COMMITTEE REPORTS

Temperance Committee' Report

We your committee on temperance submit the following:

We believe that a majority of the crimes are caused by the sale and the use of intoxicating drinks, whether lawful or unlawfully sold. We believe it is detrimental to the cause of christianity, morality, and decency. It clouds the mind and corrupts the morals of both young and old, and whereas, the officials of our government are encouraging the sale and use.

Be it resolved that we the Free Will Baptist, go on record as opposing the sale and use of same, and that we do all in our power to prevent spread of this curse over the nation (Heb. 2:15) and whereas, the people of our nation are becoming careless and indecent in dress, we urge our women to dress as becometh godliness and urge the younger women to be sober, grave and temperate, and to discourage the wearing of scanty clothing and we urge our people to stay away from public swimming pools and nudist parties (1st Tim. 2:8-10) and that our ministers preach one or more subjects where they pastor during the year on temperance.

Be it resolved, that we place ourselves on record as a denomination that opposes anything that is detrimental to a growth in grace, and that we discourage the sale and use of cigarettes to our boys and girls. We urge our boys and men to dress decent as well as our girls and women.

(1940 RESOLUTION NO. 1. First Quarterly Meeting. Be it recoived that any person or persons, trying to obstruct the duty of this association shall not hold a seat in the Association until they make their acknowledgements and apologies for same.

Second Quarterly Meeting. No. 1. Be it resolved that Association require it's licensed preachers to preach at least ten sermons on church government before they are ordained.

Thirty-fifth Annual Session. No. 1. Be it recolved that the devotional committee preach no preacher more than one time in any one Association or Quarterly Meeting.

- No. 2. Be it resolved that each church of this Association make an annual report on all deaths in their church to the Annual Association in their Annual letter.
- No. 3 Be it resolved that each church of this Association send at least \$2.00 with their letter to be used by the Association for miscellaneous expenses.
- No. 4. Be it resolved that this Association furnish blanks to give to ministers to show their years work.
- (1925) No. 1. That each pastor preach as many as two doctrinal sermons during the year to his church.
- No. 2. That the churches of this Association, that do not pay the amount promised the pastor, if he fills his part of the agreement, shall not have another pastor until they pay for the deficit.
 - (1926) The same as 1925.
- (1936) No. 2. Be it resolved that each minister make a written report to the Annual Session of his years work.
 - No. 3. Be it resolved that each minister make a written reportETAOI
- No. 3. Be it resolved that only ordained ministers and deacons administer ordinances to the church.
- (1937) No. 2. Be it resolved that God's plan to be carried out concerning Tithing, Matt. 23:23.
- No. 3. Be it resolved that all ministers and deacons go before the examining board on qualifications before ordination.
- (1938) No. 2. Be it resolved that this Association meet Wednerday night before the second Sunday in August.

- No. 2. Resolved that no church sell or dispose of church property without first bringing it before the Association.
- (1939) No. 1. Resolved that this Association so order that all the churches in this association prohibit the use of tobacco in any form inside of the church building and that the pastor and deacons see that this ruling be enforced.
- 2. Resolved that this Association demand that all ministers, pastoring in the Canadian Association and belonging to some other Association abide by the Canadian Association laws during their pastorial care in it, and that they be forbidden to organize a church in the boundry lines of the Canadian Association and then take it to some other Association.

SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE REPORT

Be it resolved that we the Canadian Association use Free Will Baptist literature and elect all officers and teachers being Christian men and women as far as possible.

RESOLUTIONS

(1940-41) Resolution No. 1. First Quarterly Meeting. Be it resolved that Deacons that have backslid and charges have been preferred against him in his church, shall not become a deacon without coming up through the legal steps of the association.

Resolution No. 1., in second quarterly meeting: Be it resolved that each church in the association send letters to our quarterly meetings like the form in our minutes.

Resolution No. 1, Annual Session

Be it resolved that when an individual church calls the Executive board that they pay the expenses of the executive board.

A Presbytery For Ordaining Ministers And Deacons

- 1. Presbytery for ordaining an Elder shall consist of two ordained ministers and one ordained Deacon.
- 2. A Presbytery for ordaining a Deacon must be composed of two ordained Deacons and one ordained minister.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe the Scripture of the Old and New Testaments are the infallible word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice 2. Tim. 3:16, 17; 2 Peter 1:20-21.
- 2. That there is but one true and living God, and in the God Head or Divine Essence, Father, Son, Holy Ghost. Gen. 17:1; 1st John 5:7.
- 3. That we are fallen and deprayed creature; and cannot extricate ourselves from our fallen situation by any ability we possess by nature, Eph. 5:1, 19.

4. That Salvation, Regeneration, Santification, Justification and Redemption are by the Life, Death, Resurrection, Assention and Intercession of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Acts 4:12; Titus 3:5.

That he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.

Matt. 24:13.

That the joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the wicked

shall be eternal. Matt. 25:46.

That Baptism and the Lord's Supper and the washing of the saint's feet are the ordinance of Jesus Christ appointed in the church, and none but true believers are proper subjects, and the anly proper mode of Baptism

is immersion. Mark 1:4, 9, 10; Luke 23:30; John 13:14.

8. We believe in the Sanctity of the first of the week, or the Lord's day, and that it ought to be observed and spent in the public or private worship of God, and that on it we should abstain from our worldly concern,

except in case of necessity or mercy. Ex. 31:15; Deut. 5:12; Matthew 12:12. 9. We believe in the resurrection of the body, both of the just and of the unjust, but every one in his own order; those who have done evil to the resurrection of damnation, and that God has appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ, 1 Cor. 15:34; John

5:28, 29; Thes. 4:16.
10. That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another, and to study the happiness of the people of God in general, and to be singly

engaged to promote the honor of God. John 13:35; Gal. 6:10.

11. We believe that Jesus Christ by the grace of God tasted death for every man, yet none can partake of His divine benefit only by his repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, infants and idiots excepted. Acts 20:21; 1 Tim. 2-5-6; John 3:14-16; 1 Cor. 15-20, 22; Romans

12. We believe that Jesus Christ is the door into the church, that baptism is a duty in answer to a good conscience. John 10:7; 1 Peter 3:21.

We believe that the Lord's people are one in Him, and therefore should be one at his table. 1 Cor. 1:1, 11, 28; John 17:11.

CONSTITUTION

From long experience, we the members of the Church of God (denominated Free Will Baptist,) being regularly baptised upon a profession of our faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, and being convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a union among us, and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, do therefore ordain this

Constitution for our better Associational government.

Art. 1. MEMBERSHIP. This Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches or Q M. of our union, not exceeding three messengers from each church, and upon producing letters, they shall be entitled to seats. All ordained ministers and deacons of said unions shall be

regular members. when present, by virtue of their office.

Art 2. NAME The members thus chosen and assembled with the ministers and deacons, to be denominated the Canadian Association of Free Will Baptist, being composed of the several churches of our union, the Association having no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor having any ecclesiastical power over the churches, reserving the right of withdrawing

from any church becoming disorderly.

Art. 3. LETTERS. Letters from the different churches representing are to express their number in fellowship, including the names and addresses of ordained and licensed ministers, the number of members received upon profession of faith, by letter or recommendation, be restoration or denominational choice; the number dismissed by letter, excluded, and those having died since last Association. The churches in sending their letters, may send obituaries of any who have died during the year, that we may

keep up the memorial of our dead.

Art. 4. OFFICERS. The Association shall have a Moderator, a Clerk and a Treasurer, who shall be elected at each annual meeting by the suf-

frage of the members present.
Art. 5. NEW CHURCHES. Newly constituted churches may be admitted to the Association, which are to petition by letter and delegates, and if upon examination, they are found to be orthodox and orderly they may be received into the Association, the Moderator giving the right hand

of fellowship

Art. 6. QUESTIONS. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.

Art. 7. MOTIONS. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except it be withdrawn by the member

who made it.

Art. 8. MINUTES. The Association is to endeavor to furnish the churches with minutes of the Association in proportion to the number of members in each church, the distribution to be at the discretion of the As-

Art, 9. CLERK. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the Association in a book to be kept by the Associa-

tion for that purpose.

Art. 10. SIGNATURES. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if needed, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk, before the close of the Association.

Art. 11. AMMENDMENTS. Ammendments to this constitution may be made when necessary by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

Art. 12. ORDINANCES. The pastor of the church shall preach on the ordinances of the church once a year, and one discourse on the support

of the ministry

CHURCH FINANCES. Every church shall call their pastor, Art. 13. state what amount they can raise, and it shall be the duty of the deacons to solicit the amount of funds necessary for all expenses of the church; act as treasurer, keeping account of all business and report all transactions to the church conference and in case of more than one deacon in the church, the deacons shall select one of their number to act as treasurer, provided the church has no treasurer.

Art. 14. QUARTERLY MEETINGS. This Association shall hold three Quarterly Meetings each year, and the ministers and deacons shall hake a written report of their work, and it shall be the duty of each quarterly conference to look after the necessities of the widows and orphans, and the order of the ministry, and the quarterly conference shall make a

written report to the Association Annually.

Art. 15. TREASURY. Resolved, That each church have a treasurer, and come together and subscribe the amount they are willing to pay into the treasury during the year for the support of ministry. widows and orphans, and incidental expenses, and that amount be paid quarterly, and that funds shall not be paid out except by order of the church.

CHURCH COVENANT

Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conference, public worship, and the observance of the ordinance of the Gospel, not fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work. We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bond of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring and as far as we are able to promote the success of the church and the Gospel. We will every where hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sabbath schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls and the conversion of the world.
