### PROCEEDINGS

The thirty-second (32) annual session of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with Shiloh Free Will Baptist Church, Route 1, Pinetown, North Carolina, October 6, 1976.

#### WEDNESDAY MORNING, 9:30 A. M.

The devotions were conducted by the Rev. L. E. Ambrose. The congregation sang "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus." Brother Ambrose read Scripture from Matthew 28:16-20. Comments were made by Brother Ambrose. Prayer was offered by the Rev. Stanley Buck.

The welcome was given by Mr. Ervin Foreman, and the response was given by Mr. Billy Dilday.

The conference was officially opened for business by the conference secretary, Mr. Oscar Webster. The printed program was adopted as the order of business, with any changes deemed necessary to be made by the moderator.

The list of churches was called with fifteen (15) reporting by letter or delegate. One church reported to the secretary after the conference. Thus all the churches reported.

The list of ministers was called with eight (8) reporting.

Visiting ministers were recongized with the following present: the Rev. Stanley Buck, Western; the Rev. Charles Parrish, Little River Association; the Revs. Joe Ingram and Billy Ray Jordan, Western Conference; the Rev. Sam Weeks, Eastern Conference, the Rev. David Thick, Western Conference; and the Revs. Walter Reynolds, and Hubert Burress, Central Conference.

A motion was made and carried to seat the Revs. Stanley Buck and Melvin Moore by action of the Board of Ordination.

The Rev. Robert May, moderator, gave his address. His message was well prepared and delivered and was pertinent to the hour.

The moderator appointed the following temporary committees:

Nominating—The Rev. Francis Garner, Mr. Billy Dilday, and Mrs. Lula Daw.

Resolutions—The Revs. Marvin Waters and W. L. Brickhouse, and Mr. Bill Gurganus.

Temperance—The Revs. John Melancon and L. E. Ambrose, and Mr. Ervin Foreman.

The congregation sang while an offering was taken for the general fund of the conference. Mr. J. T. Keech prayed the Lord's blessing on the offering.

Reports from the standing boards of the conference were called for. There were no reports from the Boards of Trustees and Education.

Mr. Bill Gurganus gave an oral report for the Board of Missions.

The report of the Board of Ordination was given by the Rev. Charlie Overton. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See report.)

A motion was made and carried that all ministers shall be ordained by the conference in which they are licensed. (See Board of Ordination Report.)

The Rev. Hubert Burress, secretary-treasurer of the Church Finance Association, gave a report of the work of the association. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report as information.

The Rev. Joseph Ingram, director-treasurer of the North Carolina Board of Foreign Missions, gave a report of the ministry of that board. In addition to

Brother Ingram's remarks, a printed report was handed out. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report as informaion.

The Rev. Sam Weeks, executive director of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home at Middlesex, N. C., gave a report of the ministry of the Home. The Rev. David Thick, one of the houseparents at the Home, talked about the work and the parents. It was very good. A printed report was handed out. A motion was made and carried to adopt these reports as information.

Brother Weeks, who is also executive director of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Homes, gave a report on the progress of this work. He stated that one of the apartments in the duplex has been completed and is now occupied. A motion was made and carried to adopt this report as information.

Announcements of interest were made by several of the ministers.

At this time the business of the conference was called off for the worship service.

The Rev. Marvin Waters, pastor of the host church, was in charge of the worship service. Special music was presented by the host church. A male quartet sang "Grace, Greater Than All Our Sins." The conference sermon was preached by the Rev. Marvin Waters. Brother Waters read for a Scripture, Acts 1:8. He used for a subject: "Whole Task, Whole Church, Whole Age." His message was informative and inspiring.

The Rev. Walter Reynolds prayed the benediction and asked the Lord's blessing on the food.

#### WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, 1:00 P. M.

The devotions were conducted by Miss Alice Webster. The congregation sang "Love Lifted Me." Sister Webster read for a Scripture 1 Corinthians 13. Prayer was by the Rev. Walter Reynolds.

A memorial service was conducted by the Rev. Francis Garner. Prayer, Scripture, two poems, and prayer again were by Brother Garner.

A motion was made and carried to enroll the Rev. Charles Parrish with the list of ministers. This action was taken on the recommendations of the Board of Ordination.

Mr. Harold Herring, director of development of Mount Olive College, Mount Olive, N. C., gave a report of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists held at Mount Olive Armory with the College as host. Brother Herring then gave an oral report of the program of the College. A printed report was also handed out. A motion was made and carried to adopt the reports as information.

Two reports were given by the Rev. Walter Reynolds. Brother Reynolds, manager of the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation, Ayden, N. C., first gave a report of the business of the Foundation. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report as information.

Brother Reynolds, who is also director-treasurer of the North Carolina Board of Superannuation, gave a report on the ministry of this Board. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report as information.

Reports were received at this time from the Temporary Committees.

Mrs. Francis Garner and Miss Alice Webster were appointed by the moderator as delegates to the 1977 session of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists to convene at Kenansville, N. C.

The Rev. and Mrs. Charles Parrish were appointed by the moderator as delegates to the 1977 session of the General Conference.

A motion was made and carried to convene the 1977 session with Sidney Free Will Baptist Church, Route 2, Belhaven, North Carolina 27810.

The right hand of fellowship was given to the three new ministers: Revs. Stanley Buck, Melvin Moore, and Charles Parrish.

The benediction was prayed by Mr. Billy Wayne Dilday.

#### Adopted at the Conference to be a Part of the Minutes

#### **REPORT OF BOARD OF ORDINATION**

We, the Board of Ordination, submit the following report:

On November 8, 1975, we met at Hickory Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, Ahoskie, North Carolina. The purpose of the meeting was to give the examination to Dallas Pinkham. He passed.

November 29, 1975, we met at Trinity Free Will Baptist Church, Route 1, Pantego, North Carolina. The purpose of the meeting was to ordain Dallas Pinkham. The Rev. Robert May delivered the ordination message. The Bible was presented by the Rev. Francis Garner. The Rev. Charlie Overton gave the charge and conducted the laying on of hands by the Board. Brother Overton also prayed the prayer of dedication. Then the hand of fellowship was extended to Brother Pinkham by the Board and the congregation.

November 29, 1975, we met at Trinity Free Will Baptist Church, Route 1, Pantego, North Carolina. The purpose of the meeting was to have the Rev. Stanley Buck to clear his credentials. The board accepted him as a licensed minister pending the outcome of his acceptance of the Treatise of Faith and Government for the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, which he agreed to do.

November 29, 1975 at Trinity Church, the Rev. Melvin Moore met with the

board to clear his credentials, which proved very satisfactory.

November 29, 1975 at Trinity Church. James Edgar Webb met with the Board to clear his credentials. The only thing he had to present to the board was expired license. We informed him we could not accept him as a licensed or ordained minister because of the expiration of his license, and also that he had . <sup>8</sup> Аз never been ordained.

December 20, 1975, we met at Hickory Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, Ahoskie, North Carolina. The purpose of the meeting was to examine Mr. Billie Reynolds for license to preach the gospel. The board was satisfied with his answers and we recommend him to his church to be licensed to preach for a period of two years.

On February 28, 1976 we met at Union Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, Route 1, Plymouth, North Carolina. The purpose of this meeting was to answer questions from Mr. James Edgar Webb about his license and ordination. Again, he was turned down by the Board.


