PROCEEDINGS

The thirty-fifth annual session of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with Mount Tabor Free Will Baptist Church, Route 2, Creswell, North Carolina, on October 10, 1979.

WEDNESDAY MORNING

The devotions were conducted by the Rev. Steve Hargrove. The congregation sang "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." Brother Hargrove read Hebrews 12:1-3 for devotional Scripture. Prayer was by Brother Hargrove also.

The welcome was given by the Rev. L. E. Ambrose. Brother Oscar Webster gave the response to the welcome.

The Conference was called to order by the secretary, the Rev. Marvin R. Waters.

The list of Churches was called. Fourteen (14) reported, by letter and by delegate.

The list of ministers was called and the following reported: Francis Garner, Ransom McAbee, L. E. Ambrose, Robert May, W. L. Brickhouse, Johnny Sexton, Floyd Burkey, Melvin Moore, Marvin Waters. It was reported that Charlie Overton could not be with us due to the illness of his wife.

Visiting ministers were recognized with the following present: Joe Ingram, Foreign Missions; Dr. Burkette Raper, Mount Olive College; Hubert Burress, Church Finance Association; Stewart Humphrey, Children's Home; Walter Reynolds, Free Will Baptist Press; Taylor Hill, Home Missions; Walter Sutton, representing Camp Vandemere; and Steve Hargrove, visiting minister of the Cape Fear Conference.

The Rev. Francis Garner, moderator, gave the moderator's address. Brother Garner remarked that "the past is behind us. The potential and probabilities for the future are unlimited." He stated that "the prize will be God's reward to us for our labors." For the present, "our united labors are essential," he said.

The moderator appointed the following temporary committees:

Nominating-Billy Dilday, Ervin Foreman, Ransom McAbee

Resolutions-Oscar Webster, Jay Leggett, Robert Midyette

Temperance-Floyd Burkey, Bill Gurganus, David Furlough

The Conference then entered into a special period of prayer for the Rev. Cedric Pierce, a fellow minister, who is reportedly ill, for the Rev. S. A. Smith, whose wife had passed away, and Mrs. Charlie Overton, who is in the hospital at the time of this conference.

An offering was received for the General Fund of the Conference.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the printed program as the order of business with the moderator having the privilege to make any changes he might deem necessary.

Report of the Executive Committee of the Conference was given by Marvin R. Waters. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See Reports.)

Report of the Board of Ordination was given by the Rev. Robert May. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See Reports.)

Report of Mount Olive College was given by Dr. Burkette Raper. Dr. Raper prefaced his remarks with an announcement concerning the death of Mrs. S. A. Smith. He called attention to the benefit suppers for the counties in our Conference area. He stated that the college is enjoying a record enrollment this year. Dr. Raper further explained the financial aid program of the college, expressing the continued desire of the college to provide every Free Will Baptist young person the opportunity for attaining a Christian education. A motion was made and carried that the report be received as information.

The Rev. Steve Hargrove requested menbership into the conference. A motion was made to receive Brother Hargrove pending his letter from the Pee Dee Association. Motion carried.

The Rev. Taylor Hill presented the report of the Home Missions Department. Brother Hill, in addition to the written report, stated that the Home Missions program is doing well. He reported that the missions had given back over \$7,000 to the denominational enterprises. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

The report of the Church Finance Association was given by the Rev. Hubert Burress. Brother Burress reported that a total of \$528,400 had been loaned during the past year. He reported that the large loan to Cragmont had been one of the most important developments of the Church Finance Association's program. Brother Burress urged each Church to purchase two memberships into the Association. This report was received by the Conference as information.

The Rev. Joe Ingram gave the report on the Foreign Missions Program. In addition to the printed report, Brother Ingram spoke of a recent trip to India. He stated that six of the Indian churches have elementary schools with an enrollment of over 900 students. Brother Ingram asked for the continued blessings of God upon the Foreign Missions ministry. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

Announcements were made relative to church concerns of the local churches.

The Conference entered the worship hour. The host church choir sang "When I've Gone the Last Mile." The Rev. Ransom McAbee delivered the Conference sermon entitled "If My People." His text was 2 Chronicles 7:14. Following the benediction by Dr. Burkette Raper, the Conference enjoyed a delicious noon meal served by the host church.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

The Rev. W. L. Brickhouse gave the devotions from 2 Timothy 3. The congregation sang "I Want to Be a Worker."

The Rev. Robert May conducted the memorial service, reading an appropriate poem and leading in a memorial prayer.

The Rev. Walter Reynolds gave the report from the Free Will Baptist Press. Brother Reynolds reported that sample packages of the new literature for the nursery, preschool, and primary Sunday school classes have been mailed to the churches. Brother Reynolds reported the Press's purchase of a new two-color printing press. This particular press will cut the work load by one-half. Brother Reynolds further encouraged each church family to subscribe to "The Free Will Baptist." A motion was made carried to receive the report as information.

The Rev. Walter Reynolds gave the report on Superannuation. Motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

The Rev. Willis Wilson sent a report to the Conference via the Rev. Walter Reynolds. This report was an open letter to all Free Will Baptists, expressing the need for continued financial support for the retiring of the loan debt on Cragmont's new assembly building. Brother Reynolds reported that the first loan payment will be due November 14, and will amount to approximately \$35,000. Motion was made and carried that we receive this report as information. The Rev. Walter Sutton gave the report on the ministry of Camp Vandemere. Brother Sutton reported that Camp Vandemere is owned and operated by the member churches of the Eastern Conference of Original Free Will Baptists. He stated that the camp is open to all Free Will Baptists with organized activities being conducted. Brother Sutton stated that those interested in Camp Vandemere's camping schedule could contact either Ralph Sumner or Walter Sutton. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

Mr. Lloyd Jones reported on the Albemarle League Convention. Mr. Jones stated that he would be glad to work any church that desires to establish a league. He called for the continued prayers of our people on behalf of the ministry of the League. Motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

Mrs. Lorraine Garner, President of the Albemarle Woman's Auxiliary Convention, reported on the work of that Convention. She gave the following figures as estimates of membership: 200 women who are members, 100 YFA members, 100 AFC members, and 25 Cherub members. Motion was made and carried to receive this report as information.

Report of the Albemarle Connference Youth Convention was by Mrs. Betty Sawyer, Youth Chairman. She reported the Convention as having had two conferences this year. These were held at the Sound Side Church and the Free Union Church. She encouraged more involvement on the part of both ministers and laity in our youth activities. A motion was made and carried to receive this report as information.

The report on the Albemarle Conference Sunday School Convention was given by Mr. Ervin Foreman, President of the Convention. Brother Foreman reported that there will be a meeting of the Board of Education of the Albemarle Conference along with the Executive Committee of the Sunday School Convention to discuss ways of improving the ministry of the Sunday School Convention. He urged the continued involvement of our Sunday school officers and teachers in the work of the Sunday School Convention. A motion was made and carried to receive this report as information.

Mrs. Laura Webster gave the report on the past State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists. She commented on the various happenings of the Convention. A motion was made and carried to receive the report as information.

The Rev. Stewart Humphrey, Director of the Children's Home, gave the report on the Home. Brother Humphrey stated that the Free Will Baptist Children's Home is leading the way in child care in institutions across the nation. Humphrey further reported on the Retirement Homes ministry, stating that we should rally behind the Retirement Homes as a ministry to both laity and clergy. A motion was made and carried to receive each of these reports as information.

REPORTS AND BUSINESS OF THE CONFERENCE

The report of the Temperance Committee was given by the Rev. Floyd Burkey. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See Reports.)

The report of the Resolutions Committee was given by Mr. Oscar Webster. A motion was made and carried to adopt the two (2) resolutions offered by the committee. (See Reports.)

A motion was made and carried that in regard to Resolution 2, as adopted by this Conference, that the Executive Committee choose a chairman of each standing board and meet with each board to give it direction as to its purpose and work.

Report of the Nominating Committee was given by Mr. Billy Dilday. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See Reports.)

A motion was made and carried that the Conference express its wishes for the State Convention to meet in the month of August.

Mrs. Lorraine Garner, Mrs. Laura Webster, and Mrs. Floyd Burkey were appointed to serve as delegates to the next State Convention.

Mr. Oscar Webster was appointed delegate of the Albemarle Conference to the General Conference.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Mr. Lloyd Jones, treasurer. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See Reports.)

Mr. Billy Dilday installed the new officers of the Conference with Scripture and a prayer of consecration.

The minutes of the Conference were read. A motion was made and carried that the reading of the minutes be adopted.

The right hand of fellowship was extended to the Rev. Steve Hargrove as the congregation sang "Amazing Grace."

A motion was made and carried that the host church be extended a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality in hosting this year's Conference.

A motion was made and carried to adjourn, leaving any unfinished business in the hands of the Executive Committee. The benediction was prayed by the Rev. Francis Garner.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee met at the Sidney Free Will Baptist Church, April 29, 1979. The item discussed was the possibility of our Conference hosting the 1979 session of the State Convention.
