SATURDAY MORNING

\$522.57 277.53 800.10 BUSINESS We, the business committee recommend that a new Ordaining Council be appointed at this session of the association, and that each year, one be replaced, according to the expiration date of the one to be replaced.

> We recommend that the association pay the amount of thirty dollars to help pay the expenses of Brother and Sister Barnett to the National Association in Kansas City, Mo. this year, 1964.

We recommend that the business committee be given the authority to act as the placement committee for this year.

We recommend that there be but one ruling for the Minister's and Deacon's Conference. A motion was made from the floor that the board of peers work out a set of rules for said conference to be added to the Rules of Decorum, for the protection of the board of peers.

We recommend that the association send twenty dollars and that each church send five dollars to the State Association to help defray expenses of same.

We recommend that the association accept no minister or deacon who cannot, or will not, conform to the qualifications set forth in the Decorum or The Free Will Baptist Treatise.

We recommend that Rev. Davis go before the ordaining council, and if found worthy, be ordained to preach the gospel.

We recommend that Rev. Elvis Drummond go before the ordaining council, and if found worthy, be ordained to preach the gospel.

We recommend that Rev. Johnny Wood serve as a licensed minister under the watch care of the church for one year, as the Treatise states.

We recommend that two new trustees be elected to replace the two who have left the Birmingham District Association. The two elected are Brother C. E. LeCroy, Chairman and Rev. Harold Lotta.

In the absence of the ordaining council, for examination of the ministers to be ordained, the three groups of special singers who were present sang several specials.

Rev.Frank Duskin gave a very inspirational devotional, giving the congregation a chance to testify. There were many very inspiring testimonies.

The ordaining council report was accepted and the candidates, with their wives received the charge, which was given by Rev. O.A. Davis. He read as his text a portion of Timothy; stating the duties of a minister and his companion, after which the ordaining council laid hands upon each of them and had a special prayer for their guidance by the Holy Spirit. After an introductory sermon is preached the Association shall be called together by the moderator who presided at the last session. In case of his absence, the Assistant Moderator shall call the body together, the former clerk also officiating until organized.

2. The Association when assembled shall be composed of all the Ministers and Ordained Deacons, and Delegates present chosen by the different churches and quarterly meetings.

3. The Officers of the Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk to be chosen from the members present.

4. It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the body during the session at which he is elected, to call the next session to order and to preside until reorganized and the elections and installation of his successor. It shall be his duty to keep order, enforce the Rules of Decorum, decide all questions, discipline, and in case of a tie vote to cast the deciding ballot. He may speak on any subject but must call on the Assistant Moderator to preside while he is speaking.

5. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep the minutes of the proceeding and to read same when called upon by the body. The clerk shall prepare the minutes for publication.

6. Each church is entitled to three delegates.

7. A majority of the members shall rule in all cases.

8. No member shall absent themself from the house without leave from the moderator.

9. All business shall be brought before the body by the Business Committee and shall be disposed of by vote of the body.

10. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject, nor more than ten minutes each time, without permission of the moderator.

11. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion or uses words of personal reflection.

12. Only one person shall be allowed to speak at a time and he must arise and address the moderator.

13. That no business be voted on without the whole delegation present.

14. This decorum may be altered, amended or abridged at any session of the Association by a majority of the members present.

15. The minister that receives the most votes shall be moderator and the next highest, assistant moderator.

16. We recommend that all preachers and churches coming from other Associations or denominations be examined by a committee before being received into the body.

17. We recommend that we correspond and ask correspondence with other Associations.

RULES OF DECORUM

18. We recommend that all ministers and deacons attend or represent by letter before receiving a certificate of standing, and that this be strictly enforced.

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19. We recommend that all ministers that reach the age of 60 be given a lifetime certificate of standing.

FREE WILL BAPTIST ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. THE BIBLE-The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice. 2 Tim. 3:16

2. GOD-There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preservor, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinetely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey. 81 Cor. 8:6; Matt. 18:19

3. CHRIST-Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in his divine nature truly God, in his human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord. St. John 1:1-12

4. THE HOLY SPIRIT-The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men. St. John 16:7-8; Acts 2:4; Eph. 4:14.

5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD-God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He, also, performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.

6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN-Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin and become guilty before God. Gen. 2:17; 3:19.

7. THE WORK OF CHRIST-The Son of God by His incamation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith. I John 2:2.

8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION-The conditions of salvation are: (1) Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. (2) Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. (3) Continuance in faith and obedience until death. 2 Cor. 7:10; Prov. 28:13.

9. ELECTION-God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ in Christ men become His elect. 8 I Tim. 2:4.

10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL-The human will is free and selfcontrolled, having the power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit or to resist them and perish. Joshua 24:15 11. SALVATION FREE-God desires the salvation of all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. PERSEVERENCE-All believers in Christ, who through grace perservere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation. Rev. 22:17; St. John 15:6; 2 pet. 2:20-22.

13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers. St. John 15:6; I Pet. 2:20-22; St. John 13:14.

14. TITHING-God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Cospel(Matt. 23:23) and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week, let every one lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him". I Cor. 16:2a.

15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH-The Divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employment and amusement for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God. Gen. 2:3; Exodus 20:8-11.

16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION-The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." John 5:9; Matt. 25:46.

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.
