CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanctions of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship and by self-denial, faith, and good words endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I

This association shall be known as the Beaver Creek Association of the (original) Free Will Baptist of South Carolina.

ARTICLE II

This association sponsors a quarterly meeting composed of standing delegates; ordained and licensed ministers and church delegates. Church delegates elected quarterly. Each church may send three (3) for the first one hundred members, and one (1) for each fifty (50) thereafter, or a fraction thereof.

ARTICLE III

The officers of this association shall be a moderator, vice-moderator, clerk, reading clerk, treasurer, assistant treasurer, elected or reelected annually.

ARTICLE IV

The rules of decorum shall be read immediately after the association has been called to order.

Any visiting minister or delegate may be invited to a seat and take part in the deliberations, without the right to vote, and his name enrolled in our minutes.

ARTICLE VI

The moderator may appoint such committees as may be necessary for the expediting of business and every committee appointed to attend to any particular business and shall report their proceedings in writing to the association while in session, and all reports made by the committee may be adopted by the body.

ARTICLE VII

New churches, or churches coming from other denominations coming to this association will be carefully and satisfactorily examined as to doctrine before being received as members by Executive Board.

ARTICLE VIII

The association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegates.

ARTICLE IX

The association assumes no higher authority than an advisory council.

ARTICLE X

The Executive Board shall consist of five (5) members which shall be the moderator as he shall be the chairman, vice-moderator, clerk and treasurer. The fifth member being elected from the floor annually.

The Executive Board must report their work at the quarterly and annual association for the approval of the association. The Executive Board shall finish their work and close their books not later than midnight Thursday before the second Sunday in August for the annual association.

ARTICLE XI

This association will encourage a sound ministry such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour, having salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the Gospel which is freely offered to all.

ARTICLE XII

The National Treatise of the faith and practices of the original Free Will Baptist shall be used.

ARTICLE XIII

The Board of Trustees shall consist of three (3) members. The Board of Trustees and their successors shall be elected for life as long as they are in this association or as long as they have good behaviour.

ARTICLE XIV

This association shall be governed by the Roberts Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XV

This Constitution may be amended at any annual association by two-thirds vote of the delegates attending, providing that a notice of such change shall have been given during the first setting of said meeting.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. There shall not be any conversation by the members, one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.
3. Every member speaking shall first rise and address the moderator.

4. No member shall interrupt a member while speaking.
5. We shall admit no other title than that of "Brother."
6. Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.
7. No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.
8. No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the moderator.
9. On motion made where the vote of the body is taken a majority shall prevail.
10. The moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member provided the chair is filled.
11. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the moderator.
12. Not less than nine churches shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. **GOD.** We believe that there is only one true and living God who is personally the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. There's one God and mediator between God and man, the man Jesus who gave himself a ransom for all to be testified in due time - I Timothy 2:5.

2. **THE HOLY SCRIPTURES.** We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine of the government of His church. All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction and instruction in righteousness.

3. **ORIGINAL APOSTASY.** We believe that Adam was created holy but by voluntary transgression fell in depravity and consequently involved his posterity in sin. "And when the woman saw the tree was for food and that it was pleasant to the eyes and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took the fruit thereof and did eat and gave to her husband and he did eat." - Gen. 3:16.

4. **CHRISTIAN FAITH.** We believe that Christian faith is the belief in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and Redeemer of the world and in the divinity of the Holy Scripture that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God. "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life and he that believeth not on the Son shall not see life but the wrath of God abideth on him." John 3:36.

5. **FREE GRACE.** We believe the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings, that the Gospel is the power of God unto salvation, that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin, but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation. For there is no difference between Jews and Greeks for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Him." Rom. 1:12.

6. **REPENTANCE.** We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which produces Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin: "Now I rejoice not that ye were made sorrow but that ye sorrowed to repentance that ye might receive damage by us in nothing: for Godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation, not be repented of but the sorrow of the world worketh death." - I Cor. 7:9-10.

7. **FREE AGENCY.** We believe that the human will is free and that men have ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scripture. He hath showed thee, O men, what is good and what the Lord required of thee but to do justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly

with thy God." - Mich. 6:8.

8. We do not believe, under the Gospel dispensation, any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but those who by faith and preservation unto the end shall be saved, that it is possible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of their faith and turn again to sin and be finally lost. "And Jesus said unto him: No man having put his hand to the plow and looking back is fit for the Kingdom of God." - Luke 9:62.

9. **GOOD WORKS.** We believe that good works are the results of faith and not necessity, that those who have faith will do works of righteousness while those who have not faith cannot do anything pleasing or acceptable unto God. "Every tree that bringeth not forth fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire: wherefore by their fruit ye shall know them." - Matt. 7:19-20.

10. **CHRISTIAN BAPTISM.** We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; that baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without faith in the subject who received it. "Therefore, we are buried with him by baptism into death that like Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father even so we should walk in the newness of life." - Romans 6:4.

11. **THE LORD'S SUPPER.** We believe the supper was instituted by our Saviour as a commemorative ordinance, that it was instituted for Christians and that all Christians should unite in sacred services regardless of name or denomination. "But let a man examine himself and so let him eat of that bread and drink of that cup for he that eateth unworthily and drinketh damnation unto himself not discerning the Lord's body." - I Cor. 11:28-29.

12. **FEET WASHING.** We believe that washing of the saints' feet was a command of our Saviour and that His followers ought to practice the same. We urge the pastors of all our churches to encourage the practical obedience of this command, especially among members of our churches. "If then your Lord and Master have washed your feet ye also ought to wash one another's feet." - St. John 13:14.

13. **THE GOSPEL.** We believe it to be the duty of all churches to support the Gospel. "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel." - I Cor. 9:14.

CONSTITUTION OF THE BEAVER CREEK MINISTER'S CONFERENCE OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I

This conference shall be called the Beaver Creek Minister's Conference.

ARTICLE II

The officers of this conference shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, reading clerk, treasurer, assistant treasurer, song leader and an Ordaining Council consisting of five (5) duly ordained ministers to be elected or re-elected yearly.

ARTICLE III

The Ordaining Council shall have interim authority to license, ordain and investigate. The said council shall report their work quarterly.

ARTICLE IV

Any brother desiring to be licensed or ordained must have a letter of recommendation from the church of which he is a member. Said church must be a

The next conference will be at the Lockhart Free Will Baptist Church, Lockhart, S. C. on the fourth Saturday in February 26th, 1966 at 1:00 p.m.

The Beaver Creek Minister's Conference met at the Lockhart Free Will Baptist Church February 26, 1966 (Saturday) 1:00 p.m.

The meeting was opened by Rev. Joe Myers from the Rock Hill Church giving the Devotional after which we had altar prayer and fellowship.

The visitors were recognized and given a seat in our conference: They were Rev. William Sealy from Manning, S. C. and Rev. Sherward Lee from Coward, S. C.

The minutes from the last conference were read and approved, after which the Constitution and Bylaws were read. The roll was called and the dues were collected.

It was moved, seconded and adopted to insert in the Bylaws the following:
"A person coming to be licensed will have a three (3) month waiting period after presenting himself to the Ordaining Council before being licensed.
M. S. and Adopted that forms of questions be drawn up according to our rules and Bylaws to recommend new ministers to this conference. And that the clerk do this for the conference.

REPORT FROM THE ORDAINING COUNCIL:

We the Ordaining Council do recommend that:

1. Bro. Allen Lemmons who came before us on February 19, 1966 be put on the 3 month waiting period for license. His address is Box 43, Lockhart, S.C.
2. That Bro. Charles R. Jackson be licensed. 355 Archer Road, Spartanburg.
3. Brother Gene Ramsey who is pastor of Enoree F.W.B. Church be ordained. He has served his 12 months under license.
4. Brother Wade Dixon Seay who is a member of Enoree F.W.B. Church in good standing be ordained. He has served his 12 months under license.
5. That Rev. Walter Ramsey preach the Ordination message to Bro. Gene Ramsey and Bro. Wade Dixon Seay.
6. We accept the Rev. Truett Dick, pastor of Mt. Pleasant F.W.B. Church, into the Beaver Creek Conference by exchanging of Ordination Papers from the Piedmont Conference, N.C. Pending a letter of recommendation from the Piedmont Conference. Letter has been received.

THE ABOVE WERE APPROVED AFTER A MOVE AND SECOND.

7. We the Ordaining Council, do recommend that Bro. Ed. Bryant which is a member of the Hearon Circle F.W.B. Church in good standing be ordained. He has served his 12 months under license.
ATTENTION was brought to the conference that Bro. Bryant had not spent the entire 12 months under license at the Hearon Circle Church. And that Bylaw #4 had been violated.

It was moved, seconded and adopted to send the above #7 of the Ordaining Council's report back to the Council to work out and bring back to this body in this session.

CONSTITUTION OF THE BEAVER CREEK MINISTER'S CONFERENCE OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I

This conference shall be called the Beaver Creek Minister's Conference.

ARTICLE II

This conference shall be composed of duly licensed and ordained ministers.

ARTICLE III

The officers of this conference shall be moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, reading clerk, treasurer, assistant treasurer, song leader and an Ordaining Council consisting of five (5) duly ordained ministers to be elected or reelected yearly.

ARTICLE IV

The Ordaining Council shall have interim authority to license, ordain and investigate. The said council shall report their work quarterly.

8-7-1-12-2

ARTICLE V

Any brother desiring to be licensed or ordained must have a letter of recommendation from the church of which he is a member. Said church must be a member in good standing of the Beaver Creek Association of the Original Free Will Baptist Churches.

ARTICLE VI

A minister coming from another conference or association must come by letter from his former conference or association.

ARTICLE VII

Each minister duly licensed or ordained must be in good standing with his church and this conference to have the privilege to vote.

ARTICLE VIII

This Constitution shall be revised at any annual conference by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) majority.

BYLAWS

1. No minister of the Beaver Creek Conference shall pastor any church or mission that is not in good standing with or under the watchcare of said CONFERENCE.

2. A minister pastoring a church or mission not affiliated with said conference has a maximum period of six (6) months to bring the work into this conference before his credentials will be repossessed.

3. If a minister's attitude is wrong and he starts a church or mission to hurt or split another church or mission and this is proven to the conference, his credentials will be repossessed.

4. No brother shall receive credentials except he has been a member of a church in good standing in said conference for a period of twelve (12) months or more. He must be licensed for twelve (12) months before he can be ordained.

5. He that desires to be licensed must come with a letter of recommendation, stating whether or not he has tithed during said period, signed by his pastor and church treasurer. Also, bringing a personal record of his work to be presented to the Ordaining Council. The same applies to his ordination. A person coming to be licensed will have a three (3) months waiting period after presenting himself to the Ordaining Council before being licensed.

6. Any minister who makes a shipwreck of his life or brings a reproach upon himself or conference, the accuser shall present a written charge properly signed to the Ordaining Council, if proven guilty shall surrender his credentials indefinitely.

7. From this the Lord's day -- February 22, 1959 A.D., the Ordaining Council shall not license, ordain or accept anyone who has two (2) living wives or if wife has two (2) living husbands. (Scripture: Titus 1:6; 1 Timothy 3:1-2).

8. Each minister of said conference must report in person or by letter to each conference, but in case of an emergency a minister has one week from dates of the conference to send a written excuse to the clerk. All ministers who fail to conform to this ruling will go before the Ordaining Council at the next conference and show reason why they should keep their credentials. If minister fails to attend the next conference and go before Ordaining Council the clerk will automatically send a certified letter to the delinquent minister telling him to surrender his credentials. The penalty for the first offense is the surrender of his credentials for one (1) year. The second is two (2) years.

9. The clerk is to inform the Ordaining Council of all ministers of said conference who do not conform to rule number eight (8) of these Bylaws.

10. All visiting ministers will be given a seat in our conference with this restriction, they will not be privileged to vote.

11. The dues of this conference are two dollars (\$2.00) per minister, payable each quarter at the regular conference.

12. The minutes of all ministers meetings are to be published in the association minutes. The conference will pay its part according to the number of pages that it has in the minutes.

13. These Bylaws may be amended by two-thirds (2/3) majority vote at any regular conference.
