PROCEEDINGS

FRIDAY NIGHT

Proceedings of the Eighth Annual Session of the Birmingham District Conference met with Blossburg Church on Friday night, Aug. 30, 1946.

The Moderator welcomed all that were present to take part with us in our worship services. We had a nice crowd of visitors with us.

Bro. Marlow conducted the Devotional Services, with all Christians taking part in the services.

Rev. J. T. Quick preached at the evening services. His text: "Our Purpose of Coming Together."

Rev. C. E. Harbin and Rev. Arthur Barker followed with interesting messages.

SATURDAY MORNING

Called together by singing songs of Praise. Moderator read the 133rd Psalm. Prayer by Rev. W. H. Ryland. Called for Fellowship of the Body. Declared the Body ready for business. Called for Letters. The following Churches reported:

Rev. W. H. Ryland, taking the devotional part of the services, talked about blind Bartimaeus. He encouraged the delegates to press forward in the work for Christ. Bro. Walter Coleman preached at the eleven o'clock service, his text being: "Here Am I, Send Me." Rev. Perry Fredrick followed Rev. Coleman. Rev. W. H. Ryland gave us some facts about the Orphanage. Took up a collection; receiving \$25.50.

Lunch, which was enjoyed by ail, was served at the Church. Returned for afternoon services, singing "Some Day." Bro. Lee M. Brown conducted the Devotional Services, with all Christians taking part. Declared body ready for business. Auditing Committee reported. Report read and accepted. Deceased Members Committee's Report was read and accepted. At this time Rev. D. H. Davenport gave us a talk. Temperance Committee's report was accepted. Business Committee gave a partial report. It was accepted and adopted by items.

Bro. Perry Fredrick, Bro. Jim Hale, Bro. Curtis Williams, Rev. Walter Coleman were questioned by the Ordaining Council.

Bro. Jim Hale and Bro. Perry Frederick were given license for one year.

Bro. Curtis Williams and Bro. S. F. Higdon were ordained as deacons, and exchanged papers with Rev. Walter Coleman.

Delegates were elected to go to Sister Association. Rev. and Mrs. Lee Hanks, were elected to go to the Flint River Association, and to carry letters from this Association.

Rev. J. F. Williams was elected to go to the Morning Star Association, and to carry a letter from this Association.

Rev. J. F. Williams talked of the State Association, and

the following delegates were elected to go there: Sis. Mae Barker, Sis. Bertha Kelly, Sis. Walter Coleman, Sis. Azelee Hogan, Bro. Lee M. Brown, and Bro. Joe Martin.

SATURDAY NIGHT

Moderator declared body ready for business. He read a letter from one of our disabled Ministers, Rev. J. M. Holly, inviting the Brethren to visit with him.

At this time the Moderator appointed an executive committee to serve for the ensuing year. They were: Bro. Charlie Franklin, Bro. Lester Banks, Bro. Curtis Williams, Bro. S. F. Higdon, and Bro. Walter Murphy.

A Minister's Conference was organized, with Rev. Walter Coleman being elected Moderator and Sis. Bertha Kelly, clerk. At this time, ministers gave their reports.

The clerk was instructed to order two hundred (200) minutes from the "Free Will Baptist Call," at Birmingham, Ala., if they are prepared to print them.

Rev. Lee Hanks preached at the evening services; his text being: "Let Us Go Over To The Other Side." After this sermon the Lord's Supper was served, followed by Feet Washing.

Called for meeting of Quarterly Conference on Saturday night before the fifth Sunday in September at Mt. Zion at East Thomas.

The next sitting of this Conference will be held with Pleasant Hill Church, Jasper, Ala., Rt. 1, on Friday night before the first Monday in Sept. of 1947.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. After an introductory sermon is preached the association shall be called together by the moderator who presided at the last session. In case of his absence the assistant moderator shall call the body together, the former clerk also officiating until organized.
- 2. The association when assembled shall be composed of all the ministers and ordained deacons, and delegates enosen by the different churches comprising the body.
- The officers of the association shall consist of a moderator, assistant moderator, and a clerk to be chosen from the members present.
- 4. It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the body during the session at which he is elected, to call the next session to order and preside until reorganization and the election and installation of his successor. It shall be his duty to keep order, enforce the Rules of Decorum, decide a liquestions, discipline, and in case to a tie vote to cast the deciding ballot. He may speak on any subject but must call on the assistant mederator to preside while he is speaking.
- 5. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a minute of the proceedings and to read the same when called upon by the body, and shall prepare the minutes for publication.
- 6. Each church is entitled to three delegates.
- 7. A majority of the members shall rule in all cases, except the admission of churches then the vote must be unanimous.
- 8. No member shall absent himself from the house without leave from the moderator.
- All business shall be brought before the body by motion and a second and be disposed of by the same.
- 10. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject, nor more than ten minutes each time without permission from the moderator.
- 11. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion or uses words of personal reflections.
- 12. Only one person shall be allowed to speak at a time, and he must arise and address the moderator.
- 13. That no business be voted on with less than two-thirds of the body present.
- 14. This decorum may be altered, amended or abridged at any session of the association by a majority of the number present.
- 15. The minister that receives the most votes shall be elected moderator and the next highest assistant moderator.
