, resolutions, nominating and finance.

SECTION 9

All reports, resolutions and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

SECTION 10

No minister, officer or delegate shall be at liberty to retire from the building during a session of the conference without the consent of the moderator.

SECTION 11

If any member, in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his rights during the remaining part of that session of the conference.

SECTION 12

This constitution and bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-third favorable vote of the members present in a regular session. All amendments shall be on the table not less than three hours prior to adoption and shall, during that time, be read at least one time.

A REMINDER: Every 20 sessions of the conference minutes shall be bound together into a book for the permanent records of the conference.
