### FREE WILL BAPTIST ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE-The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice. 2 Timothy 3:16.
- 2. GOD-There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preservor, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, and adore and obey. II Corinthians 8:6; Matthew 18:19.
- 3. CHRIST-Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in his divine nature truly God, in his human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord. St. John 1:1-12.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT-The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men. St. John 16:7-8; Acts 2:4; Eph. 4:14.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD-God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He, also, performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN-Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin and become guilty before God. Genesis 2:17; 3:19.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST—The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith. I John 2:2.
- 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION—The conditions of salvation are: (1) Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. (2) Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. (3) Continuance in faith and obedience until death. II Corinthians 7:10; Proverbs 28:13.
- 9. ELECTION—God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect. II Timothy 2:4.
  - 10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL-The human will is free and

selfcontrolled having the power to yield to the influence of the truth and the spirit or to resist them and perish. Joshua 24:15.

- 11. SALVATION FREE-God desires the salvation of all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERENCE-All believers in Christ, who through grace perservere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation. Revelation 22:17; St. John 15:6; 2 Peter 1:20-22.
- 13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES—Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility or universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers. St. John 15:6; 1 Peter 2:20-22; St. John 13:14.
- 14. TITHING-God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matthew 23:23) and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week, let every one lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" I Corinthians 16:2a.
- 15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH—The Divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employment and amusement for rest. worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God. Genesis 2:3; Exodus 20:8-11.
- 16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION—The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." John 5:9: Matthew 25:46.

#### CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the

study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel: nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and perserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. After an introductory sermon is preached, the association shall be called to order by the moderator who presided over the last session. In case of his absence, the assistant moderator shall call the body to order, the former clerk also officiating until organized.
- 2. This body shall be composed of all ministers, deacons, church clerks, and delegates present from each church.
- 3. The officers of the association shall consist of a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk and assistant clerk, to be chosen from the members present.
- 4. It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over the body during the session at which he is elected, to call the next session to order and to preside until reorganized and the election and installation of his successor. It shall be his duty to keep order, enforce the rules of decorum and decide all questions, discipline, and in case of a tie vote, to cast the deciding ballot. He may speak on any subject but must call on the assistant moderator to preside while he is speaking.

- 5. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep the minutes of the proceedings and to read them when called upon by the body. The clerk shall prepare the minutes for publication.
- 6. Each church is entitled to three delegates.
- 7. A majority of the members shall rule in all cases.
- 8. No member shall absent himself from the house without the consent of the moderator.
- 9. All business shall be brought before the body by the business committee and shall be disposed of by vote of the body.
- 10. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject, nor more than ten minutes each time, without permission of the
- 11. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion or uses words of personal reflection.
- 12. Only one person shall be allowed to speak at a time and he must arise and address the moderator.
- 13. No business shall be voted on without the whole delegation is present
- 14. This decorum may be altered, amended or abridged at any session of the association by a majority vote of members present.
- 15. The minister who receives the most votes shall be moderator and the next highest, assistant moderator.
- 16. We recommend that all preachers and churches coming from other associations or denominations, be examined by a committee before being received into the body.
- 17. We recommend that we correspond and ask correspondence with other associations.
- 18. We recommend that all ministers and deacons attend or represent by letter before receiving a certificate of standing, and that this be strictly
- 19. We recommend that all ministers who reach the age of sixty be given a lifetime certificate of standing.

# AMENDMENTS:

- 1. We recommend that if any ordained member of this body is absent for four successive meetings without provential reasons, or refuses to support this body, it be a violation of the covenant and is sufficient reason for dismissal from body.
- 2. Any minister not having been licensed by the Birmingham Association or quarterly meeting must carry a license from the association for one year.
- 3. We recommend that this body, henceforth, refuse a request from any church in this organization to ordain or license any minister or deacon who has two living wives.

# MINISTERS AND DEACONS CONFERENCE RULES

- This conference shall be known as the Minister's and Deacon's Conference of the Birmingham District Association of Free Will Baptists.
- 2. It shall be composed of ordained ministers and deacons of said association.
- 3. When in session, it shall be composed of duly elected moderator and assistant moderator and a clerk.
- 4. The moderator shall be elected at each session and remain in office until the election and installation of his successor. The clerk shall be elected for one year and shall be elected by the majority present.
- 5. To be eligible to be a standing delegate to the annual and quarterly conferences, a minister or deacon should belong to the minister's and deacon's conference.
- Ordained ministers coming from another denomination shall be eligible to belong to the order but must serve for one year under the watch care of this body before being granted ordination papers from this body.
- 7. Ministers coming from another association must bring letter from his association and must be in good standing.
- 8. Ministers or deacons making application for membership must be the husband of one living wife, or none.

# **PROCEEDINGS**

## SATURDAY MORNING

# **SEPTEMBER 8, 1973**
