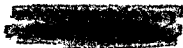

October 29th 1896.

## SECOND DAY.

FRIDAY, Oct. 30th, 1896.

According to adjournment, Conference is called to order by the Moderator at 9:30. Religious exercises are conducted by Eld. Lunda Lee.

Roll is called and 73 members answer.

Minutes of yesterday are read and approved.

Reports from churches are read. [See statistics]

On motion by Eld. Lunda Lee, the report of committee on Ministerial Character is adopted. [See report.]

On motion by Eld. C H Tripp, resolution by Bro. Erasmus Lee, concerning the repealing of the resolutions creating a committee on Ministerial Labor, is received for discussion. Speeches were made by Bro. Erasmus Lee, Eld. R Strick-



land, and Bro. I W Taylor. At this point Conference adjourns one hour for dinner.

After dinner the discussion was resumed by Elders R C Jackson, Wm. Byrd, J A Hodges, J F Hill, C H Tripp, W R Glover and others. After a somewhat lengthy discussion, Eld. Wm. Byrd moved to table the resolution until the next sitting of this body in 1897, which was carried by a vote of 48 to 36.

On motion by Eld. C H Tripp, resolution by Bro. A W Gregory, is received for discussion and adopted. [See resolution.]

On motion by Bro. A W Gregory, the Secretary is required to distinguish between standing and temporary resolutions.

On motion by Bro. A W Gregory, report of Ordaining Council is received and adopted. [See report.]

On motion by Eld. Wm. Byrd, resolution by Eld. R Strickland of 1894, requiring all the male members to be assessed 10c for the purpose of establishing a college, is repealed.

On motion by Bro. A W Gregory, report of committee on Ministerial Labor is adopted. [See report.] Conference adjourns for dinner.

At 1 o'clock Conference reassembles in the church and resumes business under the head of Miscellaneous Business.

On motion by Bro. W H Gregory, the report of Secretary of the Sabbath school Convention is adopted

On motion by Bro. A W Gregory, the name and address of the clerk of each local church be printed on the minutes.

On motion by Bro. J F Jackson, this Conference have 600 church letters printed for the use of the churches of this Conference.

Committee on Religious Exercises report to preach this evening at 2 o'clock, Elders C H Tripp, followed by J A Hodges; to-night, W B Hare, followed by R C Jackson; to-morrow, R

C Jackson, followed by J F Hill.

On motion, the committee on Religious Exercises is discharged.

On motion by Bro. W. A. Blackman, all classes at the Sabbath School convention have on equal showing.

By vote the next session of this body convenes with the church at Dunn, N. C.

On motion by Bro. Nathan Barefoot, this conference have 700 copies of the proceedings of this session printed and distribute them as follows: S. C. Conference 25: Central 25: Eastern 25: Western 25: and distribute the remainder among the churches composing this body.

#### OBITUARY OF BRO. J. P. OGBURN

Since the Conference of 1892, we find that God in his kind Providence has seen fit to remove from this honorable body, the Cape Fear Conference, two of the oldest ministers. The first was Bro. J P Ogburn, whose birth we have no definite date. Bro. Ogburn was a man in whom the people had the utmost confidence as a christian minister and brother. He was always a very pious man in all his endeavors. The writer has not been able to get the date he began preaching. However, he was a very steadfast minister in the faith once delivered to the saints.

In the latter years of work in the ministry, he was elected a member of the Ordaining Council. He stood in the highest estimation of all who knew him. In the death of Bro Ogburn the Cape Fear Conference has sustained a loss which can never be filled. He passed away in the latter part of November, 1892.

Asleep in Jesus, blessed sleep,  
From which none ever wake to weep.

"Mark the perfect man, behold the upright,  
for the end of that man is peace."

His funeral was preached by Eld. J A Hodges—  
Text: Rev- 14:13. "Blessed are the dead which  
die in the Lord, from henceforth, yea, sayeth the  
spirit, that they may rest from their labors; and  
their works do follow them."

#### OBITUARY OF BRO. Wm. HARRIS.

In connection with the obituary of Bro. Og-  
burn, with sadness, we chronicle the death of  
Eld. Wm. Harris, whose ministry dates back to  
the infancy of the Cape Fear Conference. Eld.  
Harris was a man of very much energy in the  
calling wherewith he was called. In the begin-  
ning of his ministerial labors he was a very suc-  
cessful ingatherer to the conference; yet the El-  
der made a few mistakes during his race of life.  
His manner of preaching was very plain and  
stately. Though uneducated, his familiarity  
with the word of God was hardly excelled. Like  
many others, he was acquainted with sorrow,  
tribulations and disappointments. We believe  
that his last days were his happiest ones.

He attended the annual conference held with  
the church at Shady Grove, in Sampson county,  
1893. He went home from the conference and  
immediately he was taken sick with pneumonia  
and died in the latter part of the year 1893.  
"Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord."  
We trust our loss was his eternal gain.

The funeral was preached by Eld. Lunda Lee—  
Text: 2 Tim. 4:7-8. "I have fought a good fight,  
I have finished my course, I have kept the faith;  
henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of  
righteousness which the Lord, the righteous  
judge shall give me at that day; and not to me

only, but unto all them also that love his appearing."

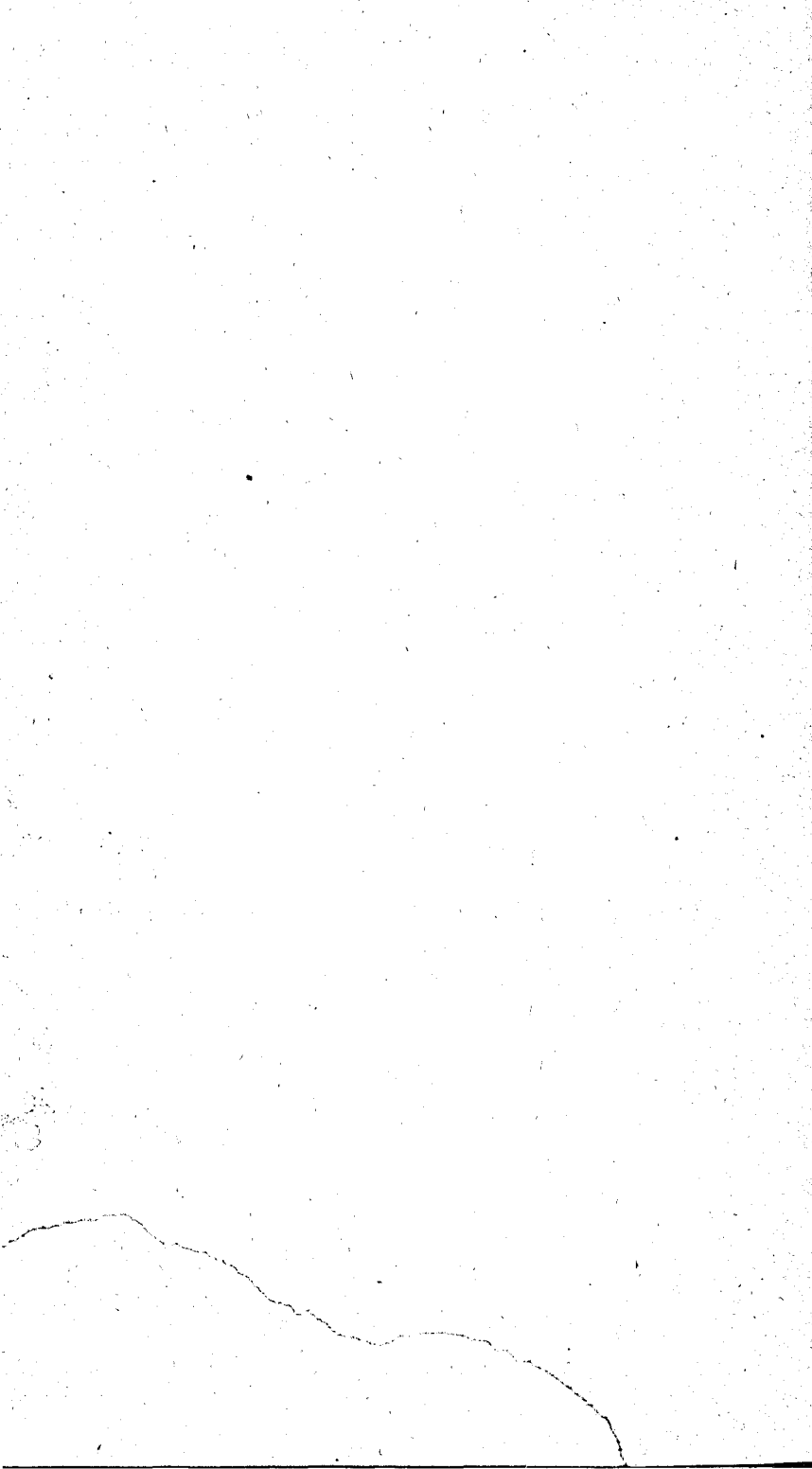
