



Moderator called the body to order and Bro. Jimmie Lee Chronister led the congregation in singing "Land Where Living Waters Flow." Bro. Richard Brown led in prayer. The following business session was then conducted:

Motion made and seconded to remove from the table the Resolution that would combine the Antioch and the Quarterly conferences into one body with one set of officers. So carried. After discussion the question was called for and the resolution carried.

A resolution was made for the Executive Board to take the responsibility of uniting the work of the Association and Quarterly into one body. So carried.

Motion made and seconded to give the Host Church a standing vote of thanks. So carried.

The Executive Board gave the following report: Bro. George Latham was selected as board chairman and Bro. Johnny McCoy as secretary. They examined and recommended the receiving of Bro. Vernon Rosemond into the Antioch pending a letter of recommendation from Arkansas Valley Association in Oklahoma. And they recommended the receiving of Bro. Jimmy Lee Chronister back into the Antioch pending a letter of recommendation from the Little Missouri River Association in Arkansas. Motion made and seconded to accept this report. So carried.

The following reports were given from the committees and the body accepted their reports and dismissed the committes:

Temperance Committee: We, the committee on temperance, wish to continue to keep the beliefs of the Free Will Baptists by being temperate in all things; James 1:12 says "Blessed is the man

tht endureth temptation, for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life which the Lord hath promised to them that love him."

Sunday School: We have found all churches have Sunday School and we encourage each church member to attend Sunday School this coming year. We also encourage each church to prayer-

fully consider having good qualified teachers for Sunday School. II Tim. 2:15 "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

Finance: We your committee on finance find all 32 churches of our association have reported with \$70 each making a total of \$2240. There was a previous balance of \$294.31 brought forward making a grand total of \$2,534.31. We also find sufficient funds to pay all expenses and to print the minutes.

Non-Represented and Union of Churches: There were 28 churches who wanted to be represented by delegates and 4 by letter only (Center Valley, Clarksville, Faith, and Moreland).

Obituary: This committee finds that 20 saints have departed from this walk of life and have gone to a better place. This past church year we are reminded of the importance of living a Christian Life. The Resolution gave their final report. The Pulpit committee was also dismissed.

Bro. Fred Scott gave a report from the Home Mission Board. The body heard the reading of the minister's diary and made corrections. The minutes of this meeting were read and approved as

Sis. Lila Webb gave a report on the past Associational Revival. The body voted to send all revival monies to the Assistant Clerk. So carried.

The body elected Bro. Bobby Joe Chronister to preach the Thursday night message and Bro. Jimmy Lee Chronister to be the back up speaker.

The body then voted to select the speaker for the Friday 11:00 a.m. service. Bro. Jimmy Lee Chronister was elected and Bro. Johnny McCoy is to be his alternate.

Bro. Benny Mahan spoke in reference to our CTS program. The meeting was adjourned in prayer by Bro. Bill Williams.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the word of God as our rule of Faith and Practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this Solemn Covenant.

1. We promise by His grace to love and obey him in all things to avoid the appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusement and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanctions of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men. -7-

2. We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer devotion and religious worship and by self denial, faith and good works endeavor to grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

3. We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church, conference, public worship, and the observance of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the Church, of its poor and its benevolent work.

4. We agree to accept Christian Admonitions and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the Church and of the Gospel.

5. We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and

Christian obligations and enterprise supreme, counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and telling that God's will may be done in us as in Heaven.

6. To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprise, the support of missions, the success of Sunday School and evangelistic effort of the salvation of the world, and may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

CONSTITUTION

From a long series of experiences we, the Churches of Jesus Christ, being regularly baptized upon the profession of our faith in Christ, are convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a reunion and a communion among us, and to preserve and maintain a correspondence and each other, we therefore propose to keep orders and rules of our Association, according to the following plan or form of government:

1. This Association shall be composed of members chosen

by the different churches of our union, and each church is entitled to three messengers. All ordained ministers, deacons, their wives and church clerks of our faith and order in the bounds of the Antioch Association shall be members, when present. In the event of the failure of part or all of the elected delegation to report by 1:30 p.m. Saturday that said vacancy be filled, providing some

official or delegate from said church recommended others for said vacancies.

2. Letters from the different churches shall be prepared, read to and approved by each church conferences assembled, signed by the moderator and clerk before presentation to the Association. Also to express their number in fellowship, the number received by experience, letter, recommendation or restoration, dismissed, excluded, and that have died since the last Association. Also the moderator, amount paid the pastor.

3. The members thus chosen and convened, to be denominated the Antioch Association of Free Will Baptists, being composed of the churches of parts of Pope, Johnson, Yell, Logan, Conway, Perry, Searcy, Pulaski and Newton counties, the Association to have no power to lord it over God's heritage nor to have any ecclesiastical power over churches reserving the right of withdrawing from any church acting disorderly.

4. The Association shall have a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk and treasurer and assistant clerk to be chosen by the suffrage of members present. No elected officer may succeed himself with the exception of the clerk and treasurer and assistant clerk. No person may serve on more than one board of the Association at the same time; but he may, however, serve on a board and a committee or an office at the same time.

5. New churches may be admitted into the Association by letter or by delegates, if found to be orthodox in faith of Free Will Baptists, the moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.
6. Every motion made and seconded shall become under the

consideration of the Association unless withdrawn by the members, making it.

7. The Association shall have a fund for its support and obligations which shall be supplied by fees from the different churches. The money shall be deposited into the hands of the Associational Clerk/Treasurer and he shall be accountable to the Association for all money received by him until it is paid out as directed by the Association. The current fee to be sent with the church letter to the Association is \$70.00 which shall be broken down as follows:

A. \$25.00 of each church's fee is to go to the Antioch

Association fund for minutes and expenses of the Association.

B. \$10.00 of each church's fee is to go to the Executive

Board for expenses which they incur as a board.

C. \$35.00 of each church's fee is to be sent to the State

Office to pay the Association's fees to the State Association and the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

8. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes, and that we pay our clerk \$100.00 for his services and urge that the minutes be printed and mailed within 60 days after the Association. Any church hosting the Association shall be paid by the clerk \$200.00 to help defray the cost of the hosting the Annual Association.

9. The Association shall have a fund for its support, which shall be supplied by voluntary contributions of the different churches, whose duty it shall be to send it by the hands of the messengers, which money shall be deposited in the hands of the treasurer for that purpose, and he shall be accountable to the Association for all money received by him until paid out as they may direct.

10. The Association, in case of failure of any church to attend, may inquire into the cause.

11. It is the duty of the Association to see after the union of churches.

12. This Association shall have the right to discipline its ministers concerning the following:

A. Should a minister take his letter from a church in this Association and neglect or refuse to place it in some other church in this Association for a period of one year, his name shall be dropped from the roll of ministers, his credentials revoked, and this Association will not recognize any work that may come under his hands as a minister after such time.

B. Any minister in good standing in the Association desiring to pastor a church outside of this Association will be granted upon request a letter of recommendation within a year from his leaving this association.

C. Any desciplined minister who wishes to be reinstated must be united with some church in this association; have an endorsement from that church; and receive an endorsement from the examining committee. At such time the clerk shall be authorized to restore said credentials.

D. This Association will not consider for ordination or accept into the Association any minister who is divorced and remarried or any minister who is married to a woman who is divorced and remarried. We believe this is in keeping with I Timothy 3:2, 12 and Titus 1:6.

E. When the need arises for a minister to be disciplined, the

church of which he is a member shall be responsible along with the Executive Board of the Association.

13. This Association shall maintain a committee of five to be elected by the Body, which shall be known as the Examining Council for Ordination. Those who are to be ordained must—
A. Have preached at least one year in the bounds of the Association.

B. Must be set apart and have an endorsement for ordination by the church of which they are a member.

C. Must have the endorsement of the Ordaining Council, or majority of a legally called meeting of the Council.

D. Lack of endorsement by either of the above authorities will hold up an ordination.

E. No one can serve on the committee unless he fully believes in this plan of work.

F. This committee shall report to this body, while in session,

the misconduct or disregard of any rule, or ordinance set forth and practiced by the Antioch Association; the said party shall be dealt with accordingly.

G. Any minister coming into the Association to pastor a church of the Association is required to come before the Examining Committee. It shall be the duty of the churches to comply with this resolution.

14. Amendments to this plan of government may be made at any time when a majority may deem it necessary.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. GOD — We believe in one true and living triune God, composed of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, equal in divine essence, purpose, power and glory. (St. John 1:1; I Cor. 8:6; I John 5:7; St. John 10:30)

2. CHRIST — We believe that Jesus Christ is the divine Son of God. Was with the Father and the Holy Spirit at the time of the creation, left the Courts of Heaven and came to this earth. Took upon Himself the form of humanity, sin accepted, by being born of the Virgin Mary, manifested His power, was crucified, placed in

Joseph's new tomb, arose from the dead and on the third day, completing the great plan of salvation, walked and talked with His disciples, publicly ascended up to Heaven, and that He descended again to gather His jewels home. (Isaiah 9:6; St. John 1:14; Luke 1:26-28; Matt. 14:13-21; Mark 16:9-19; Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:9-12; Mark 15:22-41)

3. HOLY SPIRIT — We beleive that the Holy Spirit visited true believers in all ages and especially since the ascension of the Son back to the Father, and His coming on the day of Pentecost. Has taken up His office work among all nations of people as a Divine Reproved, Comforter, and Guide. (Judges 6:34; 11:29; St. John 16:8-14; Isaiah 63:10-12; Eph. 4:30; Acts 8:17-20)

4. THE BIBLE — We believe the Bible, King James version, which is composed of the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, was given by inspiration of God, is our waybill from earth to heaven, and only infallible rule of faith and practice. (II Peter 1:19-21; II Tim. 3:14-17; Daniel 10:21; Acts 1:16-17; Matt. 21:42)

5. THE FALL OF MAN — We believe that God created man good, gave him a just law by which he should be governed with promises of reward for faithfulness and with penalties and punishment for disobedience. Gave man power of free moral

agency to choose the right and reject the wrong. But our first parents heeded the voice of the great enemy of souls, voluntarily transgressed the law of God, fell with their posterity, under the just penalty of the same, and were unable of their own power to extricate or save themselves from the dilemma into which they had fallen. God gave them the hope of salvation through the coming of Christ. (Gen. 1:27; Gen. 2:16-17; Rom. 11:11-35; Psalms 37:24; Rom. 5:15)

6. REDEMPTION, SALVATION, ADOPTION - We believe that Jesus Christ by His brith, death, burial, ressurrection, and ascension, paid the purchase price of the redemption of the whole human race, arranged a pardon for all who come to him upon gospel terms; and a law of adoption into the Kingdom of Heaven, and an eternal inheritance into the glorified Kingdom above. (Heb. 9:12; Gal. 3:13; 4:4-5; Titus 2:14; Heb. 1:4; St. John 3:16; Isa. 45:22) 7. CONDITION OF SALVATION — We believe that all persons dying in infancy and all idiots are saved by the atoning merits of the Son of God without any act upon their part; that persons coming the year of accountability, transgressing the law of God, must upon their part exercise faith in Jesus Christ through repentance toward God, at the completion of which pardon takes place in the mind of the Father and glory the Holy Spirit they pass through an ordeal of regeneration, are washed in the blood of the Lamb and are planted in the Kingdom of Christ. (St. John 3; Matt. 19:13-22; Il Cor. 7:10; Luke 18:16-17; St. John 4:11-16; Psalms 98:3)

8. SALVATION FREE — We believe that God desires the salvation of all; Christ died for all; the gospel invites all; the Holy

Spirit strives with all and whosoever will may come and be saved upon the terms of the gospel. (I Peter 1:13-25, 2:9-24; Rev. 22:17)

9. BAPTISM — We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of believers in water, in the name of the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit, in which is represented the burial and ressurrection of Christ; also represents our death to sin, and only those who have been ordained are qualified to administer the same (Matt. 3:14-16; I Peter 3:21; St. John 3:23; Acts 10:47; Matt. 28:19)

10. COMMUNION AND FEET WASHING — We believe the Lord's Supper and the washing of feet are ordinances for the gospel of Christ, the Lord's Supper was instituted by our Savior to commemorate His broken body and shed blood for the sins of the world, and to show our remembrance of Him till He comes. All Christians have a right to the Lord's Supper and should be invited: "Let a man examine himself and so let him eat."

The washing of feet was instituted by our Lord at the same time that the supper was instituted as an act of humility to show our love for each other and both ordinances should be perpetuated by all Christians until His second coming. (Luke 22:19-20; I Cor. 11:20-29; St. John 13:1-13; Matt. 26:26-29)

11. THE LORD'S DAY — We believe that the Lord's Day (Sunday) should be observed as a day of rest for worship of God; we should abstain from all sinful amusements and secular employments, works of mercy and piety excepted. (Exodus 20:11; Exodus 31:12-18; Deut. 5:12-15; Ezek. 20:12; Matt. 28:1; Luke 23:56; Acts 13:42-43; Mark 2:27; I Cor. 16:1-2; Rev. 1:10)

12. CALL TO THE MINISTRY — We believe in a divine call of the ministry; that God in His goodness and power of grace, impressed His ministers with the burden of lost souls to the extend that the call becomes irresistible with personal contentment; that when they yield to the call and exercise their native gifts according to the scriptures with a full reliance upon Him, He accompanied them in the person of the Holy Spirit to guide them in the way of truth, and to bless their labors according to His purpose. (Jonah 1:1; Jer. 1:5; Mark 3:14; Acts 1:22-26; Matt. 28:19)-

13. THE INVISIBLE CHURCH — We believe that the Invisible

or Spiritual Church is the redeemed in the aggregate, is the family of God, is composed of all true Christians of every congregation from righteous able to the restitution of all things, from every kindred nation, tongue, and people. (Eph. 3:16-21; Heb. 12:22-23; I Peter 2:5; Eph. 2:20-22; Acts 2:47; Matt. 10:18)

14. THE INVISIBLE CHURCH — We believe that a visible church of Christ is a congregation of faithful men and women, having obtained fellowship with the Lord and with each other, agreeing to keep up a good discipline and doctrine according to the rules of the gospel. (II Thes. 1:1; Acts 16:16; III John 1:10; Matt. 18:17; Acts 20:28; Rev. 1:4-11, 20)

15. PERSEVERANCE — We believe that all true believers in Christ should persevere in divine grace, and in knowledge of the truth and that God's grace is sufficient to help them to overcome all the obstacles of life and that of all the combined forces of the great enemy of souls on earth and in Hell (or in his eternal abode) aren't able to pluck them from His hand so long as they walk in the path of duty; but those who sidestep and willfully refuse or neglect to perform their duty, they would backslide and if persistently continued would be eternally lost. (II Cor. 9:10; II Peter 1:4-8; I Peter 2:2; Rom 8:35-39; Apostasy; II Peter 1:8-9; I Cor. 10:1-31;

Heb. 12:15-17; I John 5:16; Heb. 6:16; I Tim. 4:1-2; Heb. 3:12; St. John 15:1-7; Matt. 12:31-32)

16. CHRIST THE HEAD OF THE CHURCH — We believe that Christ is the great head of the Church, and that the government of the local church is with the body. (Col. 1:18-19; Matt. 16:18; Heb. 12:23; Matt. 21:42; Eph. 1:22; Acts 16:4-5)

17. SANCTIFICATION — Sanctification is the work of God's grace by which the soul is cleansed from all sin and wholly consecrated to Christ. It takes place in the regeneration. The Christian can and should abide in this state to the end of life, constantly growing in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ (I Cor. 6:11; II Thes. 2:13; Heb. 12:14; Phil. 3:21; I Thes. 5:9-23; St. John 17:17-19; II Tim. 2:20-21)

18. THE SOUL — We believe that the soul is endless, hence does not die with the body, but immediately after death enters into a conscious state of happiness or misery according to the spiritual character here possessed. (Phil. 1:23; Luke 23:43; Rev. 6:9; Luke 16:19-25; Matt. 10:28)

19. THE RESURRECTION — We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of righteous and wicked. When the resurrection shall take place, the soul and body shall be reunited, the righteous shall

be received into everlasting happiness to reign with God forever; but the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment. (Matt. 28:6; St. John 5:28-29; I Cor. 15:51-58)

20. JUDGEMENT — We believe that there will be a general universal judgement when all men shall be judged according to their works whether they be good or bad, and that immediately thereafter

the wicked shall enter into everlasting punishment and the righteous into eternal happiness. (II Thes. 1:4-9; Rev. 14:31; Acts 17:31; Luke 16:23; Rev. 21:8; II Cor. 6:10; Matt. 12:36-37; Rev. 20:12-

CHURCH DISCIPLINE

When seven or more Christians wish to be united into a Free Will Baptist Church organic body, a committee of three or more, composed of one ordained minister, one deacon, and one layman, with others, who are members of churches within the bounds of the Association where said church is being organized by authority here invested, shall examine the applicants, as to faith and doctrine of the Free Will Baptists and if found to be orthodox, will proceed as follows:

(1) The Bible is presented as the only rule of faith and practice.(2) The Church Covenant is read.

(3) A prayer of consecration is offered.

(4) The hand of fellowship is given.

(5) The church then proceeds to elect its officers: A clerk, a treasurer, a pastor, and two deacons. Other deacons may be elected and ordained as the church grows or when a vacancy occurs.

Pastor — The pastor is to be elected by a majority vote of members present at a regular or stated meeting. He is to be moderator at all church meetings when present and exercise all rights as far as his office provides.

Clerk and Treasurer — The clerk and treasurer are to be elected annually. They are to keep a record of all business proceedings of the church, roll of membership, minutes of conference meetings, and all funds collected and paid out by the membership.

Deacons — Special care should be taken by the church in the selection of deacons. I Tim. 3:8-13 gives some of the qualifications pertaining to deacons that should be heeded. They are elected by a majority vote of the church and ordained to office by a committee of three ordained, one of which should be a minister. They serve their church during their lifetime unless relieved by the church for some grievance or disorderly act.

Duties of Deacons — They are to assist at baptizings, the Lord's Supper, and Feet Washing, conduct religious meetings, moderate church when the conference by a majority vote grants the request, support of the church in its benevolence, look after the spiritual

interest of the church in general.

Members Received — Applicants are received into the church

the church

by a majority vote of members present in a church conference if they acknowledge their sins forgiven and believe in Jesus Christ.

Members Dismissed — Members may receive their letter only when in good standing with the church; and they cease to be members of the church when the conference by a majority vote grants the request and authorizes the clerk to write a letter, signed by the moderator and clerk. Request for letters of dismission should be made at a conference meeting or a writing through the church clerk, stating the cause for the request.

Members dismissed, dropped, excluded or severed in any other way of the church. it should be for legal and just cause and done in church conference by a majority vote of members present at a regular meeting.

A church may be disbanded for the same rules under which they were organized, when they cease to function properly as churches, failing to hold a conference meeting for the period of one

year and by consent of the majority of the members living near the church at one time.

Quarterly meetings and annual associations are organized and disbanded by the same rules of authority as the local church, except when a majority of the churches vote to unite with another quarterly meeting or association.

RULES OF ORDER

1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and closed with a prayer.

2. Those who speak shall rise, address the moderator, and personal reflection shall be avoided.

3. All motions made and seconded shall be open for discussion but debate may be shut off at any time by a majority of the members of the Association.

4. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and the vote taken separately.

5. Motion made and lost shall not be recorded in the minutes, unless so ordered at the time.

6. No one shall speak more than once on the same subject without special leave from the body.
7. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present.
8. No member shall absent himself without leave of the

moderator.

9. At the future sessions of the Association, arrangements

shall be made so as to insure two sermons, or other devotional exercises which shall be equivalent thereto; and the chair shall announce just before adjournment who shall fill the stand at the next meeting.

10. Alterations may be made in these rules at any regular meeting of the Association.

10. Report of committees appointed at last Association and other unfinished business.
