PROCEEDINGS

PREACHING THE GOSPEL IN PERILOUS TIMES MONDAY EVENING, APRIL 4, 1983

The fifteenth annual session of the Appalachian Association of Free Will Baptists convened at the Temple Free Will Baptist Church, Bristol, Va., on April 4, 1983 at 7:00 P.M. Sherrill Foran led the congregational hymn, "I'll Fly Away," with Lila Tittle as pianist.

The Assistant Moderator, Elmer Carter, called the session to order. Rev. Jerry Emert offered prayer. The Associational ministers, deacons, and delegates were recognized and seated as voting power of the meeting. The visiting ministers were seated as advisory council to the session.

Appointed by the Moderator to serve on the Committee on Committees were Rev. C. B. Shoemaker, Rev. O. P. Stokes, Rev. W. C. Amos and Rev. Guy Foster.

The Moderator extended a welcome to the State and National Offices.

Rev. Eugene Waddell, Associate Director of the Foreign Mission Board, was introduced to bring the Keynote Message. He opened with prayer and read Romans 15:16, 20, 21, 24 and 30. His subject was "Preaching the Gospel in Troublesome Times." He brought a challenging message on the times in which we live, stating that there is civil and political turmoil, and that the iron hand of Communism is pressing down on all of us, especially in foreign lands. Let us not be satisfied till the Gospel has been carried to all lands. He closed with prayer.

A congregational hymn was led by Sherrill Foran and an offering of \$92.31 was received for the Foreign Mission Board. Offertory prayer was by Rev. Kenneth Grindstaff.

Rev. C. B. Shoemaker presented the report of the Committee on Committees and it was adopted. (See this report below in the minutes).

The session was dismissed till Tuesday morning. Benediction was by Rev. D. C. Byrd.

TUESDAY MORNING, APRIL 5, 1983

The morning session opened at 10:00 A.M. with a congregational hymn, "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder," led by Sherrill Foran, with Lila Tittle as pianist.

The meeting was called to order and Rev. Sam Ferguson brought devotions, reading Psalms 13, and offered prayer.

A report of the General Board was presented by Rev. Roy Duckett. The report of the Treasurer was presented by Rev. Millard Johnson and was adopted. The report of the Statistician was presented by Rev. Dan Foster and adopted. (See these reports below in the minutes.)

Rev. Jerry Gibbs, Missionary in France, brought greetings from the Foreign Missions. He also thanked the Association for their support. This report was received as information.

The Moderator declared a 10-minute recess.

The morning worship service opened with a congregational hymn, "I Love to Tell the Story," and the Moderator presented Rev. Eugene Deaton, Pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church, Johnson City, to bring the message. After prayer he read Luke 14:25-33, making points that we all need to sit down and count the cost of our Salvation, and to love Jesus Christ supremely above everything and everybody. He closed with prayer.

An offering of \$37.00 was received for the Home for Children.
The worship service closed with prayer by Rev. Richard Adams.
Lunch was served by the ladies of the host church.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON, APRIL 5, 1983

The afternoon session opened with a congregational hymn, "I'm Going That Way," led by Sherrill Foran, with Lila Tittle as pianist.

Rev. D. C. Byrd brought devotions, reading Proverbs 3:5-6. Rev. L. J. Oliver offered prayer.

The report of the Sunday School Convention was presented by Rev. W. C. Amos and was received as information. (See report below in minutes). The report of the Retirement Board was presented by W. C. Amos and adopted. (See report below in minutes). The report of the Youth Camp was presented by Rev. Richard Adams concerning the camp this summer and was received as information. The report of the Home for Children was presented by Rev. James Earl Raper and he reported the home doing well with 21 children now at the home. He thanked the Conference for their support and prayers. This was received as information. The report of the State Home Missions was presented by W. L. Kell and was received as information. The report of the Placement Committee was presented by Rev. Dan Foster and was received as information. (See report below in minutes). The C.T.S. Report was presented by Dan Foster and was received as information. (See report below in minutes).

It was moved to give the host church a standing ovation in appreciation of their hospitality and for the preparation of the food which was served by the ladies.

The report of the Nominating Committee was presented by Rev. D. C. Byrd and a motion was made that these be voted on, one at a time; motion carried. Rev. Dan Foster was elected on the Ordaining Council, replacing Rev. Doyle Hoilman. (See report below in minutes.)

It was adopted that when the Appalachian Association calls a speaker from out of town or from our National offices that we contact each one of our churches by letter and request they receive a special offering to help defray expenses for the speaker and to send it to the Treasurer, Rev. Johnson. All reports where finances are involved are required to be presented to the Finance Committee for an annual audit. A motion was made to change the annual associational meeting, which meets Monday and Tuesday, to Friday and Saturday. This motion was tabled till the next quarterly meeting in July.

The meeting adjourned till the evening services. Rev. C. B. Shoemaker dismissed in prayer.

TUESDAY EVENING, APRIL 5, 1983

The evening session opened at 7:00 P.M. with a congregational hymn, "Glory Land Way." Rev. Ray Stockton led in prayer.

An offering of \$35.91 was received for the Associational expenses. Special music was presented by the host church choir and by Janice Corey and the Clayman Family. An Altar of Prayer was led by Rev. O. P. Stokes and testimonies were given.

Rev. D. C. Byrd was presented to give the report of the Ordaining Council and this was adopted. (See report below in minutes.)

Rev. Jack Greene, Chairman of the Ordaining Council, presented Rev. Edgar J.

Coleman to bring the message. He read II Timothy, Ch. 4. His subject was "Preach the Word," and he brought a challenging message.

A right hand of fellowship was given to the ministers who were received into the Association.

The fifteenth annual session of the Appalachian Association adjourned.

CHURCH COVENANT

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation to reverence to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme, counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace satisfy us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.



CONSTITUTION OF THE APPALACHIAN ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

(As revised by the 10th Annual Session in Bristol, Va.)

ARTICLE I

This Association shall be known as the Appalachian Association of the original Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II

The objects of this Association shall be to promote unity, fraternity, fellowship, and co-operation, and to encourage and to engage in larger

Christian enterprises that cannot be carried on by a single church, to combine and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptist within its bounds in one sacred effort to encourage and promote the general spread of the gospel, and the causes of the united program.

ARTICLE III

This Association shall be composed of all ordained and licensed ministers, deacons, and delegates chosen and sent by each church in its bounds, who shall be duly recommended by the church to which they belong.

1. Each church shall be entitled to five delegates regardless of membership. Any church with membership exceeding one hundred is entitled to one additional delegate per each thirty members exceeding one hundred.

ARTICLE IV

The method of support shall be two percent of the general offerings from each church.

1. These funds are to be allocated as follows: fifty-five percent to the Retirement Board of the Appalachian Association, fifteen percent to Outreach Ministries (Foreign Missions, State Home Missions, FWB Bible College, State Promotional Director), twenty percent to General Fund of the Appalachian Association, and ten percent to Youth Ministries.

ARTICLE V

This Association disclaims the right to exercise lordship over the churches, or to have any power which entitles it to infringe upon the internal affairs or rights of any of the churches composing it. Each church shall consider its internal affairs to be its own business.

1. An accused church has the same right as an individual in the church to have specific charges presented in writing, a fair opportunity for defense and to be considered innocent until proven guilty.

2. This Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegates.

3. Churches coming from another Denomination will be carefully and satisfactorily examined as to doctrine before being received as members.

ARTICLE VI

It shall be the duty of the Association to encourage a sound ministry such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour having made salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the gospel which is freely offered to all.

ARTICLE VII

The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, to be elected for one year terms.

1. The Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall not succeed themselves in election; however, the Assistant Moderator may be elected Moderator.

2. The Clerk of the Association shall be paid fifty dollars for each Quarterly Meeting and one hundred and twenty-five dollars for the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VIII

The Executive Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and three members elected from the floor, with one being elected annually.

ARTICLE IX

The Ordaining Council is to be elected by the Association. The number of this council is to be five members elected to serve in rotating terms to wit; one to five years. The Council is to have interim authority to ordain ministers and has charge of investigation of ministers. They shall report their work quarterly to the Association. No member of this council is to succeed himself in election.

ARTICLE X

This Association shall adopt the Treatise of the present Faith and Government of the National Treatise of the Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE XI

This Association shall be governed by the rules laid down in Roberts Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XII

This Association shall have a Quarterly Meeting on the third Saturday of each quarter.

ARTICLE XIII

This Association shall meet Annually on the first Monday evening and concluding on the following Tuesday evening of April.

1. This Association shall sponsor the following auxiliaries: Sunday School, Church Training Service, Ladies Auxiliary and Masters Men.

ARTICLE XIV

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any meeting of the Association.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. **GOD:** We believe that there is only one true and living God who is personally the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. There is one God and one mediator between God and man, and man Christ Jesus who gave Himself a ransom for all to be testified in due time. (1 Timothy 2:5).

2. **THE HOLY SCRIPTURE:** We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His church. All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction and instruction in righteousness.

3. **ORIGINAL APOSTASY:** We believe that Adam was created holy but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity and consequently involved his posterity in sin. "And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took the fruit thereof and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat." (Genesis 3:6).

4. **FREE GRACE:** We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings that the gospel is the power of God unto salvation, that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation. "For there is no difference between Jews and Greeks: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Him." (Romans 10:12).

5. **CHRISTIAN FAITH:** We believe that Christian faith is the belief in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and redeemer of the world and in the divinity of the Holy Scripture, that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not on the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth in him." (John 3:36).

6. **REPENTANCE:** We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which produced Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin. "Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but ye were made sorry, but ye sorrowed to repentance; for ye were made sorry after a Godly manner, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing. For Godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death." (II Corinthians 7:9-10).

7. **FREE WILL:** We believe that the human will is free and that men have ability to reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scripture. "He that shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Micah 6:8).

8. **PERSEVERENCE:** We do not believe under gospel dispensation, any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally. But that there is the possibility of apostasy in every man. (Hebrews 6:6).

9. **GOOD WORKS:** We believe that good works are the results of faith and not necessity; that those who have faith will do works of righteousness while those who have not faith cannot do anything pleasant or acceptable to God. "Every

tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them." (Matthew 7:19-20).

10. CHRISTIAN BAPTISM: We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost; that baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without faith in the Subject who receives it. "Therefore we are buried with Him by baptism into death: that like Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:4).

11. THE LORD'S SUPPER: We believe the supper was instituted by our Savior as a commemorative ordinance, that it was instituted regardless of name or denomination. "But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body." (I Corinthians 11:28-29).

12. FEET WASHING: We believe that washing the saint's feet was a command of our Savior and that His followers ought to practice the same. We urge the pastors of all churches to encourage the practical obedience of this command, especially among the members of our churches. "If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; we also ought to wash one another's feet." (John 13:14).

13. THE GOSPEL: We believe it to be the duty of all churches to support the gospel. "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel live of the gospel." (I Corinthians 9:14).



BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1 — A session of this association shall meet annually.

ARTICLE 2 — This association shall be opened and closed with suitable devotions.

ARTICLE 3 — There shall be no conversation by members, one with another, so as to interrupt business while in session.

ARTICLE 4 — Every person wishing to speak, shall first arise and address the moderator, and be recognized before speaking.

ARTICLE 5 — No member shall interrupt another while speaking.

ARTICLE 6 — Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.

ARTICLE 7 — No member shall speak on any one subject more than twice, except by permission of the moderator.

ARTICLE 8 — Every motion made and seconded shall be acted upon unless withdrawn by the person who made it.

ARTICLE 9 — A motion before the house must be acted upon before another motion can be made.

ARTICLE 10 — On all motions acted upon, the majority vote shall prevail, except those conflicting with constitution.

ARTICLE 11 — The moderator shall have the privilege to speak on any subject as any other member, provided the chair is filled.

ARTICLE 12 — No member shall absent himself from the body without permission of the moderator.

ARTICLE 13 — Any person transgressing these by-laws shall be admonished by the moderator.

ARTICLE 14 — No less than nine (9) member churches shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE 15 — It shall be the duty of every Minister and Church belonging to this Association to bring a letter, along with dues, to each session, quarterly and annually, reporting in same an account of work and statistics.
