Rules of Order

- 1. 'At every meeting, business shall be opened and conducted by prayer, by the Moderator or whosoever he may request.
- 2. Ministers and their wives, deacons and their wives present have seats and are allowed to take part in the discussions on all subjects and vote.
- Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator, personal reflections shall be avoided in all discussions.
- 4. No motion shall be discussed without being seconded.
- 5. When motion has been made and seconded and a member opposes the discussion, the Moderator shall put the question: "Shall it be discussed?" If negative the question shall not be discussed.
- If any proposition or motion under discussion contains two or mote points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.
- 7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on any question without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. All questions decided by a majority of members present.
- 10. No member shall absent himself without special leave of Moderator.
- Minutes shall be leisurely read and corrected before the close of the Association, if necessary.
- 12. In future sessions of the Association, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons each day, or other equivalents.
- 13. The Rules of Order shall be distinctly read from the chair immediately after the organization of the Association.
- Alterations may be mode in these rules at any regular session of the Association.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as churches: and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination with us, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denominational government.

ARTICLE (1)

This shall be called the Arkansas River Valley Association.

ARTICLE (2)

This Association shall be composed of such well regulated Free Will Baptist Churches maintaining Gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practices, favoring the enterprises that have been endorsed by this association.

ARTICLE (3)

The acting members of this association shall be the Ordained Ministers and wives and Deacons and wives, Church Clerks belonging to any church composing the body, also three delegates from each church chosen by the members of their respective churches.

ARTICLE (4)

The officers of this Association shall be a moderator and Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, Treaurer and an Executive Board composed of five members, elected so as to require one member to be elected each year and a Trustee Board composed of these members elected so as to require one member to be elected each year. The Trustee Board shall act as custodians of all property belonging to the Association, and shall sign legal papers when authorized by the Association to do so.

ARTICLE (5)

The property of any church in this Association that should degenerate until they cannot transact business because they are disorganized, shall become the property of the Association and the Executive Board shall have power to execute legal papers for the property.

ARTICLE (6)

This Association shall meet annually at such times and places as shall be decided upon by the Association, also shall meet in regular Quarterly Meetings, and shall at such quarterly meetings have power to transact business of the Association except to change the Constitution.

ARTICLE (7)

This Association may be called together by the Moderator by giving the churches ten days notice of such meeting.

ARTICLE (8)

This Constitution may be changed at any Yearly Meeting by a two-thirds majority of members voting.

ARTICLE (9)

The officials of the Association shall be elected at the close of each regular session.

Church Convenant

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His Grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanctions of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able to promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme, counting it our chief business to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done, in earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree tolabor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts, for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Articles of Faith

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once cricified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.

- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved commital of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. **Perseverance.** All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (1 Cor. 16:2a).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgment, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

ORGANIZATION

The organization of the Arkansas River Valley Association was on June 17th 1961 at the Liberty Free Will Baptist Church, Broken Arrow, Cklahoma. It proceeded as follows: Pianist, Sister Joan Richmond; Song Director, Rev. Marvin Mann.

Services opened by singing number 196, "He Did It &11 For Me." Executive Board members present: Moderator, Rev. Robert Duncan, Rev. Gilbert Pixley, Rev. W. V. Wood, and Rev. John West proxy for Rev. Reford Wilson, Rev. Delbert Akins read 1 Cor. 12:1-30, followed by prayer.

Churches present for organization: Haskell Free Will Baptist, Liberty Free Will Baptist, and Barnsdall Free Will Baptist.

Letters called for and read. Delegates examined as to Christian character. The Delegates voted to accept the doctrines of Free Will Baptist as stated in the Treatise.

The prayer of Consecration was prayed by Rev. John West and then the right hand of fellowship extended.

The officers elected were as follows: Moderator, Rev. Oron Estes, Assistant Moderator, Rev. Bill Mann, Clerk, Sister Rosa Estes, Assistant Clerk, Sister Delores Mann.

Executive Board elected: Rev. Marvin Mann, 5 years; Brother Jack Harrell, 4 years; Rev. Bill Mann, 3 years; Rev. Oron Estes, 2 years; and Brother Willard Peck, 1 year.

Examining Board Elected: Rev. Oron Estes, 3 years; Rev. Marvin Mann, 2 years; and Rev. L. D. Self, 1 year.

Committee for drafting a constitution for this association was elected: Rev. Bill Mann, Rev. Oron Estes, Rev. Marvin Mann, Brother Willard Peck and Rev. L. D. Self.

Resolution Committee Elected: Brother F. F. Mann, Brother G. L. Combs, and Brother Jack Harrell.

A Devotional Committee was elected: Brother Fate Morris, Sister Laura Arnold and Sister Fred Scott.

Rev. Gilbert Pixley brought the 11:00 o'clock message. Scripture, Acts 11:26. Services closed by prayer by Rev. T. H. Dixon.

The afternoon session met at 1:30. Congregation called together by singing. Rev. Marvin Mann read the scripture Romans 6:1. Followed by prayer. Time was devoted to election of officials. Motion carried to adjourn Conference.

Arrangements

We, your committee on arrangements beg to report as follows: Taking into consideration the surrounding circumstances and seeing the necessity of a rule governing the ministry and members.

Be it resolved that the Association forbid the ministers of the Arkansas River Valley Association speaking disrespectfully of one another and anyone found guilty of such conduct shall be liable to charge and dealt with as may be deemed necessary.

Be it resolved that any of our preachers or churches found to be tolerating the doctrine of unknown tongues, shall be considered guilty of heresy and shall be required to make acknowledgements to this body or stand suspended.

Be it resolved that the doors of all church property belonging to the Free Will Baptist be open to all ministers in good standing with the Association.

Be it resolved that the deacons and clerks of the several churches urge upon their members the need of finance and urge that each member assess him or herself what they feel able, to be paid into the church treasury.

Be it resolved that we try our ministers and deacons for one year before ordination.

Be it resolved that we, the Free Will Baptist of the Arkansas River Valley Association, adopt this rule, that our ministers in examining deacons and ministers stay strictly with the Bible.

Be it resolved that the Association appoint a committee of three (3) men to examine all ordained persons wishing to come into our association from another association and denominations and also to pertain to our own members who are eliaible to be ordained.

Lois Ritter and Bro. Dan Kelley. Finance: Sis. Billie Sue Lemons, Sis. Miller, and Sis. Ruby Eslick. Temperance: Sis. Myrtle Medlin, Sis. Garrett, and Sis. Shirley Scroggins. Obituary: Sis. Neva Dodson, Sis. Laura Arnold, and Sis. Neva Coffman.
