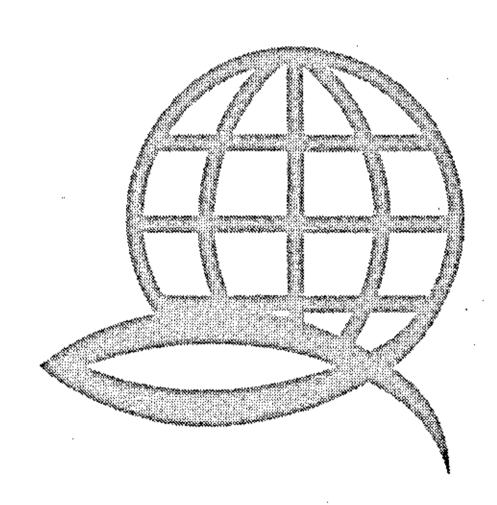

PROCEEDINGS

Monday Evening, May 19, 2014

The 117th Annual Session of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists met at Camp Beaverfork, Conway AR on May 19-20, 2014.

Tim Landers was responsible for the music during the State Association, and Sandy Foreman served on the keyboard.

Wendell Leckbee, Clerk, welcomed those present, called the session to order. He introduced the Moderator, Nelson Henderson. Moderator made announcements, welcomed those attending and led in prayer.

The Committee on Committees was elected as follows: David Taylor, Michael Morrison, Dwayne Roper, Tim Harris and Greig Caswell.

Tim Landers led the congregation in singing "Since I Have Been Redeemed" and "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus".

Nelson Henderson made known special prayer requests including those suffering from the tornados in Arkansas, preachers suffering physical needs, and one another. Paul Payne led in prayer.

Tim Campbell introduced Craig Batts, Pastor of Cross Timbers, Nashville, TN, whose message was from Matthew 5:14-16 "Who Am I-The Light of the World". Before he

spoke special music was presented by the Matchetts who sang "The Lighthouse" and "I Called Him Lord"

Tim Landers led the congregation in singing "Have Thy Own Way" Report of the Committee on Committees was received.

After announcements the meeting was adjourned.

Tuesday Morning, May 20, 2014

The service opened with a welcome from Nelson Henderson, Moderator. He delivered the Moderator's Message "The Battle for the Hearts and Minds of our People". He read from Psalms 46 with emphasis on the destruction of our value system.

Report of the Credentials Committee was read by the clerk. Motion passed to accept the report and seat the delegates.

Keith Burden, Executive Secretary of the National Association, addressed the attendees regarding the work of the Executive Department. He expressed appreciation for Arkansas and its people. He requested prayer for the family of Tim Osborne-TN.

Stan Bunch, Promotional Director-Missouri, shared information and a challenge to set apart at least one day a month to pray and fast.

Report of the Arkansas Women Active for Christ was given by Lisa Bowden, President. Motion passed to receive the report.

Report of the Executive Director was given by Tim Campbell. He expressed appreciation for those working at the State Office. He presented a plaque to Paul Payne for his service on the Executive Board. The report was received and the budget adopted.

Kurt Heathering, Vice President of James Greene and Associates (Brotherhood Mutual) presented a dividend check of \$6,865. He expressed appreciation for those participating and encouraged other churches to consider the program.

Mark Stripling, Chairman of the Executive Board, expressed appreciation for Tim Campbell and the motion to adopt the budget. Motion made to put the budget into effect immediately passed. The motion that the \$6,865 dividend check from Brotherhood Mutual be applied to the debt of the State Office for the automobile. He also presented information that our State constitution reflect the same wording on same sex marriage that will be voted at the National Association in July.

David Bishop and David Taylor were elected to the Executive Board.

The Moderator introduced the subject of the date of the State Meeting in the future. The vote was 62 - 0 to meet in May.

The Report of the Christian Education Board was given by David Ponder. The report was received and the budget adopted.

Danny O'Neil and David Ponder were re-elected to the board.

Derek Bell, Director of Development at Free Will Baptist Family Ministries brought their report and greetings. He expressed his appreciation for the work of the Florence Crittenton Home, under the leadership of Debbie Stripling, and their part in changing the life of people they serve. He thanked Arkansas people for their financial support of \$108,001.36 during the reporting year. So far this year \$121,532.14 has been received. He encouraged churches to invite State Representative, Ken Winningham for a presentation of FWBFM.

Angie Outlaw reported on how Arkansas Free Will Baptists had affected her life and the lives of others through the many ministries of Arkansas and their support of their work in Central Asia.

David Taylor spoke about his involvement as an Area Coordinator for a program from the Billy Graham Association.

David Womack brought greetings from Randall House. He presented a banner representing \$49,156 from the sale of Sunday School Literature which went to support Arkansas State Ministries. He expressed appreciation for Linda Whitten and Diane Caswell for their efforts with Randall House Literature. He reported that new Rejoice Hymnals and Dr. Picirilli's book "Discipleship" were available.

Tuesday Morning Worship Service, May 20, 2014

Services began with prayer led by Nelson Henderson. Tim Landers lead the congregation in singing "Heaven Came Down".

Lynn Crawford, pastor of New Horizon-Springdale, was introduced by Nelson Henderson. He spoke after special music by Sheila Harris. His message was from Exodus 40:34-38 – "The Glory of God"

The meeting was adjourned.

Tuesday Afternoon, May 20, 2014

The Report of the State Youth Director was given by Brian Kesterson. He expressed appreciation to groups and individuals who supported the camp in many ways. He encouraged attention to the scholarship program as well as keeping a review of the web sites. He introduced Alene Coffman and talked about the Lawnie Coffman gift of land to Camp Beaverfork and the continued support of the camp. When presented with a plaque, she said it was worth it all to have the chance to serve and to honor Lawnie's memory and God's Glory.

The Report of the Youth Board was given by Brian Kesterson. The report was received and the budget adopted. Jason Sullivan was re-elected to the board.

Bob Thompson, Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, reported on the college and its 55 years of service. He expressed appreciation to Arkansas board member and the support of Arkansas people both financially and sending their students. Kendall Ross was reelected at a Hillsdale trustee.

Ray Lewis, President and CEO of Free Will Baptist Board of Retirement, expressed appreciation for those participating in the retirement program. He encouraged every church to be aware of changes regarding taxes on pastors individual health insurance, housing allowance and the filing of a "responsible party" form.

David Brown, Director-Free Will Baptist Foundation, reported on the work and strength of the Foundation. He reported that Estate Planning seminars were available through the Foundation and encouraged churches to look at the Cornerstone Program as well as gifts, endowments, etc., available through the Foundation. He presented a thought about every Free Will Baptist leaving 10% of their estate to an endowment at the Foundation.

Matt Pinson, President of Welch College, reported that Arkansas was third in sending students and third in sending support. He expressed appreciation for Arkansas students and the service of Mark Stripling as a board member. He noted that on campus enrollment was up 24% and that on line BS degree in Ministry is now available.

The Report of the Missions Director was given by Don Matchett. He noted areas of vision and progress. Campus Connection, partnering with other countries without an American missionary and our efforts to secure Rolando Delgado to serve in the Hispanic ministry – what can be developed from that start. The report was received and the budget adopted. He presented a plaque to Michael Morrison for his service to the board. A plaque honoring David Winfrey will be presented to Mrs. Winfrey for his service to the Mission Board. Jared Higginbotham was elected to the board.

Jordan Looney shared about his service to the church in Aurora, CO as well as his appreciation of Arkansas people who supported him in his ministry while he was at Cabot.

Sam McVey brought greetings from International Missions. He expressed appreciation for Nelson Henderson who serves on the board, support of Don Matchett's work as State Missions Director and the support of Arkansas people through prayer and finances.

Donnie and Ruth McDonald spoke to those present about their family and their service in Japan. Ruth spoke about the influence of the camp on her life and her appreciation for it. Both expressed appreciation for prayers, Acts 1:8 Program and the support of Arkansas Free Will Baptists.

Ken Akers, Director of Master's Men, reported on the work of the department. He encouraged churches to participate in the activities at the National in Ft. Worth and to encourage support of Master's Men. He expressed appreciation of John Fowlkes who serves on the board and reported that Arkansas is the number one state in giving to Master's Men.

The Report of the Resolution Committee: None reported

The Report of the Obituary Committee was read by Keith Bowden, Assistant Clerk. Tim Foreman led in prayer.

The Report of the Registration Committee was received and adopted.

State officers elected were: Moderator-Nelson Henderson, Assistant Moderator-Randy Scott, Clerk-Wendell Leckbee and Assistant Clerk-Keith Bowden.

Delegates to the National Association were elected as follows: Brenda Housley, Lisa Bowden, Cameron Lane, and Melissa Haralson.

A recommendation was made from Shiloh Assocciation to send a resolution to the National Association involving the formation of a committee to consider the merger of Home Missions and International Missions. The motion failed.

Meeting adjourned.

Tuesday Evening Worship Service, My 20, 2014

Pre-Meeting music was presented by North Little Rock Choir.

Nelson Henderson called the meeting to order and expressed appreciation to those attending.

The Report of Master's Men was given by Jared Fowlkes which included information about a five year plan for Master's Men Disaster Relief. The report was received.

Don Matchett presented a plaque to Patsy Vanhook, Arkansas missionary to France for 41 years. She commented on the Acts 1:8 Plan and its benefits to her and other missionaries.

The Statistics Report was received.

Greig Caswell reported on the effects of the tornado that struck Vilonia and appreciation for the people at Vilonia for all their relief efforts. He stated that 328 houses were destroyed as well as 85% of the retail business.

Tim Landers led the congregation in singing "We have an Anchor" and "Open My Eyes that I may See". Randy Scott led in prayer.

Nelson Henderson introduced the North Little Rock Choir who presented the Special Music and Kendall Ross, Pastor at Ozark who brought the message. His text was from Revelation 3:14-22 with the subject "What the Spirit says to you, me and the churches" After closing remarks the 117th session was adjourned.

REPORT OF THE ARKANSAS WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST

The 11th Annual Presidents Luncheon was held on Friday night, March 7, 2014 at the Conway First Church. The evening meal was served by the Arkansas Executive Committee. The theme was "Leadership". 32 ladies attended the meeting with 12 presidents attending the luncheon for the first time.

The 60th Annual session of the Arkansas Women Active for Christ met March 8, 2014 at Camp Beaverfork in Conway. The theme was "Tangled Tapestry...Grace Weaver". The theme scripture was 1 Corinthians 2:9. The speaker was Ruth McDonald, Missionary to Japan. Rachel Vaughn led in worship with Robin Richardson as the pianist. Special music was by Rachel Vaughn of Polk Bayou District.

Home Missionaries gave greeting and updates during the Missionary Share Time. WNAC report was given by Lisa Bowden in place of Executive Director, Elizabeth Hodges.

11 Districts reported with 65 locals and membership of 702. A total of 128 registered, including 1 IM and 3 Home Missionaries.

Total receipts for 2013 were \$69,402.60. Our giving to ACTS 1:8 was \$16,433, IM was \$10,956.92, National Home Missions \$12,428.43, Children's Home \$4,496.08, Florence Crittenton Home \$5,307.18, and out State Project was Tom & Pam Jones, missionaries to Pennsylvania. Out 2014 State Project is Donnie & Ruth McDonald, missionaries to Japan.

The Annual Retreat will be held on September 19-20, 2014 at Camp Beaverfork. The theme is "Devine Design" by speaker Pam Jones, missionary to Pennsylvania. The theme scripture is from Psalm 139:14. Worship will be led by Sue Little and Fawn

Gibson. Decorations will be by the New Hope District. Central District will be providing the meals during the registration time 6:00-7:15 before service begins. The YWAC ladies will be working on cards for the missionary children during the retreat on Friday night. Rachel and Beth Bryant of the Memphis area will be speaking to the young ladies on Purity as well.

REPORT OF THE YOUTH DIRECTOR

After 43 years of service to Arkansas FWB Youth-Camp Beaverfork is still committed to providing a place where the lives of youth are changes forever. I want to personally thank everyone who has given sacrificially over the past year. This ministry is a "Team Ministry" with a heart!

Youth Retreats: We had 190 in attendance for the Kid's Retreat and 165 in attendance for the Teen Retreat. During these retreats, our youth were submitted to the strong preaching of God's Word by Arkansas "Preacher Boys" Dustin Crawford (Quail Valley FWB, Batesville, AR), Nathan King (Old Reyno), Devon Dundee (Cavanaugh FWB), Jimmy Wisdom (Cave City FWB). The dates for 2015 have been set as follows: Kids Retreat – February 27-28, 2015 and Teen Retreat March 6-7, 2015.

State Youth Competition: We saw a slight decrease in the 2013 State Competition. We had a total of 196 entries go to Union Grove and move 103 forward to Tampa, FL for the NYC Competition. 73 of these entries placed at the national level: 30—1st place, 29 –2nd place, and 14—3rd place.

In April of 2014, 240 entries went to Russellville to take part in the State Competition. This year, 134 entries will be moving forward to Fort Worth, TX for the NYC

Competition. Be in prayer for all these young people as they move on. Saturday, April 25, 2015 will be the date for the State Youth Competition.

National Youth Conference: Arkansas's youth continued to make an impact during the NYC by participating in several national opportunities. Congratulations for Christian Gunter (Center Point FWB) for being selected as 2013 Youth of the Year.

2013 Camp Session: 885 campers and staff attended Camp Beaverfork this year. This was an increase from 2012. 34 salvation decisions, 29 rededication, 78 other decisions and 9 answered the call into ministry.

Rentals: In 2013 Camp Beaverfork hosted 14 rentals. So far, all our renters from this past season have secured dates for the 2014 year and so far we continue to have additional books.

Don Guthrie Memorial Scholarship: This year one male and one female who will be enrolled this fall at a Free Will Baptist college will be awarded a \$500.00 scholarship. Deadline is August 1, 2014 for applications to be submitted.

REPORT OF THE MISSIONS DIRECTOR

I am very thankful for those who served on the Arkansas Missions Boards in 2013 and 2014. (Blaine Rogers, Michael Morrison, the late David Winfrey, Jeff Holland, Russell Thomas and Kevin Jewell) They have all proven invaluable in discerning the direction of the mission efforts of Arkansas Free Will Baptists.

I am also appreciative of my colleagues of Arkansas Free Will Baptist, Linda Whitten, Diana Caswell, Tim Campbell and Brian Kesterson.

Last year I stated "The mission board has made a firm commitment to assist Cabot for

two more years", but the people themselves decided that it was time to say good bye to the church in Cabot. As we have reported at many state meetings, the work at Cabot continued to be an uphill battle, and I believe that it was the right decision. Closing churches are never pleasant.

Speaking of change, you may remember that I briefly talked about a few areas in missions, that we were focusing on. I would briefly like to discuss that a little further. Last year terms of "Vision Projects":

Last year I gave you three things that were on the drafting board: A) International Partnerships: We would provide a helping hand to our Free Will Baptist brothers and sisters, bot educationally and financially, to help be worldwide planters. B) Campus Connections: Collaborate with local churches in college towns. Help train and implement college ministries, both national and international in the local churches. We are still hopeful but until a church in a college town steps up to help, we cannot move forward. C): Last year I told you that the Arkansas Mission Board hired Rolando Delgado to come to Arkansas as a missionary to the Spanish speaking people. A year later, we still continue to provide the US Government with information. Praise the Lord he has been approved. He will begin work in Russellville and expand from there. D): Another "Project Vision" which has found us. That is "Disaster Relief". In the recent tornado damage of Vilonia and Mayflower, our people responded in an amazing way. All I did was ask and you responded. I calculated that we had over 120 volunteers over a 10 day period, and we received \$12,557.83 in cash and \$1,200.00 in gift cards that were distributed to the Free Will Baptist storm victims. This lets me know where you are interested in ministering and we can improve on how we respond to disasters.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRATION COMMITTEE

The following have registered during the 117th annual session of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, held at Camp Beaverfork, May 19-20, 2014. Ministers 54, Deacons 10, Delegates 20, Missionaries 8, Visitors 59 for a total of 151 registered.

STATISTICS REPORT

The Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptist reports 16 associations comprised of 194 churches. The statistics for membership, baptism, etc., are based on the 178 churches who reported.

There are 79 churches in a city/town; 106 churches in rural; 91 with full-time pastors and 75 part-time pastors.

There are 259 ordained ministers, 53 licensed ministers, and 362 ordained deacons.

The churches reported 462 baptisms with 736 members added, 301 members lost, with a total membership of 16,050.

Sunday school enrollment of 7,533, CTS enrollment was 1,639, Women Active for Christ and Master's Men totals have been eliminated from National forms.

There were 4 churches with day care; 4 churches with kindergartens, 1 church with Christian day school.

The total income of all churches reporting was \$11,305,814.93 and 84 churches with budgets.

There were 53 churches with parsonages, and total value of all church property, including parsonages, is \$76,222,704.00

I have audited the accompanying statements of financial position of Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. (a nonprofit Corporation) as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, and the related statements of activities, and cash flows for the years then ended. The financial statements are the responsibility of the Organization's management. My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit.

Except as discussed in the following paragraph, I conducted my audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. These standards require that I plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. I believe my audit provides a reasonable basis for my opinion.

The Organization has elected to record the values of land and buildings, specifically the state offices at Conway, Arkansas, at the current appraised values. Generally accepted accounting principles require that operational assets be valued at actual cost less appropriate adjustments for depreciation and substantial decreases for obsolescence. Due to limited records and the extensive use of donations relating to the establishment of the above mentioned property, it was not practical for me to extend my examination of such records beyond the amounts recorded.

In my opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the actual cash and donations records referred to in the preceding paragraph been susceptible to satisfactory audit tests, the financial statements referred to in the first paragraph present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. as of December 31, 2013 and 2012 and its results of operations and its cash flows for the years then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

NOTE 1 - ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. is a nonprofit corporation organized to provide central leadership and representation for Free Will Baptists of Arkansas and to handle certain receipts and disbursements of Free Will Baptist Churches. The corporation's support comes primarily from COOP receipts and Sunday School literature sales.

The Corporation is exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The following significant accounting policies have been followed in the preparation of the financial statements:

Basis of Accounting

The Corporation prepares its financial statements using the accrual basis of accounting, which involves the application of generally accepted accounting principles; consequently, revenues and gains are recognized when earned, and expenses and losses are recognized when incurred.

Basis of Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Accounting Standards Codification 958-210-55. Under Accounting Standards Codification, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets; unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles includes the use of estimates that affect the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Contributions

The Corporation accounts for contributions in accordance with the recommendations of the Accounting Standards Codification 958-605-55. In accordance with Accounting Standards 958-605-55, contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

All donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. The Corporation has no temporarily restricted net assets.

DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

Property and Equipment and Depreciation

Auto, office furniture and equipment and building improvements are recorded at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method based on the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Expenditures for repairs and maintenance are charged to operations when incurred, while major betterments and renewals are capitalized. The following useful lives were used to calculate depreciation:

Auto	5 years
Office furniture & equipment	5 years
Building improvements	10 - 25 years

Cash Equivalents

The Corporation considers all highly liquid investments with a maturity of nine months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

Inventory

Inventory is stated at the lower of cost (first in, first out method) or market.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND 2012

NOTE 1 - ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Arkansas Mission Board of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, A Division of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. is a nonprofit Corporation incorporated under the law of the State of Arkansas. The purpose of the corporation is to establish and support Free Will Baptists Mission Churches. The corporation's support comes primarily from donor contributions and COOP receipts.

The Corporation is exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The following significant accounting policies have been followed in the preparation of the financial statements:

Basis of Accounting

The Corporation prepares its financial statements using the accrual basis of accounting, which involves the application of generally accepted accounting principles; consequently, revenues and gains are recognized when earned, and expenses and losses are recognized when incurred.

Basis of Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Accounting Standards Codification 958-210-55. Under Accounting Standards Codification 958-210-55, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets; unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles includes the use of estimates that affect the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Contributions

The Organization accounts for contributions in accordance with the recommendations of the Accounting Standards Codification 958-605-55. In accordance with Accounting Standards 958-605-55, contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

All donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. The Organization has no permanently restricted net assets.

Property

The property at Cabot, Arkansas is carried at cost plus donated labor and material. Expenditures for repairs and maintenance are charged to operations when incurred, while major betterments and renewals are capitalized.

Cash Equivalents

The Corporation considers all highly liquid investments with a maturity of nine months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

The balance is \$12,823 and \$0, at December 31, 2013 and 2012, respectively.

NOTE 6 – CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Board has an accounting risk of loss in the area of cash and cash equivalents to the extent cash funds are not insured by a governmental agency. The amount of accounting risk of loss on December 31, 2013 is \$ 635,539.

I have audited the accompanying balance sheets of Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth Camp, A Division of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. (a nonprofit corporation) as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, and the related statements of revenues and expenses, and cash flows for the years then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Organization's management. My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit.

Except as discussed in the following paragraph, I conducted my audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. I believe that my audit provides a reasonable basis for my opinion.

The Organization has elected to record the values of fixed assets, specifically the campground land and facilities, at the appraised values. Generally accepted accounting principles require that fixed and operational assets be valued at actual cost less appropriate adjustments for depreciation and substantial decreases for obsolescence. Due to the limited records and the extensive use of donations relating to the establishment of the campground properties, it was not practical for me to extend my examination of such records beyond the amounts recorded.

In my opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the actual cash and donation records referred to in the preceding paragraph been susceptible to satisfactory audit test, the financial statements referred to in the first paragraph present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth Camp, a Division of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, and its results of its operations and its cash flows for the years then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

GENERAL

Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth Camp is a nonprofit corporation established to serve the Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth by providing summer camp and retreat facilities.

METHOD OF ACCOUNTING

The Camp maintains its financial records on a basis of cash received and cash disbursed for internal purposes, with appropriate accruals for receivable and payable balances at the end of each fiscal period for financial statement purposes. This accounting method is generally accepted among nonprofit organizations as the most feasible way of reflecting their financial activity and position. The fund balance represents the Camp's equity in its assets.

LAND, BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Due to limited records and the extensive use of donations related to the establishment, development, and maintenance of the campground facilities, the land and buildings are recorded at their appraised value. Generally accepted accounting principles require that fixed and operational assets be recorded at cost less appropriate adjustments for depreciation and substantial decreases for obsolescence. Equipment, auto and camp improvements are recorded at cost and appropriate provisions for depreciation have been applied. Depreciation expenses for the years ended are \$ 22,056 and \$ 22,804 respectively.

STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the company considers all investment instruments purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

INCOME TAXES

The corporation is exempt from federal and state income taxes under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles includes the use of estimates that affect the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

Accounts receivable represent the balance of the COOP monies and contributions held by the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. as of December 31, 2013 and 2012, due payable to Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Baptist Youth Camp.

NOTE 2 - CONTINGENCY FUND

Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth Camp makes periodic payments to a contingency fund to be used in case of an emergency. The Youth Board has discretion over the disbursements of this fund.

NOTE 3 - CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

Camp Beaverfork, Arkansas Free Will Baptists Youth Camp maintains cash deposits at a financial institution located in the United States. Accounts at the institution are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. At December 31, 2013, \$5,725 of the corporation's money was uninsured.

NOTE 4 - SUBSUEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events through May 13, 2014, the date of which the financial statements were available to be issued.

THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE ARKANSAS STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, INC. (REVISED AUGUST 9, 2011)

Preamble

We, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us; to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination with us; to unify the work of the various districts composing the State Association; and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in cooperation with the various districts of the Association, for that may be hereafter represented therein, do therefore ordain this Constitution for the preservation of our doctrine and denominational government.

Article I.

Name:

This organization shall be known as the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II.

Purpose:

The purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various districts composing the State Association and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various districts in the Association.

Article III. The Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. shall be the doctrinal guidelines of the Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

Article IV.

Representation:

Section 1. This association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in a church in good standing with a district association, the district associational clerks, all members of state boards, and standing officers of the state association.

Note: Churches in good standing are churches that in doctrine and practice adhere to the principles and spirit of The Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the National Association of Free Will Baptists and who have paid state and national dues for that calendar year.

Section 2. Each district association shall be entitled to five (5) lay delegates at large. Each local church that holds membership in a district association affiliated with this body shall be entitled to send one lay delegate.

Section 3.

Associational Delegates:

- A. In the event any of the elected delegates fail to report, said vacancy may be filled by appointment of the moderator of said district or by the delegates present from said district.
- B. In the event the elected delegate from a local church is not present, the Pastor of that local church shall have the authority to appoint a delegate to serve in place of the absent delegate.
- Section 4. New associations desiring membership in the state association shall send messengers bearing a petitionary letter. If found orthodox upon examination by the credentials committee, they shall be received by the vote of the association and given the right hand of fellowship by the moderator.
- Section 5. The State Convention shall convene annually on the Monday following the first Sunday in the month of August unless the Executive Committee recommends another time.

Article V. Because each church is autonomous, the State Association shall never exercise any authority over any church, nor shall it in any way interfere with the constitution of any church, or with exercise of its functions as the only ecclesiastical body, but will cheerfully recognize and uphold the absolute independence of the churches.

Article VI.

Finance:

Section 1. This association shall be supported by a percentage of the Cooperative receipts as designated by the State Association and by designated gifts. Said allocations to national and state work will be determined by the State Association.

Section 2. Each district association shall send dues established by the National Association and the State Association.

Section 3. In the event any church within a local association does not pay its fee; the delegates, deacons, and ministers of that church shall not be seated.

Article VII.

Discipline:

Section 1. All offices, board members, committee members, delegates, and employees of the State Association shall be in good standing with the State Association.

Section 2. This State Association shall have the right to settle any questions of discipline, doctrine, or practice that may properly come before it from any of the districts composing said organization. If there be any question of discipline, doctrine, or practice on the part of a district body, delegates of that association shall be not seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the credentials committee.

Section 3. The decision of the credentials committee may be appealed to the State Association sitting in a committee as a whole.

Article VIII.

Officers:

Section 1. The officers of the State Association shall consist of a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, and assistant clerk. Each of these, with exception of the executive director shall be elected annually. These shall constitute a standing Executive Committee.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall plan the annual meeting of the State Association. A district association desiring to host the annual meeting of the State Association shall extend an invitation at least one year in advance. If an invitation is not received, the State Association will convene in the Conway area unless the Executive Committee recommends another site.

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall employ the auditor for all standing boards. The auditor shall be responsible to report directly to the committee, and then to the directors and boards. Each respective board shall pay for the audits.

Section 4. The Moderator shall be an ex-officio member of the Executive Board. The Executive Director shall be an ex-officio member of all standing boards and committees.

Section 5. Committee on Committees: The Executive Committee on the opening night of the association shall appoint a committee on committees. The committee on committees shall appoint all other committees. The clerk shall insure all the nominations are in good standing with the State Association and shall review the report of the committee on committees.

Section 6. Credentials Committees:

A credentials committee composed of five (5) members shall be appointed annually by the Committee on Committees at the State Convention. The credentials committee shall examine petitions for membership from new associations and shall address questions of discipline, doctrine or practice on the part of a district body.

Article IX.

Duties and Rules of Standing Boards:

Section 1. All standing boards, with the exception of the Executive Board, shall be composed of six (6) members, each of whom shall serve for three years. A member may be reelected for an additional term of three years. No board member shall immediately succeed himself after having served two full three-year terms on said board. Each board shall prepare a budget of its proposed financial expenditures at the beginning of each fiscal year and shall present it for approval by the Arkansas State Association along with an audit made by an independent certified public accountant. Each board

schedules as may be necessary for a proper presentation of the financial condition and results of operation. Each board shall create their own by-laws that shall be subject to the approval of the State Association. The Executive Committee shall review all by-laws of all standing boards of the respective divisions of the State Association and recommend them to the State Association for approval.

Section 2. All boards of this association shall organize at their first meeting following the annual association meeting. They shall elect a chairman, vice-chairman, and secretary. Each board shall give a written report at the annual association of meetings conducted, work accomplished, monies received and expended during the year. It is suggested that each board shall meet at least on a quarterly basis.

Section 3a. The Executive Board shall be composed of six (6) members, each of whom shall serve for three years. The chairmen of the Youth Board, the Mission Board, and the Christian Education Board shall be ex officio members of the Executive Board. Regular members may be reelected for an additional term of three years. No board member shall immediately succeed himself after having served two full three-year terms on said board. Each board shall prepare a budget of its proposed financial expenditures at the beginning of each fiscal year and shall present for approval by the Arkansas State Association along with an audit made by an independent certified public accountant. Each board shall also present a budget to actual of the reported year to the State Association for information. The auditor's report shall include, where applicable, a balance sheet and income statement and other schedules as may be necessary for a proper presentation of the financial condition and results of operation.

Section 3b. Executive Board: In any situation that would adversely affect The Arkansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, the Executive Board shall have the responsibility to resolve such matters. The Executive Board is empowered to act for the State Association between sessions of the association, provided that is shall never exercise any authority contrary to the expressed will of the State Association. When any unforeseen emergency occurs in any of the affairs of the State Association, or in any of the interests it controls, that in the judgment of the Executive Board requires action before the next session of the State Association, the Executive Board shall have full authority to take such action as may seem necessary, and all interests concerned shall be governed by such action, provided the Executive Board shall make a full report of all matters pertaining thereunto the next session of the State Association for its approval, and provided further, that nothing in this article shall be construed as giving to the Executive Board authority to execute any matters already committed by the State Association to any of its divisions or boards. This board shall have the authority to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any other standing board between sessions of the State Association. The Executive Committee shall fill any irregular vacancy on the Executive Board. An office may be declared vacant for any of the following reasons: if a member moves from the State; if a member fails to attend the board meetings for a period of one year without providential hindrance; or if for any reason he submits a statement of resignation.

The Executive Board shall review a record of all work accomplished, money raised, and meetings conducted, and make a full and complete report at the annual association of the State Association. The Executive Board shall receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey property entrusted to the State Association, except as stipulated elsewhere in the constitution. No board shall buy or sell real estate, encumber the State Association beyond their current fiscal year and budget, or enter into litigation when the State Association is not in conference without the approval of the Executive Board. The chairman and secretary of the Executive Board shall sign all papers by which the State Association is to become legally responsible. In case of an emergency situation, the Executive Board shall have the authority to call the State Association in conference by notifying each district association at least ten (10) days prior to the conference.

This board shall have the authority to employ the state executive director by means of a signed contractual agreement. The executive director shall assist in coordinating the work of the various boards of the State Association and shall serve as state treasurer. He shall promote the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper.

He shall receive, hold, and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made when requested.

He shall present a written report of his work at each annual session of this association, with a financial statement of all monies received and disbursed.

Section 4. Mission Board: This board shall be entrusted to manage mission property owned by the State Association. It shall be the responsibility of this board to employ a State Missions Director.

The board shall not participate in the organization of any church or mission in a town, city, or community where there is an organized Free Will Baptist Church without seeking the cooperation of said church. Neither shall this board assist in the organization of a group that is out of fellowship with an established church. This board shall be entrusted to manage state mission property.

Section 5. State Youth Board: It shall be the duty of the State Youth Board to sponsor activities for the youth of the state that will encourage, enlighten and educate them in a manner which will be uplifting to Christ. This board shall sponsor retreats, conferences, activities, camps and service oriented projects for the youth. This board shall be entrusted with management of the camp facilities owned by the State Association. It shall be the responsibility of this board to employ a State Youth Director to manage the camp facilities, organize and coordinate youth activities, and receive and disburse designated funds as directed by this board. The State Youth Director shall promote district, state and national programs involving the youth. The Youth Director shall be responsible for the hiring and dismissing of camp personnel under the direction of the State Youth Board.

Article X.

Amendments:

This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present, providing proposed amendment is presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

Article XI.

Hillsdale Trustees:

The State Association shall have two trustees to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. They shall give an annual report to the State Association on the progress of the college. One board member shall be elected annually to serve a two-year term.
