The following districts were represented in this session: Zion Hope No. 2, Antioch, Social Band, New Hope, Saline, Polk Bayou and Big Springs.

The Gospeliers, Carroll Alexander, Galen Dunbar, Dale Burden, and Willis Wilson, of the Free Will Baptist Bible College of Nashville, Tennessee were featured singers of the convention. The Willoughby duet and quartet, the Pastor's quartet, Nina and Shirley Coffman, the Sawrie family, the Lawson sisters, Vada Ann Wilson, Donna Turner, the Vaughn Trio, the Wright sisters, Patsy Higgins, Carolyn Harlson, Jeanet Eakes and H. Friday Afternoon Session

An offering of \$54.00 was given and \$230.00 in pledges at this time.

A motion was sustained to give Betty Sawrie and committee a vote of thanks for badges.
