AFTERNOON SESSION.

Conference reassembled at 2 o'clock and proceeded with business under the head of reports from Committees.

Report from Board of Directors for Beulah High School was read and adopted as follows: October 29th, 1903. The Board of Directors met at Hodges' Chapel Church at the call of the Chairman. A quorum was present.

On motion R. C. Jackson was made Chairman pro tem. The pro-

ceedings of the previous meetings were found to be as follows (viz): At Dunn, N. C., in January, 1903. Was only the collecting of funds to meet the deficiency of the first five months of the Beulah High School. At the meeting held in June it was decided that we meet the full deficiency for the year and that we notify the principal of the School that we, the Board of Directors will assume no further responsibility, and that we tender to him the school upon its merits for the next session. We find the deficiency for the two terms of last year to be \$278.22 This deficiency has been met and paid in full to Prof. J. E. B. Davis, principal of said school.

Payments received as follows: R. C. Jackson, \$86.72; J. F. Hill, \$23.50; W. P. Collier, \$23.50; O. B. Garriss, Z. Taylor, W. J. Powell, \$5.00; J. L. Alphin, \$23.25; A. W. Gregory, \$23.25; H. W. Jernigan, \$23.25; C. W. Anderson, \$23.25; Ransom West, \$23.25; F. M. Dameron, \$23.25. Total, \$278.22. We find the cost of school property to be \$280.00. The amount paid on said property by some of the churches and individuals amounts to \$170, leaving a balance due of \$123.20. School deficiency \$278.22; total Indebtedness \$401.42.

On motion The Beulah High School Improvement Company is hereby allowed the privilege of putting single patent desks in the building of said High School and are allowed the privilege to remove the same at their will.

We the Board of Directors respectfully request the Conference to take immediate steps to meet the deficiency (or amount due) on School property, and shortage in salary of the principal for the two terms heretofore mentioned.

The Chair appoints R. C. Jackson and J. F. Hill as delegates to the Triennial Conference to be held at Dunn, N. C., in October, 1904.

Resolution to amend the resolution passed by this body last session regarding Union Meetings. Following is a copy of said resolutions, as amended:

"Resolved, 1st. That this Conference organize the four Sunday-school Districts into Union Meeting Districts; also,

"2d. That each Union District on Friday before each fifth Sunday during the Conference year, shall hold a Union Meeting at some point designated for said meeting.

"3d. That each local church shall elect a delegate to each Union Meeting held in their respective districts, who shall bear a church letter to said Union, stating the amount raised for Home and Foreign Missions.

Whereas, the doors of Mount Pleasant church have been locked by a minister of another Conference against a minister of our Conference who had been in charge of said church, on motion by J. F. Hill, J. A. Blalock and A. W. Gregory were appointed as a committee to investigate the matter, and if said church-house is found to be the property of this Conference, said committee is hereby authorized to demand possession and make full report of the matter to this Conference at the next session.

On motion, Rev. J. A. Blalock was elected to preach the Introductory Sermon at the beginning of the next session of this Conference, and Rev. H. H. Goff was elected as alternate.

On motion by R. C. Jackson, a vote of thanks was tendered Hodges' Chapel church and community for the kind and hospitable manner in which this Conference has been entertained.

RESOLUTION.

Resolved, 1st. That each minister of this Conference, upon entering upon their pastoral charges, shall proceed at once to organize each church into a Missionary Society.

2d. That the money raised by said societies shall be turned over to the Treasurer of this Conference, and used only for the purpose for which it was intended, as expressed by the donor.

Said Board is vested with power to draw on the Treasurer for all money raised by the several societies of this Conference and paid to him, said money to be used only for the purpose for which it was given (for Home or Foreign Missions, as the case may be), to the best advantage, according to the discretion of said Board.

On motion by J. M. Langdon, the Moderator appointed J. A. Blalock as a delegate to the Central Conference, D. R. Stafford to the Eastern and W. H. Avery to the Western.

On motion, the Board of Directors for Beulah High School were discharged.
