## PROCEEDINGS TUESDAY EVENING, AUGUST 16, 1988

The 91st annual session of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists met at Camp Beaverfork, Conway, Arkansas, on August 16, 1988. The convention theme was "Broadening Our Boundaries." The theme verse was Isaiah 54:2. Boyd Osborne served as song director, with Sue Patton as pianist, and Brenda Pursell as organist for the sessions.

The evening service was opened with prayer by Rupert Pixley. Opening songs by congregation were "All Hail The Power," "Praise Him," and "How Great Thou Art." Wendell Leckbee, Clerk, led in prayer and called the Association into official session, and introduced the Moderator, Carl Cheshier.

The following were elected to the Committee on Committees: Roy Dale Smith, Wayne Smothers, Robert Spencer, John Turner and Larry Doggett.

The Moderator recognized all of the new ministers coming into the State since the last Association.

The congregation sang "When We All Get To Heaven" and "What A Day That Will Be."

The Moderator encouraged all present to support the missions offering which Terry Forrest, Mission Board Chairman, announced as being divided three ways among those missionaries present: 1/3 to National Home Missions, 1/3 to Foreign Missions, and 1/3 to State Missions. The 1/3 to National Home Missions was divided between Steve Trail, Louisiana, and Ron Parker, Texas. The 1/3 to Foreign Missions was given to Lynn Midgett, Spain, and Darrel Nichols, Ivory Coast. The 1/3 to State Missions was designated to O. D. Winfrey, Wynne, Arkansas. After the missionaries were recognized, Terry Forrest led in the offertory prayer.

The choir of Faith Free Will Baptist Church, Jonesboro, presented the special music. They sang "Our God Reigns," "Ring The Bells of Heaven," "As The Father Has Sent Me" and "Holy Jesus, Hear Thou Me."

The Moderator, Carl Cheshier, introduced Rev. Ralph Hampton, Moderator of the National Association, as the evening speaker. He spoke on the subject "Broadening Our Boundaries Through Growing," II Peter 3:18.

Terry Forrest presented information about Concerned Citizens which is a group working to close private clubs in dry counties. In 10 years of court action the group had hope of success. The cause was lost by a vote of 4-3 in the Supreme Court with no further action possible. He recommended that the State Association send attorney Frank Lady a letter thanking him for his 10 years of work with the organization. Much of his time was donated.

Larry Hampton presented information from Randall House and the National Sunday School and CTS Departments. He reported that a new 9-year cycle for adult literature would start in December 1990.

Report No. 9: Report of the Sunday School Board was given by Tommy Tims. The report was received and the budget adopted.

Report No. 10: Report of the State Woman's Auxiliary was given by Genelle Scott. Report was received as information.

#### REPORT NO. 3: STATE EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

October 17, 1987, and Conference Call October 25, 1987 - Keith Johnson presented the report from the Christian Supply Store. He also recommended that the state consider replacing the current station wagon used by the bookstore. A motion was passed giving authorization for the purchase of a new car to be used in the ministry of Christian Supply Store with the bookstore paying for the car out of store profits.

David Joslin rendered a report on the state office. A recommendation was presented and adopted to increase by \$25.00 per month the amount contributed by the Christian Supply Store and the Promotional Office toward the expense of utilities on the expanded state building.

The possibility of the West Memphis church donating their property to the Arkansas State Association was presented. A motion was adopted authorizing David Joslin and Terry Forrest to investigate and report back to the Executive Board. Authorization was also given to David Joslin to appoint someone to help in this if the State. Mission Board members were unable to assist.

In a conference call of October 25, 1988, a report was received on the West Memphis property. Motion was passed authorizing the acceptance of the property and that it be turned over to the State Missions Board. Proceeds from a possible sale of the property would be received by the Executive Board on behalf of the state.

January 18, 1988 - Keith Johnson presented the report from the Christian Supply Store. David Joslin presented the report from the promotional office and suggested that the Executive Board return to a quarterly meeting rather than using conference calls. Following discussions, a motion was made and adopted to return to a quarterly meeting.

Kent Tallent shared with the board the millenium question that had affected his congregation in the Antioch Association and had caused his congregation to withdraw from the association. Motion was made and adopted that a letter be sent from the Executive Board encouraging Rev. Tallent and his congregation to join another association and continue their work in the Lord.

David Joslin informed the board that he recently received a call from the Mansfield church informing him they were closing the church and were donating the property to the state association. A recommendation was adopted that a committee composed of the State Missions Board and a representative of the Unity Association meet with the church and determine what needed to be done. The State Missions Board was authorized to act on the basis of what they learned.

April 12, 1988 - Keith Johnson presented the report from the Christian Supply Store, and David Joslin presented the state office reports. Both were adopted.

David Bishop was nominated to fill the vacancy on the state Sunday School Board left by the death of Rev. John Gilliland.

The program for the state meeting was adopted. The following was adopted to be presented to the state for constitutional change: "Motion to amend the state constitution by inserting the words" assistant clerk" in Article VI, Section 4."

April 22, 1988 - The Executive Board met at Harmony Free Will Baptist Church in Russellville for the purpose of organizing the Fellowship Association.

July 12, 1988 - Keith Johnson presented the quarterly report for the Christian Supply Store and the 1989 Budget. Both were adopted.

The promotional office reports and 1989 Budgets were presented by David Joslin and adopted.

Acting as the budget committee, the Executive Board recommended the following Coop Budget for 1989.

The Executive Board received information concerning a one-acre portion of land deeded for a Free Will Baptist Church in the deed and will of Pope County man. A recommendation was adopted for the State Association to consider establishing a ministers benevolent fund.

Sidney Sawrie was elected chairman of the Executive Board because of the expiration of the term of chairman, J. W. Blanks.

# REPORT NO. 4: REPORT OF THE PROMOTIONAL DIRECTOR David A. Joslin

During the calendar year of 1987, Arkansas Free Will Baptists receipted a total of \$1,139,653.69 for state and national departments. Other areas of concern are:

#### (1) THE TARGET "90" PROGRAM

The statistics for 1987 reveal the following:

Arkansas has 16 district associations with 80 city/town churches and 144 rural churches. Eighty-seven of our pastors are listed as full time, and 137 are employed on a part-time basis. One of the most crucial needs within our denomination is the financial support of the pastor.

There are 217 churches who reported to their respective association. These 217 churches reported 646 baptisms, and 1,020 members added. Total members lost were 606, leaving a membership of 20,772. This represents an increase of 2% in net membership gain. There were three new churches started in 1987.

#### (2) DENOMINATIONAL LOYALTY, UNITY & COOPERATION

Arkansas Free Will Baptists are blessed with a spirit of unity and cooperation which is often lacking in other state associations. Denominational loyalty among Arkansas Free Will Baptists is not a vice, but a virtue. It is an asset, not a liability. All of the State Boards are aggressively achieving their assigned responsibilities, and many progressive programs are scheduled for the coming year.

#### (3) SUPPORTING THE TOTAL DENOMINATIONAL PROGRAM

The Cooperative Plan of Support continues to show progress. Arkansas Free Will Baptists maintain one of the denomination's strongest youth camp programs as well as a State Home Missions program, separate from the National Home Missions department. The giving picture, as reflected from the National Association does not reflect the total picture of denominational stewardship. In order to give the proper perspective, the total must include stewardship giving on both the state and national levels.

# REPORT NO. 7: STATE MISSIONS BOARD REPORT

The past year has proven to be a very busy, yet productive one for the Board.

On September 24, 1987, the Missions Board met in Wynne, Arkansas, with Rev. O. D. Winfrey to survey the city, and discuss with Brother Winfrey his burden to see a Free Will Baptist Church established there. Wynne is a city of approximately 9,000 people and is the county seat of Cross County. It has only 20 churches, (NOW 21).

On September 27, 1987, the Board voted to adopt Wynne as the next mission's project and appointed Rev. Winfrey as our missionary. In October 1987, 2.2 acres of prime land was located on Highway I, at the southern city limits of Wynne. This land was purchased for \$35,000.00 which was borrowed from the State Mission's APPLE fund. An additional \$70,000.00 was borrowed from the Board of Retirement and Insurance Department in Nashville, Tennessee, to finance the construction of the church building.

Robert Spencer was employed as the contractor of the building, with O. D. Winfrey as helper. Almost all of the other labor was donated. The Board is very grateful to all of those who came from the various parts of the State to assist. This made it possible to complete the 4,500 square feet brick building, and have \$5,000.00 left for the church furniture. We also want to express special appreciation to John Plyer Plumbing, Inc. of Glenwood, Arkansas, for the special prices on building materials.

The first service in the new building was conducted on July 31, 1988, with 37 people present, one salvation decision, baptized three, and 21 in attendance on Sunday night.

The greatest need, at the present time, is for churches, individuals, and/or associations to adopt the Winfrey's account on a regular monthly or quarterly basis. Monthly income to their account has been quite low. It is our hope that we will be able to see this new work become self-supporting in five (5) years. Will you help us?

During the past two years, two churches have ceased to function, and they turned the property over to the State Association. They are located in West Memphis, Arkansas, and Monroe, Louisiana. At the direction of the State Executive Board, both of these pieces of property have been listed for sale. The West Memphis property is on a lease-purchase agreement to be sold, but the Monroe property has not been sold as of the date of this report.

# REPORT NO. 9: STATE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

The State Sunday School Board met three times during the past year as follows:

# REPORT NO. 13: 1988 STATISTICIAN'S REPORT

# ARKANSAS STATE ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

### **PREAMBLE**

From experience we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us; to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination with us; to unify the work of the various districts composing the State Association; and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in cooperation with the various districts of the Association, or that may be hereafter represented therein, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denomination government.

### ARTICLE I

Name: This organization shall be known as the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

### **ARTICLE II**

Purpose: The purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various districts composing the State Association and to devise and executive measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various districts in the Association.

### **ARTICLE III**

Representation:

Section 1. This association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in a church belonging to a district association, the district associational clerk, and all members of State Boards.

Section 2. Each district association shall be entitled to five (5) lay delegates at large. Each local church which holds membership in a district association affiliated with this body shall be entitled to send one lay delegate.

Section 3. Associational Delegates:

A. In the event any of the elected delegates fail to report, said vacancy may be filled by appointment of the moderator of said district or by the delegates present from said district.

B. In the event the elected delegate from a local church is not present, the Pastor of that local church shall have the authority to appoint a delegate to serve in place of the absent delegate.

Section 4. New associations desiring membership in the state association shall send messengers bearing a petitionary letter. If found orthodox, upon examination by the credentials committee, they shall be received by the vote of the association and given the right hand of fellowship by the moderator.

Section 5. The State Convention shall convene annually on the Tuesday following the second Sunday in the month of August.

### **ARTICLE IV**

#### Finance:

Section 1. This association shall be supported by a percentage of the Cooperative receipts as designated by the State Association and by designated gifts. Said allocations to national and state work to be recommended to the association by the budget committee.

Section 2. Each district association shall send \$20.00 for each church belonging to the district association for the purpose of entertaining the State Association; \$10.00 for each church for National Association fees; and \$5.00 per each church for minutes, for a total of \$35.00.

Section 3. In the event any church within a local association does not pay its fee; the delegates, deacons, and ministers of that church shall not be seated.

# ARTICLE V

# Discipline:

Section 1. This State Association shall have the right to settle any questions of discipline, doctrine, or practice that may properly come before it from any of the districts composing said organization. If there be any question of discipline, doctrine, or practice on the part of a district body, delegates of that association shall be not seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the credentials committee.

Section 2. The decision of the credentials committee may be appealed to the State Association sitting in a committee as a whole.

### **ARTICLE VI**

#### Officers:

Section 1. The officers of the State Association shall consist of a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, promotional director, and statistician. Each of these, with exception of the promotional director should be elected annually.

Section 2. The Moderator shall be an ex-offico member of the Executive Board. The Promotional Director shall be an ex-officio member of all standing boards.

Section 3. A committee on committees shall be elected by the body on the opening night of the association. All other committees shall be appointed by the committee on committees.

Section 4. The moderator, assistant moderator, promotional director, clerk, and assistant clerk shall serve as the program committee for the State Association.

#### **ARTICLE VII**

Duties and Rules of Standing Boards:

Section 1. All standing boards shall be composed of five (5) members, each of whom shall serve for five years. No board member shall immediately succeed himself after having served a full term on said board.

Section 2. All boards of this association shall organize immediately following the annual association meeting. They shall elect a chairman, vice-chairman, and secretary. Each board shall give a written report at the annual association of meetings conducted, work accomplished, monies received and expended during the year.

Section 3. Executive Board: This board shall have the authority to fill irregular vacancies which may occur in its own body, and any irregular vacancies which may occur in any standing board between sessions of the state association. An office may be declared vacant for the following reason: if a member moves from the State; if a member fails to attend the board meetings for a period of one year without providential hindrance; or if for any reason he submits a statement of resignation.

A bookstore shall be operated from the state headquarters under the supervision and direction of the Executive Board.

This board shall have the authority to employ the state promotional director. In the event that none of the district associations request to entertain the State Association, it shall become the responsibility of the Executive Board to make the necessary arrangements when it is to be conducted at the camp at Conway.

The Executive Board shall keep a record of all work accomplished, money raised, meetings conducted, and make a full and complete report at the annual association of the State Association. The Executive Board shall receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey property entrusted to the State Association, except as stipulated elsewhere in the constitution.

The chairman and secretary of the Executive Board shall sign all deeds, bonds, notes, etc., and any other papers by which the State Association is to become legally responsible.

In case of an emergency situation, the Executive Board shall have the authority to call the State Association in conference by notifying each district association at least ten (10) days prior to the conference.

No board shall buy or sell real estate without the approval of the Executive Board, when such transactions are made between sessions of the State Association.

### Promotional Director

The promotional director shall assist in coordinating the work of the various boards of the State Association and shall serve as state treasurer. He shall promote both the state and national workers, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper.

He shall receive, hold, and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made when requested.

He shall present a written report of his work at each annual session of this association, with a financial statement of all monies received and disbursed. These books shall be audited annually.

Section 4. Mission Board: It shall be the duty of this board to promote an active missions program within the state. It shall work in cooperation with the national home missions and foreign mission boards in the arranging of missionary conferences, missionary intineraries, and shall assist in the raising of the state quota for the national missions programs.

This board shall promote the establishing of new churches and missions within the state.

This board shall not participate in the organization of any church or mission in a town, city or community where there is an organized Free Will Baptist church without seeking the cooperation of said church. Neither shall this board assist in the organization of a group that is out of fellowship with an established church.

This board shall be entrusted to receive, hold, manage, use, control, or convey State Mission Property.

Section 5. Church Training Service Board: It shall be the duty of the state Church Training Service Board to plan and assist the Church Training Service work throughout the state. It will be their responsibility to promote an active Church Training Service work in each association and to encourage Church Training Service rallies. They shall be entrusted to receive, hold, manage, use, control, or convey the youth camp property. This board shall be responsible for the selection of the youth camp personnel. They will plan and promote the annual Church Training Service Conference and Youth Encampment.

Section 6. Sunday School Board: It will be the duty of this board to work in cooperation with the National Sunday School Department in arranging Sunday School conferences and workshops, teacher's training courses, and in recommending methods and materials for the Sunday schools of the State of Arkansas.

Section 7. Christian Education Board: It shall be the duty of this board to establish and promote a high standard of Christian Education within the framework of this association. This board shall be responsible for Bible Institutes, the teaching and training of the ministry and other interested laymen. The Treatise of the faith and practices of Free Will Baptists shall be the guide of theological positions for the institutes.

### ARTICLE VIII

### Amendments:

This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present, providing proposed amendment is presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

### ARTICLE IX

# Parliamentary Procedure:

This meeting of the State Association shall be governed by the rules of parliamentary law as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.
