PROCEEDINGS

The twenty-ninth annual session of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with Union Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, R. F. D., Plymouth, October 10, 1973.

WEDNESDAY MORNING, 9:30 A.M.

The devotions were conducted by Rev. Robert Rollins. The congregation sang "Footsteps of Jesus," followed by Brother Rollins reading Scripture from Mark 1:14-26. He gave a brief talk on the Scripture and closed the devotions with prayer.

The welcome address was given by the host pastor, Rev. Robert Norville. The response was given by Rev. John Owens.

The conference was called to order by the secretary, Mr. Oscar Webster. A motion was made and carried to adopt the printed program as the order of business, with the moderator having the privilege to make any changes deemed necessary.

The list of churches was called with 16 churches represented. The list of ministers was called with seven ministers present. Visiting ministers were recognized as follows: Rev. Herman Grubbs, Cape Fear Conference; Revs. Robert Norville, Hubert Burress, and Walter Reynolds, Central Conference; Revs. Billy Ray Jordan, Joe Ingram, and Frank R. Harrison, Western Conference.

Rev. Charlie Overton, assistant moderator, gave the moderator's address.

The moderator appointed the following temporary committees:

Resolutions: Revs. Robert Rollins, William L. Littleton, and Mrs. Isaac Furlough.

Temperance: Rev. W. L. Brickhouse, Mrs. Seaton Patrick, and Mrs. Fanny Harris.

Nominating: Rev. John Owens, Mrs. Beulah Whitson, and Miss Alice Webster.

An offering was taken for the general fund of the conference.

Reports of the standing boards were called for. Mr. Bill Gurganus reported on missions and Rev. Charlie Overton reported on the Board of Ordination. A motion was made and carried to adopt the reports. (See reports.)

Announcements of interest to the body were made by several persons.

A report of the sixty-first annual session of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists was given by Mrs. Laura Webster.

Rev. Hubert Burress, secretary-treasurer of the Church Finance Association, Inc., gave a report of the association. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

Rev. Walter Reynolds made some timely remarks about the "Liquor-

by-the-Drink" referendum on November 6, 1973. A motion was made and carried to receive this report as information.

Rev. Walter Reynolds, director-treasurer of the North Carolina Board of Superannuation, gave a report on the progress of that board. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See Report.)

Rev. Walter Reynolds, manager of the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation, reported on the work of the foundation. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

A motion was made and carried to dissolve the Board of Youth Evangelism.

The business of the conference was called off for the morning worship service.

Special music was rendered by the choir of the host church, singing "Sweet Peace, the Gift of God's Love." The conference sermon was delivered by Rev. Frank R. Harrison, campus chaplain of Mount Olive College. Brother Harrison read for a Scripture text 1 Kings 18:17-21, 36-39. Following some inspiring remarks on the Scripture, the congregation sang as an invitation hymn, "Just As I Am." The benediction and blessing for the food was prayer by Rev. Walter Reynolds.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, 1 P.M.

The afternoon devotions were conducted by Rev. Herman Grubbs. The congregation sang "He Keeps Me Singing." He read for a Scripture text Hosea 8:1-7, 14. Following a few brief remarks, Mr. Grubbs closed the devotions with prayer.

A report of the North Carolina State Foreign Mission Board was given by Rev. Joe Ingram, director-treasurer. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See report.)

A memorial service was conducted by Mrs. Laura C. Webster. Sister Webster read Scripture verses taken from John 14. Following a few moments of silent prayer, Mrs. Webster read a poem and closed the prayer. Mrs. Lynn Paul played a piano solo, "Beyond the Sunset."

A report of Mount Olive College was given by Rev. Frank R. Harrison, campus chaplain. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See report.)

A report of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home was given by the superintendent, Mr. Sam Weeks. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See report.)

A report of the Resolutions Committee was given by Rev. Robert Rollins. A motion was made and carried to adopt resolutions Nos. 1 and 2. (See report.)

A report of the Temperance Committee was given by Mrs. Fanny Harris. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See report.)

A report of Cragmont Assembly, Inc., was given by Rev. Herman Grubbs. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See report.) Mr. Billy Dılday, conference treasurer, gave the treasurer's report. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See report.)

Mrs. Wilson Bowen and Mrs. Wayne Britt were elected as delegates to the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists.

Mrs. Herman Grubbs was elected as delegate to the General Conference.

A motion was made and carried to accept the petition from Gum Neck church for the next conference to be held there.

A report of the Nominating Committee was given by Rev. John Owens. A motion was made and carried to receive and adopt the report. (See report.)

A motion was made and carried to receive Rev. Herman Grubbs into the conference, pending a letter from his present conference membership. The right hand of fellowship was given Brother Grubbs while the pianist played "Blest Be the Tie."

A motion was made and carried to adopt the minutes as read by the secretary.

The congregation sang "God Be with You 'Til We Meet Again," followed with the benediction prayer by Rev. Charlie Overton.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF ORDINATION

We, the Board of Ordination, submit the following report:

On October 4, 1972, the board met at Mount Zion Free Will Baptist Church, Roper, to question Brother Bobby Taylor in relation to becoming a licensed minister. After questioning Brother Taylor, the board recommended him to his church to be licensed to preach the gospel.

On October 14, 1972, the board met at Hickory Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, Ahoskie. The purpose of this meeting was to give to Brother Johnnie Sexton the examination to preach the gospel. Brother Sexton failed the exam.

On November 4, 1972, Brother Johnnie Sexton met again with the board to take the examination. Brothter Sexton passed the exam this time.

On November 14, 1972, the board met at Plymouth High School, Plymouth, to question Brother Royce Reynolds and Brother Marvin Waters in relation to becoming licensed ministers. Both Brother Reynolds and Brother Waters passed.

On December 30, 1972, the board met at Free Union Free Will Baptist Church, Pinetown, to ordain Brother Johnnie Sexton.

On August 11, 1973, the board met at Hickory Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, Ahoskie, to give examination to Brothers Royce Reynolds, Marvin Waters, and Bobby Taylor. Each of them passed the exam.

The Ordaining Board of the Albemarle Conference met at Hickory Chapel Free Will Baptist Church September 25, 1973. The purpose of the meeting was that Wayne West wanted to talk to the board about reinstating his license, which were surrendered to the Western Conference Ordaining Council.

After hearing Brother West's comments and also comments from his pastor, Brother Herman Grubbs, the board thought the best action to take was for Brother West to go back to the place where he surrendered his license for reinstatement, or for recommendation from the Western Conference Ordaining Council, to the Albemarle Conference. The board also thought that if the conference council wanted the Albemarle Ordaining Board to meet at the same time that they would meet with them at a date set by the Western Conference board.

REPORT OF SUPERANNUATION BOARD

(July 1, 1972—June 30, 1973)

We are very grateful for your prayers and support for the work of the Board of Superannuation.

Even though this was another good year in our work, we still need more funds to increase every phase of our program. We need to meet our budget of thirty thousand dollars in gifts from our churches. This past year we received less than half of this amount.

There seems to be an increase in interest among our ministers, and more and more are participating in one or more phases of the program. While this is good, there are many not participating; and, we urge all of our ministers to take advantage of the program offered them. Your Help Is Needed

1. Pray for the work of superannuation and for the members of the

Board of Superannuation. Pray for the ministers of our denomination, and especially for your pastor.

2. Remember the request of the State Convention that our churches assist their pastor in preparing for retirement through the superannuation program with minimum assistance as follows:

a. A full-time church pays \$150 per year on pastor's retirement.

b. A part-time church pays \$75 per year on pastor's retirement. Note: This minimum assistance should either be increased by the church or matched by the minister.

3. Be sure your church is making regular offerings to this most worthy cause. Include the work of superannuation in the budget of your church in proportion to meet our needs. To insure the benefits we are offering to our ministers, we need the support of every Free Will Baptist.

4. Remember that the State Convention designated October as "Superannuation Month" and the third Sunday in June, Father's Day, as "Superannuation Day." Send your contributions to: North Carolina Board of Superannuation, P. O. Box 474, Ayden, North Carolina 28513.

REPORT OF THE CHURCH FINANCE ASSOCIATION, INC. (August 31, 1973)

The Church Finance Association, Inc. is owned and operated by Free

Will Baptists of North Carolina. The association has been serving the needs of our people since 1940.

We give thanks to God for the blessings bestowed on our work. We would like to thank everyone who has supported the work of our association with his prayers, funds, and time. We thank those who have used the services of our association.

Loans made as of August 21, 1973, for this year were \$118,761.28—a record year. Another first this year was passing the one million dollar mark in loans since April 20, 1940. Total loans made now stands at \$1,072,759.99. Our deposits have increased about 15 percent, but not enough to meet the demands. We now need funds to make loans that have been approved. Will you help us meet these needs?

Services offered by the association are as follows:

- 1. Loans for denominational needs.
- 2. Deposits for individual funds. (5¼ percent interest paid on \$500 or more.)
- 3. Endowments can be set up for:
 - a. Children's Home
 - b. Missions
 - c. Mount Olive College
 - d. Board of Superannuation
 - e. Churches
- 4. Retirement Fund. (Example, each \$1,200 will provide \$5 per month on present interest.)
- 5. All profits remain in the association to better serve Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

How can you help the Church Finance Association? Pray for the ministry of the Church Finance Association, Inc.; deposit your funds with the association and experience the joy of having your money working for our Lord; purchase memberships in the association at \$25 each; and use the services of the association.

We are proud of the repayment record of our people. Many are paying off their accounts ahead of schedule, which helps to make more loans available. All accounts are in good standing.

Constitution of Albemarle Conference

ARTICLE I

SECTION 1-NAME

This organization shall be known as the Albemarle Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

SECTION 2-PURPOSE

The general purpose of this conference shall be to promote the great cause of Christ among men by means in conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

ARTICLE II

Section 1—Composition

This conference shall be composed of the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, all general officers of the conference, the members of standing boards or committees, the president or moderator of each subordinate general organization and the churches that hold their membership with the conference, together with those that may subsequently be admitted.

SECTION 2—REPRESENTATION

Every church affiliated with the Albemarle Conference shall represent in its annual session with two delegates, and each subordinate general organization shall represent with one delegate. A report from each church and subordinate organization shall be rendered at the annual session of the conference.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The officers of this conference shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of two years. The term of office for all officers shall begin at the close of the annual session at which they are elected.

Temporary officers, representatives or messengers may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purpose deemed essential.

ARTICLE IV

STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the method of this conference to simplify its works by the assignment of specific work to representative units of authority which shall hereafter be known as standing boards and committees.

A board of trustees, a board of education and a board of ordination consisting of three (3) members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be three years but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the office of one member annually.

A board of missions, consisting of five members shall be elected. The term of office for members of this board shall be for five years, but shall be adjusted to terminate the office of one member annually.

SECTION 1

Standing boards shall have authority to write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to the authority and approval of the conference.

Section 2

The executive committee shall be composed of the general officers of the conference and the moderator or president of each subordinate general organization.

Section 3

Temporary committees shall be appointed at the option of the conference for whatever deemed necessary.

ARTICLE V

FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference program according to its membership.

Conference funds shall be used for the work and general expense of the conference. The use of all funds to be approved by the conference.

ARTICLE VI

Admission of Churches

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Free Will Baptists and desires to help promote the program and work of the Albemarle Conference may submit its petition for membership through an official delegation at any annual session of the conference. If the petition for membership be approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates and declare them duly seated.

ARTICLE VII

FRATERNAL DELEGATIONS AND VISITORS

Fraternal delegations and visitors shall be extended all the privileges of the conference except that of voting, serving on committees or holding elective offices.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

The Albemarle Conference shall meet in annual session on Wednesday before the second Sunday in October of each year. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.

BYLAWS

SECTION 1

The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted

parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Albemarle Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and subordinate general organizations; and to sign official documents that require the signature of the moderator.

Section 2

The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present and assist the moderator when called upon.

Section 3

The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Albemarle Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents, not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature.

Section 4

The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the duties of the recording secretary when that officer is not present and to assist the secretary when called upon.

SECTION 5

The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive committee or any standing board invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report accordingly to the conference.

SECTION 6

The executive committee shall have power to act in the behalf of and for the Albemarle Conference from one regular session to another. It shall organize at will and discharge the administrative duties assigned to it. It shall plan the programs of the conference. The executive committee shall meet as often as necessary for the good of the conference.

Section 7

The board of trustees shall hold title to all property belonging to this conference. It shall have power to convey such property when authorized by the conference.

Section 8

The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: obituary, temperance, resolutions, nominating and finance.

SECTION 9 Comparison of the second state of the second state of the second state

All reports, resolutions, and recommendations shall be considered properly presented the conference in written form only.
