

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REPORT OF THE CALIFORNIA BIBLE INSTITUTE A Slow Process

"Heaven is not reached by a single bound, we mount its summit round by round . . ." This saying holds true in the establishment and development of a Christian College . . . victory and ultimate results are not realized in a few days, weeks, months or even years! Christian Colleges, unlike state supported schools, must depend upon the love-offerings and gifts of people for financial support. Christian Colleges do not have hundreds of thousands of dollars coming in from taxes collected from almost every conceivable commodity. This is not bad! Israel, God's Chosen people, built the tabernacle . . . nations outside of that realm were not permitted to participate. God's people built the walls of Jerusalem and the citizens of the country were not permitted to assist in any way. Would you want California Bible Institute to be built from taxes collected from such things as liquor? We believe your answer is **no!**

Christian Colleges, particularly in their beginnings, must depend upon faithful men and women to volunteer their services as instructors. These may not always be the best audified, as the world would establish qualifications, but they are often used of God to accomplish great things in His kingdom (Christian achievements must not be measured by those of the world). These godly men and women are to be commended and respected. California Bible Institute has been fortunate in having many such me and women. The thing that matters most to Christian Colleges is that instructors be Christians. Would you want a person, no matter how well trained they might be, to teach in our school that did not personally know Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord? Again we believe your answer would be **no!**

Specific Progress

California Bible Institute, during the past three years, has made substantial progress. It has been slow, but foundational in nature and solid in character. In the 1961 catalog, the school offered but sixty units of work. In the 1962 revision of that catalog the school offered 90 units of work. In the 1963 revision, a total of 96 units were required for graduation. In the 1964-65 catalog, a total of 108 units will be required for graduation. Five instructors were on the staff during the year of 1961-62. Nine instructors were on the staff whis past term. It is hoped that at least two and per-

haps three more instructors can be added to the staff for for the 1964-65 term—all of whom will have bonifide college degrees. AABC

It was my privilege to attend the Accrediting Association of Bible Colleges during their 1963 session. I was able to learn many things of value in the establishment and work of the Bible College. Dr. Mostert, Executive Secretary of the Accrediting Association, visited CBI in November, 1963. He was very helpful in offering suggestions and the cooperation of the Association to assist us in every possible way to achieve accreditation status from that organization. We will seek accreditation from the Association as a Junior College level institution before seeking a higher accreditation status.

I have worked closely with Mr. Frank Leavett, Bureau of Readjustment Education, State Board of Education, Sacramento, during the past year. As a result of our cooperative efforts, California Bible Institute has been approved under Section 29007 (f) of the State Education Code to grant the Three Year Bible College Diploma. This represents a specific mile-stone in the program of our school. Someone has said, "this achievement is not important but those of us who are familiar with the State Education Code know that this is an achievement to "shout" about. All persons with whom we have had contact in the offices of the State Board of Education, Sacramento, have been most helpful in every way. We will be working with the State Board of Education, Sacramento, as the school progresses. This will be particularly true in the area of Liberal Arts.

Right here is a good place for me to answer a question that has been asked: "Is California Bible Institute Accredited by the State of California?" The answer is no! The State of California does not accredit Bible Colleges! By what agency could they do so? We need to distinguish the difference in "approved" and "Accredited". State Colleges may approve of the program of a Bible College and may accept the work of the Bible College; but this does not mean that they are accredited by the state! Accreditation, in the absolute sense, means a certain amount of control of the accredited institution. I am afraid that the people of our State Association would not be appreciative of some of this control. Approval simply means that a course or courses has been taught in the Bible College on such a level as to be acceptable by State controlled institutions of higher learning. The latter is that 15

in which we are interested. At least one state school has accepted work from California Bible Institute—this is a fact known by me—I prepared the transcript! You will find upon close examination that fundamental Bible Colleges are accredited by and independent accrediting agency and never by the state; but the work earned from them may be accepted in state schools.

As a rule, it takes approximately ten years, sometimes less, sometimes longer, for a new school to become fully accredited by an independent accrediting agency. This does not mean, however, that other schools (even accredited ones) will not accept the work of the young school. 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CONSTITUTIONAL BY - LAWS CALIFORNIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist Denomination, being regularly baptized upon the profession of our faith in Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as an association of churches, and to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination with us, do therefore, ordain these constitutional by-laws for our better denominational government.

ARTICLE I — Name

The name of this organization shall be the California State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II — Purpese

The purpose of this organization shall be to coordinate efforts and policy for the primary cause of the evangelization and unify the efforts of its constituency in denominational of the State of California and to aid in spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ unto the "uttermost parts of the earth".

ARTICLE III — Delegation

Delegates to this Association shall consist of two (2) types of delegates. One shall be those defined as standing representing the affiliated Associations and defined as the delegates and the other shall be those elected delegates elected delegates.

1. Standing Delegates: Standing delegates shall be all of the ordained members of any Association being a constituent part of this Association, and in good standing with the Association of which they are members, their wives, all officers and members of standing boards of this Association and the unmarried widows of deceased ordained members.

2. Elected Delegates: Elected delegates shall be those delegates duly appointed or elected by the affiliated Association which they represent.

The delegation composing this body as described above

shall in all cases be members in good standing in the affiliated Association from which they come.

Representation in this Association shall be by affiliated Associations. Each affiliated Association shall be entitled to one (1) delegate per each fifty (50) members. Each affiliated Association shall represent by a letter giving all of the statistical information called for by this Association and listing all delegates representing them by name. This Association shall have no power to fill vacancies in the delegation of any affiliated Association. Accompanying the letter of information shall be the representation fees as set by this Association. These letters and fees shall be received by a vote of the standing delegation and when received, the elected delegates shall then become voting delegates.

3. Standing delegates shall lose their status and not be recognized as voting delegates if they have moved from the territorial bounds of this Association. No ordoined or their wife shall be recognized as voting members upon moving from the territorial bounds of this Association, or are not recognized as members in good standiing in their local Association. No Ordained or their wife shall be recognized as voting members upon moving into the territorial bounds of this Association, unless they have obtained a recommendation from the Association from which they come, and that Association be a member of the State or National Association.

ARTICLE IV — Meetings

This Association shall hold it's meetings annually. The date and place shall be decided upon at the previous meeting of this Association or shall be provided by this Association. In the event of an emergency, and no other provisions having been made by this Association, the General Board of this Association of this Association.

Association shall set the date and place of the annual setting.

- ARTICLE V --- Officers and Boards
 - The officers of this Association shall be:
 - 1. Moderator
 - 2. An Assistant Moderator
 - 3. A Clerk-Treasurer
 - 4. An Assistant Clerk-Treasurer
 - 5. An Executive Secretary

Each of these except the Executive Secretary, in accordance with the following defined proceedures, shall be elected at the closing session of this Association.

Committees, as necessary, shall be appointed or elected as this Association hall provide, and shall hold office until their work is completed or their successors are appointed. Each Board, committee and officer meeting shall keep accurate minutes of their meetings and shall make these minutes available for reading at the request of the Association.

The standing Boards of this Association shall be:

1. A Mission Board

2. A Board of Christian Education

3. A Sunday School Board

4. A Book Store Board of Trustees

There shall be a General Board elected annually as may be elected by this Association hereafter, shall be governed by the following stipulations:

Each Board shall be composed of members serving terms, the number of members and length of term to be designated by this Association, so arranged that members shall be elected in staggered terms as defined in the selection of these by-laws entitled "Description of Duties." Vacancies occuring on any Board shall come by reason of:

1. Resignation. Any member of any Board shall be allowed to resign at their pleasure except in cases where resignation would be to avoid discipline or an accounting of the stewardship of their office.

2. Death. Any member of any Board passing from the stage of mortal life shall create a vacancy on the Board of which he is a member.

3. Dismissal. Any member of any Board may be dismissed by this Association for any unchristian conduct, for conduct detrimental to the general welfare of this Association. Any member who is declared out of fellowship or against whom charges of heresy or non-christian conduct are being pressed be suspended from active service on the Board of which he is a member, until the consummation of the charges made in in the affiliated Association of which he is a member, will the affiliated Association by which he is disciplined. If found guilty of charges as described above, he shall be dismissed from this Board and his position shall be declared vacant. 4. Removal from the territorial bounds. Any member of of this Association or whose membership is in a church outside the territorial bounds of this Association shall be considered

automatically dismissed from membership on the Board which he serves.

5. Failure to serve. Any member of any Board who shall fail to serve in the capacity alloted them shall upon approval by this Association, dismissed from the Board on which he serves.

No member of this Association shall be allowed to serve on more than one standing Board or Committee at one time, nor shall any member serve as an officer and on any Board or standing Committee.

Description of Duties

A. The Moderator. The moderator shall be chosen by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing of the session of this Association, to serve a term of one year.

The duties of the Moderator are:

1. He shall be the presiding officer at all business sessions of this Association and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees and auxiliaries of this Association.

- 2. He shall maintain order in all business sessions and allow full and free debate on all issues but recognize no one or allow debate by any debate by any demonstrating an unchristian spirit.
- 2. He shall serve as chairman of the General Board and Executive Committee.

B. The Assistant Moderator. The Assistant Moderator shall be chosen by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing of the session of the Association to serve a term of one (1) year. The duties of the Assistant Moderator are: 1. He shall assist the Moderator in all business sessions of Association.

2. In the absence of the Moderator, the Assistant Moderator shall become the Moderator and and be governed by the duties alloted the Ref 172 Moderator. S Ref 193 hat file of the

3. He shall serve as parlimentarian at all sessions of this Association. 37:

C. The Clerk. The Clerk shall be elected by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing of the session of this Association, to serve a term of one year.

 The clerk of this Association shall keep a true and accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, and write them in a book set apart for that purpose; keep an accurate record of all officers and committees. The Clerk shall keep all papers and documents of this Association unless otherwise ordered and shall conduct all correspondence for the Association.
 The Clerk shall serve as Clerk of the General Board and the Executive Committee.

D. The Assistant Clerk. The Assistant Clerk shall be elected by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing of the session of the Association to serve one year.

The duties of the Assistant Clerk are:

1. The Assistant Clerk of this Association shall assist the Clerk in recording the minutes of the proceedings of the Association and shall make themselves available to assist in any of the labors of the Clerk. In absence of the Clerk, the Assistant Clerk shall become the Clerk and the duties of the Clerk shall then he applied to them.

E. The Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be elected by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing of the session of the Association to serve one year.

The duties of the Treasurer are:

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It shall be the duty of the Treasurer of this Association to receive and receipt for all money turned to him from whatever source contributions may be made to the Association, deposit the same in a bank or banks, as shall be designated by the Association. All bills and accounts owed by this Association shall be paid by check drawn against the Association 38 account and signed by the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give a report of all funds received and expended, and the report shall be accompanied by an accurate balance sheet of approved standards of accounting.

F. The Executive Secretary. The Executive Secretary shall be elected after his report is given, to serve a term of two (2) years. Be it understood that upon acceptance of this position, the Executive Secretary shall serve a minimum of six months, the sole exception being for reasons of health. In the event of his resignation, he shall give a minimum of sixty days notice. In the event of his dismissal he shall be given a sixty day notice. In the event of resignation or disciplinary action, it shall become the duties of the General Board and the Book Store Board of Trustees to meet jointly to effect the dismissal and/or replace the Executive Secretary.

The Executive Secretary shall be responsible for the general promotion of all branches and department of this Association. It shall be his duties to promote the general welfare of the Association with regular reports of the work of the Association made to the general membership of this body. It shall be his duty to work closely with the Moderator in coordinating denominational efforts and making known by publication these efforts and their successes.

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The Executive Secretary shall serve as treasurer of the cooperative plan of support and shall disperse the receipts as directed by this Association. He shall make every effort to enlist all churches within the general framework of this Association to support the cooperative plan of support with a tithe, and shall promote each department or agency of the Association where designated offerings are needed or sought. All designated offerings received shall be forwarded to the agency to which they are directed. He shall serve as manager of the Bible Book and Church Supply Stores until such time as this Association shall otherwise provide. From this vantage point, he shall promote sales of church supplies and shall endeavor to supply the full needs of the churches. He shall serve as managing editor of "The Voice".

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He shall make periodic visits to each affiliated association, and there inform them of the progress of the overall work of this Association. Even though 99 ! e in in some other agencies may have executive secretaries, it shall be his duty to promote these agencies in the and coordinated denominational effort. G. The General Board. The personnel of the General Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk,

. and Executive Secretary of this Association and the chairmen of all standing boards. There shall also be elected by this body one (1) member from each affiliated Association, as recommeded by the affiliated Association annually.

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The General Board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for this Association from one regular session to another. It shall be the duty of this board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of this Association. This Board shall stand liable to this body for discipline or dismissal for actions contrary to the general policy and intent of this Association and these Articles and by-laws. No decision shall be rendered by this Board that will effect the Association that can normally be detained and decided by this bory in session.

An Executive Committee consisting of seven (7) members shall be selected from the General Board. This committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, Executive Secretary and the four (4) members representing the affiliated Associations. And

This Committee shall hear all disputes or questions of discipline doctrine or practice that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing this association; or any appeal that may be made by any Association, church or individual person which is a component part of this body. Said appeal shall have been made in writing and properly signed by the constitutent body or bodies or person making such appeal from the lower to the higher body. This committee shall be limited to making recommendations to these effected parties and if not accepted by all concerned, shall refer the signed allegations to the General Board and if mediation proves unsuccessful shall in turn refer the signed allegations to this Association for final action.

H. The Mission Board. The Mission Board shall be composed of one member from each affiliated Association and one member at large to be elected by this body. Their term of office shall be staggered from one to five years so arranged that one member shall be elected territorial bounds of the affiliated Association he each year. In the event a member moves from the territorial bounds of the affiliated Association he represents, his membership shall terminate and the remaining members shall elect his successor from the effected Association until this body meets in session and fills the vacancy.

The duties of the Mission Board shall be to labor to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to endeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this Association with whatever moral and financial assistance as may be theirs. Also, in cases of small churches failing to fuction, every assistance possible hall be rendered to to maintain the effective witness of that church. The promotion of missionary endeavors from a local, state and national level of both home and foreign nature shall be obligation of this Board. This Board shall assist in maintaining proyer and financial support to the entire missionary program of the denomination. This Board shall orient itself and elect it's own officers.

This Board, being an agency of this Association, shall be empowered to have it's own constitution and bylaws, which shall not be repugnant to this constitution or the general policy of this Association.

The Treasurer of this Board shall receive and receipt for all money coming to it from all sources. It shall be deposited in a bank, or banks, and all debts and accounts of this Board shall be paid by check drawn against this treasury and signed by the treasurer.

Accurate minutes shall be kept of all meetings of this Board, and shall be available for reading at the request of the Association. A complete report of all activities of this Board shall be made in writing to this Association while in session, with an accurate balance sheet shall accompany these reports and shall be signed by the officers of this Board.

1. The Board of Christian Education. The Board of Christian Education shall be composed of two (2) members from each affiliated Association and one (1) member at large to be elected by this body. Their term of office arranged that one member shall be elected each year. shall be staggered from one (1) to nine (9) years so In the event a member moves from the territorial bounds of the affiliated Association he represents, his his membership shall terminate and the remaining members shall select his successor from the effected Association until this body meets in session and fills the vacancy.

The Board of Christian Education shall establish and promote a high standard of christian education within the framework of this Association. In the consumation of its duties, this Board shall promote a high level academic institution wherein fundamental, ortho-The highest academic standard possible shall be attained availing themselves to higher education. The highest dox, evangelical training may be obtained by those maintained. The 'doctrines of Free Will Baptists as defined in the "Treatise of Faith and Practice of Original Free Will Baptists" published by the National Association of Free Will Baptists shall be the guiding theological position of the institution. This Board shall orient itself and elect its own officers. It shall meet

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upon the call of its chairman at any time. This Board being an agency of this Association, shall be empowered to have its own constitution and by-laws which shall not be repugnant to this constitutional by-laws and the general policy of this Association.

The treasurer of this Board shall receive and receipt for all money coming from any source, and shall deposit it in a bank, or banks, where all accounts and debts of this Board shall be paid by check, drawn against the Board's account and signed by the treasurer.

An accurate record shall be kept of all meetings of this Board, and shall be available for reading at the request of this Association. A complete report of the activities of this Board shall be made in writing to the annual session of this Association with an accurate account of all receipts and dispursements made. An accurate balance sheet shall accompany the reports and shall be signed by the Board.

This Board shall seek to work harmoniously with other denominational academic institutions.

J. The Sunday School Board. The Sunday School Board shall be composed of one member from each affiliated association and one member at large to be elected by this body. Their term of office shall be staggered from one to five years so arranged that one member shall be elected each year. In the event a member moves from the territorial bounds of the affiliated Association he represents, his membership shall terminate and the remaining membrs shall select his successor from the effected association until this bory meets in session

fills the vacancy.

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The Sunday School Board shall endeavor to establish and maintain a high standard Sunday School in each church within the structure of this Association. In accomplishing this, this Board shall offer incentive material for teacher training, attendance - building and general assistance to all Sunday Schools of this Association.

This Board shall devise and offer such materials as are acceptable to this Assocciation to the Schools. a high level, departmentalized Sunday School with This board shall be so equiped as to be able to establish attendance-building material and Bible study at every opportunity, and devise and execute such measures as are deemed appropriate and in harmony with the general policy and practice of this Association.

K. The Book Store Board of Trustees. The Book Store Board of Trusteess shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliaated Association and one (1) member at large to be elected by this bory. Their term of office shall be staggered from one (1) to five (5) years so arranged that one member shall be elected each year. In the event a member moves from the territorial bounds of the affiliated Association he represents, his membership shall terminate and the remaining members shall select his successor from the effected Association until this body meets in session and fills the vacancy.

The Board of Trustees of the Bible Book and Church Supply Stores shall be responsible for the general oversight of the operations of the stores. This Board shall establish operating proceedures that will govern the the merchandising policies of the stores. A complete accounting of the operations of the stores shall be made at each annual session of this Association accounting for all purchases, sales, operating expenses and activities in writing. Included iin this report shall be an account of all the activities of this Board and a balance sheet from a competent accountant.

All operating proceedures of the store shall be those accepted as normal retail proceedures, but not repugnant to the general policy of the Association and the tenents of these by-laws.

ARTICLE VI --- Church Government

Government of this Association shall be congregational in form and democratic in its practice. Congregational Church Government to be defined as: "The local church church is an independent body, as far as it relates to its own govenrnment, the transaction of its business, the choice of its officers and the disciplining of its members. The local church holds the deed to its own property and is responsible for its own financial obligations and there is no authority by any ecclesiastical power that can revert or change the

decision of the local church. When a majority of a congregation, in regular conference votes for or against, their decision cannot be reversed by any other authority". However, an appeal may be made by common consent by an aggrieved minority to the quarterly meeting for mediation. If, after this, the minority is still dissatisfied, the next appeal is to the district asociation. The next appeal is to the state association and if dissatisfied by the state association's decision or recommendations, their next and last appeal is the National Association of Free Will Baptists. None of these can change the decision of the church but may mediate or recommend.

If the Quarterly Meeting or other Associations are dissatisfied with the ruling of the majority of a local church, they may withdraw the hand of fellowship from the local church but it still leaves the local congregation in full charge of the church property and cannot interfere with its decisions any further.

ARTICLE VII — Discipline

This Association shall have the right and authority to discipline its members and shall be recognized as the final ecclesiastical tribunal within the State of California for Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE VIII — Amendments

These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds majority association, provided that all proposed amendments are vote of the delegates present and voting at any session of presented in writing to the Association one (1) day in advance of action upon the proposed amendments.



ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE CALIFORNIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, do hereby form a non-profit corporation under and pursuant to the provisions of Part I of Division 2 of Title I of the Corporations Code of the state of California;

AND DO HEREBY CERTIFY:

"CALIFORNIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAP-TIST".

SECOND: That the purpose of this organization shall be to coordinate and unify the efforts of its constituency in the evangelization of the State of California and to aid in denominational efforts and policy for the primary cause of spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ unto the "uttermost parts of the Earth".

1. That the purpose for which this corporation is formed does not contemplate the distribution of any gains, profits or dividends to the members thereof but shall be exclusively for religious, charitable, social and educational services as follows.

2. To further the cause of Jesus Christ in the State of

California and wherever the California State Association of Free Will Baptist shall direct the assistance of religious, charitable, social and educational work.

3. To establish, continue and maintain offices and or facilities within the bounds of the State of California, and in connection therewith, to purchase, acquire, hold, manage, encumber and convey such real and personal property as the purpose of the corporation may require.

4. To erect buildings and structures for the establishment of offices and/or facilities as may be required to maintain the purpose and general work of the corporation, storage of supplies, housing of servants of the corporation, and to do any and all such other things as are necessary and proper for carrying out aid purposes in accordance with laws of the State of California, and of the United States of America.

5. Too borrow money and to give and receive evidences of transactions with or without security; and to enter into, make, perform, and to carry out contracts of every kind and for any lawful purpose without limit as to amount, with any person, firm, association or corporation, municipality, county or State Government or other municipal or governmental subdivision, board, commission or agency of the Federal Government.

6. To excercise any and all powers contemplated by these articles, and to do such other acts, things and excercise such other powers as are in any manner connected therewith, or necessary, convenient, incidental or auxiliary thereto, or calculate directly or indirectly to do or accomplish any of such powers or purposes, or any or all of them to the same extent as a natural person might or could do, provided the same be not inconsistent with the other provisions of the Articles, or with the laws of the State of California.

7. Subject to the foregoing, this corporation shall have all of the powers, rights, and privileges now or hereafter conferred by the laws of the State of California upon corporations organized under and pursuant to the general nonprofit corporation laws; and the foregoing statement of purposes powers, and the purposes and powers stated in each clause shall be construed as the statement of both purpose and hereof shall, except where otherwise expressed, be in nowise limited or restricted by reference to or construction with the purposes and powers stated in any or all of the remaining clauses of these Articles.

THIRD: That the principal office for the transactions of the business of this corporation shall be located in the City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus, State of California at 910 "J" Street.

FOURTH: The names and address of the persons who are appointed to act in the capacity of directors until their successors shall be duly appointed or elected by this corporation, and who may be given such titles as may be deemed appropriate, but who shall be subject to all laws of the State of California relating to directors and such as may be

provided from time to time in the Constitutional By-Laws of this corporation, are as follows:

FIFTH: The qualifications, classifications, and the property, voting and other rights and privileges of the members of the corporations shall be such as may be provided from time to time in the Constitutional By-Laws of this corporation, which said By-Laws shall be duly adopted and may be amended by a vote of not less than a two-thirds (2/3)majority of the members of this corporation present and voting.

SIXTH: No individual member of this corporation shall in any event be liable for any debts, liabilities or obligations, whatsoever, of this corporation.

SEVENTH: In the event of the dissolution of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the corporation, the remaining assets shall be distributed to religious, charitable, social and educational institutions as defined by Article 501-C of the Internal Revenue Code as determined by the remaining members of this corporation.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solomn covenant. We promise by His Grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scripture, secret prayer, family devotion, and social worship, and self denial, faith, and good works and Savior, Jesus Christ." We will not foresake the assembling endeavor to "grow" in grace and the knowledge of our Lord of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work. We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of Peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church, and the Gospel. We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christians' obligations and enterprises supreme, counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly prayinng and toiling that the Kingdom of

God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday School, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of Peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by inspiration of God and an infallible rule of faith and practice.

2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scripture as Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

3. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature, truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified and is our ever present Savior and Lord.

4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit, all the attrijutes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Santifier of men.

5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.

6. Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His Posterity, therefore, inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection affected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

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8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance of sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved commital of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord, with purpose to love and obey him in all things. In the excercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy spirit, freed from the domination of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.

10. Freedom of Will. The human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live or resist them and perish.

11. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promis of eternal salvation.

12. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; Feet washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.

13. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:33) and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of lay by Him In store as God hath prospered him" (1 Cor. 16:2).

14. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities and for personal communion with God.

16. Resurrection, Judgement, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They will have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked shall " go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

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
