

COMMITTEE REPORTS

TEMPERANCE—We view with alarm the great wave of crime and debauchery now sweeping over our nation, caused, we believe, by the return of the saloon and beer joints.

We earnestly urge all Free Will Baptist to join with all God-loving people in voting and in other ways, using their influence to banish same from our communities.

We further urge the Free Will Baptist to join their influence with God-fearing people for the strict observance of the Sabbath and to keep it sacred unto the Lord.

We further urge the Free Will Baptist to resist the swimming pools, dance halls, Sunday baseball, Sunday picture shows, and all other evils of like nature.

SUNDAY SCHOOL—We urge parents of our faith to be more attentive to the necessity of Sunday school, and we pray they will help to make the Sunday school more attractive for the children.

We urge our Sunday schools to use Free Will Baptist literature.

We furthermore recommend the continuation of the Sunday School day at each Annual Session of the Association, and pray that each Free Will Baptist Sunday school be represented by a program for the Sunday School day. We recommend the banner for the Sunday school meriting the highest attendance during the year.

ENACTMENTS

1916—Be it Resolved, That we recommend that the several churches give our deacons credentials, and that they be required to live up to same, and

Be it further Resolved, That we live up to and practice the same.

- 1918—Be it Resolved, That each church in this Assocition report annually what they have paid their pastor, and the number of times their pastor has attended their church.
- 1919—Be it Resolved, That we empower our Moderator with the power to supply or recommend a pastor to any church that he may know of without a pastor.
- Association of Free Will Baptist, strictly forbid "Tongues" as used by the Apostolic people, and any member of any church wthin our bounds using these tongues is already excluded from our fellowship by their own act.
 - 1936—Be it Enacted, That our Committee on Divine Service shall select a preacher before the close of each session of our Association to preach a Memorial Sermon at the next session.
- 1937—No. 1—Be it Resolved, That we shall petition our State Association to enact Resolution No. 4, deferred in session of 1936.
- No. 2—Be it Resclved, That the Divine Service Committee shall select a preacher before the close of each session of our Association, to preach on some point of our Articles of Faith at the next session.
- No. 3—We, the Arkansas Association of Free Will Baptist, do hereby take this method of expressing our thanks to the Mulberry Church and community for their splendid hospitality, spirit of love, and Christian fellowship shown us during our stay with them. May God bless you all, we pray.
