PROCEEDINGS

WEDNESDAY MORNING CONTROL OF A PARK OF MARKET MEETING

The Rev. Robert May called the Conference to order promptly at 9:30 a.m. The devotions were held by the Rev. Frank Thigpen using 1 Corinthians 13 as his text. The congregation then sang "When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder."

The welcome was given by Mr. Lloyd Jones, and the response was given by the Rev. Joe Griffith.

The Conference was then called to order by the clerk, and the adoption of the program was the first order of business.

The roll call of churches was held with nine present and six absent.

The roll call of ministers was held with seven present and five absent with one excused absence on account of sickness.

Visiting ministers and delegates from other church bodies were welcomed and recognized. They were as follows: the Rev. De Wayne Eakes, the Rev. Bobby Taylor, the Rev. Harold Jones, Mr. Cliff Gray, the Rev. Walter Sutton, the Rev. Walter Reynolds, the Rev. David C. Hansley, the Rev. Frank Harrison.

The moderator's address was "What Constitutes a Real Church?" The text was taken from Acts 2:42 with these points: (1) Continue steadfastly in apostles' doctrine, (2) not what saith man, (3) fellowship, (4) shared all things in common, (5) breaking of bread in communion with each other, and (6) praying that God will use us as His instruments.

The moderator then established the rules for the Conference and appointed temporary committees for the day as follows: Resolutions Committee: the Rev. Bobby Brown, Mrs. Oscar Webster, and Mrs. Beulah Whitson. Temperance Committee: the Rev. Joe Griffith, the Rev. Winfred Brickhouse, and Mr. Ervin Foreman. Nominating Committee: the Rev. Charlie Overton, Miss Sara Willoughby, and Mrs. Doris Simmons. The Rev. Bobby Brown then made a motion to rescind resolution number three (#3) of the 1986 Conference which is in the 1987 *Yearbook* on page 180. The motion was passed.

As the planist played we received our Conference offering and then sang hymn 158, "Have Thine Own Way, Lord."

The reports of standing boards were called for and given as follows: Trustees: no report; Board of Missions; the Rev. Joe Griffith and the Rev. W. S. Burns; Board of Education: no report. For complete reports see REPORTS 1987 Session.

We then had announcements from the local churches.

The Rev. W. S. Burns made the motion that the Board of Missions be granted approval from the Conference to petition churches for money and be given access to money the Conference already has for the Board of Missions. The motion passed.

The Rev. W. S. Burns, president of the General Conference, gave the report of the General Conference. He expressed the desire that the General Conference be used as one means of bringing our denomination back to Original Free Will Baptist doctrine, a time of fellowship and spiritual renewal.

The Rev. Harold Jones gave the report on Foreign Missions. He expressed the need for our churches to sponsor schools in India and the need of being faithful in praying for India. He also told us that the Foreign Missions Department is sponsoring a school of prayer on February 26, 1988.

Mr. Cliff Gray, manager of the Free Will Baptist Press, gave his report and said that the Press had a profit in excess of fifty thousand dollars.

The Rev. De Wayne Eakes, president of the State Convention, gave the report of the Convention and told what the Convention is trying to accomplish.

Mrs. Eleanor Moore gave the report of the 1987 State Convention.

The Rev. Bobby Taylor, director of the Children's Home, gave his report stating that the Home cared for sixty-six children last year.

Miss Sara Willoughby gave the report of the State Woman's Auxiliary Convention stating that they had three thousand and fifty members. She expressed the need for the ladies in the churches to become active in the Auxiliary.

Business was terminated at 11:20 a.m. and the service turned over to the host pastor, the Rev. Charlie Overton of Mount Zion Church. A ladies trio from Mount Zion sang "At an Altar of Prayer of Jesus," and Brother Overton spoke on "How to Live a Righteous Life in the Face of a Sinful World" using Matthew 5:20 for his Scripture. The congregation then sang "Just As I Am" for the closing hymn.

The Conference adjourned for lunch.

The Conference resumed business at one o'clock with a piano special by Mrs. Lucy Jones of Mount Zion. The Rev. Luther Swinson, pastor of the Plymouth Church, held the afternoon devotions. The congregation sang "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." A ladies trio sang "The Solid Rock." Brother Swinson used Scripture from 1 Corinthians 3:11. In his devotions he said, "It is time that the world knows where we stand."

The Rev. Bobby Brown then held the Memorial Service in memory of those that lived in Christ, have died in Christ and are still living in Christ. Brother Brown spoke of the seven promises spoken of in John 14:1-3, 6, 10-12, 16-17, 18, 26-27.

The Rev. Frank Harrison brought greetings from Mount Olive College. He told us that enrollment was nine hundred and four at the beginning of the semester.

The secretary of the Conference gave the Executive Committee report (see Reports).

The Rev. W. C. Overton gave the Ordaining Council report (see Reports).

The Rev. Walter Reynolds gave the Church Finance report urging churches and church members to buy shares in the Church Finance Association.

The Rev. Walter Sutton gave the report for the Retirement Homes and told of the marvelous work they are doing. We are blessed to have a Retirement Homes Program and a man with vision like the Rev. Walter Sutton.

The Rev. David Charles Hansley, the director of the Board of Home Missions and Evangelism, gave his report.

The Rev. Joe Griffith gave the report of the Temperance Committee (see Reports).

The Rev. Bobby Brown gave the report of the Resolutions Committee (see Reports). The Nominating Committee report was given by the Rev. W. C. Overton (see Reports). Mr. Lloyd Jones, treasurer of the Conference, gave the treasurer's report (see Treasurer's Report).

The Rev. Joe Griffith made the motion that we give \$100 towards the renovation of the State Convention Headquarters in Ayden. The motion was passed.

Mrs. Christine Waters of Free Union and Mrs. Fowler of Saint Paul will represent our Conference at the General Conference.

Mr. and Mrs. Fentress Simmons of Mount Tabor will represent the Albemarle Conference at the State Convention in 1988.

The Rev. Bobby Brown in behalf of Shiloh Church made a motion to invite the Albemarle Conference there for 1988. The motion passed.

At the close of business the moderator asked that the minutes be read. They were read and accepted.

The motion was made to adjourn. The motion was passed and we were dismissed in prayer.
