PROCEEDINGS

PLEASE NOTE: The following Minutes for Friday morning, January 20, 1978, is included to insure a clear understanding of why the 10th Annual Session was rescheduled.

FRIDAY MORNING, JANUARY 20, 1978

The morning session was called to order at 10:45 A.M. by the Assistant Moderator, Rev. Carl Nelson. Due to heavy snowfall and an ice storm, only 15 people were present. A motion was made to cancel this session and reschedule the entire Association for April 3, 4, 1978, and to use the same program as was scheduled for this session. The motion was seconded and carried. Rev. Eddie Maupin led in prayer and the meeting adjourned.

After the meeting adjourned, Rev. Robert Morgan, the scheduled preacher for Friday morning arrived. A few others came in and Rev. Morgan preached to a congregation numbering approximately twenty-five.

MONDAY EVENING, APRIL 3, 1978

The tenth annual session of the Appalachian Association of Free Will Baptist convened at the First Free Will Baptist Church of Bristol, Va., on April 3, 1978, at 7:00 P.M. Mr. Clyde Wilson led the congregation in the hymn, "To God Be the Glory". Rev. Millard Johnson led in prayer.

The Association was called into official session by Rev. Elmer Carter. All Associational Ministers, deacons, and delegates were recognized and seated as the voting power of the session. Visiting Ministers were recognized and seated as advisory council. The host pastor, Rev. Edward Swartz, extended a warm welcome to the congregation. Rev. Carter introduced the Moderator, Rev. Winford Floyd. As his Message to the Association, Rev. Floyd read aloud the FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT.

The Committee on Committees, appointed by the Moderator, consisted of O. P. Stokes, D. C. Byrd, Eddie Maupin, Talmadge Brown, and Elmer Carter. Rev. Herman Hersey, Director of the National Board of Retirement and Insurance, was recognized and gave a brief word of greeting.

The host church choir, directed by Mr. Clyde Wilson, provided the special music for the evening. Rev. Lester MacKinnon, Pastor of the Fellowship Chapel in Bristol, Va., was introduced to bring the Message. Reading Song of Solomon 5:2-16, 6:1, and 8:5, Rev. MacKinnon built his message on the comparison of the woman in those passages to the Church waiting for Christ, and challenged everyone to continue telling the world about Jesus. He closed with prayer. After a congregational song, "There is a Name I Love To Hear", Rev. O. P. Stokes gave the report of the Committee on Committees. The Report was adopted.

A motion carried to lay the Constitution and By-Laws on the table that revisions might be acted upon the following day.

Benediction was by Rev. Herman Hersey.

TUESDAY MORNING, APRIL 4, 1978

The service opened at 10:00 A.M., with congregational singing led by Rev. D. C. Byrd. The opening prayer was led by the Moderator, Rev. Winford Floyd. Morning Devotions were presented by Rev. Eddie Maupin. Reading I Cor. 15:12-19, he spoke on the resurrection of Christ and the blessings we enjoy in Him, and closed with prayer.

The Report of the Executive Board was read by Mr. Bill Hyder and was adopted. The Report of the Statistician, Rev. Eddie Maupin, was read and adopted. The treasurer, Rev. Talmadge Brown, gave the Financial Report and it was adopted.

The Moderator introduced Rev. Herman Hersey, Director of the National Board of Retirement and Insurance. He presented information concerning the retirement programs available to our ministers, and made known some needs of his Office. His report was received as information. A motion was made and carried to give Brother Hersey a standing vote of appreciation for his work.

The Moderator declared a ten minute recess.

The morning worship service began with the congregation singing " 'Tis So Sweet To Trust In Jesus" led by Rev. John Gibbs, and prayer by Rev. W. L. Kell. An offering was received for the Home for Children amounting to sixteen dollars and fifteen cents. Rev. Dan Foster was introduced to present special music. He sang "Because He Lives". Rev. Robert Morgan, Pastor of the Harris Memorial FWB Church in Greene County, Tenn., was presented to bring the morning message. After he prayed, Rev. Morgan read Matt. 28:18-20, and preached on "Making Disciples", using the points (1) Mission of Making Disciples, (2) Meaning of Making Disciples, and (3) the Method of Making Disciples. Worship service closed with prayer and congregational song "Take My Life and Let It Be".

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to give the National Board of Retirement and Insurance one hundred dollars (\$100.00) from the Assoc. treasury.

Recessed for lunch.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON, APRIL 4, 1978

The Tuesday afternoon session opened with congregational singing led by Rev. Dan Foster. For Devotions, many of the congregation participated in a sentence prayer.

As a report from the Youth Camp Board, Rev. Richard Adams presented information concerning the Camp this summer. The report was received. Rev. Dan Foster gave a report of the Church Training Service Convention and it was received. The report of the Home Missions Board by Rev. O. P. Stokes was adopted. The Moderator introduced Rev. John Gibbs. Brother Gibbs announced that he was leaving the position of Tennessee State Promotional Director, and returning to the pastorate. He expressed appreciation to the Association for their support and encouraged the churches to continue to support the State work. His report was received as information, and he was given a standing vote of appreciation. Rev. W. C. Amos presented the report of the Retirement Board

and it was adopted. Rev. James E. Raper, Superintendent of the Home for Children, was introduced and presented information concerning the Home's finances, children, and special needs. He expressed his appreciation to the Association for their help and prayers. The report was received as information. The report of the Placement Committee given by Rev. W. L. Kell, was adopted. A motion to lift from table the report of the Finance Committee carried. A motion to adopt the report was seconded and carried. A motion to lift from table the Constitution revisions report carried. The recommended revisions were read and adopted. A motion that a copy of these revisions be sent to each church carried. A motion was made that the Home Missions Board of the Appalachian Association be dissolved, and a Youth Board be established. Motion was seconded and carried. A motion carried to change the Youth Camp Board to Youth Board and let them assume the responsibilities of the Youth Board. Rev. Richard Adams read the recommendations from the Nominating Committee. The report was received and a motion carried that all the nominations by the committee be elected.

A motion was made to take three hundred dollars (\$300.00) from the general treasury and transfer to the Youth Board. Motion received second and carried.

Rev. Houston Blevins closed the business session with a song and testimony. A standing vote of appreciation was given to the host Church and Pastor for their warm hospitality.

Rev. James E. Raper prayed the benediction.

TUESDAY EVENING, APRIL 4, 1978

The Tuesday evening service opened with the host church choir singing, "Heaven Will Surely Be Worth It All". Then Mr. Clyde Wilson led the congregation in singing "There's Power in the Blood" and "When We All Get To Heaven". Rev. Edward Swartz, host pastor, gave a warm welcome. Rev. W. L. Kell, Chairman of the Ordaining Council, assumed the Chair for this session. Rev. Eddie Maupin read the report of the Ordaining Council. Both the annual and quarterly report was adopted.

The choir of the host church, the First FWB of Bristol, presented several songs including "Without Jesus You Won't Make Heaven", "Just A Little Talk With Jesus", and Brother Wilson sang "Wonderful, Wonderful Jesus". Rev. Kell offered prayer and the evening offering was received. A standing vote of appreciation was given to the out-going Moderator, Rev. Winford Floyd.

The Moderator introduced Rev. Richard Adams, Pastor of East Side Free Will Baptist Church in Elizabethton, Tn., to bring the evening message. Reading I Cor. 10: 1-11, Rev. Adams preached from the subject, "Some Pit-falls of the Devil". He listed as some of the pitfalls — lust, idolatry, murmuring, lying, disobedience, evil speaking, tale bearing, fornication, doubt, and bad example. He closed with prayer.

The Clerk of the Ordaining Council read the names of those receiving licenses and being placed under the watchcare of the Association. They each came forward and gave a brief testimony. Rev. Winford Floyd offered prayer and a time of fellowship and song was enjoyed by all.

The tenth annual session of the Appalachian Association was adjourned.

MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

As a reminder of our obligations and purpose, I will read aloud our Free Will Baptist Church Covenant.

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Jesus Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world.

And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

The present system of allocation of money of the Appalachian Association is as follows: 55 percent Retirement Board, 5 percent Home Mission, 5 percent Foreign Missions, 5 percent FWB Bible College, and 30 percent General Fund.

We recommend the following allocation and that it be adopted as part of Article IV of the Constitution: 55 percent Retirement Board, 15 percent Outreach Ministries (Foreign Missions, State Home Missions, FWB Bible College, State Promotional Director), 20 percent General Fund, and 10 percent Youth Ministries.

Since State Home Missions will support any qualified new church started in this area, we recommend that money being used by our local Mission Board, be used for youth ministries. We also recommend that the Finance Committee operate each year with an auditing of the Associational records.

With regards to the future growth of the Appalachian Association, we strongly call attention to the Constitution, Article IV which is the means of support, that every church agrees to when they join the Appalachian Association, "The method of support shall be 2 percent of the general offerings from each Church".

REPORT OF THE CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE

We, the Constitution Committee, having studied the Constitution and By-Laws of the Appalachian Association, propose the following changes:

A. Article VII, part 2 now reads:

2. The clerk of the Association shall be paid twenty-five dollars for each Quarterly Meeting and seventy-five dollars for the Annual Session.
Change to read:

2. The clerk of the Association shall be paid thirty dollars for each Quarterly Meeting and one hundred dollars for the Annual Meeting.

(This change was voted on, and went into effect at the 7th Annual Session, but was not dealt with as a Constitutional Change)

B. Article VIII now reads:

The Executive Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and three members elected from the floor, one for three years, one for two years, and one for one year.

Change to read:

The Executive Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and three members elected from the floor, with one being elected annually.

C. Article XIII now reads:

This Association shall meet annually on the Thursday evening and concluding on Friday evening of such week in July or August as is selected by the Executive Board.

Change to read:

This Association shall meet Annually on the first Monday evening and concluding on the following Tuesday evening of April.

D. By-Laws, Article 10, now reads:

On all motions acted upon, the majority vote shall prevail.

Propose to add — except those conflicting with Constitution.

E. By-Laws, Article 14 now reads:

No less than nine members shall constitute a quorum.

Propose to read — No less than nine member Churches shall constitute a quorum.

By-Laws, Article 15 now reads:

It shall be the duty of everybody belonging to this Association to send a letter, along with dues, to each Session, reporting in same its work and statistics.

Change to read:

It shall be the duty of every Minister and Church belonging to this Association to bring a letter, along with dues, to each session, quarterly and annually, reporting in same an account of work and statistics.

MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

The Ministers' Conference of the Appalachian Association was called to order by the President, Rev. Eddie Maupin. Rev. Dennis Crowe, Jr. led in prayer. Brother Jack Greene was elected President, Dan Foster was elected Vice President, and D. C. Byrd was elected Clerk. Elected to serve as the Resolution Committee for 1978 was W. L. Kell, C. B. Shoemaker, and O. P. Stokes. Motion carried to adjourn.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON

The Ministers' Conference of the Appalachian Association was called to order by the President, Rev. Fred (Jack) Greene. Rev. W. L. Kell presented the following recommendations from the Resolution Committee:

1. The Committee recommends that we go on record stating that any Free Will Baptist Minister holding Appalachian Association Credentials while out of a church pastorate, must attend and support a Free Will Baptist Church and Pastor. If he attends or supports regularly any other church, unless called to preach or do service, we withdraw fellowship from him and call for his credentials.

2. Suggest that every Pastor when possible, take a young preacher under his supervision and teach him as much as possible the responsibilities of a pastor.

3. Recommend that the Constitution and By-Laws of the Ordaining Council be reworded to state that they will recommend a preacher to be licensed only if he is a member of a Church which is a member of the Appalachian Association.

All of the above recommendations were adopted by the Ministers Conference.

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CONSTITUTION OF THE APPALACHIAN ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

(As revised by the 10th Annual Session in Bristol, Va.)

ARTICLE I

This Association shall be known as the Appalachian Association of the original Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II

The objects of this Association shall be to promote unity, fraternity, fellowship, and co-operation, and to encourage and to engage in larger

Christian enterprises that cannot be carried on by a single church, to combine and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptist within its bounds in one sacred effort to encourage and promote the general spread of the gospel, and the causes of the united program.

ARTICLE III

This Association shall be composed of all ordained and licensed ministers, deacons, and delegates chosen and sent by each church in its bounds, who shall be duly recommended by the church to which they belong.

1. Each church shall be entitled to five delegates regardless of membership. Any church with membership exceeding one hundred is entitled to one additional delegate per each thirty members exceeding one hundred.

ARTICLE IV

The method of support shall be two percent of the general offerings from each church.

1. These funds are to be allocated as follows: fifty-five percent to the Retirement Board of the Appalachian Association, fifteen percent to Outreach Ministries (Foreign Missions, State Home Missions, FWB Bible College, State Promotional Director), twenty percent to General Fund of the Appalachian Association, and ten percent to Youth Ministries.

ARTICLE V

This Association disclaims the right to exercise lordship over the churches, or to have any power which entitles it to infringe upon the internal affairs or rights of any of the churches composing it. Each church shall consider its internal affairs to be its own business.

1. An accused church has the same right as an individual in the church to have specific charges presented in writing, a fair opportunity for defense and to be considered innocent until proven guilty.

2. This Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegates.

3. Churches coming from another Denomination will be carefully and satisfactorily examined as to doctrine before being received as members.

ARTICLE VI

It shall be the duty of the Association to encourage a sound ministry such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour having made salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the gospel which is freely offered to all.

ARTICLE VII

The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, to be elected for one year terms.

1. The Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall not succeed themselves in election; however, the Assistant Moderator may be elected Moderator.

2. The Clerk of the Association shall be paid thirty dollars for each Quarterly Meeting and one hundred dollars for the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VIII

The Executive Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and three members elected from the floor, with one being elected annually.

ARTICLE IX

The Ordaining Council is to be elected by the Association. The number of this council is to be five members elected to serve in rotating terms to wit; one to five years. The Council is to have interim authority to ordain ministers and has charge of investigation of ministers. They shall report their work quarterly to the Association. No member of this council is to succeed himself in election.

ARTICLE X

This Association shall adopt the Treatise of the present Faith and Government of the National Treatise of the Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE XI

This Association shall be governed by the rules laid down in Roberts Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XII

This Association shall have a Quarterly Meeting on the third Saturday of each quarter.

ARTICLE XIII

This Association shall meet Annually on the first Monday evening and concluding on the following Tuesday evening of April.

1. This Association shall sponsor the following auxiliaries: Sunday School, Church Training Service, Ladies Auxiliary and Masters Men.

ARTICLE XIV

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any meeting of the Association.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. **GOD:** We believe that there is only one true and living God who is personally the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. There is one God and one mediator between God and man, and man Christ Jesus who gave Himself a ransom for all to be testified in due time. (1 Timothy 2:5).

2. **THE HOLY SCRIPTURE:** We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His church. All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction and instruction in righteousness.

3. **ORIGINAL APOSTASY:** We believe that Adam was created holy but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity and consequently involved his posterity in sin. "And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took the fruit thereof and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat." (Genesis 3:6).

4. **FREE GRACE:** We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings that the gospel is the power of God unto salvation, that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation. "For there is no difference between Jews and Greeks: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Him." (Romans 10:12).

5. **CHRISTIAN FAITH:** We believe that Christian faith is the belief in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and redeemer of the world and in the divinity of the Holy Scripture, that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not on the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth in him." (John 3:36).

6. **REPENTANCE:** We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which produced Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin. "Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but ye were made sorry, but ye sorrowed to repentance; for ye were made sorry after a Godly manner, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing. For Godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death." (II Corinthians 7:9-10).

7. **FREE WILL:** We believe that the human will is free and that men have ability to reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scripture. "He that shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Micah 6:8).

8. **PERSEVERENCE:** We do not believe under gospel dispensation, any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally. But that there is the possibility of apostasy in every man. (Hebrews 6:6).

9. **GOOD WORKS:** We believe that good works are the results of faith and not necessity; that those who have faith will do works of righteousness while those who have not faith cannot do anything pleasant or acceptable to God. "Every

tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them." (Matthew 7:19-20).

10. CHRISTIAN BAPTISM: We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost; that baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without faith in the Subject who receives it. "Therefore we are buried with Him by baptism into death: that like Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:4).

11. THE LORD'S SUPPER: We believe the supper was instituted by our Savior as a commemorative ordinance, that it was instituted regardless of name or denomination. "But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body." (1 Corinthians 11:28-29).

12. FEET WASHING: We believe that washing the saint's feet was a command of our Savior and that His followers ought to practice the same. We urge the pastors of all churches to encourage the practical obedience of this command, especially among the members of our churches. "If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; we also ought to wash one another's feet." (John 13:14).

13. THE GOSPEL: We believe it to be the duty of all churches to support the gospel. "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel live of the gospel." (1 Corinthians 9:14).



BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1 — A session of this association shall meet annually.

ARTICLE 2 — This association shall be opened and closed with suitable devotions.

ARTICLE 3 — There shall be no conversation by members, one with another, so as to interrupt business while in session.

ARTICLE 4 — Every person wishing to speak, shall first arise and address the moderator, and be recognized before speaking.

ARTICLE 5 — No member shall interrupt another while speaking.

ARTICLE 6 — Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.

ARTICLE 7 — No member shall speak on any one subject more than twice, except by permission of the moderator.

ARTICLE 8 — Every motion made and seconded shall be acted upon unless withdrawn by the person who made it.

ARTICLE 9 — A motion before the house must be acted upon before another motion can be made.

ARTICLE 10 — On all motions acted upon, the majority vote shall prevail, except those conflicting with constitution.

ARTICLE 11 — The moderator shall have the privilege to speak on any subject as any other member, provided the chair is filled.

ARTICLE 12 — No member shall absent himself from the body without permission of the moderator.

ARTICLE 13 — Any person transgressing these by-laws shall be admonished by the moderator.

ARTICLE 14 — No less than nine (9) member churches shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE 15 — It shall be the duty of every Minister and Church belonging to this Association to bring a letter, along with dues, to each session, quarterly and annually, reporting in same an account of work and statistics.
