CHURCH COVENANT

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from, all sanction of the use and, sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in Love, endeavoring to "keep unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme, counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

CONSTITUTION OF THE APPALACHIAN ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

ARTICLE I

This Association shall be known as the Appalachian Association of the original Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II

The objects of this Association shall be to promote unity, fraternity, fellowship, and co-operation, and to encourage and to engage in larger Christian enterprises that cannot be carried on by a single church, to combine and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptist within its bounds in one sacred effort to encourage and promote the general spread of the gospel, and the causes of the united program.

ARTICLE III

This Association shall be composed of all ordained and licensed ministers, deacons, and delegates chosen and sent by each church in its bounds, who shall be duly recommended by the church to which they belong.

1. Each church shall be entitled to five delegates regardless of membership. Any church with membership exceeding one hundred is entitled to one additional delegate per each thirty members exceeding one hundred.

ARTICLE IV

The method of support shall be two percent of the general offerings, and all undesignated monies from each church.

1. These funds are to be allocated as follows: Fifty-five Percent to the Retirement Board of the Appalachian Association. Twenty-five percent to the General Fund. Ten percent to Youth Board, and tithe ten percent.

ARTICLE V

This Association disclaims the right to exercise lordship over the churches, or to have any power which entitles it to infringe upon the internal affairs or rights of any of the churches composing it. Each church shall consider its internal affairs to be its own business.

1. An accused church has the same right as an individual in the church to have specific charges presented in writing, a fair opportunity for defense and to be considered innocent until proven guilty.

2. This Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegates.

3. Churches coming from another Denomination will be carefully and satisfactorily examined as to doctrine before being received as members.

ARTICLE VI

It shall be the duty of the Association to encourage a sound ministry such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour having made salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the gospel which is freely offered to all.

ARTICLE VII

The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, to be elected for a two year term.

1. The Clerk of the Association shall be paid sixty dollars for each Quarterly Meeting and one hundred and thirty-five dollars for the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VIII

The Executive Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Chairman of Ordaining Council, and three members elected from the floor, with one being elected annually.

ARTICLE IX

The Ordaining Council is to be elected by the Association. The number of this council is to be five members elected to serve in rotating terms to wit; one to five years. The Council is to have interim authority to ordain ministers and has charge of investigation of ministers. They shall report their work quarterly to the Association. No member of this council is to succeed himself in election.

ARTICLE X

This Association shall adopt the Treatise of the present Faith and Government of the National treatise of the Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE XI

This Association shall be governed by the rules laid down in Roberts Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XII

This Association shall have a Quarterly Meeting on the third Saturday of each quarter.

ARTICLE XIII

This Association shall meet annually on the first Friday evening and concluding of the following Saturday morning of April.

1. This Association shall sponsor the following auxiliaries: Sunday School, Church Training Service, Ladies Auxiliary, and Masters Men.

ARTICLE XIV

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any meeting of the Association.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. GOD: We believe that there is only one true and living God who is personally the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. There is one God and one mediator between God and man, the man Christ Jesus who gave Himself a ransom for all to be testified in due time. (*I Timothy 2:5*)

2. THE HOLY SCRIPTURE: We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His church. All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction and instruction in righteousness.

3. ORIGINAL APOSTASY: We believe that Adam was created holy but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity and consequently involved his posterity in sin. "And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took the fruit thereof and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat." (*Genesis 3:6*)

4. FREE GRACE: We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings that the gospel is the power of God unto salvation, that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation. "For there is no difference between Jews and Greeks: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Him." (*Romans 10:12*)

5. CHRISTIAN FAITH: We believe that Christian faith is the belief in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and redeemer of the world and in the divinity of the Holy Scripture, that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not on the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him." (*John 3:36*)

6. REPENTANCE: We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which produces Godly Repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin. "Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but ye sorrowed to repentance; for ye were made sorry after a Godly manner, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing. For Godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not be repented of: But the sorrow of the world worketh death." (*II Corinthians 7:9-10*)

7. FREE WILL: We believe that the human will is free and that men have ability to reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scripture. "He that shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (*Micah 6:8*)

8. PERSEVERANCE: We do not believe under gospel dispensation, any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally. But that there is the possibility of apostasy in every man. (*Hebrews 6:6*)

9. GOOD WORKS: We believe that good works are the results of faith and not necessity; that those who have faith will do works of righteousness while those who have not faith cannot do anything pleasant or acceptable to God. "Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them." (*Matthew 7:19-20*)

10. CHRISTIAN BAPTISM: We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost; that baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without faith in the Subject who receives it. "Therefore we are buried with Him by baptism into death: that like Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." (*Romans 6:4*)

11. THE LORD'S SUPPER: We believe the supper was instituted by our Savior as a commemorative ordinance, that it was instituted regardless of name or denomination. "But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body." (*I Corinthians 11:28-29*)

12. FEET WASHING: We believe that washing the saint's feet was a command of our Savior and that His followers ought to practice the same. We urge the pastors of all churches to encourage the practical obedience of this command, especially among the members of our churches. "If I then, Your Lord and Master, have washed your feet, ye also ought to wash one another's feet." (*John 13:14*)

13. THE GOSPEL: We believe it to be the duty of all churches to support the gospel. "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel live of the gospel." (*I Corinthians 9:14*)

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1 A session of this association shall meet annually.

ARTICLE 2 This association shall be opened and closed with suitable devotions.

ARTICLE 3 There shall be no conversation by members, one with another, so as to interrupt business while in session.

ARTICLE 4 Every person wishing to speak shall first arise and address the moderator, and be recognized before speaking.

ARTICLE 5 No member shall interrupt another while speaking.

ARTICLE 6 Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.

ARTICLE 7 No member shall speak on any one subject more than twice, except by permission of the moderator.

ARTICLE 8 Every motion made and seconded shall be acted upon unless withdrawn by the person who made it.

ARTICLE 9 A motion before the house must be acted upon before another motion can be made.

ARTICLE 10 On all motions acted upon, the majority vote shall prevail, except those conflicting with constitution.

ARTICLE 11 The moderator shall have the privilege to speak on any subject as any other member, provided the chair is filled.

ARTICLE 12 No member shall absent himself from the body without permission of the moderator.

ARTICLE 13 Any person transgressing these by-laws shall be admonished by the moderator.

ARTICLE 14 No less than nine (9) member churches shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE 15 It shall be the duty of every Minister and Church belonging to this Association to bring a letter to each session, quarterly and annually, reporting in same an account of work and statistics.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE ORDAINING COUNCIL OF THE APPALACHIAN FREE WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I

Any person called of God to preach the Gospel, shall not be considered by the Ordaining Council as a candidate for license in this Association until he has studied the Treatise, "Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists", and further, has been a member of the Free Will Baptist Denomination for a period of at least one year.

1. The Ordaining Council will recommend a preacher to be licensed only if he is a member of a Church which is a member of the Appalachian Association. (This amendment made during 10th annual session.)

ARTICLE II

The Ordaining Council shall not recommend to this Association any candidate until his credit rating and character have been investigated by the Association and have been found to be good.

ARTICLE III

Anyone recommended by the Ordaining Council for license or ordination to preach must first present to the Council a letter of recommendation signed by the Clerk and Pastor of the church of which he is a member; nor shall the Ordaining Council recommend anyone from another association to the Conference as an ordained minister until he has presented to the Council a letter of recommendation from the association of which he is a member.

ARTICLE IV

Before a candidate who has been licensed to preach for one year may be ordained by the Ordaining Council, he must first be: (a) called to pastor a church; or, (b) a Christian Day School teacher; or, (c) an evangelist who conducts a minimum of 20 weeks revival in one year; or, (d) a full-time Minister of Music and a minister of the Gospel; or, (e) a Home or Foreign Missionary. However, any minister having served under license for one year is eligible to take the examination for ordination. Said examination to be given by the Ordaining Council in accordance with the conditions herein above set forth in this Article.

ARTICLE V

Any candidate coming before the Ordaining Council for license or ordination shall be required to take an oral examination and a written examination, must have studied the required books, and shall comply with such other conditions as the Ordaining Council, in its discretion, shall deem pertinent to the examination of the candidate.

ARTICLE VI

The Ordaining Council may ordain ministers who qualify, at a Quarterly or Annual Association.

ARTICLE VII

Acceptance of a candidate by the Ordaining Council shall not be contingent upon his theological premise, but shall be based upon his belief in sound Biblical doctrine, as evidenced by his full agreement with, and acceptance of, the Treatise, Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists".

ARTICLE VIII

The Ordaining Council will not consider any candidate who has been divorced and married again.

1. The Ordaining Council will not consider any man who is married to a divorcee. (This amendment made during 8th Annual session.)

ARTICLE IX

All licensed and ordained ministers are required to report in person and by letter to all quarterly and annual meetings, unless provisionally hindered. Failure to do so will mean he is to render his credentials which will be subject to being revoked.
