#### Annual Meeting Prague F.W.B. Friday Night Service August 12, 1989

Service opened with Moderator in charge. Song service led by John Young with Connie Haas at the piano. Special singing by the Shady Nook Church, Harold Haas Family, and the Prague Church. There were five churches represented with fifty-one being present. Brother Junior Reid brought the message from Colossians 1:10 - "Walk Worthy Unto the Lord."

#### Saturday Morning Service August 13, 1989

Moderator Randall Miller called the meeting to order. Opened in prayer by Harold Haas. Singing led by John Young. The ordained were called to sign in. Letters were called for and read. Delegates were then seated. Motion to seat Sister Wells as Delegate from Hanna Church pending receipt of their letter carried. There were no letters of recommendation. There was a request from the Earlsboro Church to re-license Brother Kent Jalo. Motion to re-license carried. The Shady Nook Church made a request to re-license Brother Junior Reid. Motion to re-license carried. Brother Randall Miller, the Host Pastor, gave the welcome and a devotion from II Corinthians, 8:22.

Petitionary letters were called for ... there were none. Moderator asked Raymond Coats to come forward and act as substitute Assistant Moderator. Brother Coats read rules of order and then the following committees were chosen:

The pulpit committee chose Junior Reid to be speaker for the 11:00 o'clock worship service. Minutes were read and accepted. The financial report was read and accepted. Brother Miller gave a report on youth camp finances. He noted that the total cost for camp this year was \$6,410.81. He reported that this amount was \$700.00 more than the cost last year. He suggested that the youth camp board consider raising the cost to campers by \$5.00 for next year. No action was taken at this time.

There was a motion to dismiss for a short break until the 11:00 o'clock worship service. Carried.

#### Eleven O'Clock Service

Service was opened with "acting" Assistant Moderator, Raymond Coats in charge. Song service led by John Young. Special singing by Helen Pridemore, Sonny Ticer, Jodi Shaner, Harold Haas Family and Brother and Sister Young. Brother Junior Reid then brought the message from II Timothy 1:6-12, II Timothy 2:4 and Hebrews 2:11. We were then dismissed for the noon meal.

#### Afternoon Session

The service opened with Moderator in charge. Song service led by John Young and business was opened with prayer by Atha Brooks. Unfinished business was called for. Brother Sonny Ticer made a motion to send 10% of the balance of account to the Hugo Mission Project. Carried.

New business was then called for. Brother Miller then asked what we can do about the finances of Youth Camp. Brother Haas made a motion to give \$500.00 of our \$800.00 balance to the Youth Camp Fund, and to increase our Association giving each quarter by \$125.00 for a total of \$1,025.00 per quarter. Motion carried.

Reports from the committees were called for and were as follows: Finance Committee reported \$1,782.67 in tithes. Motion to accept report and dismiss committee. The Resolution Committee had no resolutions. Motion to dismiss committee and accept report.

The Obituary Committee reported that God in His infinite wisdom has called from our midst: J.C. Hanna and Mel Harris of Earlsboro; Clara Caton and Monte Boze from Shadynook; Bob English from Western Avenue; and Eve Pittman from Prague. Motion to accept report and dismiss committee. The miscellaneous business was called for. Treasurer gave report on C.D. and suggested we could put an additional \$750.00 into the account. Motion was made to have treasurer review the related accounts and place in the C.D. in what she finds is appropriate. Motion carried.

Meeting places for the upcoming year will be as follows: First Quarterly Meeting will be at Hanna, the Second Quarterly Meeting will be at Western Avenue, the Third Quarterly Meeting will be at Earlsboro and the Annual will be held at Minneha. Speaker for the Friday night service at the First Quarterly Meeting will be Brother Raymond Coats with Brother Randall Miller as alternate. Atha Brooks was chosen for the Friday night speaker at the Annual with Jimmy Ticer as alternate.

### **Business Done in Quarterly Meetings**

#### First Quarterly Meeting November 13, 1988

Brother Mike Fields discussed the work on the Hugo Project and encouraged the Association to help with finances, if possible. Motion was made to put \$50.00 per quarter in the Camp Land Fund. Motion carried. Motion to send \$1,000.00 gift to the Hugo Project and to give something each quarter for the period of one year. Carried. We had a moment of prayer for Brother Olen Woodruff's Mother, Lettie who went to be with the Lord, after faithfully serving Him for seventy-five years. The congregation sang "Happy Birthday" to Brother George Wells who has been a member of the Association for forty-eight years. We were dismissed after a standing vote of thanks to the Happa Church for the poon meal.

#### Second Quarterly Meeting - February 11, 1989

Motion was made to send \$200.00 to the Home Missions and have each church give a love offering to be combined with the Associational gift. Motion carried. Motion to send 10% of the account balance to the Hugo project. Carried. The Examining Board reported that they had met with John Eversole and found him sound in doctrine and character. Motion to accept Brother Eversole in full membership to the Canadian Association. Motion carried. A standing vote of thanks was given to the Western Avenue Church for hosting the meeting and for the good noon meal.

#### Third Quarterly Meeting - April 29, 1989

Shady Nook Church requested that David Thorpe go before the Examining Board and that Jimmy Ticer be re-licensed. Motion to re-license Brother Ticer carried. Brother Berton Perry gave a rundown on different missions projects and asked us to pray for all projects in the works. Motion to send 10% of account balance to Hugo Project carried. A standing vote of thanks was given to the Shady Nook Church for the good noon meal. Meeting dismissed in prayer by Brother Junior Reid.

# Constitution

#### CONSTITUTION

#### Preamble

From long experience, we, the members of the Church of God (denomination Free Will Baptist), being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, and being convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to prepetuate a union among us, and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our church government. We have adopted the Treaties of The Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptist as our rule of faith and practice.

#### Article I

Membership: This Association shall be composed of members chosen by different churches of our union, not exceeding three messengers from each church; and upon presenting Letters, they shall be entitled to seats. All Ordained Ministers and Deacons of said union shall be regular members when present, by virtue of their office. A Minister or Deacon listed on the Association Roll as Inactive shall have no standing vote. A Minister or Deacon will be placed on the Inactive list if he absent himself from his church or the Association for one year. A Minister or Deacon coming to this Association from another association shall bring with him a Letter of Recommendation from the association he is leaving, and go before the Examining and Credential Board. At the Annual Association Meeting, each member church must reaffirm its desire to continue as a member in the Letter to Association. The Clerk and Treasurer shall be regular members of the Association. Any member church not attending shall be contacted to encourage and admonish them in the Lord to come and fellowshipwith us; and if they refuse, the Association shall break fellowship with these churches. The Association shall send separate Letters of Recommendation for the Church and Ordained Ministers when leaving the Association.

All ministers and deacons on the inactive list must come before the examining and credential board before being received back into the association.

#### Article II

Name: The members thus chosen and assembled with the Ministers and Deacons, to be denominated the Canadian Association of Free Will Baptists, being composed of several churches of our union, the Association having no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor having any ecclesiastical power over the churches and reserving the right of withdrawing from any church becoming disorderly.

#### Article III

Letters: Letters from the different churches represented are to express their number in fellowship, including the names and addresses of Ordained and Licensed Ministers, the number of members received upon Profession of Faith by Letter or Recommendation or by restoration or denominational choice, the members dismissed by Letter, Ministers or Deacons dropped or inactive and those having died since the last Association meeting. Churches sending their Letters, may send obituaries of any who have died during the year so that we may keep up on the memorial of our dead. Any church desiring to have the Annual Meeting, or one of the Quarterly Meetings, should ask for such in the Annual Letter.

#### Article IV

Officers, Boards and Committees: The Association has a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk and Treasurer, an Executive Board, an Examining and Credential Board, a Youth Camp Board, and the following committees: Orthodox, Resolution, Finance and Pulpit, appointed at each Quarterly Meeting, with an Obituary Committee appointed only at the Annual Meeting. No one in the Association shall hold more than one office, except the Moderator, Assistant Moderator and the Youth Camp Board. Any Delegate seated by the Association shall be eligible to serve on any committee, except the Orthodox Committee.

#### Article V

New Churches: Newly constituted churches, which are to petition by Letter and Delegates, may be admitted to the Association; and if, upon examination, they are found to be orthodox and orderly, they may be received into the Association with the Moderator giving the Right Hand of Fellowship. Please see Article IV, Section H, Orthodox Committee, for the above-mentioned examination.

#### Article VI

Questions: No question from any church shall come under consideration of the Association, unless it has been first discussed in its local church.

#### Article VII

**Motions:** Every Motion made and seconded shall come under consideration of the Association, except if it be withdrawn by that member making it. *MOTION (Definition):* A proposal made only toward a single action.

#### Article VIII

Minutes: That the Association endeavors to furnish the churches, equally, with Minutes of the Local, State and National Associations. The Association Clerk shall send two copies of the Minutes to the Historical Commission.

#### Article IX

Ordinances: The Pastor of the church shall preach on the Ordinance of the Church once a year, and discourse on the support of the ministry. Only Ordained Ministers and Deacons shall administer the Ordinance of the Church.

#### Article X

Amendments: Amendments to this Constitutuion may be made, when necessary, by two-thirds of the members present at any regular session.

#### Article XI

Support: Be it resolved that we carry out God's plan on tithing. The Association is supported by a 10% tithe sent by each church from its quarterly tithes and offerings. The Association supports the cooperative plan with 10% of the tithes received into the Association.

#### Article XII

Discipline: Any person or persons trying to obstruct the duty of this Association shall not hold a seat in the Association until he or she makes acknowledgement and apologies for the same. Any question of misunderstanding or conflict with the Association will be presented to the Executive Board and studied before coming before the Association for action.

#### Article XIII

Qualification of Ministers and Deacons: By granted right from each member church, the Canadian Association will examine upon written request any man being considered by that member church as a Minister or Deacon. The Canadian Association has adopted the following qualifications:

- A. That women be not ordained in this Association, or pastor a church belonging to this Associaton (1 Cor. 14:34-35; 1 Tim. 2:11-15).
- B. That no man known as homesexual be considered in any way for a Minister or Deacon.
- C. That no may be ordained who does not have total abstinence from intoxicating drink or misuse of drugs.
- D. That we go on record against the use of tobacco in any form, and ask our Pastors and Deacons to set the example.

#### A. Moderator

The Moderator shall preside over the business and worship of the Associaton while in session. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it will cause discord or division. Questions of this nature shall be referred to the Executive Board by the Moderator. The Moderator shall have the right to appoint at any time someone to fill the vacancy of an office or a member of a board. The Moderator-Elect shall take office at the First Quarterly Meeting (elected annually).

#### B. Assistant Moderator

The Assistant Moderator shall act by the direction of the Moderator, and shall assume the moderation of the Association in the absence of the Moderator (elected annually).

#### C. Clerk

The Clerk shall have the responsibility of the Association Minutes. The Clerk shall read all letters received, keep a list of seated Delegates, requests made by each Church and Petitionary Letters. All committee reports shall be read by the Clerk. The Clerk shall move that the report be approved and the committee dismissed.

The clerk shall have the responsibility of making a list of the Active Ordained at Quarterly Meetings.

#### D. Treasurer

The Treasurer shall have responsibility for the Association monies and all financial related matters shall go through this office. The Treasurer shall set up a separate account for the Youth Camp funds.

#### E. Executive Board

The Executive Board shall be the delegated power of the Association while not in session, but shall make no final decision without the approval of the majority of the member churches. The Executive Board shall be elected on one-, two-, three-, four- and five-year rotation terms. There is to be no more than one Executive Board Member from any one church. The Executive Board shall be responsible for contacting absentee churches to find out why they have not been in attendance, to encourage or admonish, and offer any assistance or help that might be needed from the Association. When an individual church calls the Executive Board in matters of dispute, it pays the expense of the Board. The Executive Board will have the responsibility to accept and deal with any question taken from the floor by the Moderator. The Executive Board members shall be Standing Members, along with the Examining and Credential Board and Moderator as Chairman of the Orthodox Committee to examine all churches desiring to unite with the

Association. The Board shall also act as an organizing council for newly-organized churches. The Scholarship Fund to Hillsdale from the Association will be under the direction of this Board, with priority given to any student from this Association, and has the responsibility to direct it to the college as a Scholarship Fund for a needy student.

#### F. Examining and Credential Board

All Ministers and Deacons must go before the Board for qualification before ordination. The Association will not ordain a minister until a specific Christian work arises requiring ordination (usually as a pastor, evangelist or missionary). The Association has the granted right to replace a member or members of the Examining and Credential Board who do not attend meetings. The Examining and Credential Board shall use the Questionnaire listed in the Minutes, and also those qualifications listed in this Constitution, in the examining of a candidate. All Ministers and Deacons must answer the Questionaire in writing, and such must be open for review to any member of the Association with voting rights upon request. The Examining and Credential Board may meet for the given purpose of examining any candidate by a written request from the church, the candidate and the Board (when possible, the church sending the candidate would be an ideal setting). The Moderator shall set a time and day for the Examining and Credential Board to meet.

#### G. Youth Camp Board

The Association shall have a standing Youth Camp Board of five persons to be elected on rotation terms on one, two, three, four, and five years. The elected Director and Assistant Director shall be ex-officiate members. The Board is to have full responsibility for the Canadian Youth Camp, with consideration to:

- 1. Recommend a Camp Director, who is to choose his Assistant.
- 2. Plan for the camp site.
- 3. Select the time.
- 4. Determine cost for camp and other expenses.
- 5. Set curriculum, schedule, worship, classes, activities and rules.
- 6. Call the Evangelist.
- 7. Secure: teachers, sponsors, cooks, all other needed help.
- 8. Purchase all needed material for camp: food, literature, insurance, awards.
- 9. Plan housing for the Evangelist and cooks.
- 10. Promote the Youth Camp throughout the year.
  - A. The Director shall be responsible to the Board and Association for administering the camp in: worship, classes, needs, rules, and activities.
  - B. The Assistant Director shall have responsibility as assigned by the Director.

#### H. Orthodox Committee

The Orthodox Committee shall be composed of at least five of the following: the Executive Board, the Examining and Credential Board and the Moderator (who shall serve as Chairman). Any church desiring membership into the Canadian Association will be examined by this Orthodox Committee at a regular set service of the church desiring membership, and must bring a written Recommendation back for the Association to accept or not accept. The Recommendation must pass by a two-thirds majority.

#### I. Resolution Committee

A Resolution Committee of three persons shall be appointed by the Moderator to make or receive Resolutions for consideration of this body. Be it understood that there may not always be Resolutions.

Resolution (Definition): A proposal having fixed purpose, lasting, firm, directed into being legislated into law. (Constitution).

#### J. Finance Committee

A Finance Committee of three members shall be appointed by the Moderator to audit monies received at the Quarterly and Annual Meetings, and assist the Treasurer in any computation needed.

#### K. Pulpit Committee

A Pulpit Committee of three members shall be appointed by the Moderator at each Quarterly and Annual Meeting, to select from the Ministers present the Ministers to preach the message of God for the day.

### L. Obituary Committee

An Obituary Committee shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting by the Moderator to compose a list of those deaths since the last meeting, and move the Association have a time of silence for those who have gained the crown.

#### RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Be It Resolved: that the Association elect a Minister to preach only the First Quarterly and Annual Meetings.
- 2. Be It Resolved: that the Canadian Association sponsor a \$200.00 Scholarship, annually, to Hillsdale Bible College, for a person selected by the Executive Board (with preference given to students from the Canadian Association).
- 3. Be It Resolved: that the Home Church supply the Noon meal for both the Annual and Quarterly Association Meetings.
- 4. Be It Resolved: that we meet beginning at 9:30 a.m., on Saturday mornings.
- 5. Be it Resolved: to set the Clerk's salary at \$160.00 per year, and the Treasurer salary at \$160.00 per year.
- 6. Be it Resolved: that the churches that are members of the Canadian Association that fail to attend fellowship and support the association for one year be dropped from the association roll. Churches dropped may be reinstated by a letter, fellowship and support at any quarterly meeting of the Canadian Association.
- 7. Be It Resolved: that all meetings of the Examining and Credential Board and Executive Board be put on tape for a permanent record available to anyone in the association upon request.
