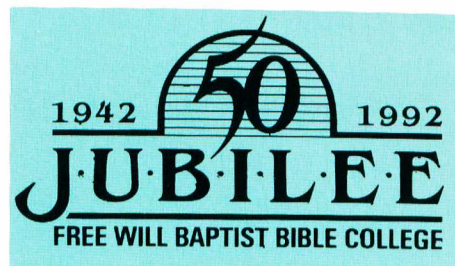

Come Home To FWBBC For '92 Bible Conference!

Alumni will play prominent roles in the college's Jubilee Bible Conference, March 8-12.

Departing from the format of three or four speakers, the Jubilee Committee has asked a number of alumni to share in the conference. Evangelist Bobby Jackson is the only speaker who will be featured more than once. Past FWBBC Presidents—Dr. L. C. Johnson and Dr. Charles A. Thigpen—will be on the program, as will the current President, Dr. Tom Malone.

Other speakers will include Rev. James Forlines, Rev. Steve Lytle, Rev. Jack Stallings, Rev. Jeff Manning, Rev. Bobby Ferguson and Dr. Homer Willis.

A number of special events during the conference will make the meeting unique. Afternoon times for class reunions are scheduled, as are times for reunions of former members of the college choir, quartets, trios, and drama groups. Special services will feature both music and drama. Former members of music groups and drama casts have responded to invitations in *The Shofar* to be involved.

The Alumni Association plans to host its fellowship meeting following the Monday evening service and hold its banquet and business meeting on Tuesday afternoon.

All friends of the college—especially alumni—are urged to attend this special Jubilee Bible Conference, March 8-12.

FWBBC Seeking Regional Accreditation

The nine trustees of Free Will Baptist Bible College, at the board's semi-annual meeting in Nashville, December 5, 1991, voted unanimously for the college to pursue regional accreditation.

An official letter of inquiry was sent to the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), informing them of the college's intentions. Once FWBBC completes formal application, it will begin an 18-month self-study which it will submit to SACS. "We sincerely hope to achieve Candidate status two years from now, and full accreditation two to four years after that," says Dr. Robert Picirilli, FWBBC's Academic Dean. Candidate status would bring with it most of the benefits of accreditation.

FWBBC is already accredited by the American Association of Bible Colleges (AABC). This accreditation is nationally recognized and enables students to transfer credit to most colleges and universities. Other institutions, however, recognize only regional accreditation. With SACS accreditation, even those institutions should recognize FWBBC's credits

says, "We have examined carefully the current standards of SACS and they do not appear to require anything conflicting with our commitment." President Tom Malone adds, "If at any point we see that SACS requires of us something we feel will compromise our commitment to Biblical faith and practice, we will drop the proceedings without hesitation." Dr. Picirilli says the college will submit "strong descriptions of our Christian commitment" so that SACS will either have to reject the college's application or accredit it, knowing full well what the college is.

The majority of voting member institutions in SACS are private colleges, many of them Christian colleges that share FWBBC's commitment to the cardinal doctrines of the faith. By joining them, Free Will Baptist Bible College will open new doors for its students who wish to transfer or pursue graduate studies.

Basketball "Summit" Held at FWBCC

In a historic meeting, students from all four Free Will Baptist colleges met in Nashville, December 12-14, on the campus of Free Will Baptist Bible College. The occasion was a round robin basketball tournament, but the meeting's significance was far greater than the competition on the court.

Gathering at FWBCC were teams and visitors from Southeastern Free Will Baptist College, Wendell, NC; Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Moore, OK; and California Christian College, Fresno, CA.

The tournament was a special project of FWBCC's Coach Byron Deel, who worked for two years to bring it about. He initiated the contact with the three other Free Will Baptist colleges, doggedly pursued the dream when circumstances seemed about to shatter it, and labored long to make all of the plans to bring it about.

FWBCC President Tom Malone describes it as "a historic week." He says, "This is the only time all four of our colleges have met on the same campus. Fellowship among the students was the outstanding event." He feels that the attendees left with "a new understanding and appreciation of the fact we are all Free Will Baptists, with a common goal of reaching the world for Christ."

Two of the three visiting teams were accompanied by their institution's president. President Malone says, "It was a privilege to have President Jim McAllister of California Christian and President Billy Bevan of Southeastern greet the students and share the burden they feel for all our students." Both visiting presidents, as well as Hillsdale's coach, spoke in FWBCC's chapel.

The tournament was won by Hillsdale, at 3-0, followed by California Christian, at 2-1, FWBCC at 1-2, and Southeastern at 0-3. Hillsdale was awarded the Classic Cup by Coach Deel.

Hillsdale's Vincent Thomas, a 6'4" sophomore, was chosen Most Outstanding Player. Plaques were given to 10 other players who were selected for the first and second all-tournament teams.

Mr. Forlines To Retire

Rev. Leroy Forlines, the dean of Free Will Baptist Bible and theology teachers, will retire at the end of this school year.

The native of Winterville, NC, joined the FWBCC faculty in 1952. During his 36 years of teaching, he has impacted hundreds of Free Will Baptist young people with his unswerving loyalty to the Bible, his keen ability to interpret Scripture and his great love for people, especially those who are hurting. He wrote the volume on *Romans* in the Randall House Commentary series and other books and pamphlets.

Mr. Forlines may continue to teach on a part-time basis. The college will recognize his years of service at Commencement in May.

Mr. Jones, Dr. Riggs To Leave Faculty

Rev. Joseph Jones and Dr. Ken Riggs, with some 46 years of teaching at FWBCC between them, have announced that they will leave the faculty at the end of the school year, according to Dr. Robert Picirilli, Academic Dean.

Mr. Jones joined the faculty in 1967 to teach English and Speech. He organized the college's first drama tour, directed scores of plays, traveled with summer drama teams, and became chairman of the English-Speech Department. He plans to return to Alabama, but hopes to continue his ministry of Christian drama, as opportunities are available.

Dr. Riggs joined the FWBCC faculty in 1971 to direct the school's teacher education program. He has built it into an outstanding arm of the Bible College's ministry, with hundreds of graduates serving the Lord in classrooms. Now, with the program well underway, he is leaving the faculty to devote more time to his pastorate and to other interests.

Dr. Picirilli said that the college will give special recognitions to Rev. Jones and Dr. Riggs later in the school year.

Pleasant View Wins Basketball Tourney

Pleasant View Christian School, Pleasant View, TN, won FWBBC's 13th annual High School Invitational Basketball Tournament, held at the college January 9-11.

They took the championship, defeating Florence Christian Academy, Florence, AL, in the final game. Florence was second place in the tournament, followed by Bethel Christian Academy, Kinston, NC.

FWBBC Coach Byron Deel commended all of the teams and players. "We had some very competitive games," he said. "The enthusiasm and conduct of the players and cheerleaders was outstanding. It is exciting to see the product our Christian schools are producing."

Trey Lawrence, a 6' senior from Florence was chosen Most Outstanding Player. He was joined on the All-Tournament Team by Daren Sutton, Bethel Christian (NC); Matt Holt, Florence Christian; Ryan Parker, Pleasant View Christian; Jason Anderson, Woodbine Christian; and Larry Little, Pleasant View Christian.

Other participants in the tournament were Bethel Christian, South Roxana, IL; Glennville Christian, Glennville, GA; Liberty Christian, Guin, AL; and Peninsula Christian, Newport News, VA.

Doctrines Videos Selling Very Well

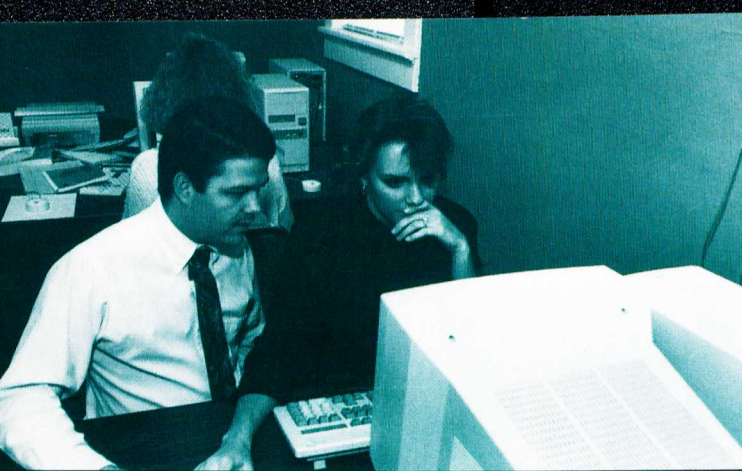

New Computer Lab

Up and Running

Free Will Baptist Bible College has opened its new computer lab, and students are fast picking up the powerful new tools the college has placed in their hands.

The lab includes 11 fast 386 computers with super-VGA monitors. It also provides both dot matrix and laser printers, music keyboard interfacing, and color scanning equipment. Computers already in use in the Business Education Department and in the library will be networked with those in the new lab. Faculty members are currently examining software that will be useful for studies in their particular fields.

- The lab will give all students access to:
- Word processing programs that will include spellchecking, grammar/style checking, and other features to help them write papers and reports.
- Drill programs for math, grammar, music theory, New Testament Greek, Hebrew, and more.
- Music software that will allow on-screen composition and printing of music scores.
- Research materials that allow students to browse encyclopedias, atlases, the classics, periodicals, etc. as they look for information for papers and reports.
- Accounting programs and database software that they will use in the business world.
- Bible language and Bible research materials for personal study and sermon building.

Sandy Goodfellow, FWBBC's Business Manager for Physical Operations, spearheaded the project and negotiated most of the arrangements with the Christian College Cooperative, headquartered in Dayton, TN.

Dr. Robert Picirilli, Academic Dean, says that the next step is to make it possible for dormitory students to lease computers and printers for use in their rooms and to network them into the campus system centered in the lab. Town students will also have remote access to the lab via telephone connections. "FWBBC now has computer equipment that is state of the art and at the cutting edge of a fast developing field," he says.

Our Jubilee Bible Conference/Homecoming, March 8-12, broke all of the rules.

Instead of keynote speakers, alumni from all five of the college's decades were featured. Much of the special music was from folks whose voices should have been cracking with age. Even the weather conspired to cut the attendance.

It should have been a disaster. But it wasn't!

From the large opening night crowd to the final amen, the conference exceeded expectations and predictions.

Summarizing it is difficult. To say we had 12 preachers on the program leaves much unsaid. All were FWBBC alumni, representing each of the five decades the college has existed, except for the two past presidents—Dr. L. C. Johnson and Dr. Charles Thigpen. And they were great! They made us feel that we must have been doing something right for the past 50 years!

Good music has always been an important part of our Bible conferences. This year was no exception. But what made it special was that, in addition to the usual appearances by the College Choir and other current music groups, we enjoyed the resurrected talents of quartets, trios, instrumentalists and ensembles from former years.

One of the highlights of the conference—by anyone's measure—must be the Jubilee anthem, "Blow Ye The Trumpet In Zion," by Dr. Vernon Whaley. This musical work was commissioned by the Jubilee Committee and was adapted from passages in Psalms 65-67. It encapsulated the theme perfectly—praise for God's faithfulness and our continued

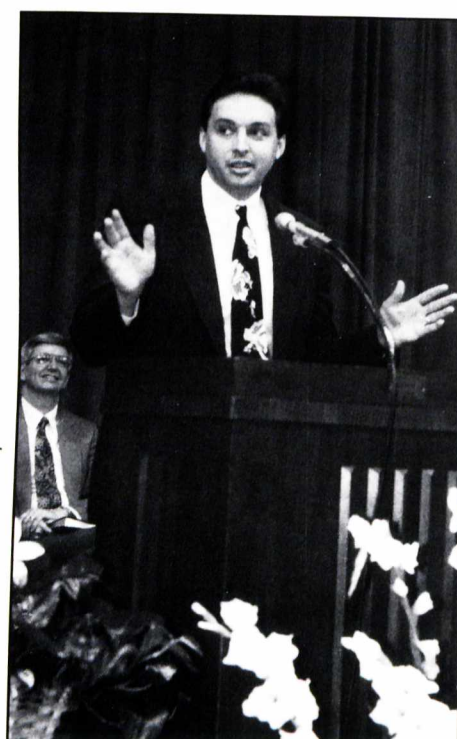

Two performances of the drama on Tuesday evening were required to accommodate all who wanted to see it. No one was disappointed. At the end of the first performance, the cast honored Mr. Joseph Jones and his wife, Beverly, for his 25 years at the college. He is leaving the faculty at the end of the school year.

Testimonies from alumni and the current student body president were sprinkled through the program. They provided a fresh addition to the conference.

Reunions, not usually a part of the Bible Conference agenda, abounded this year. Of course, it was advertised as Homecoming, so reunions were to be expected. In addition to class reunions, by decades, the college provided meeting areas for many alumni groups: music/choir members, yearbook staffs, dramatic performers, preachers, missionaries, CE/youth directors, school teachers, and business graduates.

From any vantage point, the Jubilee Conference must be termed outstanding. Our appreciation to Jubilee Chairman Charles Hampton and the Jubilee Committee: Dr. Mary Wisehart, Rev. Ken Walker, Rev. ReachOut '92 will minister to the FWBBC family. But it will also appeal to missionaries (home and foreign), pastors, and laity—anyone who is interested in Jesus Christ's last command.

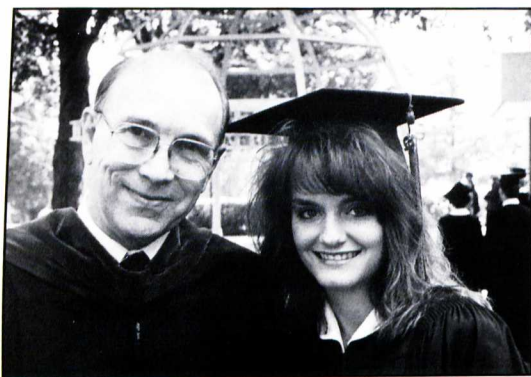

Outstanding Speakers

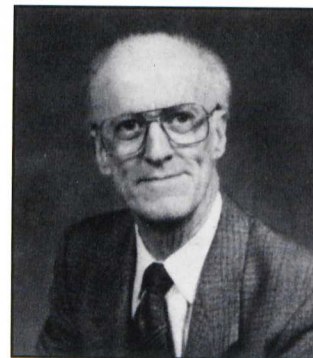
The featured speakers will be Dr. Paul Smith, pastor of The

Peoples Church of Toronto, Canada, and Don Richardson, world-famous missionary and writer. Both men have a global view of missions and are challenging speakers.

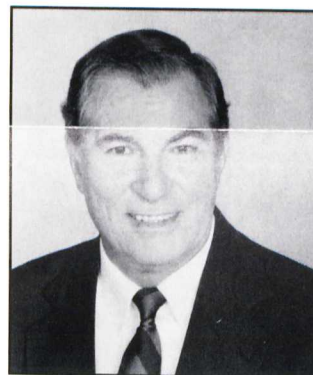
Dr. Smith's church gives more than \$2 million per year to missions and his annual travels keep him in contact with missions work around the world.

Year Finished In The Black!

The college ended the 1991-92 school year \$22,323 in the black. Among the factors which made this possible were the 11.5% increase in student enrollment and the continued giving of our friends. Also noteworthy was the residual giving toward the old \$600,000 debt, which was successfully completed this spring.

The Bible College thanks you for praying, directing new students our way, and for generously giving to this ministry.

But...

We are grateful that we operated within our \$2.26 million budget in 1991-92. However, numerous past and present needs, such as adequate staffing and salary adjustments, renovation and maintenance of our buildings, and the replacement of old furniture, equipment and vehicles has been deferred for several years because of insufficient income.

The proposed 1992-93 FWBBC budget *begins* to address these critical issues through increased student and gift income.

With our old debt now repaid, pray with us as we "shift gears" to correct these deficiencies.

Computers Move Into Dormitories

In its effort to help every student become "computer literate," the college is extending its computer lab into its dormitories.

When FWBBC students return to college in a few weeks, they will find that Goen Hall and Polston Hall will have mini computer labs available for their use. They will contain 2-3 computers and a high-quality printer. They will be networked with the main computer lab.

Last year, dorm students could use the main lab only until 9:30 p.m. The dorm labs will be open until midnight. Off-campus students can continue to use the main computer lab as they have in the past.

The lab was opened last school year and proved to be both popular and useful. Teachers noted that student papers improved, not only in appearance, but in the quality of the research done.

Sports Medicine, Accounting To Be Offered

A new Bachelor of Science program in Sports Medicine will be offered this fall to prepare athletic trainers, according to Dr. Robert Picirilli, Academic Dean.

He also says that the college is nearly ready to announce a new Accounting major for business students. Students who enroll this year in the Business program should be able to complete the Accounting major within four years, provided there are enough students who seek this major.

FWBBC continues to develop new programs in response to the interests of our denomination's young people.

FWBBC enjoyed a seven percent enrollment growth this year, registering an even 300 students from 24 states, the Virgin Islands and four foreign countries, according to Registrar Charles E. Hampton.

Record Goals Set For Christmas Drive

Two goals have been set for the college's 1992 Paul Kettelman Memorial Christmas Drive, according to Bob Shockey, Public Relations Director. "Our Victory Goal will be \$250,000," he says, "but our Hallelujah Goal is \$300,000."

FWBBC's Christmas Drive in December is recognized by the National Association as its own unique and special fund-raising effort. As part of the Together Way Plan, adopted last summer in Indianapolis, the denomination voted to sanction four annual stewardship drives—for FWBBC, Home Missions, Foreign Missions and other causes.

The goals represent a leap of faith for the college. Last year the Christmas Drive total was \$150,331.43. Hard work on the part of students and FWBBC employees, with the cooperation of many churches, pastors, family and friends, produced nearly \$78,000—52 percent of the total received.

The college credits all gifts received in December to the Christmas Drive. Also, any gifts designated for the drive received through the end of January will count toward the final total.

The drive is named in honor of Rev. Paul Kettelman, who served as Public Relations Director of the college for 25 years before his death in 1987.

First Quarter Gifts Behind Budget

At the close of the first fiscal quarter, gifts to the college were 37 percent behind where they need to be, according to Tom Sass, Treasurer. "Although we thank God for what has been given, gifts now are behind those for the same time a year ago," he added.

Gifts for the three-month period totaled \$161,441.95, an average of \$53,813.98 per month. The college needed \$256,250—\$85,416.67 per month—to meet its budget for the first quarter.

In spite of finishing last year in the black, the college needs to receive every dollar in its \$1,025,000 budget for this year.

FWBBC's annual Paul Kettelman Memorial Christmas Fund Drive is aiming high. The goal for this year's drive is \$250,000, according to Bob Shockey, Public Relations Director.

The need is critical. The college is facing the possibility of ending the year in the red, due largely to a drop in gifts. (A chart inside shows how your state is doing in its support.) Tom Sass, FWBBC Treasurer, says this could be one of the worst years, financially, in the college's 50-year existence. Denominational response to the Christmas Drive could determine the outcome.

Mr. Shockey has put a major burden for the drive directly on the college family. FWBBC employees and students are working to raise \$100,000—leaving just \$150,000 to come from the denomination at large. Students, teachers and staff workers have already adopted individual goals in the drive and have taken steps to meet and exceed the \$100,000-goal.

In a letter to Free Will Baptist pastors, Mr. Shockey urges each to do something for FWBBC during December. Among the suggestions he offers are:

- Give one Sunday's offerings.
- Vote a designated amount.
- Take a retiring offering each Sunday in December.
- Have a "Bible College Day" in December.

The key is total involvement—everyone doing something. "We want to take the Paul J. Kettelman Memorial Christmas Fund Drive and challenge every pastor, every church, and every individual to send a special gift to FWBBC to help our young people who are preparing to take the gospel into the 21st century," Mr. Shockey says.

All gifts to the college in December are counted in the drive. So are any January gifts that are designated for the Christmas Drive.

December has been set aside by the denomination for FWBBC to make a major fund-raising effort. The Together Way stewardship plan, adopted by the National Association of Free Will Baptists meeting in Indianapolis in July, recognizes four months each year in which different national departments make major appeals. FWBBC has traditionally promoted its Christmas Drive in December.

Since the drive was begun in 1976 by Paul Kettelman, who served for 25 years as the college's Public Relations Director, it has raised more than \$1 million for FWBBC. Mr. Kettelman died in 1987, and the Christmas Drive was renamed in his honor.

Your help—as a pastor, an alumnus, a friend—is important. Please promote the drive in your church this month. Your special Christmas gift will also be highly valued.

Dr. Geisler On Campus For Forlines Lectures

Dr. Norman Geisler, one of the 20th Century's outstanding defenders of the faith, was on campus October 20-21 in the first F. Leroy Forlines Lectures.

Dr. Geisler has served on the faculties of Dallas Theological Seminary and Liberty University. He is the author of numerous books. Presently he serves as Dean of Southern Evangelical Seminary in Charlotte, NC.

Dr. Geisler spoke in extended chapels on both days. His messages encompassed the changes taking place in American society because of the influences of the New Age movement and humanism.

Graduate Program Discontinued

Free Will Baptist Bible College's Board of Trustees—at the recommendation of Mr. Ralph Hampton, Dean of the Graduate School, President Tom Malone, and Dr. Robert Picirilli, Academic Dean—voted unanimously September 25 to discontinue the graduate program.

The decision was made primarily because of insufficient enrollment. "To put it simply, we have not had the enrollment needed to enable us to have a sound or accreditable program. Nor does it appear that these circumstances will change significantly in the days ahead," says Dr. Picirilli. "Courses will be offered through the December, 1993, session and the last group will graduate in May, 1994."

Dr. Picirilli says that the college will try to redirect its focus and provide continuing education in less formal ways that may be available and helpful to more people. This will largely be done through the college's External Studies Division, directed by Mr. Harrold Harrison. "We believe our energies will be more effective in this way," adds Dr. Picirilli.

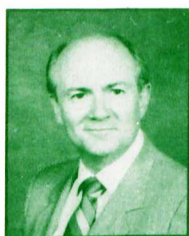

As president, he will preside over the Board and over AABC meetings. He will often be the AABC representative at governmental and educational meetings.

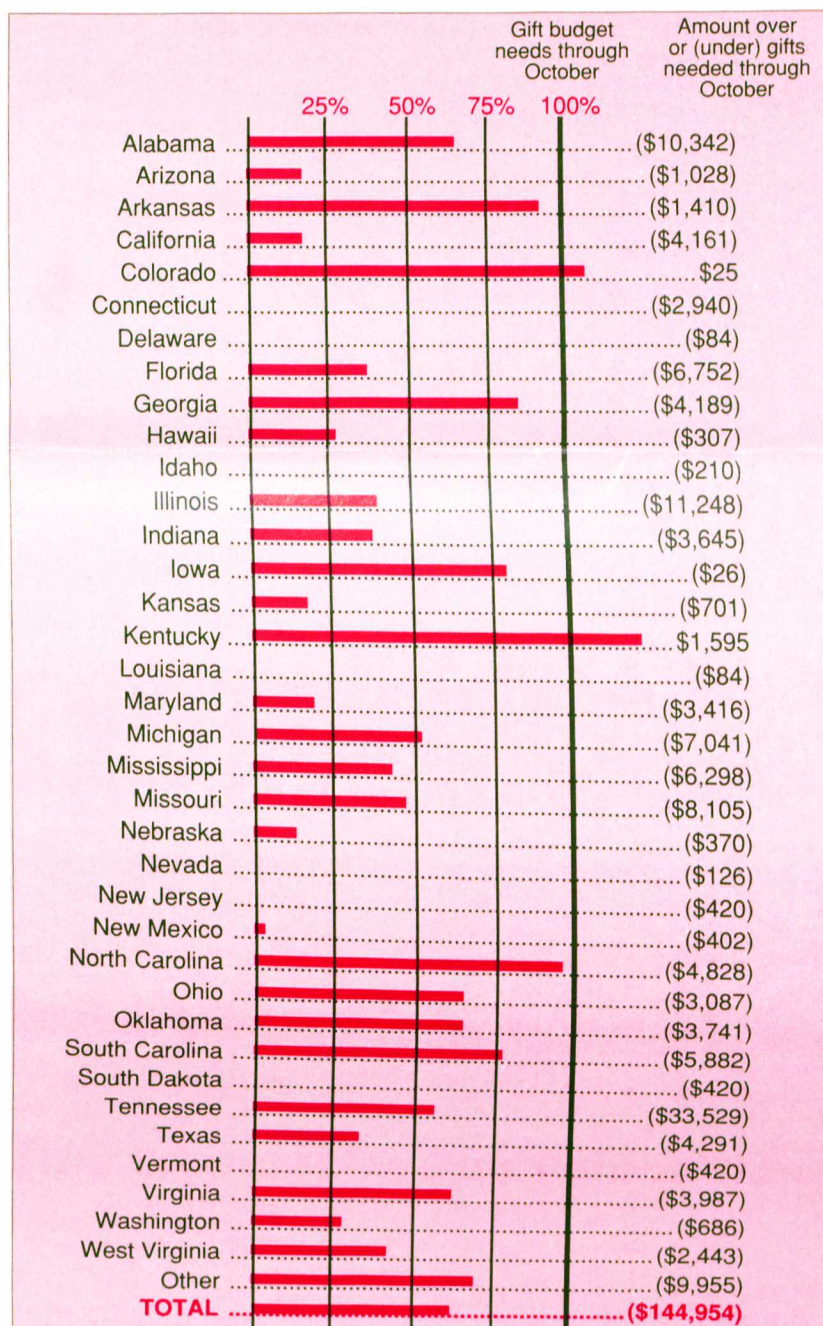

This is the first of three messages preached at FWBBC's 1989 spring Bible Conference. They are classical theological expositions by the dean of Free Will Baptist theologians. (See the others in this series below.)

The Amazing Grace of Sanctification—by Leroy Forlines (one tape)

The second in the series above.

Holiness—by Leroy Forlines (one tape)

The third in the series above; based on 1 Peter 1:15, 16.

Pathway of Life—by Laura Belle Barnard (two tapes)

These four messages, by the late FWB missionary to India, were delivered at FWBBC in September, 1979. They reveal the real Laura Belle Barnard—her wit, humor, determination and submission to the will of God. These should be in the library of every Free Will Baptist.

The Purpose of Dating—by Dr. Robert Picirilli (one tape)

These messages will serve a youth director or parent of teenagers well. They contain practical, common sense, down-to-earth advice.

How To Live Right—by Dr. Ken Riggs (one tape)

Based on Galatians 3:24-25, these two messages are especially slanted to meet the needs of young people. Dr. Riggs excels in communicating to youth.

A Biblical Basis of Missions—by Eddie Payne (two tapes)

Rev. Payne, former missionary to Ivory Coast, preaches four messages which give a most comprehensive Biblical mandate for missions to the Christian. They enlighten, edify and challenge.

The Blessed Man—by Dr. Tom Malone (two tapes)

These three excellent expository messages, from Psalm 1, are manna for the soul. **Exposition of Romans 12:1, 2**—by Dr. Robert Picirilli (one tape)

Two powerful messages with soul-searching implications. "The best I've heard on this passage of scripture" (Harold Harrison).

The Ten Commandments and The Law of God—by Dr. Robert Picirilli (three tapes)

These six messages are clear, powerful expositions of what God's Law means and how it affects every believer today.
