Thursday, September 28th, 1967 - 7:00 P.M. Service opened with congregational singing, 'Are you Washed in the Blood.' Prayer by Bro. Allen Higginbotham. More congregational singing. Talk or welcome by Moderator. Devotional lead by Rev. Larry Johnson with testimonies from the congregation. Song and handshake by congregation.

8:00 P.M. - Talk on Youth Camp and book he has written and also message by Rev. W. H. Ryland. Scripture, St. John 5:39, I John 3:24, I Timothy 1:15, Romans 5:1, Nebrews 2:3, and Acts 4:12 Invitation to come to Jesus given.

Conference called to order by Clerk. Credential Committee appointed by Moderator: Ed Goodwin - Chairman, E. O. Shelnut, and Voyd Howard. Visitors from other associations recognized and announcements. Benediction by Rev. A. D. Lynn.

Friday, September 29th, 1967 - 9:00 A.M. Service opened with congregational singing. Prayer by Rev. J. W. Marlow. Scripture reading by Assistant Moderator, St. John 14:1-4. Altar prayer. Welcome by Sis. Billie Collins. Congregational singing. Report of Credential Committee. (accepted) Visitors recognized. Letters read by Sis. H. A. McSpadden and Sis. Margie Isbell. Letters accepted and delegates seated. Devotional Committee appointed: Sis. Parker, Sis. Imogene Walker, and Sis. Goodwin. Recess.

10:45 A.M. Special 'Where Could I go but to the Lord' by Mr. & Mrs. Gene Coffman. Devotion Committee report given and accepted. Rev. Jimmie Sims selected for devotion and Rev. A. J. Looper selected for preaching. Business Committee and Ordaining Council appointed. Congregational singing. Devotional by Rev. Jimmie Sims. Scripture, Psalms 133:1-2. Special 'A Millionnaire with Jesus' by Mr. and Mrs. Gene Coffman.

Message by Rev. A. J. Looper. Scripture, Psalms 78:41 and also part of 13th Chapter of Numbers. Dismissed for lunch with prayer by Bro. Armstrong.

Friday September 29th, 1:00 P.M.

Service opened after lunch with congregational singing. Prayer by Rev. W. H. Ryland. Scripture reading, Psalms 1st Chapter, by Moderator. Appointment of committees. Partial report of Business Committee. (Business Committee recommended that Mt. Zion church be received and delegates seated by this body. This was accepted by conference.) Delegates of Mt. Zion Church given hand of fellowship while congregation sings 'Amazing Grace' Special by Rev. J. D. Wales, 'Family Bible.' Letter of appreciation for filter plant at Childrens' Home read. Congregational singing. Devotional by Rev. M. D. Harper. Report of Temperance Committee given and accepted. Auditing Committee report given and accepted. (See Committee Reports) Oral report on Youth Rallies given and accepted as information. Deceased Committee report given and accepted.

Talk by Rev. M. D. Harper on public education and lack of religious teachings in our public schools. Atheism taught in our textbooks. Atheists had religion took out of education. We need to stand up and have Atheism took out. Don't force Free Will Baptist or salvation on anyone, but give them the freedom to accept it. Talk by Rev. J. W. Marlow: Put Bible reading and prayer back in schools. We are heading toward one world government. Congregation had moment of silence for deceased. Talk by Paul Nichols concerning the National Council of Churches. The Sunday School literature on the Adult Level published by the Sunday School Dept. of the National Association of Free Will Baptists is still based on the International Sunday School Lesson outlines, which are owned and controlled by the National Council of Churches. The Sunday School literature below the Adult level has already been changed to our Free Will Baptist Curriculum and is not now based on the International Sunday School lesson outlines. The Sunday School Dept. has been planning a change on the Adult level, to our own curriculum for several years now. It seems that the Sunday School Dept. should have had time to make this change by now and we need to encourage them to make this change now and let them know that we are opposed to paying the National Council of Churches for these outlines. Bro. Looper speaks in favor of Sunday School Department.

Report of Sunday School and C.T.S. Committee. (The following report was made by this Committee) We, the Sunday School and C.T.S. Committee feel that our teachers should be spirit filled and members of the Freewill Baptist as far as possible - We ask that this association advise its churches to discontinue the Adult Sunday School Material as long as its lessons are

based on the International Sunday School Lesson, because of its affilliations with the National Council of Churches and if adopted to forward this request to the State Association asking them to adopt the same, and to notify the Freewill Baptist Publishing House of this adoption. We encourage the teachers to catch a vision of the fields that are white all ready for harvest, praying without ceasing, looking to Jesus Christ, the author and finisher of our faith. Henry McLaughlin, Gene Coffman, Amon Edge, E. O. Shellnut, Jimmy Sims. (After discussion by the conference, there was a motion and second which was passed by the conference to table the motion and second to accept this report. This report will not be printed under Committee Reports, but a latter report by the Sunday School and C.T.S. Committee which was accepted by the conference will be printed there.)

Partial report of Business Committee. (The following recommendation by the Business Committee was not accepted by the Association. See Committee Reports for recommendations that were accepted by the Association.) Recommend that the Association pay all expenses out of the General Fund for the Youth Camp and each church try to double their contributions which would amount to \$20.00 per month. (defeated) The following report of the Executive Committee oral) was accepted as information. They were called to Leeds Church. The Pastor had 2 living wives. Saturday, September 30th, 1967, 9:00 A.M. Congregational singing led by Rev. John Counts, Pianist, Sis. Billie Rollins. Scripture reading by Assistant Moderator, II Corinthians 4:3-5. Altar prayer led by Rev. Jack Rollins. Business Committee report given and accepted. Devotional Committee report: For devotional Rev. C. E. McCrory; for preaching, Rev. Jimmy Youngblood. Family Devotion Committee report given and accepted. (See Committee Reports) Standing of the Ministry report given and accepted. There seemed to be some difference of opinions concerning the regulations of the association as to who

were to receive (certificates) of standing and who should not. A motion was passed that a Committee be appointed to straighten out this situation or the regulations. Those appointed to this Committee were Rev. J. J. Staab, Chairman: Rev. Johnny Baxley and Rev. Maxwell Harper. Recess.

Saturday, September 30th, 1967, 1:00 P.M. Service opened with Congregational singing. Scrip-ture, II Timothy 3:1-5 by Moderator. Prayer by Rev. Ed Ledlow. Report of the 'Committee to straighten out Regulations as to who should get Certificates of Standing' given and accepted. (See Committee Reports) There was much discussion as to who would receive certificates of standing and a guestion as to who would receive certificates of standing. The Clerk tells the association that he is not going to send certificates of standing to the Ministers and Deacons of the churches that did not request certificates of standing for their Ministers and Deacons, if the Association wants him to do differently, to tell him. (The Association did not instruct the Clerk to do otherwise). (The above announcement by the Clerk was based on the Standing of the Ministry Report, which was accepted by the Association, and the discussion which had took place. The discussion brought out that last year a man from one church received a certificate of standing, altho his name was left off the Church Letter on purpose and the Church did not intend to request a certificate of standing for him.) BY-LAWS OF MINISTERS AND DEACONS

Conference of Cahaba River Association

(1) The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, or the Senior Minister in years, may call the meeting to order and shall have charge until Moderator as-

(2) It shall be the duty of the Clerk to enroll all Ministers present who are in good standing. If there are questionable characters they shall be referred to an appointed Credential Committee for advice but not for trial. They may be seated if found worthy, if not they are referred to

(3) Each meeting shall be opened with scripture reading and prayer.

(4) By a two-thirds vote any decision of the moderator may be overruled. (5) This meeting shall sit with open doors unless it goes into a commit-

(6) Any person, not a member of the body shall be allowed to take part in discussion, with Moderator's permission, but shall have no vote. (7) All members of the body are expected to be present throughout the session unless excused by Moderator.

(8) No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one officer or committeeman if his nomination is elected.

(9) The Moderator must not allow any discussion to be carried on in an

(10) The person who desires to speak, must first rise and address the Moderator and when recognized shall proceed.

(11) The votes on any question must be counted upon request of one-

(12) No member shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes, nor twice on the same subject unless given permission by Moderator. (13) All Ministers belonging to this body are required to support all committees and boards elected or appointed by Association, (such as Home Mission Board, Building Committee, etc.).

(14) This body ordains no one until he has carried license for one year and proved himself worthy of Ordination.

CONSTITUTION

Article I-The Association shall be known as The Cahaba River Association of The Free Will Baptist.

Article II-The Association shall be composed of Ministers, Deacons, and Delegates of different churches forming the same.

- Article III-All Ministers and Churches wishing to become members of this body must willingly submit to the Articles of Constitution and all rules of same.
- Article IV-Each church composing this Association shall be entitled to three(3) delegates of the first 100 members and one (1) for each additional fifty (50) or fraction thereof.
- Article V-All church clerks shall mail church letters to the Association clerk not later than one week in advance of the first day of the beginning of the Association.
- Article VI-The Officers of the Association shall be composed of Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer. They shall be elected by body each year, at the end of each session. The Treasurer shall serve for a term of two (2) years. He shall handle all money of the Association and shall be bonded.
- Article VII-Credential Committee shall be appointed on Thursday Night at the beginning of Association, and receive church letters and shall be ready to report on letters at 9:00 a.m. Friday, stating if letters are certified and give list of delegates from said church.
- Article VIII-All appointed committees shall be appointed at each session and shall serve during session. At end of session their responsibility shall cease.
- Article IX-This Association shall meet on Thursday Night before the first Sunday in October of each year.
- Article X-Each church shall pay tithes of their income thus: 25 per cent of tithes to Children's Home, 25 per cent of tithes to Annual Association, 25 per cent of tithes to Home Mission, 15 per cent of tithes to Foreign Mission, 10 per cent of tithes to Superannuation.
- Article XI-Each Minister and Deacon belonging to the body shall pay an annual fee of \$1.00
- Article XII-The Clerk shall be paid the sum of \$25.00 annually. The Moderator shall be paid the sum of \$25.00 annually. The Assistant Moderator shall be paid the sum of \$12.50 Annually. All other expenditures not specified shall be by decision of the body.

Through the redemption effected by Christ salvation is actually enjoyed in this world, and will be enjoyed in the next by all who do not in this life refuse obedience to the known requirements of God. The atonement for our sin was necessary. For present and future obedience can no more blot out our past sins than past obedience can remove the guilt of present and future sins. If God pardoned the sins of men without satisfaction for the violation of His law it would follow that transgression might go on with impunity; government would be agrogated, and the obligation of obedience to God would be in effect. removed.

- 2. Mediation of Christ. Our Lord not only died for our sins, but He arose for our justification, and ascended up to Heaven, where, as the only Mediator between God and man, He makes intercession for us, until He comes again.
- 3. We believe that all children dying in infancy, having not actually transgressed against the Law of God, in their own persons are only subject to the first death which was brought on by the fall of the first Adam, and not that anyone of them dying in that state shall suffer punishment on Hell by the guilt of Adam's sin for of such is the Kingdom of God.

Chapter VII-The Holy Spirit

- 1. The Scriptures ascribe to the Holy Spirit the acts and attributes of an intelligent being. He guides, knows, moves, gives information, commands, forbids, sends forth, reproves, and can be sinned against.
- 2. The attributes of God are ascribed to the Holy Spirit.
- 3. The works of God are ascribed to the Holy Spirit; creation, inspiration, giving of life, and a sanctificat .n.
- 4. The Apostles assert that the Holy Spirit is Lord and God. From the foregoing the conclusion is that the Holy Spirit, is in reality God, and one with the Father in divine perfections. It has also been shown that Jesus Christ is God-one with the Father. Then these Three: The Father, Son and Holy Spirit, are One God.

The truth of this doctrine is also proved from the fact that the Father, The Son, and The Holy Ghost are united in the authority by which believers are baptized; and in the benedictions pronounced by the Apostles, which are acts of the highest religious worship.

Chapter VIII-The Gospel Call

The call of the Gospel is co-extensive with the atonement to all men both by the Word and strivings of the spirit, so that Salvation is rendered equally possible to all, and, if any fail of etemal life, the fault is wholly his own.

Chapter IX-Repentance

The repentance which the Gospel requires includes a deep conviction, a penitential sorrow, an open confession, a decided hatred and an entire forsaking all sin. This repentance God has enjoined on all men, and without it in this life the sinner must perish eternally.

Chapter X-Faith

Saving faith is an assent of the mind to the fundamental truths of revelation, an acceptance of the Gospel, through the influence of the Holy Spirit, and a firm confidence and trust in Christ. The fruit of faith is obedience to the Gospel. The power to believe is the gift of God, but believing is an act of the creature, which is required as a condition of

pardon, and without which the sinner cannot obtain salvation, all men are required to believe in Christ; and those who yeild obedience to this requirement become the Children of God by Faith.

As man is a fallen and sinful being, he must be regenerated in order to obtain salvation. This change is an instantaneous renewal of the heart by the Holy Spirit, whereby the penitent sinner receives new life, becomes a Child of God, and is disposed to serve him, this is called in scripture being born again-born of the spirit, being quickened, passing from death unto life, and a partaking of the divine nature.

- God.
- Jesus Christ.

There are strong grounds to hope that the truly regenerate will persevere unto the end, and be saved, through the power of divine grace which is pledged for their support, but their future obedience and final salvation are neither determined nor certain, since through infirmity and manifold temptations they are in danger of falling; and they ought there fore to watch and pray, lest they make ship-wreck of their faith and be lost.

This is one day in seven, which from the creation of the world God has set apart for sacred rest and holy service. Under the former dispensation, the seventh day of the week as commemorative of the work of creation, was set apart for the Sabbath. Under the Gospel, the first day of the week, in commemoration of the Resurrection of Christ, and by authority of Christ and the Apostles, is observed as the Christian Sabbath. On this day all men are required to refrain from secular labor and devote themselves to the worship and service of God.

A Christian Church is an organized body of believers in Christ, who statedly assemble to worship God, and who sustain the Ordinances of the Gospel according to the Scriptures. Believers in Christ are admitted to this church on giving evidence of faith in Christ, obtaining consent of the body, being baptized, and receiving the right hand of fellowship.

The Church of God, or members of the Body of Christ, is the whole body of christians throughout the whole world, and none but the regenerate are its members.

Both the Old and New Scriptures teach tithing as God's Financial Plan for the support of His work.

1. Justification. Personal justification implies that the person justified has been guilty before God, and in consideration of the atonement of Christ, accepted by faith, the sinner is pardoned and absolved from the guilt of sin and restored to the divine favor. Christ's atonement is the foundation of the sinner's redemption, yet, without repentance and faith, it can never give him justification and peace with

Chapter XVII-The Gospel Ministry

- Qualification of Ministers. They must possess good, natural and acquired abilities, deep and ardent piety, be especially called of God to the work, and ordained by prayer and the laying on of hands.
- Duties of Ministers. These are to preach the word, administer the Ordinances of the Gospel, visit their people, and perform the work of faithful ministers.

Chapter XVIII-Ordinances of the Gospel

- Christian Baptism. This is the Immersion of Believers in Water in the name of the Father, the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, in which are represented the Burial and Resurrection of Christ, the Death of Christ, the death of christians to the world, the washing of their soul from the pollution of sin, their rising to newness of life, their engagement to to serve God, and their resurrection at the last day.
- 2. The Lord's Supper. This is a commemoration of the death of Christ for our sins, in the use of bread which He made the emblem of His broken body, and the cup, the emblem of His shed blood, and by it the believer expresses his live for Christ, his faith and hope in Him and pledges to him perpetual fidelity.

It is the priviledge and duty of all who have spiritual union with Christ to commemorate His death; and no man has a right to forbid these tokens to the least of His Disciples.

3. Washing the Saints Feet. This is a sacred Ordinance, which teaches humility, and reminds the believer of the necessity of a daily cleansing from all sin. It was instituted by the Lord Jesus Christ, and called an "example" on the night of His betrayal, and in connection with the institution of the Lord's Supper. It is the duty and happy preogative of every believer to observe this sacred ordinance.

Chapter XIX-Death

 Death. As a result of sin, all mankind, is subject to the death of the body. The soul does not die with the body; but immediately after death enters into a conscious state of happiness or misery, according to the character here possessed.

Chapter XX-Second Coming of Christ

The Lord Jesus, who ascended on high, and sits at the right hand of God, will come again, to close the Gospel Dispensation, Glorify His Saints, and judge the world.

Chapter XXI-The Resurrection

The Scriptures teach the resurrection of the bodies of all men each in its own order; they have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil to the resurrection of damnation.

Chapter XXII-The Final Judgement and Final Retribution

- The Final Judgement. There will be a final judgement, when time and man's probation will close forever. Then all men will be judged according to their works.
- Final Retribution. Immediately after the final judgement, the righteous will enter into eternal life, and the wicked will go into a state of endless punishment.
