We urge all Free Will Baptists to spend this day as God has taught us. We pray for a return to the "Old Paths" of taking the family to God's house every service on Sunday and give a good testimony to Christ's resurrection in our lives as Christians.

CONSTITUTION AND BY LAWS

of the

BLUE RIDGE ASSOCIATION

οf

NORTH CAROLINA

Affiliated With

National Association of Free Will Baptists

Article 1

This Association shall be known as the Blue Ridge Association of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

Article 2

- 1. The purpose of this Association shall be: To promote unity, fraternity, fellowship, and co-operation; to encourage and engage in larger Christian enterprises which cannot be carried on by a single church; and to combine and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptists within its bounds in one sacred effort to encourage and promote the general spread of the gospel and the causes of the National Association.
- 2. This Association shall encourage a sound ministry, which presents Christ as an all-sufficient Saviour, having made salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the gospel, which is freely offered to all.

Article 3

This Association shall be composed of all ordained Ministers, Deacons, and Delegates chosen and sent by each church in its bounds, who are duly recommended by the church to which they belong. Each church shall be entitled to at least (6) six delegates.

Article 4

- 1. This Association disclaims the right to exercise lordship over the Churches, or to have any power which would entitle it to infringe upon the internal affairs or rights of any of the churches of which it is composed. Each Church shall consider its internal affairs to be its own business, but it shall not disrespect the Association and those who are placed in authority by the proper process.
- 2. An accused church shall have the same right as an individual in the church, namely: Specific charges must be presented in writing; a fair opportunity shall be given for defense; and the accused shall be considered innocent until proven guilty.
- 3. This Association may withdraw from any church which becomes disorderly, or refuses to be represented by letter or delegates.

Article 5

Cliurches coming from another denomination shall be carefully and satisfactorily examined as to doctrine before being received as members.

Article 6

- 1. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be elected for a term of two years, entering upon their said duties of said offices at the close of the current session. A Historian shall be elected for an indefinite period.
- 2. The Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall not succeed themselves in election. However, the Assistant Moderator may be elected Moderator.
- 3. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all the meetings of the Association.
- 4. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to preside in the absence of the Moderator.
- 5. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a faithful and accurate record of the proceedings of the Association in a business-like manner; to superintend the printing of the minutes and the distribution of same; and to give over all properties belonging to his or her office to his or her duly elected successor. The Clerk shall be paid a fee of \$100.00 for services rendered—amount fixed by the Association. Minutes of the Association shall be sent to all visiting Free Will Baptist Ministers.
- 6. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds belonging to the Association and to disburse same as directed by the Association. The Treasurer shall be bonded by an amount sufficient to cover all money coming into their hands.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the Historian to keep a record of such items of interest as may be useful in the future, and to preserve the same in a book. He or she shall keep a file of the minutes. All materials and property shall be given to his or her duly elected successor in office.

Article 7

At each annual session, the Moderator shall appoint such committees as the Association may direct. It shall be the duty of these committees to report at the appointed time.

Article 8

A Youth Director shall be elected annually. This Director shall be responsible for promoting youth work in the Association, in co-operation with the Church Training Service.

Article 9

The Executive Board of this Association shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and three (3) members elected from the floor annually. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to have the supervision of the work of the Association between sessions. The Moderator and Clerk, by virtue of their office, shall be Chairman and Secretary, respectively, of the Board. Five members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum.

Article 10

- 1. This Association shall maintain an Ordaining Council elected from the ordained authority, preferably ministers, five (5) in number, whose tenure of office shall be from one (1) to five (5) years. The Association shall elect annually to supply the vacancies as they occur.
- 2. The Ordaining Council shall act as an Advisory Council and an investigating committee, under the authority and recommendations of the local Church in this Association, issuing license, prescribing qualifications for the Ministry, conducting examinations, and ordaining Ministers, and at all times working for the most harmonious and effective ministry. The local church should use close scrutiny in recommending anyone for license, and the Church should be thoroughly convinced of the candidate's calling and moral integrity. He shall preach under license until he is called to pastor or to full time Christian Service requiring ordination.
- 3. This Association deems it necessary for the protection of the gospel not to accept anyone as a minister who has two living wives. Each minister must maintain a Christian character, and clean habits, and shall not have a tolerant attitude toward liberalism, modernism, communism, Catholicism, etc.
- 4. Each minister shall be required to practice, preach, and teach tithing as the means of church support.

Article II

1. Any church seeking membership in this Association shall furnish evidence that there is a deed, or record, made to the Trustee of said Free Will Baptist Church and their successors in office.

Article 12

This Association shall have a quarterly meeting on the first Saturday of each quarter after the annual meeting for the furtherance of every phase of work of the Association. Each minister shall report in person or by letter at each meeting with a donation of \$1.00, and shall submit a report at each annual meeting

Article 13

This Association deems the Treatise of the Faith and Practice of the Origina Free Will Baptists as adopted by the National Association of Free Will Baptists as its rule of faith and practice.

Article 14

This Association shall be governed by the rules laid down in Robert's or Hasting's Rules of Order.

Article 15

This Association shall meet annually on Friday and Saturday before the sec ond Sunday in August.

Article 16

This Association recommends that each church pay one percent (I percent) o their income for the support of this Association, either monthly or quarterly.

Article 17

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of those present a any annual meeting of this Association.

BY-LAWS

- ARTICLE 1 This Association shall be opened and closed with suitable devo-
- ARTICLE 2 There shall be no conversation by members, one with another, so as to interrupt business while in session.
- ALTICLE 3 Every person wishing to speak shall first arise and address the Mederator, and be recognized before speaking.
- ARTICLE 4 No member shall interrupt another while speaking.
- ARTICLE 5 Every member speaking shall attend the subject under consideration.
- ARTICLE 6 No member shall speak on any one subject more than twice, except by permission of the Moderator.
- ARTICLE 7 Every motion made and seconded shall be acted upon unless withdrawn by the person who made it.
- ARTICLE 8 A motion before the house must be acted upon before another motion can be made.
- ARTICLE 9 On all motions acted upon, the majority vote shall prevail.
- ARTICLE 10 The Moderator shall have the privilege to speak on any subject as any other member, provided the chair is filled.
- ARTICLE 11 This Association shall admit no other title while in session but that of Brother or Sister.
- ARTICLE 12 No member shall absent himself from the body without the permission of the Moderator.
- ARTICLE 13 Any person transgressing these By-Laws shall be admonished by the Moderator.
- ARTICLE 14 No less than twenty (20) members shall constitute a quorum.
- ARTICLE 15 An offering shall be received at the annual meeting as is necessary. The necessity will be determined by the Moderator.
- ARTICLE 16 These By-Laws may be amended at any regular annual meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. GOD: We believe that there is only one true and living God who is personally the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. There is one God and one mediator between God and man, the man Christ Jesus who gave Himself a ransom for all to be testified in due time. I Timothy 2:5.
- 2. THE HOLY SCRIPTURE: We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His church. All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine; for reproof, for correction and instruction in righteousness.
- 3. ORIGINAL APOSTASY: We believe that Adam was created holy but by voluntary transgression fell into repravity and consequently involved his poserity in sin. "And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took the fruit thereof and did eat, gave also unto her husband with her, and he did eat." (Genesis 3:6).
- A. FREE GRACE: We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings, that the gospel is the power of God unto salvation, that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means whereby sincers are converted and made wise unto salvation. "For there is no difference between Jews and Greeks: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Him." (Romars 10:12).
- 5. CHRISTIAN FAITH: We believe that Christian faith is the belief in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and redeemer of the world and in the divinity of the Holy Scripture, that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. :: He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth rot on the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth in him." (John 3:36).
- 6. REPENTANCE: We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which produces Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin. "Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but ye sorrowed to repentance: for ye were made sorry after a Godly manner, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing. For Godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death." (2 Corinthians 7:9-10).
- 7. FREE GRACE: We believe that the human will is free and that men have ability to reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scripture. "He that shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Micah 6:8).

- 8. PERSEVERENCE: We do not believe, under gospel dispensation, any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but that those who by faith perservere to the end will be saved; that it is possible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of their faith and turn again to sin and finally be lost. "And Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plough and looking back, is fit for the Kingdom of God." (Luke 8:62).
- 9. GOOD WORKS: We believe that good works are the results of faith and not necessity; that those who have faith will do works of righteousness while those who have not faith cannot do anything pleasant or acceptable to God. "Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them." (Matthew 7:19-20).
- 10. CHRISTIAN BAPTISM: We believe that Chirstian baptism is the immerson of a believer in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost; that baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without faith in the Subject who receives it. "Therefore we are buried with Him by baptism into death: that like Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:4).
- 11. THE LORD'S SUPPER: We believe the supper was instituted by our Savior as a commemorative ordinance, that it was instituted regardless of name or denomination. "But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthly, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body." (I Corinthians 11:28-29).
- 12. FEET WASHING: We believe that washing the sain't feet was a command of our Savior and that His followers ought to practice the same. We urge the pastors of all churches to encourage the practical obedience of this command, especially among the members of our churches. "If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet." (John 13:14).
- 13. THE GOSPEL: We believe it to be the duty of all churches to support the gospel. "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel live of the gospel." (I Corinthians 9:14).

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in the solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusement and unholy comformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scripture, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeaver to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We shall not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE BLUE RIDGE DISTRICT WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION OF THE BLUE RIDGE ASSOCIATION OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS OF NORTH CAROLINA

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1. NAME:

This organization shall be known as the Blue Ridge District Woman's Auxiliary Convention of the Blue Ridge Association of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

ARTICLE 11. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each local auxiliary within their District together for the purpose of transacting business pertaining to the promotion of work in general.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:

The officers of this convention shall be a President; Vice-President, who shall serve as Enlistment Chairman; Recording Secretary; Assistant Recording Secretary; Corresponding Secretary; Treasurer; Field Worker; Study Course Chairman; Stewardship-Prayer Chairman; Personal Service-Evangelism Chairman; and Missions Chairman. These shall constitute the District Executive Committee, six of whom shall be a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP:

This convention shall be composed of the officers of the Convention, together with the President and six (6) delegates (duly accredited by the Credentials Committee) from each local Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V. MEETINGS:

This convention shall meet semi-annually, with the first meeting of each year being held the second Saturday in April, and the second meeting being held on Thursday night before the second Sunday in August. These meetings shall be held for the transaction of business, at such time and place as may be determined at the previous meeting, or by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI. AMENDMENTS:

This constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

BY-I AWS

ARTICLE 1. DUTIES OF OFFICERS:

Section 1. President: The President shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the Executive Committee together when necessary, be ex-officio member of all standing committees, and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2. Vice-President: The Vice-President shall preside in the absence of the President, and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the general work. She shall also serve as promoter of enlistment activities within the District. During the District Convention, the Vice-President serves as Chairman of the Registration Committee.

Section 3. Recording Secretary: The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and Executive Committee meetings, preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office. She shall make an annual report to the State Recording Secretary, at least ten days before the annual convention of the State.

Section 4. Assistant Recording Secretary: The Assistant Recording Secretary shall serve as Chairman of the Credentials Committee. In the absence of the Recording Secretary, she shall serve in her place.

Section 5. Corresponding Secretary: The Corresponding Secretary shall have charge of all correspondence pertaining to the work of the convention. It shall be her duty to promote the sale of all denominational periodicals. She shall compile a slate of the local officers and their addresses for the District officers immediately after the District meeting in April. She shall also send a slate of the District officers and addresses to the State Corresponding Secretary, and each local auxiliary in the District. She shall also serve as Publicity Chairman.

Section 6. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention, and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and paid out at each annual meeting of the convention. She shall also send an annual report to the State Treasurer at least ten days before the annual convention of the State.

Section 7. Field Worker: The Field Worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention. She should co-operate with the District Vice-President in the organizing of new auxiliaries. In every way possible, she should seek to coordinate the work of the convention with that of the school as well as the State and National work.

Section 8. Study Course Chairman: The Study Course Chairman shall promote all study courses for the year as recommended by WNAC, and secure suggested helps and information from State Chairmen as needed. She shall work with the local Study Course Chairmen through personal contact or correspondence, and shall secure the co-operation of the state and local chairmen in encouraging and promoting workshops in the District.

Section 9. Stewardship-Prayer Chairman: It is the duty of the Stewardship-Prayer Chairman to promote the idea of being good stewards in all phases of life, promote family altars, Seasons of Prayer, and prayer fellowship in the local auxiliaries. She shall work with the local Treasurer and Program-Prayer Chairmen offering periodic suggestions for the enlisting of tithers, the promotion of family altars, and other phases of stewardship and prayer endeavors.

Section 10. Personal Service-Evangelism Chairman; The Personal Service-Evangelism Chairman shall encourage the local Personal Service-Evangelism Chairmen in assigned and directed community projects which include soul-winning efforts, benevolences, orphanage work, and ministerial relief.

Section II. Missions Chairman: The Missions Chairman shall assist the local Missions Chairmen in the promotion of foreign and home missions in accord with the policies of the National Boards. She shall keep the local missions chairmen informed of the latest developments in our missionary programs by correspondence with our Missionary Leaders and Directors, and study of our church publications. State mission projects shall be promoted by this officer in the District.

ARTICLE 11. DEPARTMENTAL PROMOTION WORK:

Departmental promotional work shall be carried on by chairmen of the various departments in the convention in co-operation with like chairmen in the local auxiliaries.

The District Chairmen shall plan and direct work in their departments in harmony with the WNAC plan of work. These plans shall be arranged and presented to the Executive Committee meeting at its regular session prior to the convention. Approved plans will be recommended to the convention. Each chairman shall devise ways and means of promoting her respective department of work throughout the District Convention, securing help from the State Chairmen. Each chairman will secure and compile facts from local chairmen or officers concerning her department's activities which will be informative and inspirational to the district convention.

ARTICLE III. ELECTIONS:

The general officers shall be nominated by a Nominating Committee and shall be elected by acclamation, unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the convention in its April meeting. Elections shall be held every two years.

ARTICLE IV. EXPENSES:

An appropriation of 8c per mile shall be paid toward the expenses of the general officers and Nominating Committee, to all official meetings. Secretary's expenses, postage, stationery, and other expenses for officers, shall also be

paid by the convention. All field promotional work is subject to the District Executive Committee, who must approve all itineraries made by District Officers in the interest of District work, as well as expenses for same. Other appropriations may be decided upon by the Finance Committee and passed upon by the Convention.

ARTICLE V. COMMITTEES:

Section 1. Executive Committee: The Executive Committee shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as needed. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to maintain an oversight of the work at large. They shall act for the convention when necessary, same to be subject to the will of the convention at its regular meetings. They shall prepare the program for the regular meetings of the convention and fill any vacancy occurring between elections.

Section 2. Nominating Committee: The Nominating Committee shall be composed of at least five members who are delegates nominated from the floor and elected by the body at the August meeting just prior to the April meeting when elections are to take place. The first person nominated shall be considered chairman of the committee, and shall be responsible for calling the committee together for the purpose of nominating a slate of officers for the convention. Nominations from the floor will be accepted after the report of the Nominating Committee is given.

Section 3. Credentials: The Assistant Recording Secretary shall be Chairman of the Credentials Committee, and other members may be appointed by the President. This committee examines the Annual Reports of the representing Auxiliaries to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order. New Auxiliaries organized since the last District meeting, who desire to become members of the convention are examined by this committee and passed upon, after which they are recommended to the convention for membership.

Section 4. Finance: The Treasurer shall be chairman of the Finance Committee and four other members may be appointed by the President. This committee reviews the financial condition of the District, and makes recommendations concerning honorariums and other items concerning the financial business of the District.

Section 5. Registration: The Vice-President shall be Chairman, and two other members may be appointed by the President to serve on this committee. This committee registers the convention officers, delegates, visitors, Ministers, and any other the convention may desire, and shall report on same to the convention.

Section 6. Resolution: The President shall appoint a Chairman, plus 2 other members to serve on this committee. It shall be the duty of this committee to accept and compile resolutions for recommendation to the Convention.

ARTICLE VI. FEES:

In order to be recognized as a member of this Convention, each local auxiliary shall pay one dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25) per active member to the District Convention, with 25c being kept in the District, and \$1.00 sent to the State Woman's Auxiliary Treasurer, out of which the State Treasurer will keep 25c and forward 75c to the National Auxiliary for promotional work. This with the annual Treasurer's Report, at least ten days prior to the April Convention.

Offerings should be sent or brought to the April and August Conventions for the support of the work of this Convention.

ARTICLE VII. REPORTS:

It shall be the duty of each local auxiliary affiliated with this District to send an annual report to the District Recording Secretary and Treasurer at least 10 days prior to each Convention in April.

ARTICLE VIII. GIFTS

The desired financial program for Woman's Auxiliaries is: Missions offerings following each special Season of Prayer; Co-Laborer Offerings; Offerings to the District Projects for Missions and the Bible College; and annual gifts to WNAC General Fund thru Emphasis Month; and the Student Loan Fund.

ARTICLE IX. AMENDMENTS:

These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at any regular meeting of the District Auxiliary Convention.
