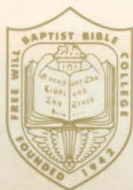

ASSOCIATIONAL PROCEEDINGS

THURSDAY EVENING

The sixth annual session of the Appalachian Association of Free Will Baptist convened at the First Free Will Baptist Church of Morrison City on August 1, 1974, at 7:30 P. M. Mr. Thomas Austin led the congregation in singing "Love Lifted Me", and Rev. Paul Ketterman prayed. The house was called to order by the assistant moderator, Rev. Ermine Butler. Associational ministers, deacons, and delegates were recognized and seated as the voting power of the association. Visitors were welcomed and seated as advisory council. Rev. Butler presented the moderator, Rev. Jack Ward. Reading Mark 16:15, Rev. Ward presented three steps in spreading the Gospel: we must learn it, live it, and love it. Rev. Winston Sweeney led in prayer.

Rev. O. P. Stokes, Clarence Shoemaker, Buddy Henry, Raymond Davis, and Ray Scalf were appointed by the moderator to serve as the Committee on Committees.

The song service began with congregational singing led by Tom Austin. A special program of music was presented by the choir of the host church. The moderator introduced the keynote speaker, Rev. Tom Maines, pastor of the Valley Forge F. W. B. Church. Reading Ezekiel 33:1-9, Rev. Maines brought an inspiring message on our responsibilities as a watchman of God. He closed with prayer.

The report of the Committee on Committees was presented by Rev. Stokes. A motion was made to accept the recommendations of the report, and to elect these committees. Motion was seconded and carried.

Rev. W. L. Kell prayed the benediction for this evenings session.

FRIDAY MORNING

The Friday morning session was called to order at 10:00 A. M. Mr. Tom Austin led the congregation in singing "I Would Not Be Denied". The morning devotion was given by Rev. Carl Nelson. Reading Psalms 3:3, he spoke on the subject, "What to do with Trouble". Special prayer requests were made and Rev. Frank Thompson led in prayer.

The report of the Executive Board was presented by Rev. C. B. Shoemaker. The report was adopted. Reports from the Statistician, Rev. Tom Maines, and the Treasurer, Rev. Talmadge Brown, were adopted. The report from the Sunday School Convention was given by Rev. James Raper and accepted. Rev. Raper also gave a report from the Home for Children. The churches of the Appalachian Association have contributed a sum of \$8,915.88 to the F. W. B. Home for Children this year. The report was received as information.

A brief recess was declared by the moderator and Rev. Buddy Henry dismissed with prayer.

The worship service opened with the congregation singing "When We All Get To Heaven". Rev. Dan Foster sang "A Child of the King". An offering was received for the Home for Children amounting to \$43.40, and prayer was offered by Rev. J. D. Wilson.

To bring the morning message, the moderator introduced Rev. Winfred Floyd, pastor of the First F. W. B. Church of Elizabethton, Tenn. Rev. Floyd read Exodus 3:1-7 and Acts 9:1-6 and using Moses and Paul as examples, he brought a message on "Determining God's Will for our Lives".

Rev. Edward Swartz offered prayer and the service was dismissed for lunch.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

The Friday afternoon session began at 1:30 P. M. Brother Herman Hersey presented a piano solo, "When They Ring Those Golden Bells". Thomas Austin led the congregation in singing "Come Unto Me". Rev. Doyle Hoilman presented a devotion giving praise to the Word. He read Ephesians 4:10-13 and closed with prayer.

Mr. Mike Wright gave a report from the C. T. S. Convention, and the report was adopted. The financial report of the Retirement Board was presented by Rev. W. C. Amos. The report was adopted. Brother Amos introduced Rev. Herman Hersey, director of the Board of Retirement and Insurance. He presented information concerning the different programs now being offered by his Department. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to accept his report as information. Rev. Dan Foster gave the report of the committee appointed to study and make recommendations concerning our Retirement Board. Motion was made to receive report and adopt item by item. Motion carried. All items were adopted.

Rev. Paul Ketterman was introduced by the moderator. Brother Ketterman is the Director of Public Relations of the F. W. B. Bible College. He presented information concerning the Bible College and the need for churches to recognize their obligation to support the College. The report was received as information. The reports of the Home Mission Board by Rev. D. C. Byrd, the Placement Committee by Rev. Dan Foster, and the Resolutions Committee by Rev. Byrd, were presented and adopted.

The report of the Nominating Committee was read by Rev. C. B. Shoemaker. The report was received and since no other nominations were made from the floor, those who had been nominated by the committee were elected by acclamation.

The report of the Ordainnig Council was read by Rev. Eugene Deaton. The report was accepted and the recommendations of the Council were adopted.

A motion was made to change the time of Ministers' annual reports to the calendar year, January thru December, to coincide with the church reports. An amendment was proposed to change the time of our annual Association to January, and have all reports covering the calendar year. The amendment was adopted and the original motion carried.

A motion was made to purchase a filing cabinet to be used by the clerk and treasurer for Associational records. Motion was seconded, and carried.

A motion carried to adjourn and Rev. Richard Adams dismissed with prayer.

FRIDAY EVENING

The Friday evening session began at 7:30 P. M. Song Director, Tom Austin, led the congregation in singing "Some Day" and "Standing on the Promises". Special music was presented by Rev. John Bowery. He sang "Ship Ahoy" and "Some Golden Daybreak". Mrs. Alvis, a member of the host church, sang a song she wrote especially for the Ordination Service. Rev. O. P. Stokes prayed. The moderator, Rev.

Jack Ward, presented as the evening speaker, Rev. Eugene Deaton, pastor of the First F. W. B. Church of Mountain City, Tenn. After offering prayer, Rev. Deaton read I Timothy 1:18 and I Timothy 6:12-14. He called upon us to remember that we are in a warfare, and that every army must have soldiers, a commander, and a banner. He closed with the assurance that God's army will have the victory.

Rev. O. P. Stokes presided over the Ordination Service. Rev. W. C. Amos and Rev. Jack Gallanger were presented as candidates to be ordained. Rev. Guy Foster gave the Scripture Charge, reading II Timothy, chapter two. Rev. Stokes gave the Ordination Charge. As the candidates knelt at the altar, the Ordaining Council laid hands on them and prayed a prayer of consecration with Rev. Carl Nelson leading the prayer. Mrs. Amos and Mrs. Gallanger were asked to join their husbands and the congregation enjoyed a time of handshaking and fellowship.

Motion made, seconded, and carried to adjourn. Rev. Wallace Amos dismissed with prayer.
