GENERAL BOARD REPORT

The General Board in session this 23rd day of June, 1965, wish to report to this Association that the following items have been presented and heard by the General Board and are referred to this body in its deliberations:

- 1. The National Foreign Mission Board received the resolution adopted by this Association in its last annual meeting and inform us that missionary appointees will have access to itenerate funds if it becomes necessary as per our request.
- 2. The Articles of Incorporation of this Association have been amended as adopted by this body in it last annual meeting.
- 3. Received and referred to this body all reports of all departments of this Association with the following recommendations not contained in the specific reports:
 - A. "The Voice" be sent to every family in every church on a non-subscription basis with offerings to be received once each quarter in the local churches to underwrite the cost of printing and mailing.
 - B. The Executive Secretary be authorized to print a denominational calendar with all activities of all departments of all associations included.
 - C. The "Digest of Reports" be printed for each setting of this Association.
 - D. The Executive Committee be instructed to secure the services of an accounting firm for all departments of this Association and close the associational year March 31.
 - E. The Constitution and By-Laws of the State Layman's Committee be adopted as presented.
 - F. The Executive Committee be instructed to present a uniform polity concerning the dismissal of ordained members to other denominations.
 - G. The Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws of each subsidiary body of this Association be presented to this Association for their approval.
 - H. The By-Laws of each subsidiary board be printed in the minutes.

BY-LAWS CALIFORNIA BIBLE INSTITUTE

- I. This Institution shall be governed by the Board of Trustees under the California Association of Free Will Baptists with said Board being elected at the annual meeting of said Association in accord with the Constitution and By-Laws.
- II. The officers of this Institution shall consist of President, Dean, and Registrar-Secretary. These are to be elected annually by this Board subject to the approval of the State Association.
- III. Each Faculty member shall be recommended to the Board of Trustees in writing for final approval (signature of all officers required.)

- IV. All monies collected by this institution shall be recorded and reported annually to the Board of Trustees subject to the approval of the State Association.
 - V. Salaries shall be set by the Board of Trustees subject to the approval of the State Association.
- VI. All disciplinary action of the student body shall be in the hands of the dean, president and faculty, subject to the approval of the State Association.
- VII. The By-Laws may be amended or added to by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Board of Trustees.

REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

- 1. Be it resolved that the program of the State Association and address of host church be printed in "The Voice" and mailed to every family at least two weeks prior to the Association.
- 2. Be it resolved that a standing vote of thanks be given the host church for their hospitality during this Association.

REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE

- 1. We recommend that \$30.00 be paid to the Moderator, \$15.00 to the Assistant Moderator, \$45.00 to the Clerk and \$25.00 to the Assistant Clerk.
- 2. We recommend that \$45.00 be sent to the National Association for Registration fee.
- 3. We recommend that each Association send 256 per. capita to the 1966 session of the State Association.
- 4. We recommend that 4100.00 be given to Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville, Tennessee and \$100.00 to California Bible Institute.
- 5. We recommend that \$100.00 be given to State Layman's Congress to be applied to cost of a sign for National Headquarters Building.
- 6. We recommend that \$100.00 honorarium be given Mrs. Reba Kirk for auditing the books.
- 7. We recommend that the cooperative plan be allocated as follows:

National Association	30%
State Mission Board	11%
Christian Education Board	25%
Promotional Department	32%
Sunday School Board	2%

8. That we pay one-half of Rev. Lawless' expenses to the Nat-ional Association.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE

We, the temperence committee, recommend the following:

- 1. That all Free Will Baptist ministers abstain from the use of tobacco in any form.
- 2. That every Christian be conscious of their appearance which may seem evil, as well as the appearance of evil.
- 3. That we use Romans 12:2 as a basis of Christian conduct.

REPORT OF OBITUARY COMMITTEE

We, the Obituary Committee, report that the Lord has called a total of 33 from our midst: Golden Gate 9; Center 10; Southern 10; West Coast 4.

We, the Committee, request a moment of silence and prayer in memory of those that have joined our Lord.

REPORT OF STATE AUDUTING COMMITTEE

We have audited the books of: Bible Book and Church Supply, Promotional Department, State Sunday school Board, State Board of Education and California Bible Institute, General Treasurer, *State Mission Board and find them in order.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTION AND BY -LAWS of the CALIFORNIA STATE LAYMAN'S CONGRESS

ARTICLE I. NAME

This organization shall be known as the California State Layman's Congress of the Association of the Free Will Baptists.
ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

The purpose of the California State Layman's Congress shall be: to promote the objectives of the congress by enlisting, utilizing and developing leadership abilities among the laymen of our denomination; to acquaint our laymen with, and urge their participation in, our denominational affairs and activities; to provide an efficient and effective corp of assistance to our pastors; and to unify the organizational structure of the various units of laymen work, known as the "Master's Men" throughout the churches of our state.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The officers of the organization shall be a president, a vice-president, a membership chairman, an activities chairman, a chorister, and a recording secretary. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP

The Membership of the congress shall be composed of the officers of said organization together with three laymen from each of the associations of the state. Additional congressmen are to be added when an association reaches 30 churches at the rate of one congressman per 10 churches.

ARTICLE V. MEETINGS

The congress shall meet semi-annually or may meet more frequently if deemed advisable, at a place and time designated by the Executive Committee. The committee may plan and conduct a state Layman's Conference annually at a time and place designated by the congress and a state Layman's breakfast during the annual meeting of the State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE VI. AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be ex-officio member of all standing committees and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2. The vice-president shall act as president in the presidents absence or by request. He shall serve as chairman of the program committee with the president and the executive secretary. He shall be responsible for ideas and promotion to stimulate good programs for state, district, and local chapters.

Section 3. The recording secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the congress and the executive committee.

Section 4. The membership chairman shall suggest and plan promotional ideas to stimutate attendance at Layman's meetings, state and district-wide as well as the local chapter. He shall also be responsible for organizing local, district and state-wide conventions.

Section 5. The activities chairman shall be responsible for suggesting and promoting various social and religious activities for the local, district and state-wide work. He shall present one state project each year, which shall be approved by the executive committee. He will also promote Layman's Day and Lay-

man's Revivals in the local churches throughout the state.

Section 6. The chorister shall be responsible for planning and projecting ideas and suggestions to our local chapters, for more effective musical programs. He shall work with and encourage state and district choristers in planning programs in cooperation with the program chiarman.

ARTICLE II. ELECTIONS

The general officers shall be elected by the State Association of Free Will Baptists annually. The president shall be recommended as National Congressman from this state.

Laymen from each affiliated association shall be elected to serve as congressmen for a two year term and shall be elected annually as this body shall provide from time to time.

ARTICLE III. AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting.

- 1. We recommend each District send 20¢ per capita member and \$5.00 per capita Auxiliary for convention expenses.
- 2. We recommend \$50.00 be given the host church.
- 3. We recommend \$30.00 be paid the State Association for printing of the Auxiliary minutes in the State Minutes.
- 4. We recommend that each state officer be reimbursed the amount for telephone calls, postage, stencils, etc. for the State Convention and 4¢ per mile allowance for attending the Executive Committee meetings.
- 5. We recommend that the state project for 1965-66 be: \$2,500.00 for an automobile for the Don Robirds, Brazil; and \$2,500.00 for an educational building for Jerome, Idaho. This quota can be reached by giving \$12.50 per capita.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

- 1. Be it resolved that the host church be given a standing vote of thanks for their hospitality and good lunch.
- 2. Be it resolved that a state program be sent to each local Auxiliary in advance to stimulate interest in attendance.
- 3. Be it resolved that we have a returned missionary on our state Convention program if possible; if our own are not available, attempt to get one from another evangelical group.
- 4. Be it resolved that the State Woman's Auxiliary Convention set up a student loan fund for C. B. I. with rules and regulations similiar to those of W.N.A.C. Also that the State Executive Committee have power to approve applications.

CONSTITUTIONAL BY-LAWS CALIFORNIA STATE ASSOCIATION of FREE WILL BAPTIST

From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon the profession of our faith in Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as an association of churches, and to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination with us, do therefore, ordain these constitutional by-laws for our better denominational government.

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the California State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this organization shall be to coordinate efforts and policy for the primary cause of the evangelization and unifying the efforts of its constituency in denominational work in the State of California and to aid in spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ unto the "uttermost parts of the earth".

ARTICLE III - DELEGATION

Delegates to this Association shall consist of two (2) types of delegates. One shall be those defined as elected delegates representing the affiliated Associations and the other shall be defined as standing delegates.

- 1. Standing Delegates: Standing delegates shall be all of the ordained members of any Association being a constituent part of this Association, and in good standing with the Association of which they are members, their wives, all officers and members of standing boards of this Association and the unmarried widows of deceased ordained members.
- 2. Elected Delegates: Elected delegates shall be those delegates duly appointed or elected by the affiliated Association they represent.

The delegation composing this body as described above shall in all cases be members in good standing in the affiliated Association from which they come.

Representation in this Association shall be by affiliated Associations. Each affiliated Association shall be entitled to one (1) delegate per each fifty (50) members. Each affiliated Association shall represent by a letter giving all of the statistical information called for by this Association and listing all delegates representing them by name. This Association shall have no power to fill vacancies in the delegation of any affiliated Association. Accompanying these letters of information shall be the representation.

tation fees as set by this Association. These letters and fees shall be received by a vote of the standing delegation and when received the elected delegates shall then become voting delegates.

3. Standing delegates shall lose their status and not be recognized as voting delegates if they have moved from the territorial bounds of this Association. No ordained or their wife shall be recognized as voting members upon moving from the territorial bounds of this Association, or are not recognized as members in good standing in their local Association. No ordained or their wife shall be recognized as voting members upon moving into the territorial bounds of this Association, unless they have obtained a recommendation from the Association from which they come, and that Association be a member of the State or National Association.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

This Association shall hold its meetings annually. The date and place shall be decided upon at the previous meeting of this Association or shall be provided by this Association. In the event of an emergency, and no other provisions having been made by this Association, the General Board of the Association shall set the date and place of the annual setting.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS AND BOARDS

The officers of this Association shall be:

- 1. Moderator
- 2. Assistant Moderator
- 3. Clerk/Treasurer
- 4. Assistant Clerk/Treasurer
- 5. Executive Secretary

Each of these except the Executive Secretary, in accordance with the following defined proceedures, shall be elected at the closing session of this Association.

Committees, as necessary, shall be appointed or elected as this Association shall provide, and shall hold office until their work is completed or their successors are appointed. Each Board, committee and officer meeting shall keep accurate minutes of their meetings and shall make these minutes available for reading at the request of the Association.

The standing Boards of this Association shall be:

- 1. A Mission Board
- 2. A Board of Christian Education
- 3. A Sunday School Board
- 4. A Bookstore Board of Trustees

There shall be a General Board elected annually as may be elected by this Association hereafter, and it shall be governed by the following stipulations:

- A. It shall meet at the call of the chairman or a pre-set date.
- B. It shall have an annual meeting the day prior to the opening session of this Association.
- C. It shall serve in the capacity of the Association when the Association is not in session but shall answer to this Association for all actions.

Each Board shall be composed of members serving terms, the number and length of term to be designated by this Association, so arranged that members shall be elected in staggered terms as defined in the section of these by-laws entitled "Description of Duties". Vacancies occuring on any Board shall come by reason of:

- 1. Resignation. Any member of any Board shall be allowed to resign at their pleasure except in cases where resignation would be to avoid discipline or an accounting of the stewardship of their office.
- 2. Death. Any member of any Board passing from the stage of mortal life shall create a vacancy on the Board of which he is a member.
- 3. Dismissal. Any member of any Board may be dismissed by this Association for any un-Christian conduct, for conduct detrimental to the general welfare of this Association. Any member who is declared out of fellowship or against whom charges of heresy or non-Christian conduct are being pressed shall be suspended from active service on the Board of which he is a member, until the consummation of the charges made in the affiliated Association by which he is disciplined. If found guilty of charges as described above, he shall be dismissed from this Board and his position shall be declared vacant.
- 4. Removal from the territorial bounds. Any member of this Association ciation whose membership is in a church outside this Association or who moves to reside outside the territorial bounds of this Association shall be considered automatically dismissed from membership on the Board which he serves.
- 5. Failure to serve. Any member of any Board who shall fail to serve in the capacity alloted them shall upon approval by this Association, be dismissed from the Board on which he serves.

No member of this Association shall be allowed to serve on more than one standing Board or Committee at one time, nor shall any member serve as an officer and on any Board or standing Committee except the General Board.

DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES

- A. The Moderator. The moderator shall be chosen by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing session of this Association, to serve a term of one year.
 - 1. He shall be the presiding officer at all business sessions of this Association and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees and auxiliaries and boards of this body.
 - He shall maintain order in all business sessions and allow full and free debate on all issues but recognize no one or allow debate by any demonstrating an un-Christian spirit.
 - 3. He shall serve as chairman of the General Board and Executive Committee.
- B. The Assistant Moderator. The Assistant Moderator shall be chosen by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing session of this Association to serve a term of one year.

- 1. He shall assist the Moderator in all business sessions of this Association.
- In the absence of the Moderator, the Assistant Moderator shall become the Moderator and be governed by the duties alloted the Moderator.
- 3. The Assistant Moderator shall serve as parlimentarian at all sessions of this Association.
- C. The Clerk. The Clerk shall be elected by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing session of this Association, to serve a term of one year.
 - 1. The clerk of this Association shall keep a true and accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, and write them in a book set apart for that purpose; keep an accurate record of all officers and committees. The Clerk shall keep all papers and dicuments of this Association unless otherwise ordered and shall conduct all correspondence for the Association.
 - 2. The Clerk shall serve as Clerk of the General Board and the Executive Committee.
- D. The Assistant Clerk. The Assistant Clerk shall be elected by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing session of the Association to serve one year.
 - 1. The Assistant Clerk of this Association shall assist the Clerk in recording the minutes of the proceedings of the Association and shall make themselves available to assist in any of the labors of the Clerk. In the absence of the Clerk, the Assistant Clerk shall become the Clerk and the duties of the Clerk shall then be applied to them.
- E. The Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be elected by the majority vote of the delegates present and voting at the closing session of the Association to serve one year.
 - 1. The Treasurer of this Association shall receive and receipt for all money turned to him from whatever source contributions may be made to the Association, deposit the same in a bank or banks, as shall be designated by the Association. All bills and accounts owed by this Association shall be paid by check drawn against the Association account signed by the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give a report of all funds received and expended, and the report shall be accompanied by an accurate balance sheet of approved standards of accounting.
- F. The Executive Secretary. The Executive Secretary shall be elected after his report is given, to serve a term of two (2) years. Be it understood that upon acceptance of this position the Executive Secretary shall serve a minimum of six (6) months, the sole exception being for reasons of health. In the event of his resignation, he shall give a minimum of sixty days notice. In the event of resignation or disciplinary action, it shall become the duties of the General Board and the Book Store Board of Trustees to meet jointly to effect the

dismissal and/or replace the Executive Secretary.

The Executive Secretary shall be responsible for the general promotion of all branches and departments of this Association. It shall be his duties to promote the general welfare of the Association with regular reports of the work of the Association made to the general membership of this body. It shall be his duty to work closely with the Moderator is coordinating denominational efforts and making known by publication these efforts and their successes.

The Executive Secretary shall serve as treasurer of the cooperative plan of support and shall disperse the receipts as directed by the Association. He shall make every effort to enlist all churches within the general framework of this association to support the cooperative plan of support with a tithe, and shall promote each department or agency of the Association where designated offerings are needed or sought. All designated offerings received shall be forwarded to the agency to which they are directed.

He shall serve as manager of the Bible Book and Church Supply Stores until such time as this Association shall otherwise provide. From this vantage point, he shall promote sales of church supplies and shall endeavor to supply the full needs of the churches.

He shall serve as managing editor of "The Voice".

He shall make periodic visits to each affiliated Association, and there inform them of the progress of the overall work of this Association. Even though some other agencies may have executive secretaries, it shall be his duty to promote these agencies in the coordinated denominational effort.

G. The General Board. The personnel of the General Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk and Executive Secretary, of this Association and the chairmen of all standing boards. There shall also be elected by this body one (1) member from each affiliated Association annually.

The General Board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for this Association from one regular session to another. It shall be the duty of this board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of this Association. This Board shall stand liable to this body for discipline or dismissal for actions contrary to the general polity and intent of this Association and these Articles and By-Laws. No decision shall be rendered by this Board that will effect the Association that can normally be detained and decided by this body in session. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

In cases of disputes arising from, or within, an affiliated Association, this committee Shall serve as a mediatorial committee. This committee shall have no dictitorial powers whatever, but shall by mediation attempt to settle such disputes as may be referred to it. If a satisfactory settlement can not be executed by mediation, the matter shall be referred to this body in session. In mo case shall either the General Board

or the Executive Committee issue a verdict or edict that could or would supercede this Association in its decision.

This committee shall hear all disputes or questions of discipline, doctrine or practice that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing this Association; or any appeal that may be made by any Association, church or individual person which is a component part of this body. Said appeal shall have been made in writing and properly signed by the constituent body or bodies or person making such appeal from the lower to the higher body. This committee shall be limited to making recommendations to these effected parties and if not accepted by all concerned, shall refer the signed allegations to the General Board and if mediation proves unsuccessful shall in turn refer the signed allegations to this Association for final action.

H. The Mission Board. The Mission Board shall be composed of one member from each affiliated Association and one member at large to be elected by this body. Their term of office shall be staggered from one to five years so arranged that one member shall be elected each year. In the event a member moves from the territorial bounds of the affiliated Association he represents, his membership shall terminate and the remaining members shall elect his successor from the effected Association until this body meets in session and fills the vacancy.

The duties of the Mission Board shall be to labor to further the gospel of Jesus Christ into the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to endeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this Association with whatever moral and financial assistance as may theirs. Also, in cases of small churches in failure to function, every assistance possible shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church.

The promotion of missionary endeavors from a local, state an national level of both home and foreign nature shall be the obligation of this Board. This Board shall assist in maintaining prayer and financial support to the entire missionary program of the denomination.

This Board shall orient itself and elect it's own officers. This Board, being an agency of this Association, shall be empowered to have it's own constitution and by-laws, which shall not be repugnant to this constitution or the general polity of this Association.

The Treasurer of this Board shall receive and receipt for all money coming to it from all sources. It shall be deposited in a bank, or banks, and all debts and accounts of this Board shall be paid by check drawn against this treasury and signed by the treasurer.

Accurate minutes shall be kept of all meetings of this Board and shall be available for meading at the request of the Association. A complete report of all activities of this Board shall be made in writing to this Association while Innsession

an accurate balance sheet of approved standards of accounting of all funds received and disbursed shall accompany these reports and shall be signed by the officers of this Board.

I. The Board of Christian Education. The Board of Christian Education shall be composed of two (2) members from each affiliated Association and one (1) member at large to be elected by this body. Their terms of office shall be so arranged that one member shall be elected each year to serve a term of nine (9) years. In the event a member moves from the territorial bounds of the affiliated Association he represents, his membership shall terminate and the remaining members shall select his successor from the effected Association until this body meets in session and fills the vacancy.

The Board of Christian Education shall establish and promote a high standard of Christian education within the framework of this Association. In the consummation of its duties, this Board shall promote a high level academic institution wherein fundamental, orthodox, evangelical training may be obtained by those availing themselves to higher education. The highest academic standard possible shall be attained and maintained. The doctrines of Free Will Baptists as defined in the "Treatise of Faith and Practice of Original Free Will Baptists" published by the National Association of Free Will Baptists shall be the guiding theological position of the institution.

This Board shall orient itself and elect its own officers. It shall meet upon the call of its chairman at any time. This Board being an agency of this Association, shall be empowered to have its own constitution and by-laws which shall not be repugnant to this constitutional by-laws and the general polity of this Association.

The treasurer of this Board shall receive and receipt for all money coming from any source, and shall deposit it in a bank or banks where all accounts and debts of this Board shall be paid by check drawn against the Board's account and signed by the treasurer.

An accurate record shall be kept of all meetings of this Board, and shall be available for reading at the request of this Association. A complete report of the activities of this Board shall be made in writing to the annual session of this Association with an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements made. An accurate balance sheet of approved standards of accounting shall accompany the reports and shall be signed by the officers of this board.

This Board shall seek to work harmoniously with other denominational academic institutions.

J. The Sunday School Board. The Sunday School Board shall be composed of one member from each affiliated association and one member at large to be elected by this body. Their term of office shall be staggered from one to five years so arranged that one member shall be elected each year. In the event a

member moves from the territorial bounds of the affiliated Association he represents, his membership shall terminate and the remaining members shall select his successor from the effected Association until this body meets in session and fills the vacancy.

The Sunday School Board shall endeavor to establish and maintain a high standard Sunday School in each church within the structure of this Association. In accomplishing this, this board shall offer incentive material for teacher training, attendance building and general assistance to all Sunday schools of this Association.

This Board shall devise and offer such materials as are acceptable to this Association to the schools. This Board shall be so equipped so as to be able to establish a high level, departmentalized Sunday school with attendance building material and Bible study at every opportunity, and devise and execute such measures as are deemed appropriate and in harmony with the general polity and practice of this Association.

K. The Bookstore Board of Trustees. The Bookstore Borad of Trustees shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated Association and one (1) member at large to be elected by this body. Their term of office shall be staggered from one (1) to five (5) years so arranged that one member shall be elected each year. In the event a member moves from the territorial bounds of the affiliated Association he represents, his membership shall terminate and the remaining members shall select his successor from the effected Association until this body meets in session and fills the vacancy.

The Board of Trustees of the Bible Book and Church Supply Stores shall be responsible for the general oversight of the operations of the stores. This Board shall establish operating proceedures that will govern the merchandising policies of the stores. A complete accounting of the operations of the stores shall be made at each annual esssion of this Association accounting for all purchases, sales, operating expenses, and activities in writing. Included in this report shall be an account of all the activities of this Board and a balance sheet from a competent accountant.

All operating proceedures of the store shall be those accepted as normal retail proceedures, but not repugnant to the general polity of the Association and the tenets of these bylaws.

ARTICLE VI - CHURCH GOVERNMENT

The government of this Association shall be congregational in form and democratic in its practice. Congregational church government to be defined as: "The local church is an independent body, as far as it relates to its own government, the transaction of its business, the choice of its officers and the disciplining of its members. The local church holds the deed to its own property and is responsible for its own financial obligations and there is no arthority by any ecclesiastical power that can revert or change

the decision of the local church. When a majority of a congregation, in regular conference votes for or against, their decision cannot be reversed by any other authority". However, an appeal may be made by common consent by an aggreived minority to the Quarterly Meeting for mediation. If, after this, the minority is still dissatisfied, the next appeal is to the district association; the next appeal is to the state association and if dissatisfied by the state association's decision or recommendations, the next and last appeal is to the National Association of Free Will Baptists. None of these can change the decision of the church but may mediate or recommend.

If the Quarterly Meeting or other Associations are dissatisfied with the ruling of the majority of a local church, they may withdraw the hand of fellowship from the local church but it still leaves the local congregation in full charge of the church property and cannot interfere with its decisions any further.

ARTICLE VII - DISCIPLINE

This Association shall have the right and authority to discipline its members and shall be recognized as the final ecclesiastical tribunal within the State of California for Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the delegates present and voting at any session of this association provided that all proposed amendments are presented in writing to the Association one (1) day in advance of action upon the proposed amendments.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We promise by His Grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men".

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scripture, secret prayer family devotion, and social worship and thy self denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ." will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church of its poor, and all its benevolent work. We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church, and the Gospel. We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme, counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday school, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of Peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by inspiration of God and are an infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scripture as Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature, truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified and is our ever present Savior and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit, all the attributes of God. He is the reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of man.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercizes a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.
- 6. Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posteriety therefore, inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God, by His incarnation, life suffering, death, and resurrection affected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance of sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved commital of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the donimation of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence, by faith in Christ, men become elect.
- 10. Freedom of Will. The human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit of life or resist them and perish.

- 12. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.
- 13. <u>Tithing</u>. God commanded tithes and offerings in the 61d Testament; Jesus endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:33) and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one lay by him in store as God hath prospered him" (I Cor. 16:2)
- 14. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgement and Final Retribution. The Scriptum teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked shall "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."
