REPORT OF THE UNION MEETING OF THIRD DISTRICT.

Through our Seretary, undersigned, we beg leave to report as follows: We have been blessed with success in all of our union meetings this year, having a quorum present at each meeting. The following figures show the amounts raised for Home and Foreign Missions by our district during this Conference year:

For Home Missions.....	\$118.81
For Foreign Missions.....	156.77

Grand total for Home and Foreign Missions.....\$275.58

We have organized two new churches, supported two Home Mission stations and have helped to support three others, all of which are doing well. We have kept Elder W. W. Avant in the Home Mission field regularly except a few days since January 1, 1904, and have given him \$25 per month and allowing him all of his collections besides, unless such collections exceeded \$50 per month. Up to date we are out of debt to Brother Avant, through the aid of individuals, save a very small amount. We ask the prayers and co-operation of all our sister unions to aid us in putting a missionary in the Foreign field at this session, or at as early a date as we possibly can afterwards. We also ask your body to give us all the amount of Mission money raised through the several societies in the local churches constituting the Third district, that we may add it to our fund for Foreign Missions.
