#### RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Be it resolved, That only ordained ministers and deacons administer ordinance of the church.
- 2. Be it resolved, That we carry out God's plan on tithing.
- 3. Be it resolved, That all ministers and deacons go before the Examining Board for qualification before ordination.
- 4. Be it resolved, That this Association demand all ministers pastoring in Canadian Association, whil belonging to another Association, abide by all Canadian Association laws, during their pastoral care in it.
- 5. Be it resolved, That each church make a report of all deaths in their letter to the Annual Session.
- 6. Be it resolved, Any person or persons trying to obstruct the duty of his Association, shall not hold a seat in Association until they make their acknowledgment and apologies for same.
- 7. Be it resolved, That when an individual church calls the Executive Board, they pay the expense of the Board.
- 8. Be it resolved, That this Association elect ministers to preach only the first quarterly and annual.
- 9. Be it resolved, That this Association leave article one of the Constitution in this Association to read exactly as they are in the minutes with the exception of the clerk and assistant shall also be regular members.
- 10. Be it resolved, That we abolish Resolution No. 2 of 1951. Be it further resolved, That we elect all Boards for 1-2-3-4-5 years.
- 11. Be it resolved, That no one hold more than one office in this Association in any one year, except the Moderator and Assistant Moderator.
- 12. Be it resolved, That all Standing Boards addresses be printed in the minutes.
- 13. Be it resolved, That Resolution No. 2 of Second Quarterly of 1952 be abolished. Now be it resolved, That we have a skeleton letter also printed in our minutes of the quarterly meeting of each church to abide along with the one to the annual.
- 14. Be it resolved, That when the clerk reads a repost of the committee that they made the motion that the report be approved.
- 15. Be it resolved, That we abolish Resolution No. 1 of 1952. Now be it resolved, That the outgoing clerk keep the books and have the minutes printed then turn the books over to the new clerk at the First Quarterly meeting.
- 16. Be it resolved, That any question of misunderstanding or conflict with Association be presented to the Executive Board and studied before coming before the Association for action.
- 17. Be it resolved, That we replace members of the Examining Board that do not attend meetings, with ones that will put forth an effort to be in attendance.
- 18. Resolution committee recommends that the new moderator and assistant moderator take office at the First Quarterly meeting.
- 19. Be it resolved, That we all take more interest in our meeting on Friday night before business meeting on Saturday.
- 20. Be it resolved, That each church be more concerned about their delegates getting to meetings.
- 21. Be it resolved, That this Association send 10 percent of all funds to the Co-op Plan.
- 22. Be it resolved, That there be no more than one Executive Board members from any one church.

- 23. Be it resolved, That any chruch desiring to have the annual or one of the quarterly meetings do so by asking for it in their letter to the Annual Association.
- 24. Amend to a motion that assistant clerk move up to the clerk the following year.
- 25. Be it resolved, That the Canadian Association sponsor \$100.00 scholarship annually to Hillsdale Bible College to a person to be selected by the Executive Board.
- 26. Be it resolved, That any delegate seated by the Association shall be eligible to serve on any committee.
- 27. Be it resolved, That each church in the Canadian Association send twenty dollars to the Association prior to the annual meeting in August. The money will be sent to the State Association prior to October so the Canadian Association delegates may be seated the State Association. The Association will be responsible for the money of each member church.
- 28. Be it resolved, That we create a standing Sunday School Board. Those elected to this board will serve until our annual meeting, and then be treated as all our committees. Also that each committee be told what its function is.
- 29. Motion to investigate the churches that have not been in attendance, to admonish them in the Lord Jesus Christ to come and fellowship with us, and if they refuse, to break fellowship with these churches.
- 30. Motion that the Executive Board be made responsible to contact absentee churches to find out why they haven't been in attendance, Also, to offer any and all help that might be needed in these churches form the Association.
  31. Be it resolved, That the clerk write up the responsibilities of each committee.
- 32. Be it resolved, That each church send their Cooperative money to the Association clerk to be forwarded to the State Executive, so the Association can be credited with their giving.
- 33. Be it resolved, That the host church supply the noon meal for both the Annual and Quarterly Associations.
- 34. Be it resolved, That the Association be reaffirmed by confirmation letters from each member church designed to continue as a member. This resolution to be administered by a letter from the clerk of each present member church asking for continuance at each annual meeting hereafter.
- 35. Motion to ammend Resolution that the dues be \$20.00, also \$5.00 sent to the scholarship fund.
- 36. Be it resolved, That each church carry out the Resolutions we already have.
- 37. Motion made to send \$480.00 to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College through the Canadian Association, to be paid quarterly and each member church in Association be responsible for the money requested.
- 38. Be it resolved that resolution No's 21 and 35 of the 1975 minutes be abolished. Be it further resolved, That 10 percent of that taken in by each church be sent to cover Association dues.
- 39. Be it resolved, That resolution No. 28, be abolished, of the 1975 minutes.
  40. Motion made, second and carried to delete articles 12 and 13 of the 1975 minutes.

1. We believe the Scripture of the Old and New Testaments are the infallible Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practise II Tim. 3:16: II Peter 1:20-21.

2. That there is but one true and living God, and in the Godhead or

Divine Essence, Father, Son and Holy Ghost. -- Gen. 17:1; John 5:7.

3. That we are fallen and depraved creatures and cannot extricate ourselves from our fallen situation by any ability we possess by nature. --Eph. 5:1-19.

4. That Salvation, Regeneration, Sanctification, Justification and Redemption are by the Life, Death, Resurrection, Ascension and Intercession of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. --Acts 5:12; Titus 3:5.

5. That he shall endure to the end, the same shall be saved. -- Matt.

22:13; Rev. 2:10.

- 6. That the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal. --Matt. 25:46.
- 7. That Baptism and the Lord's Supper, and the washing of the Saints' feet are the ordinances of Jesus Christ appointed in the church and none but true believers are proper subjects, and the only proper mode of baptism is immersion. --Mark 1:4; Luke 23:30; John 13:14.

8. We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week, or the Lord's Day, and that it ought to be observed and spent in the public or private worship of God, and that on it, we should abstain from our worldly concerns except in cases of necessity and mercy. --Ex. 31:16; Matt. 12:12; Deut. 5:12.

9. We believe in the resurrection of the body, both of the just and unjust, but everyone in his own order, those who have done evil to the resurrection of the damnation, and that God has appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ. --I Cor. 15:28; I Thes. 4:16.

10. That it is our duty to be thender and affectionate to one another, and to study the happiness of people of God in general, and to singly engaged to

promote the honor of God. -- John 8.

11. We believe that Jesus Christ by the grace of God tasted death for every man; yet none can partake of His Divine benefit only by his repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Infants and Idiots excepted. --Acts 20:21; I Tim. 2:5-6; John 3:14, 16; 15:10-22; and Romans 5:15.

12. We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ is the door into the church; that Baptism is a duty in answer to a good conscience. --John 10:7; I Peter 3:21.

13. We believe that the Lord's people are one in Him and therefore should be one at His table. -- I Cor. 1:11, 27; John 17:11.

## CONSTITUTION

From long experience, we, the members of the Church of God (denomination Free Will Baptist), being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Lord Jesus Christ, and being convinced fo the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a union among us, and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better church government.

Article 1. MEMBERSHIP: This association shall be composed of members chosen by different churches of our union, not exceeding three messengers from each church and upon producing letters they shall be entitled to seats. All ordained ministers and deacons of said union shall be regular members when present, by virtue of their office.

Article 2. NAME: The members thus chosen and assembled with the ministers and deacons, to be denominated the Canadian Association of Free Will Baptist being composed of several churches of our union, the Association having no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor having any ecclesiastical power over the churches, reserving the right of withdrawing from any church becoming disorderly.

Article 3. LETTERS: Letters from the different churches representing are to express their number in fellowship, including the names and addresses of ordained and licensed ministers, the number of members received upon profession of faith, by letter or recommendation, by restoration or demoninational choice: the number dismissed by letter, excluded, and those having died since last association. Churches, in sending their letters, may send obituaries of any who died during the year, that we may keep up the memorial of our dead.

Article 4. OFFICERS: This Association has a Moderator, a Clerk and a Credential Committee of three ordained elected by the sufferage of the members of the Association at each annual association. The Credentials Committee shall be elected as follows: One for three years, one for two years, and one for one year. Then one each year following to succeed the outgoing members.

Article 5. NEW CHURCHES: Newly constituted churches may be admitted to the association, which are to petition by letter and delegates, and if upon examination, they are found to be orthodox and orderly they may be received into the association, the moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.

Article 6. QUESTIONS: No questions from any church shall come under consideration of the association unless it has been first considered in its own church.

Article 7. MOTIONS: Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the association, except it be withdrawn by the members who made it.

Article 8. MINUTES: The association is to endeavor to furnish the churches with minutes of the association in proportion to the amount paid by each church, the distribution to be at the discretion of the association.

Article 9. CLERK: It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the association in a book to be kept by the association for that purpose.

Article 10. SIGNATURES: The minutes of the association shall be read and corrected, if needed, and signed by the moderators and clerk before the close of the association.

Article 11. ORDINANCES: The pastor of the church shall preach on the ordinances of the church once a year, and one discourse on the support of the ministry.

Article 12. AMENDMENTS: Amendments of this Constritution may be made, when necessary, by two-thirds of the members present at any regular session.

## FREE WILL BAPTIST CONVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ, and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We promise by His love and grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid the appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements, and unholy conformity to the world; from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, to provide "all things honest in the sight of all men".

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the spirit" in the bonds of peace, to careful of one another's happiness and reputation, seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able to promote the success of the church and the gospel, we will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligation and enterprise supreme: counting our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family worship and social worship, by self dental, faith and good works, endeavor "to grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all of its benevolent work.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprise, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls, and the conversion of the world. Any may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
