## WEDNESDAY MORNING

The congregation sang "Where He Leads I'll Follow" to open the thirty-ninth session of the Albemarle Conference. The devotions were conducted by Mrs. Betty Whitley of Free Union Church.

The welcome was given by Mrs. Christine S. Waters. The response was given by the Rev. Charlie Overton.

The Conference was called to order by the moderator, the Rev. Robert May, due to the death of Brother Oscar Webster, Conference secretary. Brother May then made the following announcements.

1. Brother Robert Burke was to conduct a funeral that day and asked to be excused.

2. Oscar Webster, the secretary, passed away October 4, 1983.

3. Mr. Webster's funeral would be conducted October 6, at 2 p.m. in Washington, North Carolina, with interment in the Webster Cemetery, near Free Union Church. Our hearts are sad this morning to hear of Brother Oscar's passing. We will miss him very much. The Conference will never be the same. He served so long and so faithfully and always enjoyed working for his Lord anywhere he could. Let's stand and have silent prayer in his memory. It was closed by the Rev. L. E. Ambrose.

Brother May introduced the assistant secretary, Mrs. Beulah Whitson, acting today in Brother Oscar's place.

He also welcomed all ministers, delegates and visitors to worship with us.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the printed program as the order of business, with the moderator having the privilege of making any changes he deems necessary.

The list/of churches was called with 14 present, 2 absent, and 1 dropped.

The list of ministers was called with 12 present, 2 excused, and 1 absent.

Visiting ministers were recognized with the following present: the Revs. Billy Jordan, Bobby Taylor, and Don Fader, Central Conference; Harold Jones, Charles Crisp, Western Conference; Frank Harrison, Cape Fear Conference; Gary Bailey, president of the State Convention. Also attending was Brother Cliff Gray, Executive Director of the Free Will Baptist Press.

Motion was made and carried to receive the Rev. Bobby Brown into the Albemarle Conference today, so he could have voting privileges now.

The moderator's address was short and to the point. Mr. May chose Acts 2:42-47 as his text. Walking close to the Lord, let go and let God have His way, always being considerate of other's feelings and be willing to yield the floor to others so all may have a chance to express their desires.

The moderator appointed temporary committees for the day as follows: Nominating: the Rev. Charlie Overton, Brother Billy Spencer, Mrs. Christine Waters; Temperance: the Rev. Bobby Brown, Brother Lloyd Jones Jr., Mrs. Collier Miller; Resolutions: the Revs. Joe Griffith, Charles Parrish, and Brother David Furlough.

The following board appointments were made.

Board of Trustees: the Revs. W. L. Brickhouse, Joe Griffith, Brother Ervin Foreman.

Board of Ordination: the Revs. Charlie Overton, Steve Hargrove, Robert May.

Board of Missions: the Revs. Steve Hargrove, Floyd Burkey, Bobby Brown, Brother Billy Dilday.

Board of Christian Education: Mrs. Laura C. Webster, Mrs. Mae Oliver, Mrs. Margaret Woolard Sheppard.

An offering was received while the Rev. Joe Griffith played soft music. The Rev. W. L. Brickhouse prayed the offertory prayer.

The report of the Executive Committee was given by the Conference moderator. A motion was made and carried to adopt the report. (See Reports.)

Reports of standing boards were called for.

The report of the Board of Education was given by the Rev. Joe Griffith, who talked about improving our Sunday schools. The Spring workshop and the new methods and materials are to help us do a better job. The Fall banquet will be announced later.

The Rev. Harold Jones gave a report on Foreign Missions. Progress is slow but improving. He thanked us for our support and asked that we continue. They have disappointments also; the Board received news that the passports for the Van der Plas family waiting to go to India did not come through. Time elapsed before all credentials could be taken care of. He asked that we all pray that God would open the door to India or anywhere He wanted them to go. May God's will be done in the matter. Motion was made and carried to adopt report. The Rev. Frank Harrison, chaplain of Mount Olive College, reported on the progress of College Hall. A special need is arising for dormitory space for the extra students that will be transferring to the four-year College as the grades are added on. We can start having our Convention, Conferences and meetings of different kinds in College Hall next year.

Motion was made and carried to adopt the report.

In giving the report of the State Convention the Rev. Gary Bailey reported that it was well attended and the business went very smoothly. He spoke of some minor changes. Motion was made and carried to adopt this report.

The Rev. Charlie Overton gave the report of the Board of Ordination. (See Reports.) Motion was made and carried to adopt the report.

The worship service began with singing by the New Day Spirituals of the host church. They sang "Where No One Stands Alone," and "My Jesus Knows Just What I Need."

The Rev. Don Fader brought the message, concerning the blessings and promises of God and His boundless love toward us. We should put Him first in our lives, with study, worship, and service.

The Rev. Bobby Brown dismissed us with a prayer of thanksgiving and asked God's blessings on the food we were about to receive.

#### WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

The devotions were conducted by the Rev. Charles Parrish. Speaking on the true gospel of Christ, he warned against man-made religions and cults.

A memorial service was conducted by the Rev. Joe Griffith. (See Reports.) The memorial service ended with the congregation standing and singing, "It Is Well With My Soul" in memory of all the deceased.

The report of the General Conference was brought by the Rev. Steve Hargrove. Motion was made and carried to accept this report.

The report of the Temperance Committee was given by the Rev. Bobby Brown. A motion was made and carried to adopt this report. (See Reports.)

The report of the Nominating Committee was given by the Rev. Charlie Overton. (See Reports.)

Motion was made and carried to accept the report.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was given by the Rev. Joe Griffith. Motion was made and carried to accept the report. (See Reports.)

The Children's Home was represented by the Rev. Bobby Taylor. The Home has been in operation 63 years; 750 children have passed through their doors. There is an adolescent program in formation at present.

Folders are being used this year; similar to the old Turkey folders, for raising money for the Home. Motion was made and carried to accept the report.

The Rev. Bobby Taylor also brought greetings, news and the needs of Cragmont. Motion was made and carried to accept the report.

The Rev. Walter Sutton reported on the progress of the Retirement Homes work. He asked for our prayers and support for the work, and also presented a plan they have for keeping some of the elderly in their neighborhoods. Motion was made and carried to accept the report.

Speaking for the Board of Superannuation, the Rev. Don Fader gave a short report of the needs of monies for the care of the retired ministers and/or their widows. The cost of living has risen, and there are more who need it.

Motion was made and carried to accept the report.

The Rev. Charles Crisp, reporting on Home Missions, told us the work was established 11 years ago, starting with a \$35 offering. It takes at least four families to start a mission. Victory Mission was the first one. It was started by the Rev. Taylor Hill. The churches and missions of the Laotian people of California are doing well. They have three students at Mount Olive College preparing for the ministry. They plan to go home and minister to their people. The Board is asking that we increase our support to the college for ministerial students.

Cape Colony has closed its doors for service. As of October 21, 1983, it will be put up for sale to some interested church.

A motion was made and carried to accept this report for information.

Mr. Lloyd Jones gave the Treasurer's Report. A motion was made and carried to accept the report. (See Reports.)

Mr. Cliff Gray, executive director of the Free Will Baptist Press, reported on the services offered for our needs in any organization in the denomination. For example, that they now have large-print Sunday school quarterlies for those who have difficulty reading small print. Motion was made and carried to accept this report. All of the enterprises passed out printed literature.

Brother Lloyd Jones gave an oral report on the progress of the Free Will Baptist League, stating at present it was weak but they were still hoping it would improve.

Brother Ervin Foreman and his wife were appointed to represent us as delegates to the 1984 session of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists. The Rev. Joe Griffith was appointed to serve as delegate to the General Conference to be held at Durham.

The Rev. Bobby Brown was given the right hand of fellowship, and welcomed into the Albemarle Conference.

The time and place of the next conference will be announced at a later date.

Motion was made and carried to adjourn. and the

## REPORTS 1983 SESSION

## EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina met several times with the Cape Colony Church to try to help solve their internal problems but with no success.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following article be placed in the minutes and the *Yearbook*.

WHEREAS, The Cape Colony Free Will Baptist Church, Edenton, began as a mission at the request of the Albemarle Conference to the North Carolina Home Missions Board of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists and WHEREAS, The Albemarle Conference organized Cape Colony Mission into a church at the request of the Cape Colony Mission and the Home Missions Board, and WHEREAS, due to internal problems the Cape Colony Church had deteriorated in numbers, to even lower than at the beginning when organized as a mission, with a decrease in support for both the church and pastor, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Albemarle Comference of Free Will Baptists, place Cape Colony Free Will Baptist Church back under the status of a mission and that all liabilities and assets be placed back under the direction of the North Carolina Home Missions Board until such time as a sufficent number of responsible believers wish to be established into a new church.

Motion made and carried to adopt the report.

## BOARD OF ORDINATION

The Board of Ordination submits the following report:

On March 26, 1983, the Board met at Mount Zion Church, Roper, to discuss a matter of business with Mr. Bill Gaylord relative to a court trial. Mr. Gaylord stated to the Board that he was not guilty of any charges. The Board also examined the Rev. Bobby Brown's license. We, the Board, were satisfied. On September 10, 1983, the Board met at Mount Zion Church to give Robert Burke an examination for the ministry. He passed. The Board met at Mount Zion Church to examine Johnnie Sexton. After much discussion we decided it best to ask him to turn in his credentials, which he did.

On September 17, 1983, the Board met at Free Union Church, Pinetown, to ordain Robert Burke.
