ASSOCIATIONAL PROCEEDINGS

THURSDAY EVENING

The fifth annual session of the Appalachian Association of Free Will Baptist convened at the Westview F. W. B. Church of Johnson City, Tenn., on August 2, 1973, at 7:30 P.M. The house was called to order by Rev. W. C. Amos. Rev. Jerry Presley led the congregation in singing, "An Old Account Settled". An altar prayer was led by several ministers who were called forward by Rev. Amos. The ministers, deacons, and delegates were recognized and a motion carried to seat them as the voting power of this session. Visiting Ministers, Rev. Carl Osborn, Rev. Elmer Carter, Rev. Bill Van Winkle, Rev. Joe England, and Rev. Herbert Hughes were recognized and seated as advisory council. Rev. Amos presented the moderator, Rev. Richard Adams. Reading from I Peter 2:9, Rev. Adams spoke of the unlimited opportunities we have to win the lost to Christ, and praised the Lord for the way He is now using Free Will Baptist. Prayer was offered by Rev. Guy Foster.

The Moderator mentioned a need to amend the Constitution as to the days of the week when the annual meetings would convene. A motion carried to table this matter until the business session.

Rev. W. C. Amos, Rev. Talmadge Brown, and Rev. Guy Foster were appointed by the moderator to serve as the Committee on Committees.

The song service included congregational hymns, "I'll Fly Away" and "At Calvary", and a solo, "Pearly White City" by Rev. Jerry Presley. The moderator introduced as the Key Note Speaker, Rev. D. C. Byrd, Pastor of the Berea F. W. B. Church of Johnson City, Tenn. Reading St. John 11:25, 26, Rev. Byrd used as a subject, "Living to Live Again". Using many Bible characters as examples, he brought out the points that we must be born again, we must believe God's word, and we must obey by faith. Rev. Byrd closed with prayer.

The report of the Committee on Committees was presented by Rev. Amos. A motion was made to accept the recommendations of the report and to elect these committees by acclamation. The motion carried. The moderator recognized Rev. Jack Ward, President of the Ministers' Conference who appointed a Resolutions Committee.

Rev. Joe England offered the benediction for this evenings session.

FRIDAY MORNING

The Friday morning session was called to order at 10:00 A.M. Rev. Jerry Presley led the congregation singing. The morning devotions was given by Rev. W. C. Amos. Reading II Cor. 14:7-10, he asked us to consider the question, "What is the Purpose of Our Meeting?", and using Scriptures he gave the answer, "that we might working together, glorify the name of Jesus Christ".

The report of the Executive Board was read by Rev. W. L. Kell and adopted. A report from the Home for Children was presented by the Superintendent, Rev. James E. Raper. He expressed appreciation for the increased support from this Association, and gave a brief summary of the progress being made at the Home. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive his report as information, and a standing vote of appreciation was given for him. The Report of the Statistician was presented by Rev. Jerry Presley. The report was adopted.

A five minute recess was declared by the moderator.

The Worship service opened with the congregation singing "Are You Washed in the Blood?", and prayer by Rev. Talmadge Brown. An offering was received for the Home for Children in the amount of \$53.23.

To bring the morning message, the moderator introduced Rev. Carl Steele, Pastor of the Keystone F. W. B. Church in Johnson City, Tenn. Reading the 150th Psalm, Rev. Steele used the subject, "Excited", and closed with a challenge that we all get excited about serving God.

Rev. Clarence Phillips offered prayer and the service was dismissed for lunch.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

The afternoon session opened at 1:30 P.M., with a congregational hymn, "Standing on the Promises". Rev. Rodney Bailey offered prayer. Devotions was given by Rev. Tommy Maines. After reading II Cor. 12:9 and praying, he spoke on the subject, "The Grace of God is Sufficient".

Treasurer's Report was read by Rev. Talmadge Brown, and adopted. The Report of the Home Missions Board read by Rev. D. C. Byrd was adopted. Tennessee State Home Missionaries, Rev. Bill Van Winkle of Murfreesboro, and Rev. Joe England of Crossville were introduced and each gave a brief report of the work they are doing in these cities. These reports were received as information. Rev. Talmadge Brown gave a report from the C T S Convention. The Appalachian Association had one team and four individual winners in state competitions this year. Diana Brown gave a report on the National competition. The reports were received. The report of the Superannuation Board read by Rev. W. C. Amos was adopted. Rev. Amos made a motion that the name, Superannuation Board, be changed to Retirement Board. Motion was seconded and carried. The Retirement Board recommended that the new program be reinstated as is. A motion was made to do this, and was seconded. An amendment to the motion carried to increase the amount \$2.50 more per month for each member participating. The motion with amendment carried. A motion was made that the Retirement Board send \$75.00 to Mr. Herman Hersey for operational expense of the new Department of Retirement and Insurance. Motion was seconded. The motion was amended to read, \$100.00 be sent, but taken from the Associational Treasury instead of the Retirement Board. The amended motion carried. Report of the Placement Committee was read by Rev. C. B. Shoemaker. The report was adopted. The report of the Resolutions Committee, read by Rev. W. L. Kell, was adopted. The recommendations of the Nominating Committee were presented by Rev. O. P. Stokes. Rev. Frank Thompson's resignation from the Ordaining Council was accepted, and each of the Committees recommendations were elected. A motion was made to remove from the table the Constitution change. Motion was seconded and carried. A motion was made to have the Constitution state that the annual Association would be held on Thursday and Friday instead of Monday and Tuesday. Motion carried. A motion carried to give \$100.00 to each of the state missionaries, Rev. Van Winkle and Rev. Joe England.

A motion carried to adjourn and Rev. W. L. Kell dismissed with prayer.

FRIDAY EVENING

The Friday evening session began at 7:30, P.M., with the congregation singing "Battle Hymn". Rev. D. C. Byrd prayed. The Report of the Ordaining Council was read by Rev. Eugene Deaton. A motion was made, seconded and carried to adopt the report and recommendations of the Ordaining Council. An offering was received for the general fund of the Association amounting to \$47.48. Rev. Guy Foster prayed the offertory prayer. Rev. Jerry Presley led the congregation in singing "He Keeps Me Singing" and special music was presented by Mr. Mike Wright singing, "In Times Like These" and "He Touched Me".

The moderator presented as the evening speaker, Rev. Carl Osborne, "a retired pastor" but a "re-fired preacher" now living in Unicoi, Tenn. Reading I Tim. 4:12-16 as a scripture text, Rev. Osborne spoke on the following points — the Preacher's Calling, the Preacher's Preparation, the Preacher's Life, and the Preacher's New Home. He closed his message with prayer.

Rev. O. P. Stokes presided over the Ordination Service. Rev. Eugene Deaton presented as candidates for Ordination, Rev. Daniel Foster, Rev. Rodney Bailey, and Rev. Hubert Haney. Each gave a testimony as to his personal salvation and the call of God to him to preach the Gospel. Rev. Guy Foster gave the charge reminding them that God must always be first, that they must be good soldiers, that they must prepare, have patience, obey God and act like a son of God. While the candidates knelt at the altar, the Ordaining Council laid hands on them and prayed with Rev. Carl Nelson leading the prayer. The wives and parents were asked to come forward, those receiving licenses were called forward, and the congregation enjoyed a time of fellowship together.

Rev. Terry Hopson offered prayer and the Appalachian Association adjourned.

Rev. Ermine Butler, chairman of the Resolutions Committee, made a motion that the Ministers' telephone numbers be printed in the minutes of the Association. Motion carried.

Rev. Carl Nelson made a motion to adjourn with an altar prayer.

CONSTITUTION OF THE APPALACHIAN ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

ARTICLE I

This Association shall be known as the Appalachian Association of the original Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II

The objects of this association shall be to promote unity, fraternity, fellowship, and co-operation, and to encourage and to engage in larger Christian enterprises that cannot be carried on by a single church, to combine and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptist within its bounds in one sacred effort to encourage and promote the general spread of the gospel, and the causes of the united program.

ARTICLE III

This association shall be composed of all ordained and licensed ministers, deacons, and delegates chosen and sent by each church in its bounds who shall be duly recommended by the church to which they belong.

1. Each church shall be entitled to five delegates regardless of membership. Any church with membership exceeding one hundred is entitled to one additional delegate per each thirty members exceeding one hundred.

ARTICLE IV

The method of support shall be two per cent of the general offerings from each church.

ARTICLE V

This association disclaims the right to exercise lordship over the churches, or to have any power which entitles it to infringe upon the internal affairs or rights of any of the churches composing it. Each church shall consider its internal affairs to be its own business.

1. An accused church has the same right as an individual in the church to have specific charges presented in writing, a fair opportunity for defense and to be considered innocent until proven guilty.
2. This association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegates.
3. Churches coming from another denomination will be carefully and satisfactorily examined as to doctrine before being received as members.

ARTICLE VI

It shall be the duty of the association to encourage a sound ministry such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour having made salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the gospel which is freely offered to all.

ARTICLE VII

The officers of this association shall be moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, treasurer, to be elected for one year terms.

1. The moderator and assistant moderator shall not succeed themselves in election: however, the assistant moderator may be elected moderator.
2. The clerk of the association shall be paid twenty-five dollars for each quarterly meeting and seventy-five dollars for the annual association.

ARTICLES VIII

The executive board shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, treasurer, and three members elected from the floor, one for three years, one for two years, and one for one year.

ARTICLE IX

The ordaining council is to be elected by the association. The number of this council is to be five members elected to serve in rotating terms to wit; one to five years. The council is to have interim authority to ordain ministers and has charge of investigation of ministers. They shall report their work quarterly to the association. No member of this council is to succeed himself in election.

ARTICLE X

This association shall adopt the Treatise of the present Faith and Government of the National Treatise of the Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE XI

This association shall be governed by the rules laid down in Roberts Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XII

This association will have a quarterly meeting on the third Saturday of each quarter.

ARTICLE XIII

This association shall meet annually on the Thursday evening and concluding on Friday evening of such week in July or August as is selected by the Executive Board.

- 1 This association shall sponsor the following auxiliaries: Sunday School, Church Training Service, Ladies Auxiliary and Master Men.

ARTICLE XIV

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any meeting of the association.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. **GOD:** We believe that there is only one true and living God who is personally the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. There is one God and one mediator between God and man, and man Christ Jesus who gave Himself a ransom for all to be testified in due time. (I Timothy 2:5).
2. **THE HOLY SCRIPTURE:** We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His church. All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction and instruction in righteousness.
3. **ORIGINAL APOSTASY:** We believe that Adam was created holy but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity and consequently involved his posterity in sin. "And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took the fruit thereof and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat." (Genesis 3:6).
4. **FREE GRACE:** We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings that the gospel is the power of God unto salvation, that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation. "For there is no difference between Jews and Greeks: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Him." (Romans 10:12).
5. **CHRISTIAN FAITH:** We believe that Christian faith is the belief in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and redeemer of the world and in the divinity of the Holy Scripture, that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not on the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth in him." (John 3:36).
6. **REPENTANCE:** We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which produces Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin. "Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but ye were made sorry, but ye sorrowed to repentance: for ye were made sorry after a Godly manner, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing. For Godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death." (II Corinthians 7:9-10).
7. **FREE WILL:** We believe that the human will is free and that men have ability to reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scripture. "He that shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Micah 6:8).
8. **PERSEVERENCE:** We do not believe under gospel dispensation, any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally. But that there is the possibility of apostasy in every man. (Hebrews 6:6).
9. **GOOD WORKS:** We believe that good works are the results of faith and not necessity; that those who have faith will do works of righteousness while those who have not faith cannot do anything pleasant or acceptable to God. "Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them." (Matthew 7:19-20).

10. **CHRISTIAN BAPTISM:** We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost; that baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without faith in the Subject who receives it. "Therefore we are buried with Him by baptism into death: that like Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:4).
11. **THE LORD'S SUPPER:** We believe the supper was instituted by our Savior as a commemorative ordinance, that it was instituted regardless of name or denomination. "But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body." (I Corinthians 11:28-29).
12. **FEEET WASHING:** We believe that washing the saint's feet was a command of our Savior and that His followers ought to practice the same. We urge the pastors of all churches to encourage the practical obedience of this command, especially among the members of our churches. "If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; we also ought to wash one another's feet." (John 13:14).
13. **THE GOSPEL:** We believe it to be the duty of all churches to support the gospel. "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel live of the gospel." (I Corinthians 9:14).

BY-LAWS

- ARTICLE 1—A session of this association shall meet annually.
- ARTICLE 2—This association shall be opened and closed with suitable devotions.
- ARTICLE 3—There shall be no conversation by members, one with another, so as to interrupt business while in session.
- ARTICLE 4—Every person wishing to speak, shall first arise and address the moderator, and be recognized before speaking.
- ARTICLE 5—No member shall interrupt another while speaking.
- ARTICLE 6—Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.
- ARTICLE 7—No member shall speak on any one subject more than twice, except by permission of the moderator.
- ARTICLE 8—Every motion made and seconded shall be acted upon unless withdrawn by the person who made it.
- ARTICLE 9—A motion before the house must be acted upon before another motion can be made.
- ARTICLE 10—On all motions acted upon, the majority vote shall prevail.
- ARTICLE 11—The moderator shall have the privilege to speak on any subject as any other member, provided the chair is filled.
- ARTICLE 12—No member shall absent himself from the body without permission of the moderator.
- ARTICLE 13—Any person transgressing these by-laws shall be admonished by the moderator.
- ARTICLE 14—No less than nine (9) members shall constitute a quorum.
- ARTICLE 15—It shall be the duty of everybody belonging to this association to send a letter, along with dues, to each Session, reporting in same its work and statistics.
