- No, 5, We recommend that we ad to our Articles of Faith "That we believe the scriptures teach the support of the Ministery, and it is duty of our preachers to teach the same.
- No 6 Resolve that we extend our thanks to the Missionary Baptist church at this place for dismissing their meeting on Saturday night to attend our service.
- No 7. Resolve that we extend our heart felt thanks to the good people of Branch and surrounding country for their kindness toward us while we were with them. May the blessings of the heavenly Father rest on them.

RULES OF ORDER

1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer.

2. Those who speak shall rise, address the Moderator,

and personal reflections shall be avoided.

3. All motions made and seconded shall be open for discussion, but debate may be shut off at any time by a majority of the members of the Association,

4. If any proposition or motion under debate contain two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and the vote taken separately.

5. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded on the minutes unless so ordered at the time.

on the same 6. No one shall speak more than once subject without special leave from the body.

7. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present.

8. No member shall absent himself without leave of the Moderator.

9. At the future sessions of this Assoication arrangements shall be made so as to insure two sermons, or other devotional exercises which shall be equivalent thereto, during each day of the session, and that the chair announce before adjournment who shall fill the stand at the next meeting.



CONSTITUTION.

From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist Church of Christ, being regularly baptized, upon the confession of our faith in Jesus Christ, being convinced of the necessity of a combination of association to perpetuate a union and a communion among us, and to preserve and maintain a correspondence with each other, do therefore adopt this constitution for our better government.

- 1 The Association shall be composed of ordained ministers and members chosen by different associations in our union, not exceeding five from each association and deacons on producing letters shall be entitled to a seat.
- Letters from different association are to express their number of fellowship, the number received by experience, letters of recomendation, the number dismissed, excluded, restored, and those who have died since the association,
- Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptist, being composed of sundry associations in the State of Arkansas—the association to have no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor to have no ecclustrical power over the association, reserving the right of withdrawing from any association becoming disordly, provided, however, that the association shall have power, for good cause to revoke the licens or credential of any minister, licensed or ordained by any association within its jurisdiction and to exclude the delegates from its sessions when they or the associations are disorderly or fail to keep a good report.
- 4 The association to have a Moderator, Clerk and a Treasurer, who are to be chosen by the sufferage of the members present.
- 5 Newly constituted churches may be admitted to the association which are to petition by letters and delegates, and

upon examination they are found to be orthodox and orderly may be received into the association, the association giving the right hand of fellowship.

- 6 No question from any association shall come under the consideration of the association, unless it has first been discussed in its association.
- The consideration of the association, except it be withdrawn by the member who made it-
- 8 This association is to endeavor to furnish the associations with minutes of the association in proportion to the numbers in each association, the distribution being at the discretion of the association
- 9 It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a reglar file of minutes for this purpose.
- 10 The minutes of the association shall be read and corrected if needed and signed by the Moderation and Clerk before the close of the association.
- 11 Amendments to the constitution may be made when necessary by a majority vote of the members present.
- Section 12 It is the duty of this association to see after the union subordinate associations.
- Section 13 The minutes of the association shall be read and corrected, if need, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the association adjourns

Section: 14 Amendments to this form of government, may be made at any time when a majority of the members may deem it necessary.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in one true and living God, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and these three are equal in divine essence, power and glory. Rom. 1:21; 1 John 5:7.

2. We believe that the scriptures in the Old and New Testaments are the words of God, and the only infallible rule

of faith and practice. 2 Tim. 4:2; John 10:30.

3. We believe that God created man good and gave him holy commandments, whereby he should live holy, but man voluntarily disobeyed the commandments of God. transgressed the law and fell under the just condemnation of the same, whereby all mankind are sinners, not by constraint, but by choice, being partakers of the sinful nature attained by the power. But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honor; then He by the grace of God should taste death for every man. Gen. 1:31; Heb. 2:9.

4. We believe that Christ by his death, burial and resurrection purchased our pardon and offers it freely to all mankind upon the principle of repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. He now commands all men everywhere to repent; therefore look unto Me and be ye saved of all the ends of the earth, for I am God, and there

is none else. Matt. 4:17; Isa. 45:22; Acts 20:21.

5. We believe that all adult persons must be regenerated and born of the spirit of God if they inherit eternal life.

John 3:3; Rom. 5:1-13.

- 6. We believe that regenaration is an instantaneous renewal of the heart by the Holy Spirit whereby the penitent sinner receives a new life, becomes a child of God and is disposed to serve Him. Hence as babes require constant foo dfor bodily development the new born babes in Christ require spiritual food that they may develop by a gradual growth into full stature of Christian manhood. John 3:3-5; Ezek. 36:26-7; Heb. 12:14; Rev. 21:27; Gal. 5:1-21; Titus 3:5; Eph. 2:10; Rom. 8:16; John 1:12; John 5:25-26; James 1:18; 2 Cor. 5:17. Mustard seed, Matt. 13:31. Growing seed, Mark 4:26.
- 7. We believe that the doctrine of Sanctification or Holiness as taught in the Bible is applicable to the soul or inner man and to it alone, and that the sanctification of the body will not take place until the resurrection of the dead when the mortal shall put on immortality and this corruptible body shall put on incorruption. Jeffreys; John 3:6; 1 Cor. 6:11; Phil. 3:21.

Adopted as a substitute.

8. We believe that all Christians should perserve in grace, and be faithful to the end if they inherit eternal life, for blessed are they that do his commandments that they have a right to the tree of life and enter in through the gates of the city. Cor. 10:12-13; Rev. 22:14; John 15:2-6; Heb. 10:26.

9. We believe a visible church of Christ is a congregation of faithful men and women who have obtained fellowship with each other and have given themselves to the Lord and one another, having agreed to keep up good discipline according to the rule of the gospel. 1 Cor. 1:2-10.

10. We believe that Jesus Christ is the great head of the church, and the government thereof is with the body.

Col. 1:18; Matt. 18:17-18.

- 11. We believe that baptism by immersion is the opostolic mode, even the burial of a believer in water, and that Christ, who is our life, showed this humble example to His children and bade them walk therein. Matt. 3:4-16; Matt. 28:19-20; Mark 1:9-11.
- 12. We believe that God in His goodness displays power. of grace in a great degree in calling and qualifying His servants by the teaching of the Holy Ghost and by the instruction of His blessed word to go forth and proclaim life. and salvation without price. He bids us freely to come and nothing prevents the salvation of any but their own stubborn. rebellion and sinful refusal to come. 1 Cor. 1:23; Eph. 3:7; Rev. 22:17.
- 13. We believe that baptism, the Lord's Supper and. the washing of the saints' feet are ordinances of the gospel. of Jesus Christ and that the keeping of the Lord's Day holy and abstaining from worldly justs and carnal cares and assembling of ourselves together are ornaments which prepare and beautify the soldier of the cross to march onward in the army of the Lord. Matt. 26:28; John 13:14-15; Ex. 20:8-10: Heb. 10:25 20:8-10; Heb. 10:25.
- 14. We believe that none have a right to baptism only those who have obtained a living hope in the Lord Jesus Christ, and none the right to administer the same only those who are called of God and have come under presbytery of elders. Tit. 1:15; Mark 16:16.
- 15. The soul is immortal, hence does not die with the body, but immediately after death enters into a conscious state of happiness or misery according to the moral character here possessed. Ecl. 12:17; Phil. 1:23; Luke 23:43; Matt. 16:22-26; Rev. 6:9.
- 16. We believe that there will be general or universal judgment when all men shall be judged according to the deeds done in the body whither good or bad and that immediately thereafter the wicked shall enter into everlasting punishment. Act. 17:21; 1 Cor. 15,24; Rev. 2:10; 6 Peter 3, 17:3; 22, 31 and 32; Acts 7:59; Matt. 10:28; 2 Cor. 5:8; Luke 22.12; Ecl. 9-10; 2 Cor. 5-19; Ecl. 12-14; Matt. 25,26; 2 Thos. 1,8,10; Rom. 6-29; 2 Peter 1-14; Mark 3, 43,44; Jude 7; Rev. 14:11, and 21,7,3,26; Mark 13,41,41; Rom. 2,6,10.
- 17. We believe it is the duty of each church to assemble themselves together once a month, and that it is the duty of the pastor of the church, when setting forth the Lord's Supper and washing the saints' feet, to invite all Christians.
