

#1---This Conference shall be known as the Minister's and Deacon's Conference of the B'ham
District Association of Free Will Baptist Inc.
#2---It shall be composed of Ordained Ministers
and Deacons.

#3---When in session, It shall be composed of duly elected Moderator, Assistant Moderator, and Clerk. #4---Moderator to be elected at the end of each session for the next session.

#5---Clerk to be elected every five(5) years and shall be elected by majority present.

#6---To be eligible to be a standing delegate to the Annual and Semi-Annual Conference, a Minister and a Deacon, should belong to the Minister's and Deacon's Conference.

#7---Ordained Ministers coming from another Denomination shall be eligible to belong to the Conference, but must serve for one year under the watch care of this Body, before being granted Ordination Papers from this Body.

#8---Ministers and Deacons making application for membership, must be the husband of one living

wife, or none.

#9---Ministers and Deacons coming from another Association must bring a letter from his Association and must be in good standing.

#1 -- After an introductory Sermon is Preached, the Association shall be called to order by the Moderator, that presided over the last Session. In case of his absence, the Assistant Moderator shall callthe Body to Order. Also, the Clerk will officiate until Organized. (Same Clerk for five (5) years.

#2-This Body shall be composed of Ministors, Deacons, Church Clerks, and Delegates present from each Church.

#3 -- The Officers of the Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, to be chosen from the merbers present.

#4--It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the Body during the session at which he is elected, to call the next session to order and to preside until reorganized and election installation of his successor. It shall be his duty to keep order, enforce the rules of the Decorum, and decide all questions, discipline and in case of a tie vote, cast the deciding ballot. He may speak on any subject, but must call on the Assistant Moderator to preside while he is speaking.

#5-It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep the minutes of the procedings and read them when called upon by the Body. The Clerk shall prepare the minutes for publication.

#6-Each Church is entitled to three Delegates. #7-A majority of the members shall rule in all cases.

#8-No member shall absent himself from the house without the consent of the Moderator.

of the Business Committee and shall be disposed of by the Body.

#10-No Brother shall be interrupted while speaking, unless he departs from the subject under discus sion, or uses words of personal reflection.
#11-No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on same subject, nor more than ten(10)minutes each time, without permission of the Moderator.
#12-Only one person shall be allowed to speak at a time and he must stand and address the Moderator.

THE CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to GOD, by faith in CHRIST, and adopted the WORD of GOD as our rule of FAITH and PRACTICE, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solem Covenant.

We promise, by his GRACE, to love and obey him in all things, to avoid all appearances of evel, to abstain from all sinful amusfments and unholy conformity to the World, fromall sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret Prayers, family devotions and social worship; and by self-denial, Faith and good works, endeaver to grow in Grace and the knowledge of our LORD and SAVIOR JESUS CHRIST."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for Church Confernces, Public
worship, and the observance of the ordiances of
the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our
ability for the support of the Church, of its
poor and all of its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in Love, endeavering to "Keep the unity of the Spirit," inthe bonds of Peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the Church and of the Gospel.

We will every where hold Christian principle Sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises Supreme; counting it our chief business in Life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly Praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, His will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end, we agree to labor for the promotion of Educational and Denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and Evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the World. And may the God of Peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our LORD JESUS CHRIST.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

11---THEBIBLE--The Scriptures of the Old and
New Testaments were given by inspiration of GOD,
and our infallible rule of faith and practice.

#2---GOD--There is one living and true GOD, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and

Righteous Governor of the Universe; and in the Scriptures as FATHER, SON, AND HOLY GHOST; yet as one GOD, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to LOVE, ADORE, and Obey.

"j---CHRIST--CHRIST is GOD manifested in the flesh; in His divine nature truly, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between GOD and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Savior and Lord.

#4---THE HOLY SPIRIT-The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.

#5---THE GOVERMENT OF GOD--God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.

#6---THE SINFULNESS OF MAN--Man was created innocent, but by disobediece fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therfore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies, that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before GOD.

#7---THE WORKS OF CHRIST--The Son of God by His Incarnation, Life, Sufferings, Death, and Resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of Salvation by Faith.

Salvation are: 1-Repentance or sicere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2-Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to CHRIST as Savior and LORD, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the Soul is renewed by the Holy SPIRIT, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3-Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

#9---ELECTION--God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the coditions of Salvation. Hence by Faith in Christ men become His elect.

#10--FREEDOM OF WILL--The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.

#11--SALVATION FREE--God desires the Salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

#12--PERSERVANCE--All believers in Christ, who through Grace perservere in Holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal Salvation.

#13--GOSPEL ORDINANCES--1-Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, 2-The Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. 3 Feet Washing, an ordinance, teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.

#14-TITHING-God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in Gospel (Matt.23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week, let everyone of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (Cor. 16:2a).

#15--THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH--The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, Holy works, activities, and for personal communion with God.

#16-RESURRECTION, JUDGEMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUT TION-The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evel unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.
