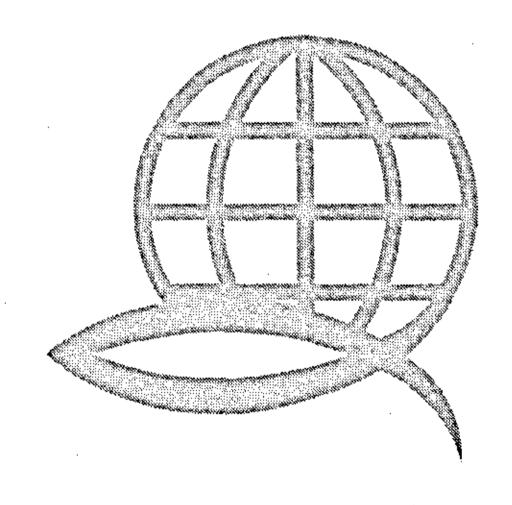

PROCEEDINGS Tuesday Evening, August 7, 2007

The 110th annual session of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists met at the James H. Clark Auditorium in Conway, Arkansas, August 7-8, 2007. The convention theme was "A Ministry of Heritage & Hope" The theme verse was I Peter 1:3-5.

The Tuesday evening service opened with congregational singing led by Jeremy Raines, song director, "Heavens Jubilee." David Winfrey served as pianist.

Wendell Leckbee, Clerk called the session to order and introduced Moderator, Nelson Henderson. David Harper Assistant Moderator, led in prayer.

The Committee on Committees was elected as follows: Tommy Tims, Randy Scott, John High, Jackie Brown, and Greig Caswell.

The congregation sang "Just a Little Talk with Jesus" and "Majesty".

Offertory prayer was by Randy Ledbetter, Missionary to Salt Lake City. Offertory music was by David Winfry.

The offerings were divided between National Home and International missionaries who were present at the state meeting.

Nelson Henderson introduced the evening speaker, Steve Sawrie, Pastor, First Free Will Baptist Church; Ozark, AR. Special music was presented by Don Matchett who sang "How Great Thou Art." Brother Sawrie preached from I Peter 1: 3-5 and Matthew 16:13-17 "Who Jesus Is," and II Timothy 3:16 "The Bible is the Word of God."

Report of the Executive Director was given by Tim Campbell. Financial and Audit reports we given by Ricky Taylor, C.P.A. Tim Campbell reported on his itinerary for the year and the positive financial reports. He also commented on the success of the National Association and the support of Linda Whitten and Sheryl Baze. Curt Hetherington, of James Green and Associates, presented a check for \$18,969. Tommy Tims and Jim Walker were elected to the Executive Board.

Report of the Nominating Committee was read by the Clerk (page 68). Motion passed to accept the report.

A report from Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College was given by Bob Thompson. David Taylor was elected to the Board of Trustees.

Representatives from the Board of Retirement, Free Will Baptist Foundation, Randall House, Youth Ministries, Free Will Baptist Bible College, Free Will Baptist Family Ministries (James Kilgore was presented an Arkansas Traveler Certificate by Debbie Stripling) and Alabama Children's Home reported on their ministries. Eldon Bagwell dismissed the meeting in prayer.

Wednesday Morning Worship Service August 8, 2007

The service opened with congregational singing "What a Day that Will Be" and "Jesus is All the World To Me." David Cronecker led in prayer.

Tim Campbell complemented David and Carolyn Winfrey on their work at Christian Supply Store. A standing ovation was awarded by the State Association.

Report of the Registration Committee (page 11) was adopted. After announcements the meeting was adjourned.

REPORT OF THE ARKANSAS WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST

The 53rd Annual session of the Arkansas Women Active for Christ met August 7, 2007 at James H. Clark Auditorium. The theme was "Here, I Am Lord." The theme scripture was 1 Samuel 3:4. The speaker was Joe Tolbert, Missionary to Cabot Arkansas. Tracy Gilliland directed the singing with Jayne Hannah as the pianist.

Several Home and International Missionaries gave greetings and updates during the Missionary Share Time.

Celebration and presentations were given in honor of the women who helped with Arkansas WAC's opportunity to host the WNAC National Convention in Little Rock, AR in July 2007.

11 Districts reported with 66 Locals and membership of 697. A total of 131 registered, including 5 International Missionaries, and 5 Home Missionaries.

Total receipts for 2006 were \$76,812.07. Our giving to International Missions was \$22,062.56 (Acts 1:8 receiving \$18,173.75 of this amount), National Home Missions \$6,364.00, Children's Home \$1,583.97 and our 2006 State Project was Florence Crittenton Home in Little Rock with a total of \$11,143.23.

REPORT OF ARKANSAS MASTER'S MEN

On March 16 and 17, 2007 Free Will Baptist Men met at Camp Beaverfork. On Friday evening, the Mercy River Boys presented a concert of Southern Gospel Music. Bobby Jackson, leader of the quartet, presented the program.

On Saturday morning, the men heard a devotional from John Fowlkes, National Master's Men board member. After breakfast, the installation of the metal doors began. All doors were not finished that day, but other men from across the state came later and finished the installation.

Donations of tools and equipment for the Disaster Response Unit were also received. Plans are to continue to encourage groups and individuals to donate tools or supply the funds to purchase the needed items such as a generator, chain saws, rakes etc. The Annual Master's Men Banquet was held at Ryan's Family Steak House in Conway on August 8. A drawing for the door prize was won by Jared Fowlkes.

The treasurer's report and the minutes were read and approved. The goal of \$9,000 to purchase new metal doors for the cabins at Camp Beaverfork was exceeded with \$9,284.00 total received. An additional \$245 was received in donations for the Disaster Relief Unit.

Officers elected for a two year term were President-Wendell Leckbee, Membership-Carmen Rushing, Activities-Jared Fowlkes, Program-Ken Nabors, Secretary/Treasurer-Jerry Lewis and Chorister-Richard Dennis.

The body adopted a recommendation to make the 2007-2008 Project the resurfacing of the Camp Beaverfork pool-\$9,000 to repair and replace skimmers-\$6,000 and purchase a sign/repair pool house-\$5,000 for a total project cost of \$20,000. Forty groups or individuals will be encouraged to raise \$500 each. Fifteen of the forty slots were filled at the meeting. Special music was provided by Jeremy Raines.

Joe Tolbert, Missionary to Cabot, AR spoke from Philemon 1-7, "A Man's Reputation Glorifies God." The meeting was adjourned in prayer by Delbert Hughes.

STATISTICS REPORT

The Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists reports 15 associations comprised of 211 churches. The statistics for membership, baptism, etc., are based on the 189 churches who reported.

There are 98 churches located in a city/town; 106 churches in rural, 90 with full-time pastors, and 90 part-time pastors. There are 317 ordained ministers, 43 licensed ministers, and 440 ordained deacons.

The churches reported 451 baptisms with 824 members added, 441 members lost, with a total membership of 18,305.

Sunday school enrollment was 9,912; CTS enrollment was 1,837; Women Active for Christ membership was 1,004 and Master's Men enrollment was 225.

There were four churches with day care; five churches with kindergartens, and four churches with Christian day schools and one Bible Institute.

The total income of all churches reporting was \$13,127,082.19 and 45 churches with budgets.

There were 54 churches with parsonages, and a total value of all church property, including parsonages, of \$63,849,382.72.

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Executive Committee Summaries February 23, 2006

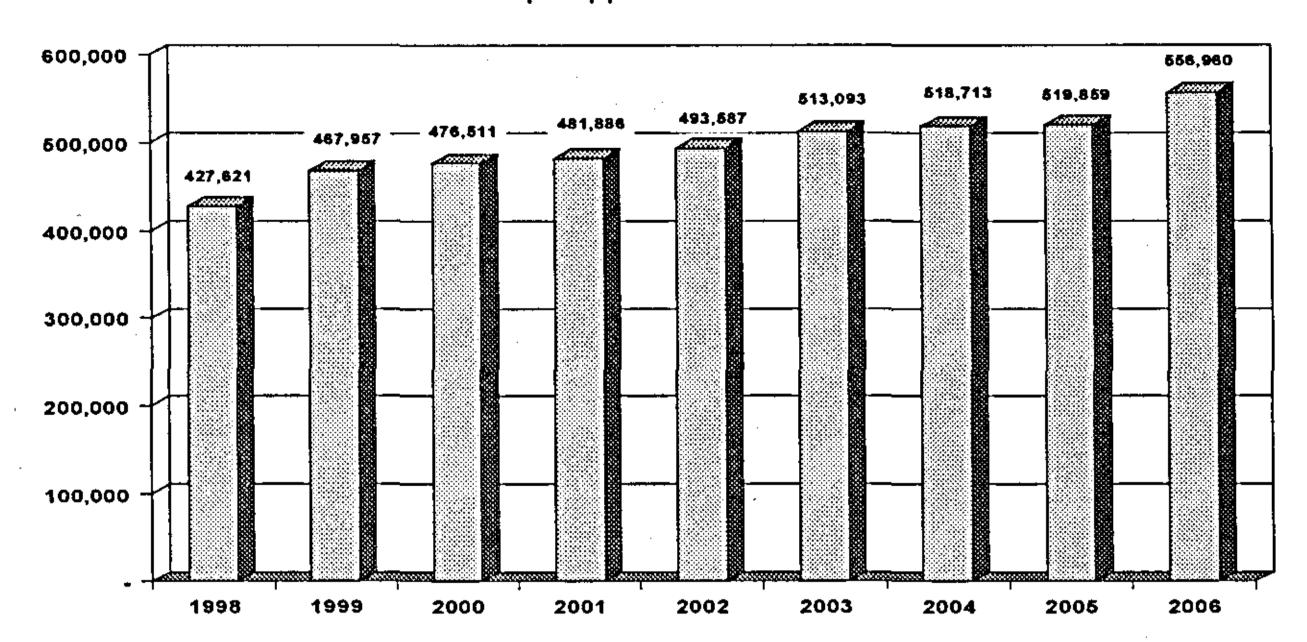

#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To The Board of Directors
Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

I have audited the accompanying statements of financial position of Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. (a nonprofit Corporation) as of December 31, 2006 and 2005, and the related statements of activities, and each flows for the years then ended. The financial statements are the responsibility of the Organization's management. My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit.

Except as discussed in the following paragraph, I conducted my audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. These standards require that I plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. I believe my audit provides a reasonable basis for my opinion.

The Organization has elected to record the values of land and buildings, specifically the state offices at Conway. Arkansas, at the current appraised values. Generally accepted accounting principles require that operational assets be valued at actual cost less appropriate adjustments for depreciation and substantial decreases for obsolescence. Due to limited records and the extensive use of donations relating to the establishment of the above mentioned property, it was not practical for me to extend my examination of such records beyond the amounts recorded.

In my opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the actual cash and donations records referred to in the preceding paragraph been susceptible to satisfactory audit tests, the financial statements referred to in the first paragraph present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. as of December 31, 2006 and 2005 and its results of operations and its cash flows for the years then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### NOTE 1 - ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. is a nonprofit corporation organized to provide central leadership and representation for Free Will Baptists of Arkansas and to handle certain receipts and disbursements of Free Will Baptist Churches. The corporation's support comes primarily from COOP receipts and Sunday School literature sales.

The Corporation is exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The following significant accounting policies have been followed in the preparation of the financial statements:

#### Basis of Accounting

The Corporation prepares its financial statements using the accrual basis of accounting, which involves the application of generally accepted accounting principles; consequently, revenues and gains are recognized when earned, and expenses and losses are recognized when incurred.

#### Basis of Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets; unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles includes the use of estimates that affect the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Contributions

The Corporation accounts for contributions in accordance with the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in SFAS No. 116, Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made. In accordance with SFAS No. 116, contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

All donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. The Corporation has no temporarily restricted net assets.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - (CONTINUED)

DECEMBER 31, 2006 AND 2005

#### Property and Equipment and Depreciation

Auto, office furniture and equipment and building improvements are recorded at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method based on the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Expenditures for repairs and maintenance are charged to operations when incurred, while major betterments and renewals are capitalized. The following useful lives were used to calculate depreciation:

#### Cash Equivalents

The Corporation considers all highly liquid investments with a maturity of nine months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

#### **Inventory**

Inventory is stated at the lower of cost (first in, first out method) or market.

#### NOTE 1 - ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **ORGANIZATION**

The Christian Supply Store, Inc., is a nonprofit corporation in Conway, Arkansas, organized to provide Christian material for Arkansas Free Will Baptists. The Corporation also services many other denominations and organizations within Arkansas and other surrounding states. The inventory consists primarily of bibles, music, literature, clothing, reference and training materials as well as eards and gift items.

#### METHOD OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Corporation have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, where income and expenses are recorded as they are earned or incurred.

#### PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method based on the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Estimated useful life of the property, equipment and leasehold improvements range from 3 to 10 years. Depreciation expense for the years ending December 31, 2006 and 2005 are \$4.857 and \$5,374, respectively.

#### INVENTORY

Inventory is recorded at lower of cost or market using first-in, first-out method for cost of sales.

#### STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Corporation considers all investment instruments purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents. Cash available per operating accounts are \$ 1,323 and cash in the contingency fund is \$ 694.

#### State Mission Board Summaries

#### January 11, 2006 (Conference Call)

The State Mission Board held a conference call with all members present, along with Tim Campbell and Don Matchett. The conference call was a preview of Don Matchett and Kerry Gandy's meeting scheduled on Thursday, January 12, 2006 in Cabot with Jim Fairchild. Several needful items at Cabot were reviewed and a consensus of action was agreed upon.

#### January 30-31, 2006 (All Boards Meeting)

The State Mission Board at First Free Will Baptist Church in Conway during the All Boards meeting.

Monday (PM), January 30, 2006

Board members Jackie Brown, Randy Burris, Kerry Gandy, David Taylor, Gerald Thomas and Ken Winningham were present, along with Mission Director Don Matchett. Don opened in prayer.

Minutes of the December 13, 2005 Board meeting and the January 11, 2006 conference call were distributed and reviewed. A motion carried to accept the minutes of both meetings. No financial reports were available.

Jim Fairchild met with the Board and distributed a written annual report for 2005 at the Worship Center FWB Church. Goals and projects for 2006 were included in the report. A motion carried that Don Matchett (state office staff) serve as the bookkeeper for the Cabot Church until a qualified church member can assume this responsibility. A motion carried that we apply for a credit card for the Worship Center FWB Church to allow Jim to handle necessary every-day church needs.

Don Matchett distributed copies of his February-March itinerate. Copies of church/district association A.C.T.S. 1:8 giving totals for 2002 through 2005 were handed out. Don Matchett shared updates from A.C.T.S. 1:8 missionaries Randy Ledbetter (Salt Lake City, UT), John Reed (Green Bay, WI), and Paul Hammons (Flagstaff, AZ). It was noted that Randy Ledbetter and John Reed are already sending offerings in to A.C.T.S. 1:8.

By a 4-0 vote, a motion carried to approve the merger of the Arkansas State Mission Board with the Arkansas State Association. Chairman Kerry Gandy asked the members to think of five (5) goals for the Board to accomplish in 2006.

The next scheduled meeting is February 21, 2006 (10:00 am) at the State Office. Gerald Thomas closed in prayer.

#### February 21, 2006

The State Mission Board met at the State Office in Conway. Board members Jackie Brown, Kerry Gandy, David Taylor, Gerald Thomas and Ken Winningham were present, along with Mission Director Don Matchett and Executive Director Tim Campbell. After prayer requests, Ken opened in prayer.

Don Matchett gave his report. The A.C.T.S. 1:8 Task Force minutes were read and the 2007 budget of \$475,000.00 was presented. A motion carried to send the proposal on to the State Association annual meeting in August for adoption. The 2007 State Mission Board budget was presented. Don Matchett gave the Mission Director's report. A motion carried to receive the State Mission Board financial report for July as printed and reviewed. Don's August and September itinerate was shared. The Board agreed that plans for Don and Kerry to visit the mission works in Salt Lake City, Utah (Ledbetter & Warren) and Prescott, Arizona (Hammons) proceed as previously discussed.

July financial and attendance information pertaining to the Cabot work was reviewed. A motion carried that the Worship Center FWB Church be authorized to purchase a used (60 hours) John Deere mower (60" cut) for \$7,000.00. The monies will come from the church treasury, pledges from the Cabot members, and the building fund. The search continues for a missionary pastor for the Cabot work.

John Reed (Green Bay, WI) reports that an acre of land adjacent to their property has come available

With Nelson's letter of August 15, 2006 as background, it was explained that 2007 budgets totaling approximately \$800,000.00 were set by International Missions for our missionaries, while the 2007 A.C.T.S. 1:8 budget adopted at our recent state meeting was \$475,000.00. With A.C.T.S. 1:8 receipts not exceeding \$489,000.00 over the past six years and the addition of new missionaries over the same period of time, surpluses in missionary accounts have been depleted. With no significant increase in A.C.T.S. 1:8 giving, a large difference in the budgets established and those adopted, we now face a crisis of missionaries not being able to return to the field and maybe those on the field returning home-all to raise monies to bolster their accounts.

Workable solutions centered around four areas:

What can the Task Force do?

What can the missionary do?

What can the Mission Board and Director do?

What can the State Office do?

Discussion offered some positive ideas that included:

Plan for a Sunday in October to be set aside in our churches for fasting and prayer for the crisis facing our missionaries.

Ask pastors and churches to set aside a Sunday in January for receiving commitments from people to give to missions through the A.C.T.S. 1:8 Plan.

Divide up the churches in the state by the number of missionaries, and have each missionary keep special contact with their assigned churches and visit them during their furlough time.

Ask churches to give extra during the last four months of 2006 to help erase the deficit accounts.

Discussion was also made regarding developing some clear guidelines of the roles and responsibilities of the Mission Board and Director and the Task Force regarding the

A.C.T.S. 1:8 program. It was also discussed about developing a format or application process for future missionary candidates to apply for A.C.T.S. 1:8 financial funding.

Following an altar of prayer, the meeting dismissed.

After lunch the Mission Board met back at the State Office with all members present except Randy Burris.

The Board discussed possible steps to take as a Mission Board to help meet the crisis in AC.T.S. 1:8 funding. An update was given by Don Matchett on the status at the Cabot mission, followed by discussion.

The next scheduled Mission Board meeting is set for Tuesday, October 17,2006 (9:00 am) at the State Office. Don Matchett closed the meeting in prayer.

#### September 27, 2006 (Conference Call)

The State Mission Board held a conference call with board members Jackie Brown, Randy Burris, Kerry Gandy, David Taylor, Gerald Thomas and Ken Winningham present, along with Mission Director Don Matchett and Executive Director Tim Campbell.

After discussion, a motion carried that the Mission Board is open to considering a bi-vocational pastor at Cabot. A motion carried to adjourn.

October 24, 2006 (Conference Call)

The State Mission Board held a conference call with all board members on line. Mission Director Don Matchett and Executive Director Tim Campbell also took part in the conference call.

Chairman Kerry Gandy asked for a roll-call of the Board members and it was unanimously agreed to extend a second interview to Joe Tolbert. This interview was tentatively set for 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, October 31, 2006 at the State Office. Don Matchett will contact Joe about the interview and request that his wife accompany him, if possible.

Don Matchett closed the meeting in prayer.

#### October 31, 2006

The State Mission Board met at the State Office with all Board members present. Mission Director Don Matchett and Executive Director Tim Campbell were also in attendance. Randy Burris opened in prayer.

A motion carried to accept the minutes of the October 24, 2006 conference call. A motion carried to accept the October 17, 2006 minutes with their corrections.

Chairman Kerry Gandy reviewed the business of the day: to interview Reverend Joseph Tolbert for the position of Missionary Pastor at the Cabot Church. Questions to be asked were reviewed. It was agreed that the Board would make a decision whether to extend a call to the candidate, or not, at the end of our interview.

A motion carried to offer a salary benefit package to the missionary. A motion carried that the mission work/missionary would be a state project only. A motion carried that the Board secretary review the offer of employment agreement between the missionary and the Mission Board and email the revised version to the Board members ASAP for their review and approval.

At 10:00 am the Board met with Joe Tolbert. His wife Mandy was not able to attend due to work obligations. Gerald Thomas led in prayer. The Board members asked the candidate questions regarding ministry concepts, worship, plans, goals, problem solving, etc. Don Matchett dismissed the morning session in prayer. The Board and guests went to lunch.

Kerry Gandy opened the afternoon session in prayer.
After discussion, a motion carried (unanimously) to
extend a call to Joe Tolbert to be the Missionary Pastor
of the Cabot work. The Board reconvened its meeting
with the candidate and shared the salary benefit package being offered and extended the invitation to the

Cabot work to him. Joe said that he would be able to give an answer within a week's time.

A conference call will be set up by Don Matchett to advise the Board of Joe's decision. Jackie Brown closed the meeting in prayer.

#### November 21, 2006

The State Mission Board held a conference call with all Board members present. Mission Director Don Matchett and Executive Director Tim Campbell were also a part of the call.

Don Matchett informed the Board that Joe Tolbert would accept the position of missionary pastor at the Cabot work. A motion carried to hire Joe Tolbert.

Plans are for Joe's first Sunday at Cabot to be December 17, 2006. Don will be looking into a wording question on the employment agreement between the missionary and the Mission Board.

#### A.C.T.S. 1:8 Task Force Summaries

#### June 20, 2006

The A.C.T.S. 1:8 Task Force met at the Conway First FWB Church in Conway with 13 people in attendance. Nelson Henderson, Task Force Chairman opened in prayer.

Don Matchett, State Mission Director discussed the year-to-date totals for the A.C.T.S. 1:8 program. He explained the formula currently in use was not keeping all of the missionary accounts in good standing. He also discussed the goal for 2007.

Motion passed to set \$475,000 as the 2007 A.C.T.S. 1:8 goal.

The funds reallocated to a missionary account would not exceed the original percentage of allocation to date. This proposal will supersede any previous proposal for allocation.

We recommend these two items be presented to the State Mission Board and the Arkansas State Association.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2006 AND 2005

#### NOTE 1 - ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Arkansas State Home Mission Board of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. is a nonprofit Corporation incorporated under the law of the State of Arkansas. The purpose of the corporation is to establish and support Free Will Baptists Mission Churches in the state of Arkansas. The corporation's support comes primarily from donor contributions and COOP receipts.

The Corporation is exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue: Code.

The following significant accounting policies have been followed in the preparation of the financial statements:

#### Basis of Accounting

The Corporation prepares its financial statements using the accrual basis of accounting, which involves the application of generally accepted accounting principles; consequently, revenues and gains are recognized when earned, and expenses and losses are recognized when incurred.

#### **Basis of Presentation**

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets; unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles includes the use of estimates that affect the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Contributions**

The Organization accounts for contributions in accordance with the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in SFAS No. 116, Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made. In accordance with SFAS No. 116, contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

All donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. The Organization has no permanently restricted net assets.

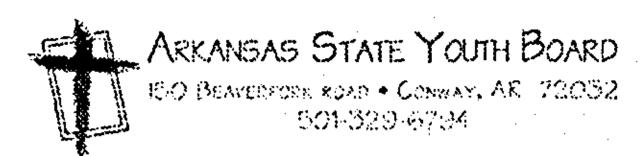

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#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Trustees of Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth Camp, Inc.

I have audited the accompanying balance sheets of Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth Camp, Inc. (a nonprofit corporation) as of December 31, 2006 and 2005, and the related statements of revenues and expenses, and each flows for the years then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Organization's management. My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit.

Except as discussed in the following paragraph, I conducted my audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. I believe that my audit provides a reasonable basis for my opinion.

The Organization has elected to record the values of fixed assets, specifically the campground land and facilities, at the appraised values. Generally accepted accounting principles require that fixed and operational assets be valued at actual cost less appropriate adjustments for depreciation and substantial decreases for obsolescence. Due to the limited records and the extensive use of donations relating to the establishment of the campground properties, it was not practical for me to extend my examination of such records beyond the amounts recorded.

In my opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the actual cash and donation records referred to in the preceding paragraph been susceptible to satisfactory audit test, the financial statements referred to in the first paragraph present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Haptists Youth Camp, Inc. as of December 31, 2006 and 2005, and its results of its operations and its cash flows for the years then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **GENERAL**

Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth Camp, Inc. is a nonprofit corporation established to serve the Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth by providing summer camp and retreat facilities.

#### METHOD OF ACCOUNTING

The Camp maintains its financial records on a basis of cash received and cash disbursed for internal purposes, with appropriate accruals for receivable and payable balances at the end of each fiscal period for financial statement purposes. This accounting method is generally accepted among nonprofit organizations as the most feasible way of reflecting their financial activity and position. The fund balance represents the Camp's equity in its assets.

#### LAND, BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Due to limited records and the extensive use of donations related to the establishment, development, and maintenance of the campground facilities, the land and buildings are recorded at their appraised value. Generally accepted accounting principles require that fixed and operational assets be recorded at cost less appropriate adjustments for depreciation and substantial decreases for obsolescence. Equipment, auto and camp improvements are recorded at cost and appropriate provisions for depreciation have been applied. Depreciation expenses for the years ended are \$ 23,450 and \$ 23,337 respectively.

#### STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the company considers all investment instruments purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

# ARKANSAS STATE ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

### Preamble

From experience we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us; to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination with us; to unify the work of the various districts composing the State Association; and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in cooperation with the various districts of the Association, for that may be hereafter represented therein, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denominational government.

### Article I.

#### Name:

This organization shall be known as the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

### Article II.

### Purpose:

The purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various districts composing the State Association and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various districts in the Association.

## Article III.

## Representation:

- Section 1. This association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in a church belonging to a district association, the district associational clerk, all members of state boards, and standing officers of the state association.
- Section 2. Each district association shall be entitled to five (5) lay delegates at large. Each local church which holds membership in a district association affiliated with this body shall be entitled to send one lay delegate.

## Section 3. Associational Delegates:

A. In the event any of the elected delegates fail to report, said vacancy may be filled by appointment of the moderator of said district or by the delegates present from said district.

- B. In the event the elected delegate from a local church is not present, the Pastor of that local church shall have the authority to appoint a delegate to serve in place of the absent delegate.
- Section 4. New associations desiring membership in the state association shall send messengers bearing a petitionary letter. If found orthodox, upon examination by the credentials committee, they shall be received by the vote of the association and given the right hand of fellowship by moderator.
- Section 5. The State Convention shall convene annually on the Tuesday following the first Sunday in the month of August unless another time is recommended by the Executive Committee.

### Article IV.

#### Finance:

- Section 1. This association shall be supported by a percentage of the Cooperative receipts as designated by the State Association and by designated gifts. Said allocations to national and state work to be recommended to the association by the budget committee.
- Section 2. Each district association shall send \$25.00 for each church belonging to the district association for the purpose of entertaining the State Association; \$100.00 for each church for National Association fees; and \$5.00 per each church for minutes, for a total of \$130.00.
- Section 3. In the event any church within a local association does not pay its fee; the delegates, deacons, and ministers of that church shall not be seated.

## Article V.

## Discipline:

Section 1. This State Association shall have the right to settle any questions of discipline, doctrine, or practice that may properly come before it from any of the districts composing said organization. If there be any question of discipline, doctrine, or practice on the part of a district body, delegates of that association shall be not seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the credentials committee.

Section 2. The decision of the credentials committee may be appealed to the State Association sitting in a committee as a whole.

## Article VI.

#### Officers:

Section 1. The officers of the State Association shall consist of a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, and executive director. Each of these, with exception of the executive director shall be elected annually. These shall constitute a standing Executive Committee.

- Section 2. The Executive Committee shall plan the State Association. A district association desiring to host the state association shall extend an invitation at least one year in advance. If an invitation is not received, the State Association will convene in the Conway area unless another site is recommended by the Executive Committee.
- Section 3. The Executive Committee shall employ the auditor for all standing boards. The auditor shall be responsible to report directly to the committee, and then to the directors and boards. The audits shall be paid for by each respective board.
- Section 4. The Moderator shall be an ex-officio member of the Executive Board. The Executive Director shall be an ex-officio member of all standing boards and committees.
- Section 5. A committee on committees shall be elected by the body on the opening night of the association. All other committees shall be appointed by the committee on committees.
- Section 6. The moderator, assistant moderator, executive director, clerk, and assistant clerk shall serve as the program committee for the State Association.

### Article VII.

Duties and Rules of Standing Boards:

Section 1. All standing boards shall be composed of six (6) members, each of whom shall serve for three years. A member may be reelected for an additional term of three years. No board member shall immediately succeed himself after having served two full three-year terms on said board.

Each board shall prepare a budget of its proposed financial expenditures at the beginning of each fiscal year and shall present same for approval by the Arkansas State Association along with an audit made by an independent certified public accountant, which audit shall lead to the expression of an unqualified opinion on the financial statements. The auditor's report shall include, where applicable, a balance sheet and income statement and other schedules as may be necessary for a proper presentation of the financial condition and results of operation.

- Section 2. All boards of this association shall organize immediately following the annual association meeting. They shall elect a chairman, vice-chairman, and secretary. Each board shall give a written report at the annual association of meetings conducted, work accomplished, monies received and expended during the year
- Section 3. Executive Board: This board shall have the authority to fill irregular vacancies which may occur in its own body, and any irregular vacancies which may occur in any standing board between sessions of the state association. An office may be declared vacant for any of the

reasons: if a member moves from the State; if a member fails to attend the board meetings for a period of one year without providential hindrance; or if for any reason he submits a statement of resignation.

The Executive Board shall keep a record of all work accomplished, money raised, meetings conducted, and make a full and complete report at the annual association of the State Association. The Executive Board shall receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey property entrusted to the State Association, except as stipulated elsewhere in the constitution.

No board shall buy or sell real estate, encumber the State Association beyond their current fiscal year and budget, or enter into litigation when the State Association is not in conference without the approval of the Executive Board. The chairman and secretary of the Executive Board shall sign all papers by which the State Association is to become legally responsible.

In case of an emergency situation, the Executive Board shall have the authority to call the State Association in conference by notifying each district association at least ten (10) days prior to the conference.

A bookstore shall be operated under the supervision and direction of the Executive Board who shall have the authority to employ a bookstore manager. A contractual agreement shall be signed annually by the manager of the bookstore and the Executive Board. The manager shall present a financial statement of the bookstore operation at each annual session of the association.

This board shall have the authority to employ the state executive director. A contractual agreement shall be signed annually by the executive director and the Executive Board. The executive director shall assist in coordinating the work of the various boards of the State Association and shall serve as state treasurer. He shall promote both the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper.

He shall receive, hold, and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made when requested.

He shall present a written report of his work at each annual session of this association, with a financial statement of all monies received and contract of the contract of th

Section 4. Mission Board: It shall be the duty of this board to promote an active missions program. It shall work in cooperation with the national home mission and foreign missions boards in the arranging of missionary conferences, of missionary itineraries, and shall assist in the raising of the State quota for the national missions program.

The board shall not participate in the organization of any church or mission in a town, city, or community where there is an organized Free Will Baptist Church without seeking the cooperation of said church. Neither shall this board assist in the organization of a group that is out of fellowship with an established church.

This board shall be entrusted to receive, hold, manage, use, control, or convey State Mission Property.

Section 5. State Youth Board: It shall be the duty of the State Youth Board to sponsor activities for the youth of the state that will encourage, enlighten, and educate them in a manner which will be uplifting to Christ. This board shall sponsor retreats, conferences, activities, camps, and service oriented projects for the youth. This board shall be trustees of the camp facilities owned by the state. It shall be the responsibility of this board to employ a State Youth Director to manage the camp facilities, organize and coordinate youth activities, and receive and disburse designated funds as directed by this poard. The State Youth Director shall promote district, state, and national programs involving the youth. The Youth Director shall

be responsible for the hiring and dismissing of camp personnel under the lirection of the State Youth Board.

Section 6. Christian Education Board: It shall be the duty of this board o promote Christian education throughout the state. They shall arrange ctivities which may include conferences, workshops, teacher training ourses, and retreats to promote instruction and fellowship.

## Article VIII.

Amendments:

This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present, providing proposed mendment is presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

## Article IX.

Hillsdale Trustees:

The State Association shall have two trustees to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. They shall give an annual report to the State Association on the progress of the college. One board member shall be elected annually to erve a two-year term.

## Article X.

Parliamentary Procedure:

This meeting of the State Association shall be governed by the rules of Parliamentary law as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.
