# **Proceedings**

The 75<sup>th</sup> annual session of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists was held at Hickory Chapel Original Free Will Baptist Church in Ahoskie, North Carolina on Wednesday October 9, 2019, with the Reverend Al Markuson moderating.

The session convened at 9:30 A.M. with the singing of the hymn "There's Something About That Name" led by Brother Lloyd Jones Jr., with Sister Lucy Jones serving as pianist. The morning devotion was brought by The Reverend Royce Reynolds, speaking from Proverbs 27:1. He used the scripture passage to help set the tone for the day's proceedings. He encouraged the congregation to be busy about God's work by making it a PRIORITY in all that we do. He then led the session in prayer. The moderator recognized Sister Sarah Jane Parker of the host church for the welcome. Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. gave the response thanking Hickory Chapel Church for their invitation and hospitality.

The session was called to order by the clerk Sister Shirley Pelletier using the call to order established by the late Brother Oscar Webster, "I, Shirley Pelletier, clerk of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists, do declare the 75<sup>th</sup> Annual Session of the Conference is now officially in session; for prayer and praise to God, for the preaching of His Word, and for the transaction of any business pertinent to the ongoing business of said conference. May God to our good and His Glory bless our coming together. The Reverend Al Markuson now presiding." The moderator presented the program for the annual session. A motion to approve the program as presented was made by The Reverend Keith Pelletier, seconded by Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. The motion was duly voted and passed.

The moderator called The Reverend David Young, The Reverend John Mark Windley and The Reverend Tony Parrish to the front of the sanctuary as candidates for membership with the Albemarle Conference. Upon confirmation of their good standing in their respective Conferences, all three are eligible for membership. A motion by Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. was made to accept these three men into membership, seconded by The Reverend Royce Reynolds. The motion was duly voted and passed and the three Pastors were welcomed into the Albemarle Conference.

The moderator called for the roll call of churches. There were ten churches with delegates present. Churches present included First Plymouth, Free Union, Hickory Chapel, Malachi Chapel, Mt. Tabor, Mt. Zion, Sidney, Sound Side, Trinity, and Union Chapel. The moderator called for the roll call of ministers. There were eight (8) ministers present and three (3) ministers absent. Visiting ministers were recognized; they included: The Reverend Bobby Taylor, The Reverend Harold Jones, The Reverend Ronnie Taylor, The Reverend Tim Heath, The Reverend Neal Cox, The Reverend Richard Cuddington, The Reverend Gary Bailey, and The Reverend David Currie.

The moderator, The Reverend Al Markuson, brought the moderator's address from Philippians 3:12-14. He spoke about Paul the Apostle, and Paul's charge to "press toward the prize of Jesus Christ." He encouraged the congregants to "Rise up and fight the good fight and finish the race for the work of Our Lord, Jesus Christ." In honor of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Albemarle Conference, the moderator presented attendees with a gift: a pen, magnet, notepad and 2020 calendar planner in remembrance of the day. The moderator recognized Sister Sandi White of Hickory Chapel Church who shared several highlights from the past 75 years in celebration of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Albemarle Conference's service to the region.

Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. led the session in singing an offertory hymn, "Trust in Jesus." The Reverend John Mark Windley led the offertory prayer. Reverend John Mark Windley and Brother Andrew Pelletier served as ushers.

The moderator appointed the following temporary committees. Sister Lynn Paul and Sister Kathy Cahoon were appointed to the Memorial Committee. The Reverend Keith Pelletier and The Reverend David Furlough were appointed to the Resolutions Committee.

After a short intermission, the Conference continued with the Business Session. The Moderator, The Reverend Al Markuson asked to be excused for the purpose of a funeral at his home church and Assistant Moderator, The Reverend Royce Reynolds presided over the remainder of the Conference.

Vacant Officer and Board positions were announced, and the Moderator asked for nominations from the floor. The following appointments were made either by nomination or volunteer and accepted by acclamation being duly voted upon:

The Moderator asked for the Treasurer's report which was given by Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. He reported a General Fund balance of \$3,973.10 and a Mission's Fund Balance of \$11,103.96.11. Brother Jones moved that the report be accepted and the motion for acceptance was seconded. There was a question raised regarding the purpose of the Mission Fund. Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. treasurer explained that the funds proceeds were earmarked for Mission work within the Albemarle Conference as needed. Being no further discussion the treasurer's report was accepted as presented.

The Moderator called for old business:

• The Belhaven Church property is currently for sale and any interested party should contact Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr.

The Moderator then called for new business and there was none.

A motion was made by Brother Lloyd Jones. Jr., seconded by The Reverend Keith Pelletier and passed to close the business session.

The Conference Worship Service began with Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. leading the session in singing "He Keeps Me Singing." The Choir from the host church provided special music, singing "O Lamb of God." The Moderator then introduced The Reverend David Young, Pastor of Mt. Tabor OFWB Church, Creswell, NC to bring the Worship Message. The Reverend Young spoke from 1 Thessalonians 2:1. He spoke on the "Roll of the Pastor", using Paul the Apostle as the example. He encouraged pastors in attendance to "stick with the stuff (gospel.)" He ended by asking those in attendance to be bold about the gospel. The Reverend Young closed with prayer.

The Conference Memorial Service was led by Sister Lynn Paul who used 1 Corinthians 15:55-57 for scripture reading and recognized the names of six deceased members. Sister Kathy Cahoon led the session in prayer for those being remembered who included: Brother Octavious Wallace, Jr., Sister Sally Matthews, Sister Doris Rodrick, Brother Hubert Jackson, Brother Phil Armstrong, Jr. and Brother Wesley Spencer.

The Moderator called for the Resolutions Committee report which was given by The Reverend Keith Pelletier. Two resolutions were presented (see Resolution Committee Report) for acceptance, seconded and duly voted upon and passed.

The Moderator recognized The Reverend John Mark Windley, who led the Conference in the closing prayer and blessing of the meal. The Conference then enjoyed lunch and fellowship with the host church.

# Sunday, April 7, 2019

The Executive Committee met briefly following the Annual Conference Revival at Union Chapel FWB Church, Plymouth, NC for the purpose of determining a convenient date to meet to address several items. Upon mutual agreement, the Executive Committee will meet on Thursday evening, April 11, 2019 at Mt. Zion FWB Church, Roper NC at 6:00 pm.

# Thursday, April 11, 2019 6:00 pm

The Executive Committee met at Mt. Zion Church, Roper NC. Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. opened with prayer.

# Items for discussion:

- April 16, 2019 Pine Level FWB Church meeting.... attending will be Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr., The Reverend Al Markuson, The Reverend Royce Reynolds, and possibly The Reverend Jim Skipper.
- Discussion regarding concerns amid rumors of proposed revisions to portions of the OFWB Covenant, Articles of Faith, Constitution and Bylaws, specifically around the wording pertaining to "from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages"
- General feeling of group is that any wording regarding alcohol should not be changed.
- Group consensus that the current Covenant has been passed down as our heritage, and as such valid concerns exist for any changes
- The Reverend Al Markuson distributed copies of the Convention Executive Committee's proposed
  constitutional amendments for review prior to May 2019 Convention. There were concerns about the late
  date for suggesting changes to the Constitution and Bylaws along with the resulting lack of time for
  delegates to consider any such changes, as well as the process for such changes.
- All these issues require lots of prayer.

#### Other items discussed:

Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. asked the Moderator, The Reverend Al Markuson to inquire of the Convention if there were any type of consolidated letters/reports available to reduce the burden of paperwork for clerks reporting to both the Conference and Convention.

St. Paul OFWB Church, Elizabeth City, NC has made a request to withdraw from the Albemarle Conference and the Denomination via a November 19, 2018 email and letter.

Belhaven Property - Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. is still working on disposition of said property.

75<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference will be held Oct. 9, 2019. Upon request, Hickory Chapel OFWB Church, Ahoskie NC will host the conference. The Executive Committee will consider methods of acknowledgment of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and discussed possible means.

Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. made a motion to adjourn, seconded by The Reverend Royce Reynolds. The Reverend Al Markuson closed with prayer.

#### September 3, 2019 6:00 pm

The Executive Committee met at Mt. Zion Church, Roper, NC for the purpose of planning the upcoming 75<sup>th</sup>. Annual Session of the Albemarle Conference to be held at Hickory Chapel, OFWB Church, Ahoskie NC on October 9, 2019. The session will convene at 9:30 a.m. The Reverend Al Markuson called the meeting to order and The Reverend Royce Reynolds opened with prayer. The Conference Program was discussed and planned accordingly. There will be three (3) Board Positions to be replaced and all Officer Positions will need to be filled at the Conference.

The Reverend Al Markuson shared that The Reverend David Young has met with the Ordaining Council and was given Ordination Credentials in the Albemarle Conference. The Reverend Young has requested membership with the Conference. After discussion, The Reverend Royce Reynolds made a motion to accept The Reverend David Young into membership of the Conference. Brother Wayne Britt seconded the motion which was duly voted and passed unanimously. The Reverend Young will be notified of his acceptance and his membership will be duly recognized by the right hand of fellowship at the Conference.

There was a motion by Sister Shirley Pelletier that the Moderator and/or his designee be allowed to use up to \$400.00 of Conference funds for the purpose of purchasing tokens of remembrance for Conference attendees in recognition of the Conference's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The Reverend Royce Reynolds seconded the motion. After discussion of ideas, the motion was duly voted and passed.

The Executive Committee directed the clerk to report to the Convention office the number of information packets needed for the Conference. The clerk was instructed to ask that the Convention encourage Denominational Ministry Directors to be in attendance as this would be a time of celebration of 75 years of service to the Albemarle Area.

There was a reminder that the minutes of the Conference session will be recorded and presented to the Executive Committee for approval at a later date following Conference.

Other items discussed:

- Brother Lloyd Jones, Jr. made a motion, seconded by Brother Wayne Britt that The Reverend Royce Reynolds attempt to investigate the deed of property for the St. Paul property in Elizabeth City. Duly voted and passed. The Reverend Reynolds will report back to the Executive Committee.
- Upon request from the Convention President to The Reverend Al Markuson, a motion was made by Sister Shirley Pelletier that The Reverend Al Markuson and The Reverend Royce Reynolds be named as representatives from the Albemarle Conference to the Committee established at the May 2019 OFWB Convention to consider revisions to the OFWB Covenant and Articles of Faith. Brother Wayne Britt seconded the motion. After discussion, the motion was duly voted and passed.
- The Reverend Al Markuson also discussed the potential for the Albemarle Conference to have an online
  presence via web page or newsletter on the OFWB Convention's webpage. The Executive Committee
  discussed the potential and will move forward as information becomes available.

The Albemarle Conference Ministerial Fellowship will meet on September 23, 2019 at 6:00 pm at the Golden Skillet Restaurant in Plymouth, NC. All ministers will be notified and invited by letter.

After a time of announcements and prayer requests, the meeting was adjourned with prayer by Brother Wayne Britt.

# Resolutions Committee Report to the 2019 Albemarle Conference

#### **Resolution One**

Whereas, every living member of the Churches of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists has freely entered into a Covenant relationship with God and with each other<sup>1</sup>, and

Whereas by accepting the Original Free Will Baptist Church Covenant we covenant to abstain ... "from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages"<sup>1</sup>, and

Whereas, any attempt to alter, abandon or make optional our adherence to the Original Free Will Baptist Church Covenant would put us, and every living Original Free Will Baptist, in the position of breaking our own covenant with God and with each other, and

Whereas, an estimated 88,000 Americans die from alcohol related causes annually, making alcohol the third leading preventable cause of death<sup>2</sup>, and

Whereas in 2010, alcohol misuse cost the United States \$249 billion<sup>2</sup>, and

Whereas, behaviors and attitudes developed by youth and young adults influence them for a lifetime, and

Whereas, more than 10 percent of U.S. children live with a parent with an alcohol problem<sup>2</sup>, and

Whereas researchers estimate that, in the U.S., 1825 college students die annually from alcohol related unintentional accidents, 696,000 college students are assaulted annually by another student who has been drinking, 97,000 students annually report alcohol related sexual assault or rape, and 1 in 4 college students report academic consequences from drinking<sup>2</sup>, and

Whereas, every 50 minutes in the United States a person dies in a motor vehicle crash involving an alcohol impaired driver<sup>3</sup>, and

Whereas, in 2016 one million American drivers were arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol<sup>3</sup>, and

Whereas, in 2016 one-hundred-eleven million Americans self-reported driving while under the influence of alcohol<sup>3</sup>, and

Whereas, no one plans to abuse alcohol, become dependent on alcohol or to become alcoholic<sup>4</sup>, and

Whereas, the distinction between use and abuse of alcohol is a subjective measure and is different and unpredictable for each individual, and

Whereas, for some people the only way to avoid alcohol abuse, dependency, alcoholism or other negative alcohol related outcomes is to never take their first drink<sup>4</sup>, and

Whereas, many Original Free Will Baptists have personal experience, or knowledge and anecdotal evidence of the negative effect of alcohol use on themselves, their families, churches and communities,

Therefore, Be It Resolved that the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists opposes, rejects and condemns any effort to allow any "sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages" to be accepted or permitted among Original Free Will Baptists.
