

FIRST DAY.

CASEY'S CHAPEL, WAYNE Co., N. C., November 9th, 1894.

The congregation assembled in the church at 11 o'clock, A. M. Eld. The Moderator appoints Bros, Ransom Garris, Edward Long, and Eld. J. F. Hill a committee on Religious Exercises; on Finance, J. C. Smith, G. 3. Strickland, and J. R. Baggett; committee on boundaries, J. L. Aulphin, Richard Anderson, and W. T. Barefoot.

By motion, Lee's Grove church is received and enrolled as a member of this Conference.

By motion, the report of the committee on ministerial character is received and committee continued. (See report).

By motion, the rules of order are suspended

and the letters from most of the churches read.

By motion by Eld. J. F. Hill, the name of New Prospect be stricken from our list.

By motion, the reports are received from the ministers. (See reports).

By motion, the report of the Sabbath School Convention is received. (See reports).

By motion, Conference adjourned until tomorrow morning at 9: 30 o'clock; closing exercises conducted by Elder Kenith Revnor.

NIGHT SESSION.

The Ordaining Council met at Bro. Alex Ca-sey's and examined Bros. J. W. Moore and W. B. Hare on the principal doctrines of the Free Will Baptist faith, and found them to be orthodox in the faith, whereupon the council proceeded to ordain them according to the usual custom of laving on hands, praver and sermon.

Elder Lee preached from St. Mark 16: 15,16, "Go ve into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be danned."

By motion, Elder J. H. Worley, of the Western Conference, and W. C. Vause of the Eastern Conference, are invited to a seat in this body.

By motion, resolution by Bro. A. W. Gregory is received for discussion and adopted. (See resolutions.)

By motion, resolution by Elder Robert Strickland is received for discussion and adopted. (See resolutions.)

Committee on Religious Exercises report to preach at the stand at 2 o'clock, Elder J. S. Ellis, followed by Elder W. C. Vause; to-morrow at 10 o'clock, A. M., Elders R. C. Jackson and J. H. Worley, Elder Lee close.

Petitions are received from New Hope and Johnston's Union. It is decided by a vote that the next session of this Conference be held with the church at Johnston's Union, Johnston county, commencing on Thursday before the first Sabbath in November, 1895, at 12 o'clock. Petitions are received from Stoney Run and Hodges Chapel. It is decided by vote, that the next session of the Sunday School Convention be held with the church at Hodges Chapel, Harnett county, on Saturday before the first Sunday in October, 1895.

By motion, Conference adjourns oue hour for d uner.

Conference reassembles in the house at 1:30 and resumes business under the head of miscellineous.

The names of Elders R. C. Jackson and J. F. Hill are put in nomination to preach the introductory sermon at the next annual session of this body. Eld. Jackson is elected and Eld. Hill his alternate.

By motion, the Moderator appoints a committee to investigate the trouble existing between the church at Johnston's Union and Bros. L. 4. and Lodrie Corbett. The Moderator appoints on this committee, Eld. J. A. Hodges, Bros. A. Muns, and W. B. Stricktand.

By motion, the Moderator pays over to the Treasurer the balance of \$2,83 from last year, sent by Bro. H. W. Jernigan.

By motion, the names of W. B Hare and J. H. Moore be entered on the list of ordained ministers.

By motion, the report of the Finance committee is received and committee discharged. (See reports).

By motion, the Treasurer pays over \$11,00 to Bro. A. W. Gregory in part payment of the debt of \$24,00.

By motion, this Uonference have 500 copies of

its proceedings printed, and send 50 copies to the Western Conference and 50 copies to the Eastern Conference.

By motion, Conference pays the Secretary \$10, 00 for preparing the manuscript and recording same on Book of Records.

By motion, the Treasurer pays the Secretary \$18,01 to defray the expenses of printing the minutes.

By motion, the Treasurer pays Eld. R. C. Jackson \$1,75, his expenses to the Western Conference.

By motion, this body send a delegate to the next Western Conference. Eld. J. A. Hodges is elected a delegate to the same.

By motion, this Conference send a delegate to the Eastern Conference. Bro. A. W. Gregory is elected a delegate to the same. Eld. Robert Strickland is elected alternate for Bro. Gregory, and Eld. R. C. Jackson for Eld. Hodges.

By motion, this Conterence tenders a vote of thanks to this community for its kind hospitality shown them during this session of this Conterence.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE 1. This body shall be known as the Cape Fear Free-Will Baptist Conference.

ART. 2. The object of this Conference shall be to promote Christ's kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

ART. 3. This Conference shall be composed of its own officers, of the ministers who are members of the churches belonging to the body, of delegates from the churches, each church being entitled to three delegates, and one representative from each Board and Standing Committee.

ART. 4. The delegates from each church shall bear to the Conference a letter certifying their appointment, showing the condition and statistics of the church, and giving a statement of all funds raised during the year for denominational or other benevolent purposes.

ART. 5. The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Treasurer, Corresponding and Recording Secretary, who shall remain in office until their successors are elected.

ART. 6. This Conference may, at each regular meeting, elect as many boards or standing committees as may be necessary in carrying out its benevolent purposes. These shall keep a record of their proceedings and make a report at each regular meeting of this Conference.

ART. 7. Any church desiring to become a member of this body shall present her petition at a regular session of Conference through delegates appointed for that purpose. If she be received, the Moderator shall extend to her delegates the hand of fellowship.

ART. 8. The Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body, save that of voting.

ART. 9. This Constitution may be amended at any regular session by a vote of four-fifths of the members present
