Quarterly Meeting October 29, 1960

A committee consisting of Brother and Sister Roy Duckett and
Rev. Ken Frisbee was selected to make arrangements for the Blue
Ridge Youth Conference for the summer, and annually. It was voted
to request each church give \$20.00 for Medicine for the Mileys, our
medical missionary to Africa.

Brother Benny Turner resigned as Youth Chairman as he accepted

a church in Erwin, Tennessee. His resignation was accepted by the delegates.

It was voted to pay Brother Wayne Smith, \$10.00 for programs. The delegates voted for the program committee to prepare the program and give it to the clerk to be printed, the Association to pay for supplies etc. for this purpose.

Quarterly Meeting — February 3, 1961 — No business transacted.

Quarterly Meeting — April 29, 1961.

Each pastor was asked to report to the Committee on Blue Ridge Youth Conference, the number of young people from their church who would be attending the conference during July 2-8. It was voted that at least 12 youth would have to attend in order to hold the conference. A motion was made and passed to request a week at Cragmont a year in advance for next season.

The Salem Free Will Baptist Church requested a letter of dismissal from the Association to go to the Jack's Creek Association. This request was granted by the delegates.

ANNUAL MEETING

The eighth annual session of the Blue Ridge Association was called to order by Rev. W. L. Kell Moderator.

The speaker for the morning was Mrs. Josephine Stevens, Missionary to Zululand, Africa. Mrs. Stevens gave a stirring call to the churches to return to the "first love of Jesus Christ" — Missions. A missionary offering was taken in the amount of \$27.25. The session was dismissed for lunch at Cragmont Assembly.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON:

The following business was conducted in the afternoon business session:

A motion was made to accept the 1960 Committee's Reports until next year, and was accepted by the delegates.

The motion was made and accepted to have moderator and clerk appoint the Committees to make reports next year. These Committees were urged to give the reports clearly and through the leadership of Jesus Christ. A great deal of discussion was given on the support of Mrs. Josephine Stevens, Missionary. A motion was made and accepted that the Blue Ridge Association give \$34.50 per month for the next five years toward the support of Mrs. Stevens.

Discussion was made on the position of the N. C. State Convention, pertaining to Congregational Church Government or Connectional Church Government. The moderator read Article 3, (4) and Article 14, of the Blue Ridge Association stating our position on these matters. The motion was made and accepted that our delegates to the N. C. State Convention, stand for these Articles, and our position, under any circumstances.

The motion was made that the moderator call the National Association Moderator to see if delegates of our association could be seated if the Association and churches did not accept the State Treatise. The motion was voted and accepted by the delegates. The following day the moderator gave a report, reading certain Sections of the State Convention Constitution, thus supporting the idea that our delegates would have to be seated. Each church was urged to send their pastor and delegate to this convention as it is very important to the growth

of the Free Will Baptist Denomination in North Carolina.

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Discussion was made on the churches supporting the 1% of total income to be given to the Blue Ridge Association.

The motion was made and accepted to request that each church give its share for the expenses of operations of the Blue Ridge Association, which is 1% of the churches total income.

The motion was made that the salary of the Clerk be \$75 per year.

The delegates voted and accepted this motion.

The motion was made that the Rev. Harold Pitts assist the Clerk in investigating different printers so that the Minutes can be printed with as little expense as possible. The motion was voted on and accepted.

It was voted to table the discussion of the Youth Conference until the first Quarterly Meeting.

The Kannapolis Church, Mount Zion, asked to remain under watch-care of the Association for another year. The delegates voted on this request and accepted this request.

The Sulphur Springs Church requested its letter of dismissal to go to the French Broad Association. The delegates voted to grant this request.

It was voted to pay the delegates to the N.C. State Convention 6c per mile on their expenses to Mount Olive for the State Convention.

It was also voted to send \$25.00 to the State Convention.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION:

The following business was conducted in the afternoon business session:

The motion was made to amend the Constitution, Article 3 to read as follows: (1) This association shall be composed of all ordained and licensed ministers and deacons and of delegates chosen and sent by each church in its bounds, who shall be duly recommended by the church to which they belong.

(2) The following auxiliaries of each church are entitled to one delegate each: The Sunday School, the ladies auxiliary and the Free Will

Baptist League. No church shall be entitled to more than six (6) delegates.

Officers were elected for a two year term, according to the Constitution.

A motion was made that each church send to the clerk the names of the delegate it is sending to the State Convention to the church as soon as the delegate is selected; Motion passed.

Motion was made and passed that the clerk notify each church ten (10) days prior to the State Convention of the date and place, which would serve as a reminder.

The motion was made and passed that Rev. W. L. Kell be empowered to appoint a proxy if necessary during the State Convention.

The ninth annual session of the Blue Ridge Association was invited to meet at the Rocky Pass Free Will Baptist Church at Marion, N. C., and at Cragmont Assembly. The delegates voted to meet at Cragmont Assembly.

Motion was made to adjourn.

MINISTERS ANNUAL REPORT

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
of the
BLUE RIDGE ASSOCIATION
of
NORTH CAROLINA
Affiliated with
National Association of Free Will Baptists

Article 1

This association shall be known as the Blue Ridge Association of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

Article 2

The objects of this association shall be: To promote unity, fraternity, fellowship and co-operation; and to encourage and engage in larger Christian enterprises that cannot be carried on by a single church. To combine and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptists within its bounds in one sacred effort to encourage and promote the general spread of the gospel; and the causes of the united program.

Article 3

1. This Association shall be composed of all ordained and licensed ministers and deacons and of delegates chosen and sent by each church in its bounds, who shall be duly recommended by the church to which they belong.

2. The following auxiliaries of each church are entitled to one delegate each: The Sunday School, Ladies Auxilliary and Free Will Baptist League. No church shall be entitled to more than six (6) delegates.

3. Each church and its auxiliaries may represent by letter and a donation for the expenses of the association and the causes it fosters.

4. This association disclaims the right to exercise lordship over the churches, or to have any power which entitles it to infringe upon the internal affairs or rights of any of the church composing it. Each church shall consider its internal affairs to be its own business; but it shall not disrespect the association and those who are placed in authority by the proper processes.

Article 4

An accused church has the same right as an individual in the church: to have specific charges presented in writing, a fair opportunity for defense, and to be considered innocent until proved guilty.

Article 5

This association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegates.

Article 6

Churches coming from another denomination will be carefully and satisfactorily examined as to doctrine before being received as members.

Article 7

1. The officers of this association shall be moderator and assistant moderator, clerk, treasurer, historian and field superintendent, who shall be elected for a term of two years, entering up their said duties of said offices at the close of the current session.

2. The moderator and assistant moderator shall not succeed themselves in election. However, the assistant moderator may be elected moderator.

3. It shall be the duty of the moderator to preside over all the meetings of the association.

4. It shall be the duty of the assistant moderator to preside in the

absence of the moderator.

5. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a faithful record of the proceedings of the association in a business-like manner, and to superintend the printing of the minutes, and the distribution of said minutes, and to give over all properties belonging to his or her office to his or her duly successor. The clerk shall be paid a fee of \$75 for services—amount fixed by the association. Minutes of the association shall be sent to all visiting Free Will Baptist ministers.

6. It shall be the duty of the treasurer to receive all funds belonging to the association, and to disburse same as directed by the association. The treasurer shall be bonded for an amount sufficient to cover all money coming into their hands.

7. It shall be the duty of the historian to keep a record of such items of interest as may be useful in the future; to preserve the same in a book. He or she shall also keep a file of the minutes. He or she shall give over all materials and property to his or her successor in office.

8. It shall be the duty of the field superintendent to encourage the work in general in this association, and in every way possible assist them in doing greater things for God's glory. He shall promote unity and fellowship among the ministers and their churches. He shall supply for any pastor who shall be providentially kept from his work. He shall be paid a salary agreed upon by the association. He shall receive an offering at all churches, the same to be turned over to the association to help maintain this work.

Article 8

At each annual session the moderator shall appoint such committees as the association may direct. It shall be the duty of these committees to report at the next annual meeting.

Article 9

The following directors shall be elected annually: Director for young people's work; director for the woman's auxiliary work—who shall be responsible to do all the work they can to promote the work in these departments in each church in this association. They shall encourage co-operation with the state league and ladies' auxiliary organization.

Article 10

The executive board shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, treasurer, historian, field superintendent, and three members elected from the floor. It shall be the duty of the executive board to have the supervision of the work of the association between sessions. The moderator and clerk, by virtue of their offices, shall be chairman and secretary, respectively, of the board. Five members of the executive board shall constitute a quorum.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1—A session of this association shall meet annually.

ARTICLE 2—This association shall be opened and closed with suitable devotions.

ARTICLE 3—There shall be no conversation by members, one with another, so as to interrupt business while in session.

ARTICLE 4—Every person wishing to speak, shall first arise and address the moderator, and be recognized before speaking.

ARTICLE 5—No member shall interrupt another while speaking.

ARTICLE 6—Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.

ARTICLE 7—No member shall speak on any one subject more than twice; except by permission of the moderator.

ARTICLE 8—Every motion made and seconded shall be acted upon unless withdrawn by the person who made it.

ARTICLE 9—A motion before the house must be acted upon before another motion can be made.

ARTICLE 10—On all motions acted upon, the majority vote shall prevail.

ARTICLE 11—The moderator shall have the privilege to speak on any subject as any other member, provided the chair is filled.

ARTICLE 12—We shall admit no other title while in session but that of Brother and Sister.

ARTICLE 13—No member shall absent himself from the body without permission of the moderator.

ARTICLE 14—Any person transgressing these bylaws shall be admonished by the moderator.

ARTICLE 15—No less than nine (9) members shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE 16—An offering shall be received at the annual meeting as is necessary. The necessity will be determined by the moderator.

ARTICLE 17—These bylaws may be amended at any regular annual meeting by two-thirds vote.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. GOD: We believe that there is only one true and living God who is personally the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. There is one God and one mediator between God and man, the man Christ Jesus who gave Himself a ransom for all to be testified in due time. 1 Timothy 2:5.

2. THE HOLY SCRIPTURE: We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His church. All Scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction and instruction in righteousness.

3. ORIGINAL APOSTASY: We believe that Adam was created holy but by voluntary transgression fell into reprobity and consequently involved his posterity in sin. "And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took the fruit thereof and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat" (Genesis 3:6).

FREE GRACE: We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessing, that the gospel is the power of God unto salvation, that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation "For there is no difference between Jews and Greeks: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon him" (Romans 10:12).

5. CHRISTIAN FAITH: We believe that Christian faith is the belief in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and redeemer of the world and in the divinity of the Holy Scripture, that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not on the Son shall not see life;

but the wrath of God abideth in him" (John 3:36).

6. **REPENTANCE:** We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which produces Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin. "Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry; but ye sorrowed to repentance: for ye were made sorry after a godly manner, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing. For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death" (2 Corinthians 7:9, 10).

7. **FREE AGENCY:** We believe that the human will is free and that men have ability to reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures. "He that shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Micah 6:8).

8. **PERSEVERANCE:** We do not believe, under gospel dispensation, any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but that those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved; that it is possible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of their faith and turn again to sin and finally be lost. "And Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plough and looking back, is fit for the Kingdom of God" (Luke 9:62).

9. **GOOD WORKS:** We believe that good works are the results of faith and not necessity; that those who have faith will do works of righteousness while those who have not faith cannot do anything pleasing or acceptable to God. "Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them" (Matthew 7:19, 20).

10. **CHRISTIAN BAPTISM:** We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost; that baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without faith in the Subject who receives it. "Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:4).

11. **THE LORD'S SUPPER:** We believe the supper was instituted by our Saviour as a commemorative ordinance, that it was instituted for Christians and that all Christians should unite in sacred services regardless of name or denomination. "But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body" (1 Corinthians 11:28, 29).

12. **FEET WASHING:** We believe that washing the saint's feet was a command of our Saviour and that His followers ought to practice the same. We urge the pastors of all churches to encourage the practical obedience of this command, especially among the members of our churches. "If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet" (John 13:14).

13. **THE GOSPEL:** We believe it to be the duty of all churches to support the gospel. "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel should live of the gospel" (1 Corinthians 9:14).

CHURCH COVENANT

Having give ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in the solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to

avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scripture, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Article 11

It shall be the duty of the association to encourage a sound ministry, such as present Christ as an all-sufficient Saviour, having made salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the gospel, which is freely offered to all.

Article 12

Any church seeking membership in this association shall furnish evidence that there is a deed on record made to the trustees of said Free Will Baptist church and their successors in office, and after a satisfactory examination as to their doctrine and fellowship and disposition toward the united program, may be received as members.

Article 13

We will have a union meeting on Saturday before each fifth Sunday, for the furtherance of every phase of the work of this association. The meeting shall be composed of all members and two delegates from each church.

Article 14

This association shall adopt the Treatise of the Faith and Government of the National Treatise of the Free Will Baptists.

Article 15

A church may become a member of this association by petition, or by letter, or by delegates, and by adopting the Treatise and Articles of Faith and Government, and the Constitution and By-laws of this association.

Article 16

This association shall be governed by the rules laid down in Rob-

erts' or Hastings' Rules of Order.

Article 17

This association shall meet annually on Thursday before the first Sunday in August.

Article 18

The minutes of each meeting of this association shall be printed, the Constitution and Bylaws of the association, and Constitution and Bylaws of the Ministers' Conference; also the Church Covenant.

Article 19

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting of the association.
